Major League sports history will be made in New England, at Boston's famous Fenway Park, Tuesday night, when the Boston Beacons make their bow before local sports fans in a North American Soccer League game against the colorful Detroit Cougars.

Kickoff is at 8:05 p.m., with colorful pre-game ceremonies starting at 7:30.

Richard Cardinal Cushing will dignify this occasion by presenting the game ball to the rival captains - - Erik Dyreborg of the Beacons and Bryan Snowden of Detroit.

The colorful Aleppo Temple Shriners band and color guard will officiate at flag-raising ceremonies, and additional Shrine marching units will participate in the halftime pageantry under the direction of Howard L. MacOdrum, Illustrious Potentate.

The pre-game festivities will get underway with a demonstration of the few, easily-understandable rules of soccer by Beacons players, to give new fans to this sport, which is sweeping the United States in interest, an easy understanding of the game. Soccer for years has been the greatest spectator sport in the world.

The Beacons, coached by Jack Mansell, one of the game's outstanding mentors, have put together a hustling squad of players representing eight nations, including the United States.
