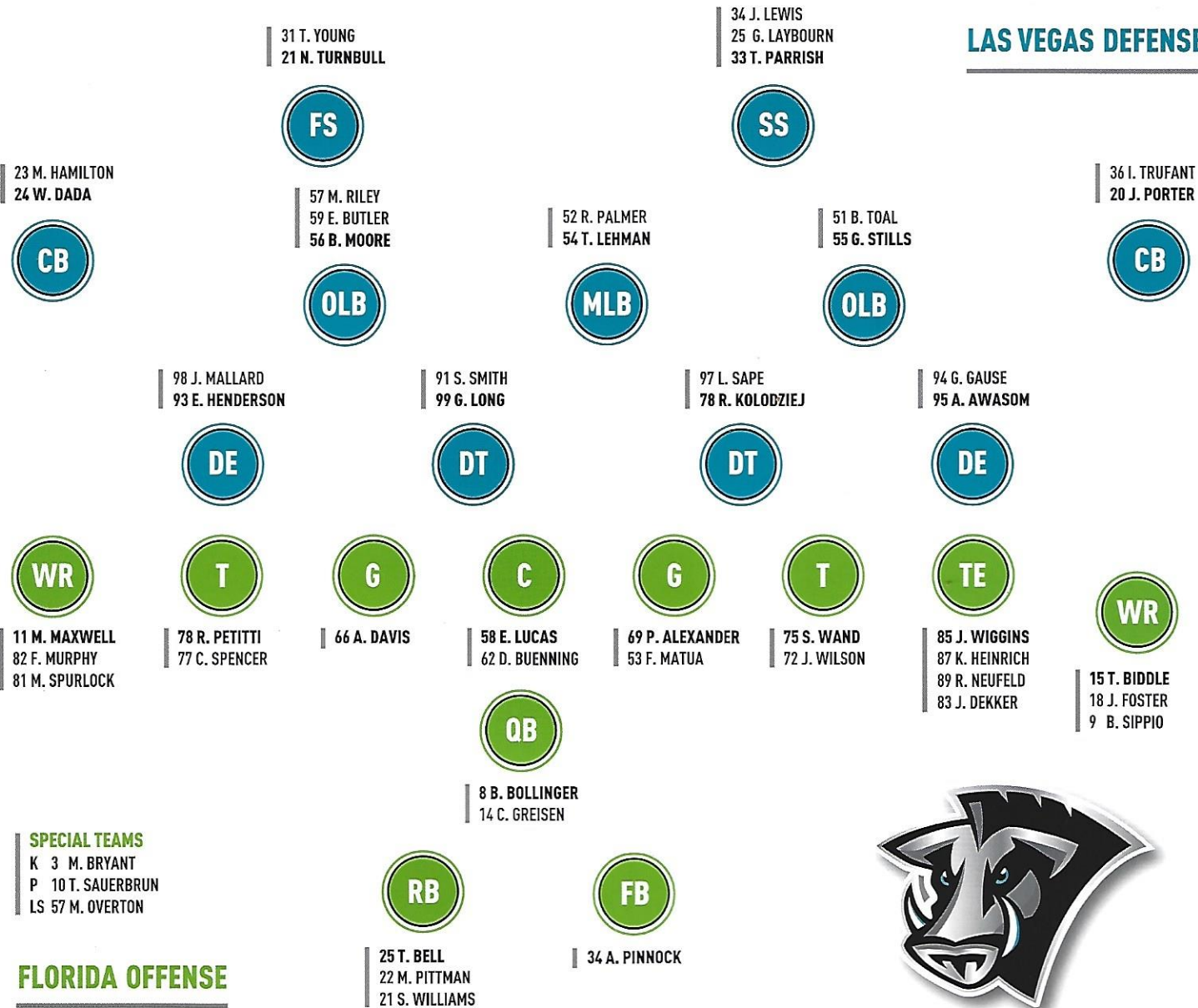

Road to the Championship Game



Welcome to the Championship Game of the "Premiere" season of the United Football League. Today is the culmination of much hard work on the part of the players, the coaches and the League. The UFL began from a simple idea - "It's all about U". This is a league created for fans and the fans are going to see an exciting match-up today. The Championship Game features not only the two teams with the best records in the UFL, (Florida 6-0/ Las Vegas 4-2), but also the squads with the top two ranked offenses and defenses. The last time the Tuskers and Locos met on October 30th at Tropicana Field, they produced a UFL record 865 yards of combined total offense (LV 434/FL431) in Florida's 27-24 victory. Las Vegas Head Coach Jim Fassel, who now has a 1-3 career record against Tuskers Head Coach Jim Haslett, will be looking to win the third, and most important meeting between these two teams. The first two meetings of the season were both decided by less than seven points. In two games against Las Vegas, Tuskers QB Brooks Bollinger is averaging 318 yards passing while completing 69% of his passes and threw for 5 TD's against only one interception. While the Tuskers' offense has been explosive this season against Las Vegas, it has been their defense that has controlled the games. In two games, Florida has sacked Locos QB JP Losman 11 times, intercepted two passes, and forced four fumbles.

Florida's dominating regular season 6-0 record can be attributed to some outstanding individual performances. QB Brooks Bollinger led the UFL in passing yards (1,526), passing TDs (14), completion % (67.4%), average yards per completion (12.6) and completions (120). WR Taye Biddle led the League in receiving yards (460) and yards per reception (17.7), while DE Patrick Chukwarah and Safety Jerome Carter led the UFL in sacks and interceptions, respectively. The Tuskers offense will be looking to get back on track after finishing the regular season with their only sub-300 yard performance of the season in Florida's 34-27 win over California.

Las Vegas QB JP Losman, who sat out of the Locos last regular season game with a hand injury, will be back on the field looking to capture the UFL Championship, along with his first win against the Tuskers. In the first two games against Florida this season, Losman averaged 245.5 yards passing and threw for four touchdowns, despite getting sacked 11 times. In their Week 4 matchup against the Tuskers, Las Vegas RB DeDe Dorsey put on one of the most explosive performances of the UFL season. Dorsey, who attended Lindenwood College before spending three seasons in the NFL, rushed for 139 yards and a TD, while averaging 11.6 yards per carry. He scored on a 22-yard carry, and also had a 71-yard run in the 4th quarter that set up the Locos game-tying touchdown.

The Locos defense ranks second in the UFL against the rush, and is led by MLB Teddy Lehman. The former Oklahoma Sooner and 2nd round draft choice of the Detroit Lions leads the UFL in tackles. He had 17.5 tackles, two pass breakups and a sack in the two games against the Tuskers. Heading into the Championship Game, Las Vegas is coming off of one of most dominant defensive performances of the entire UFL season. In their 41-6 win against New York, the Locos allowed a UFL record low 41 yards rushing, and also picked off a season high three passes.
