

BILLIE JEAN KING

CO-FOUNDER, WORLD TEAMTENNIS
VISIONARY + INNOVATOR + CHAMPION

BORN

November 22, 1943

BIRTHPLACE Long Beach, Calif.

As one of the 20th century's most respected and influential people, Billie Jean King has long been a champion for social change and equality. She created new inroads for both genders in and out of sports during her legendary career and she continues to make her mark today. Among her many accomplishments are:

Named one of the "100 Most Important Americans of the 20th Century" by *Life Magazine* in 1990.

Won 39 Grand Slam singles, doubles and mixed doubles tennis titles, including a record 20 titles at Wimbledon.

In 2008 King authored "Pressure is a Privilege: Lessons I've Learned from Life and the Battle of the Sexes" to commemorate the 35th anniversary of her historic 1973 match against Bobby Riggs.

Was one of nine players who broke away from the tennis establishment and accepted \$1 contracts from tennis promoter Gladys Heldman in Houston. The revolt led to the birth of women's professional tennis and the formation of the Virginia Slims Tour and Women's Tennis Association.

Empowered women and educated men when she defeated Bobby Riggs in one of the greatest moments in sports history – the Battle of the Sexes in 1973. This match is remembered for its effect on society and its contribution to the women's movement.

Founded the Women's Tennis Association (1973), the Women's Sports Foundation (1974), Women's Sports Magazine (1974) and co-founded GreenSlam, an environmental initiative for the sports industry (2007).

Co-founded World TeamTennis (1974), the groundbreaking co-ed professional tennis league and founded the World TeamTennis Recreational League, one of the most popular recreational tennis formats in the U.S.

Named Global Mentor for Gender Equality by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in 2008 and received the NCAA President's Gerald R. Ford Award in 2009, recognizing her contributions to improving higher education and intercollegiate athletics.

Continues to be a leader in the fight for equality and recognition in the GLBT community, and has been honored by many of the leading GLBT organizations, including the Human Rights Campaign, GLAAD and Lambda Legal Foundation.

Honored on August 28, 2006, when the National Tennis Center, home of the US Open, was renamed the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in honor of King's contributions to tennis, sports and society both on and off the court. She continues to be involved with the USTA and is currently Honorary Chair of the Tennis in the Parks Committee.

Currently serves on the boards of the Women's Sports Foundation and the Elton John AIDS Foundation.



ILANA KLOSS

COMMISSIONER, WORLD TEAMTENNIS

BORN March 22, 1956

WTT CEO/Commissioner Ilana Kloss knows firsthand how the sport of tennis can connect and inspire. At age 11, she was a ballkid for the South African Open, a men's and women's pro tournament in Kloss' native South Africa. One of the top players hit a few balls with her and told Kloss' father Shlaim that his daughter had real potential. That was all an aspiring young tennis player needed to hear. "When I heard that I really began to dream about the possibilities and work towards being the best player I could be," said Kloss.

Four decades later Kloss is still inspired by tennis, now as WTT's CEO and Commissioner. Kloss heads up the day-to-day efforts to secure sponsorships and grow the team tennis concept both in the U.S. and internationally. Kloss, who was recognized as Sports Business Woman of the Year by the Warsaw Sports Marketing Center in 2007, recently negotiated two major agreements for WTT. In January 2009, the League announced a threeyear title sponsorship extension of the Advanta WTT Pro League. Rec League and the Smash Hits charity event. Additionally, the United States Tennis Association (USTA) became a minority owner of World TeamTennis and will work with WTT on a number of growth initiatives, including youth participation in team tennis.

Kloss' passion for WTT's unique co-ed format and community appeal is evident when she speaks about how WTT stands out in the sports landscape. "WTT is about both men and women competing together on a level playing field. Our vision is to grow tennis and make it a true team sport. With the Advanta WTT Pro League, we are able to bring the best professional players to local communities

where kids can see them working together as a team. That's an important inspirational message."

"WTT is also about giving communities a sense of ownership in tennis and a connection to our players," adds Kloss. "We provide a level of access and involvement fans generally can't get with other sports."

Kloss was just a kid herself when she became the youngest No. 1 in South African tennis history at age 17. By the time she turned 20, she was the topranked doubles player in the world, winning doubles titles at the US Open, Italian Open, U.S. Clay Courts, German Open, British Hard Courts and Hilton Head in 1976. Kloss also added the 1976 French Open Mixed Doubles title with Kim Warwick.

