CBA NOTES

When Wilkes-Barre's Rich Cornwall hit on a 3-pointer with only two seconds left in the Barons' home game against the Lancaster Red Roses (Wed. Nov. 8), the game was stopped and the nine-year CBA veteran was presented with an award. The 3-pointer was number 300 in Cornwall's career and it earned him a free suit from The Hub Men's Shop in Wilkes-Barre....Andre McCarter, the former UCLA playmaker and a one-year NBA veteran with the Kansas City Kings, has piled up a large number of assits with the Rochester Zeniths. Presently, Andre leads the league in that category with 9.8 per contest and his one-game best of 16 is also tops in the CBA....Bruce (Soup) Campbell, the former Providence star, is off to a fine start with the Wilkes-Barre Barons. In his first two games, Bruce totaled 45 points and 21 rebounds...Former St. Bonaventure star Greg Sanders is another impressive newcomer to the CBA. After two games, Greg is averaging 17 points per contest....The Rochester Zeniths won two of their three games this week and Larry McNeill was a big reason. The former Marquette star and NBA veteran picked up 69 points and 29 rebounds in the three contests, hitting on 59% (26 for 44) of his shots from the field....The Wilkes-Barre Barons Bill Terry also had a fine week. Terry, the CBA's Rookie-of-the-Year last season, compiled 99 points and 11 assists in the Barons' three games, finishing a very close second to Allentown's George Berry for the Player-of-the-Week.
