There will be a wearin' of the green in Baltimore this Sunday, but the Baltimore Bays are hinting that May 22nd may be an even bigger day for the Irish of Baltimore.

The Dundalk team, 1967 Irish League Champions, will be the first foreign team to play the Bays in an exhibition match at Memorial Stadium on that day.

"Hours of careful thought went into selecting the first foreign team we play ... and we are convinced the Bays-Dundalk game is a natural," explains Bays General Manager, Clive Toye (an Englishman)...

"Dundalk, Maryland is named for Dundalk-County Louth, Ireland, home of the Dundalk team. Secondly, and best of all, Dundalk, Maryland is celebrating its 50th birthday this year and its Golden Anniversary Committee has agreed to kickoff the festivities with the May 22nd exhibition game," concludes Toye.

Ticket applications for the game will be distributed this weekend at the St. Patrick's Day celebration of the Emerald Isle Club, Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, Hibernians and, of course, along the parade route on Sunday.

Ticket prices for the Dundalk game will be the same as regular season match tickets (Box \$3.25, Reserve \$2.50, Adult General Admission \$2, Student General Admission \$1). Bays season ticket holders will be given the option to purchase their regular season seats at the single game price.

Frank Cashen, Oriole Executive Vice President, also happens to be President of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick. "He wouldn't be talking to this Englishman on St. Patrick's Day if I had chosen any other team, " quips Toye. "Why I've even bought a green tie."