Kloss played WTT for years (San Francisco, Oakland, Long Beach, Miami Beach) before becoming a team coach. She guided the Chicago Fyre to the 1983 title before joining WTT full-time as Player Liaison in 1985. The transition from the courts to the office was a smooth one for Kloss, becoming the WTT Vice President in 1987 and succeeding Billie Jean King as WTT Executive Director in 1991. Kloss was named CEO/Commissioner in February 2001.

Kloss oversees the Advanta WTT Pro League and the nationwide grassroots Advanta WTT Rec League programs from her New York City office. Kloss' primary focus is on national sponsorships, strategic planning, media partnerships and expansion of the Advanta WTT Pro League.

In 2006, Kloss was inducted into the National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame. She currently serves on the executive boards of the Elton John AIDS Foundation and WTT Charities.



Nellie Chu Office Manager

Nellie works as the Office Manager at our headquarters in New York City, as well as assisting WTT CEO/Commissioner Ilana Kloss. Prior to joining WTT in November 2008, Nellie worked in Financial Services as an Account Manager for various hedge funds and privately managed accounts. Nellie graduated from Baruch College in 2004 with a B.B.A. in Industrial/Organizational Psychology and is pursuing her Masters in Taxation.



Rosie Crews Vice President, Communications

Rosie joined WTT in 2006 and is responsible for communications and media relations. Prior to joining the League staff, Rosie worked for an international sports and event marketing agency where she supervised WTT and other tennis accounts. She has a diverse background in sports and entertainment and has led PR and event marketing initiatives for major events and corporate clients including the Olympics, Kentucky Derby, Sundance Film Festival, Diageo, Philip Morris, and sports properties such as tennis, auto racing, beach volleyball, bowling and surfing. Rosie graduated from the University of Texas at Arlington with a B.A. in Communications (Journalism).



Jeff Harrison Vice President, League Properties

Jeff joined WTT in 1997. He currently manages and oversees all League-owned teams, the Advanta WTT Finals and Advanta Smash Hits. Jeff works from our Wilmington, Delaware office. Jeff previously worked in the Marketing/Public Relations division of the USTA, Middle States Section, and also for IMG's tennis and golf divisions in their Charlotte, North Carolina office. He was also the Director of Sales and Marketing for the Virginia Slims Legends Tour-Charlotte and the Charlotte Express of WTT. Jeff earned his B.A. degree from the University of Delaware.



Bryan Hicks Supervisor of Officials

Bryan joined WTT in February 2006. He oversees the WTT Officiating department including rules, regulations and statistics. Bryan joined WTT after working for the Atlantic Hockey League for four years, where he was the Assistant to the Director of Hockey Operations. Bryan graduated from Neumann College with a B.S. in Sport Management.



Bill Mountford

Bill joined WTT in November 2008 and works in the New York office serving in a variety of roles, including business development, long-term planning, and contributing to industry and USTA relations. Previously, Bill worked for Great Britain's Lawn Tennis Association as a member of the executive leadership team, and was responsible for coaches (education and relations) and competitions (juniors through seniors, and all pre-Wimbledon and professional events) in the U.K. Prior to that, Bill worked for the USTA as Director of Tennis at the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center, the country's largest and busiest public tennis facility, and also served as Director of Player Operations at the US Open. He graduated from Boston University with a B.A. in English in 1989. Bill and his family, wife Catherine, son Jack, and daughter Riley, reside in New York City.



Kerry Schneider Manager, Marketing & Sponsorships

Kerry joined WTT in January 2004. She assists in all League marketing efforts including signage, television and advertising development. Kerry also acts as a liaison to our national sponsors, helping to facilitate the day-to-day communications between sponsors, the League and the Pro teams. She joined WTT after holding positions with both the New York Power of the WUSA and Pam Shriver's Charity Tennis Event, where she was ticket manager in addition to handling event promotions. Kerry graduated from Loyola College with a B.B.A. in Marketing.

Local rec league teams compete at National Qualifiers held in each division to earn a spot in the Advanta WTT Nationals each year to battle for a national championship title. The 2009 Nationals are set for Oct. 30 - Nov. 1 in Indian Wells, Calif.



