How Acq: Terr.-84

A four-year starter, Baird played both left cornerback and free safety. He was named honorable mention All-Pac 10 his junior season when he intercepted 3 passes and recovered 2 fumbles. He had 7 career interceptions. He attended Cherry Creek High in Englewood, Colo., where he was the Colorado Athlete of the Year in 1979.

As a senior, he rushed 214 times for 914 yards (4.3 avg.) and 2 touchdowns, plus had 39 catches for 312 yards (8.0 avg.). He attended Monterey (Ca.) High.

Despite missing four games in 1983 because of an injury, Lewis managed to catch 28 passes for 501 yards (17.9 avg.) and 3 touchdowns. He was named second team All-America by The Sporting News and was selected for the Hula Bowl and Senior Bowl. As a junior, Lewis caught 54 passes—a Pac 10 record for tight ends—and ended his career as the Bears' No. 3 all-time receiver with 114 catches for 1,607 yards (14.1 avg.) and 10 touchdowns. He attended Grant High in Portland, Ore.

Loberg, Greg

Prior to his two seasons at Chabot (Hayward, Ca.) College, Pratt attended Mt. Eden High in Hayward.

He was named second team All-PCAA after his junior season when he caught 40 passes for 590 yards (14.8 avg.) and 4 touchdowns. While at Monterey (Ca.) Peninsula College, Richardson had 63 catches for 1,236 yards (19.6 avg.) and 11 touchdowns his sophomore season. He attended Novato (Ca.) High.
