Bullock, a former schoolboy All-American in San Antonio, Texas, has an outstanding collegiate carreer at Texas Tech. Well-known for his aggressive and physical style, Rich was selected as the Southwest Conference Newcomer of the Year as a freshman and was named All-Southwest Conference for the following three years. In 1976 Bullock was drafted by the New York Knicks and was the team's final cut that season.

ZENITH SPOTLIGHT PLAYER OF THE NIGHT PETE DAVIS

Pete Davis, a 6'1", 180 pound point guard out of Michigan State University, will be doing his playmaking for the Rochester Zeniths this season.

Davis, a two-year veteran of the Continental Basketball Association played with the Long Island Ducks of the CBA last season (and with the Rochester Zeniths of the AABA), averaging 16.3 pts. and 5.2 assists per game. Pete spent his first year (76-77) in the CBA with the Jersey Shore Bullets.

A native of Brooklyn, New York, Pete played his schoolboy basketball at well-known Boy's High. Following his stellar high school career, he attended Michigan State University in the rugged Big Ten.

Although chosen by New York in the forth round of the 1975 NBA draft, Davis was unable to crack the talented Knicks' roster.

A marketing representative for IBM in the off-season, Pete resides in Brooklyn, New York.

LEAGUE NOTES: The Baltimore Metros home opener attracted 2,017 fans and the Wilkes Barre Barons welcomed 1,066 to their first home game.... ESSIE HOLLIS, the former St. Bonaventure star who was a late cut of the Detroit Pistons this season, picked up 56 points (28.0 avg.), 28 rebounds (14.0). seven assists (3.5) and seven blocks (3.4) in his first two games, while hitting on 71% (25-35) of his shots from the field and 100% (6-6) of his shots from the line.... Rookie Galen Baker, a 6'3'', 170 pound guard who played with the Harlem Blobetrotters last season, is the surprise of the league so far, scoring 33 pts. in his first game and 19 in his second. Baker, a native of Philadelphia who attended the University of Southwestern Louisianna, also picked up eight assists while shooting at a 53% (21-40) clip from the field and 91% (10-11) clip from the line.... Joe Pace, a member of the Washington Bullets World Championship team last season, and now a member of the Baltimore Metros, jammed a finger (on a dunk attempt) in the Metros home opener. Pace played only six minutes in that contest and not at all in Baltimore's second game... Pete Monska, head coach of the Wilkes-Barre Barons, was presented with his 1978 CBA Coach of the Year award, prior to the Barons' home opener on Sunday evening.... Timmy Claxton, a rookie (with Baltimore) from Temple University, deposited 50 points (25.0 avg.) in his first two contest, shooting at a 51% clip from the field (19-37) from the field. The former Owl also pulled in 17 rebounds (8.5 avg.) and dished eight assists (4.0).