This tournament, hosted by Advanta WTT cofounder Billie Jean King, is a premier national junior tournament event featuring 16 co-ed teams from across the U.S. The 2009 Nationals will be held August 5 - 8 at the Barnes Tennis Center in San Diego, Calif.

WTT Teaming Up For Tennis





USTA CAMPUS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The WTT format is used for one of the most exciting collegiate events on the tennis calendar, the USTA Campus Championships. World TeamTennis works with the USTA, the National Intramural Recreational Sports Association (NIRSA), the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) and the various USTA Sections in bringing non-varsity college tennis players together to experience fun, fast-paced, co-ed action.

WTT - IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

Each year after Wimbledon, WTT takes center stage in professional tennis. Some of the world's best men and women pros team up in ten markets to play singles, doubles and mixed doubles in an exciting and unique format. The players enjoy the camaraderie of team play and the hometown support from their fans. Here are key terms to know about the WTT experience.



COACHES CHALLENGE

The WTT Coaches Challenge allows each coach to challenge twice per event. Teams also receive an extra challenge for each tiebreaker, overtime.

and/or supertiebreaker. If the call on the court stands, the challenging team will be penalized the loss of one challenge. The team that challenged will not lose a challenge if the challenge is correct and the call is overturned.

DRAFT

The system by which team rosters are determined. There are four or five rounds to the WTT Roster Draft, which took place March 31, 2009, in Miami. Returning franchises have the right to protect players from the previous year's roster. Each player that a team protects reduces the number of available draft selections for that team. Teams draft in reverse order of the previous year's final team standings (including playoffs), based on overall match won/loss record. The team that wins the WTT Final will draft in the last position. Expansion teams draft in the middle of the order. In the case of a tied record, order is determined using the WTT tiebreaker system. That order continues throughout the draft.

FRANCHISES

Ten teams will compete for three weeks during the season, July 2-26. The franchises are divided into two conferences:

EASTERN CONFERENCE



Boston Lobsters New York Buzz New York Sportimes Philadelphia Freedoms Washington Kastles

WESTERN CONFERENCE



Kansas City Explorers Newport Beach Breakers Sacramento Capitals St. Louis Aces Springfield Lasers

OFFICIALS

Seven roving linespersons and a head umpire comprise the officials corps at a WTT match. The head umpire, who calls the match from an umpire's box, is in charge. His/her decisions are final.

ORDER OF EVENTS

The home team coach determines the order of events. An event will be one set.

OVERTIME

Overtime eliminates the possibility of the final sets becoming exhibitions. If the team ahead in the cumulative score wins the final game of the last set, then that team is the winner. If, however, the trailing team wins the final set, the match is sent into Overtime and continues until, a) the leading team wins one game, or b) the trailing team ties the match score. If the score becomes tied, the match is decided by a Supertiebreaker.

SCORING

All games, sets and Supertiebreakers are won by a margin of one point.

SEASON

There will be 70 regular season WTT matches plus three post-season matches between July 2-26.

SET

The first team to reach five games in an event wins each set. Should a set be tied at 4-4, a nine-point tiebreaker is played.

SUBSTITUTION

A coach may substitute one player, per event, per gender at the conclusion of a point. If a player is substituted, he/she may not return to the match during that set.

SUPERTIEBREAKER

In the event of a tied match at the conclusion of five sets or if the trailing team ties the score in Overtime, a 13-point Supertiebreaker, involving the same fifth set event, decides the outcome of the entire match. A coin toss determines the choice of side, server and receiver. Players change sides after six points. The first team to win seven points is awarded a single game and the match.



TEAM

Each team has a coach and four players; two men and two women (five players if there is a Marquee Player on the team). Teams may name local alternates and substitute those should a regular team member become injured during a match. Players are permitted to play in three sets per match.

TIEBREAKER

If a set reaches 4-4, a nine-point tiebreaker is played to decide the winner of the set. The first team to reach five points wins the tiebreaker. Players change sides after four points. The tiebreaker counts as one game and decides the outcome of the set.

ADVANTA WTT FINALS JULY 26, 2009 – 5 PM EST KASTLES STADIUM – WASHINGTON, D.C.

