Baltimore Bandits vs. Carolina Monarchs OPENING NIGHT

Friday, October 6, 1995, 7:30 p.m.

BANDITS' BLURBS

The Baltimore Bandits concluded their first ever exhibition season last Saturday night in a 4-3 loss to the Hershey Bears at the Baltimore Arena bringing their pre-season record to 0-2. Despite a 3-1 lead in the third period, the Bandits dropped their second consecutive game to the Hershey Bears (the first of which was a 6-1 loss at HersheyPark Arena on September 27).

The Bandits' did, however, manage to score two power play goals and one short-handed goal in the contest. In fact, the Bandits' special teams have accounted for each of the four Bandits' goals (2 PP, 2SH) scored in the pre-season. Bandits C Sean Pronger kicked off the Bandits' scoring in Hershey last week with a short-handed goal in the third period; C Jarrod Skalde picked up the ball on Saturday, Oct. 30, in front of 4,934 at the Baltimore Arena, as he netted two power play goals; while LW Mike Maneluk chipped a short-hander past Hershey goaltender Neil Little in the first period. Tonight, the Bandits play host to Southern Division foe, the Carolina Monarchs. Tonight's game represents the first for the Monarchs in the AHL and the first in the Bandits' existence.

THE UPCOMING AGENDA -- Following Tonight's game, the Bandits hit the road for a match tomorrow night in Glens Falls, NY, vs. the Adirondack Red Wings at 7:30 p.m. Then it's back to the Baltimore Area for three days of practice at the Columbia Ice Rink and out to Hershey, PA, after next Wednesday morning's practice, for a game that evening vs. the Bears at 7:30 p.m. The Bandits head south after a Thursday morning practice at Columbia to Greensboro, NC, for back-to-back games vs. Carolina on Friday and Saturday nights. Both games are at 7:30 p.m.

A NEW FACE IN TOWN THIS WEEK -- On Tuesday, Oct. 3, the Mighty Ducks of Anaheim (NHL) assigned RW Steven King to Baltimore. In 36 games with Anaheim last season, King had eight goals and three assists. King, 26, hails from East Greenwich, RI, and is a graduate of Brown University. Before being acquired by Anaheim from the New York Rangers in the 1993 NHL Expansion Draft, King played two seasons with the Binghamton Rangers (AHL).

A LOOK AT THE MONARCHS

Much like the Bandits, the Carolina Monarchs (formerly the Greensboro Monarchs of the East Coast Hockey League) enter their first AHL season this evening. The Monarchs wrapped up a three game pre-season on Friday in a 5-4 overtime loss at Binghamton finishing the exhibition season at 1-2. Prior to Friday's loss, the Monarchs split a home-and-home series with the Orlando Solar Bears of the ECHL. Carolina netminder Kevin Weekes stopped 38 of the 40 shots he faced in the pre-season while RW Ashley Buckberger leads the team in scoring with three points.

INJURIES -- Carolina's Danny Gravelle is expected to be out for the season. Gravelle tore the anterior cruciate ligament in the second exhibition game against Orlando.

TRANSACTIONS --Monarchs' Centers Alexei Kudashov and Steve Washburn were re-assigned to Carolina last Wednesday. Both appeared in several exhibitions with the Florida Panthers (NHL).

HTS BROADCAST OF HOME OPENER -- Home Team Sports will telecast the Bandits' Inaugural Season Opening Night Game. WBAL Sports Director, Josh Lewin will be handling the play-by-play while the Monarchs' Brooks Melchoir will do color commentary. The Bandits' own Brian Hamilton will be conducting player interviews and all the in-between periods festivities.
