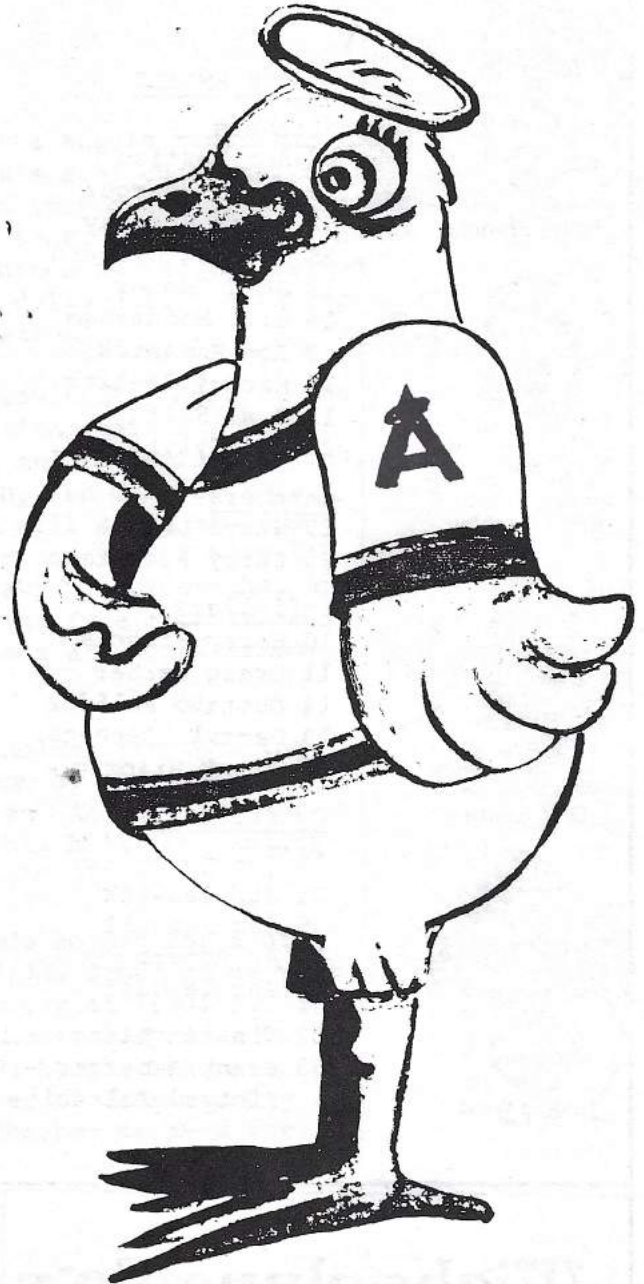
UPCOMING PROMOTIONS

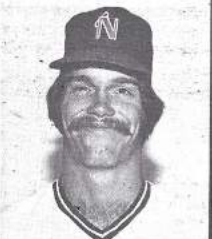

Injury free Polidor has eyes on Angel SS job

SPRINGFIELD, Mass.—Gustavo Polidor of the Nashua Angels is back bigger and better than ever after a fall and winter rest which included six weeks spent in a body cast.

The 21-year-old shortstop, hampered the past two seasons by chronic back problems, had tried just about everything to remedy the problem, according to Mike Port, vice president in charge of player development for the Angels.

"He had lifts in his shoes, did exercises, rested, you name it and it still bothered him," Port recalled. "The doctors then thought it was going to nag him throughout his career until one decided to put him in a body cast."

The cast covered Polidor from his armpits to the top of his buttocks, and it apparently did the trick.

Port now echoes the sentiments of many when he speaks of the revitalized Polidor:

"I think this will be THE year for Gustavo. He has the potential to hit .300 and has the potential to be another Dave Concepcion."

When the Angels signed Polidor two years ago, they were the envy of baseball. The star shortstop of the Venezuela National Team and a Venezuelan Winter League all-star, he was wooed by nearly every team in baseball.

At Nashua, Polidor remains a cause for celebration.

"I'm excited about the fact Gustavo will be with us," said Nashua manager Winston Llenas. "He gives our infield stability. He also hit very well in spring training. Because of a few injuries to a couple of players, I plan to bat him lead off. He doesn't have the burning speed of a normal leadoff man, but had good bat control and can reach the alley with his power."

Polidor hit .248 as a rookie in 1981 at Holyoke. Last year, between long periods of inactivity, he hit .226.

"The first year he was learning the language and the culture so it was a period of adjustment," said Port.

"But, even the year of transition he was one of the smoothest fielding shortstops in baseball. I know a great many scouts like him because he's a throwback to the old days of shortstops. He's not flashy. He gets in front of the ball fielding it."

Dick Schofield, considered the Angels' best minor league prospect, is also a shortstop. He started the 1983 season in AAA at shortstop, though there has been some talk the hard-hitting infielder will be eventually shifted to third base.

"Scouts have compared Dick to Robin Yount and Paul Molitor," said Port. "So I'm not sure where he'll end up in the field, but I can assure you, there will be a place in the lineup for Dick and Gustavo because of their talent."
