The lowa Cornets is owned by international amateur sports benefactor George Nissen of Cedar Rapids, Iowa. As owner, Nissen intends to uphold his long time business philosophy of "I never put my name on anything but the best".

The lowa Cornets was the first team to be signed into the Women's Pro Basketball League in early 1978. The name "lowa Cornets" was originated by Nissen because lowa is recognized nationally as the "corn" state.

Since its organization, the Iowa Cornets have been involved in many activities, including, the national draft held July 18, 1978 in New York City, signing 14 players from two tryout camps, holding a basketball camp for Junior High and High School girls and starring in the full length feature movie "Dribble" scheduled to premier in many Iowa cities this winter.

The team's general manager, Rod Lein of Ankeny, Iowa, is one of the pioneers of women's basketball. Lein has been active in all aspects of promoting and organizing women's

basketball.

The Women's Pro Basketball League (WBL) is comprised of eight teams from throughout the nation, including, the lowa Cornets.

The league is governed by a board of directors made up of team owners and general managers. The board of directors meet monthly to determine league policies, playing rules and other matters pertaining to the league.

The league will consist of two divisions. The Eastern Division is comprised of teams from New York, New Jersey, Houston and Dayton with the Midwest Division consisting of Milwaukee, Chicago, Minnesota and the lowa Cornets.


