The Los Angeles Wolves return home to the Pasadena Rose Bowl Sunday against the Toronto Falcons to launch a busy home schedule calling for four North American Soccer League matches in ten days.

Sunday's meeting between Toronto and Los Angeles, scheduled for a 2 p. m. kickoff, is the first official meeting this year although the two tied 2-2 in a practice match last month in Toronto.

The Wolves, trying to snap a winless streak at home that has produced two losses and three ties since the L.A. side clipped the Baltimore Bays on Easter Sunday, 2-1.

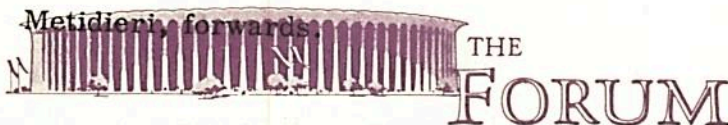
Sunday's game also marks the first home appearance of two Wolves players -- 28-year-old goalkeeper Joe Dean, signed two weeks ago after completing his season with Carlisle of the English Football League's first division, and 20-year-old center forward Barry Ingold, former Al-L.A. City football player at Sylmar High School in the San Fernando Valley.

Following the Falcons into the Rose Bowl will be the Oakland Clippers next Wednesday night at 8, the Kansas City Spurs Sunday, June 23 at 2 p. m. and the Dallas Tornados on Wednesday night, June 26, kickoff is at 8 o'clock.

Wolves coach Ray Wood, who may see some reserve action against Toronto at inside right, indicated he would go with his usual lineup. That means Malcolm White in goal; Gerr Lightowler and Jim Houliston, fullbacks; Ed Reeves, Tony Knapp and Danny Campbell, half-backs; Ray Veall, Mickey Walker, George Benitez, George Piotti and high-scoring Carlos