The 2009 Advanta World TeamTennis Finals are coming to the nation's capital for the first time in the League's 34-year history.

The Washington Kastles will host the Advanta WTT Finals on Sunday, July 26, at Kastles Stadium in downtown Washington, D.C. The last time the Advanta WTT Finals was played on the East Coast was in 2004 on the grounds of the US Open in New York.

The 10 co-ed teams in the Advanta WTT
Pro League will be battling for a spot in
the Finals during the 2009 regular season
which runs July 2-22.

The top two teams from the regular season in both the Western and Eastern Conference will advance to the Advanta WTT Conference Championships on Friday, July 24, on the home court of the top-seeded team from each Conference. The Conference Champions face off for the King Trophy, named after League co-founder Billie Jean King, in the Advanta WTT Finals on Sunday, July 26.

2009 WTT COACHES CHALLENGE PRESENTED BY GEICO: **HOW IT WORKS**

Instant replay was introduced to pro tennis competition in 2005 with the WTT Coaches Challenge presented by Geico. The technology, provided by Hawk-Eye, will be featured at select 2009 regular season Advanta WTT Pro League matches as well as the Advanta WTT Finals.

RULES FOR WTT COACHES CHALLENGE PRESENTED BY GEICO

- 1. Each team will receive 2 challenges per event and will receive an additional challenge if the event goes to a tiebreaker. Challenges cannot be carried over from the event to event.
- 2. Teams receive an extra challenge for Overtime. This challenge is added to any remaining challenges from the fifth event.
- 3. Teams receive an extra challenge for the Supertiebreaker. This challenge is added to any remaining challenges from the fifth event and/or Overtime.
- 4. Teams can challenge a call up to and including the final point of the match. Play must be stopped immediately, reflex returns are acceptable.
- 5. A request for a Coaches Challenge of a line call or overrule by a team shall be allowed only on either a point-ending shot or when a player team stops playing the point during a rally (returns are permitted but then the player must immediately stop).

- 6. Challenges must be made within 10 seconds of the conclusion of the point.
- 7. If the challenge results in the call being overturned, the point will either be awarded to the challenging team or a let will be played. The team that challenged the call will not lose a challenge if the challenge is correct and the call is overturned. However, if the call stands, the challenging team will be penalized the loss of one challenge.
- 8. The Box Umpire will conduct all replay reviews on either a court-level monitor or the stadium LED screen. The umpire will review the shot (mark), and make his/her decision. All players not playing in the current event SHALL remain on their bench.
- 9. Once the Box Umpire has made his/her ruling, players will have 30 seconds to start the next point.
- 10. If the review is inconclusive, then the original call on court stands and no challenges will be lost.



BIG RETURNS & DEBUTS

Andre Agassi returns to the League for the first time since 2004. Andre played for the Sacramento Capitals from 2002 to 2004, and this season will play for the Philadelphia Freedoms. Hall of Famer Michael Chang and former world No. 1 Kim Clijsters will make their WTT debuts in 2009. Clijsters will play for the St. Louis Aces, marking her return to professional tennis since her retirement in 2007. Chang will play for the Sacramento Capitals.

NEW VENUES

Two teams move to new venues this season — the 2008 WTT Champion New York Buzz will play at the Univ. at Albany in Albany, and the New York Sportimes move to the new \$15 million Sportime Stadium on Randall's Island. With the move, the Sportimes are the first WTT franchise to play in New York City since 1978. Proceeds from the operation of the NY Sportimes will benefit Randall's Island Sports Foundation and the tens of thousands children it serves every year.

YOUTH IS SERVED

While the average age of the entire New York Buzz squad is only 16, they still aren't the youngest players in the League. That honor goes to Madison Keys, who at 14 years, 5 months, will be the youngest player ever to play in the Advanta WTT Pro League. Keys won her pro tour debut earlier this year.

Tennis legend Martina Navratilova will set two WTT records this summer. Navratilova, the League's oldest player at 52 years, 10 months, returns for a record 20th season as a player.

SHOWCASING AMERICA'S FUTURE

The defending WTT Champion New York Buzz will field World TeamTennis' youngest team ever with a lineup of four up-and-coming American junior prospects, another WTT first. The new-look New York Buzz (shown from left to right below) will be Alex Domijan, 17; Evan King, 17; Christina McHale, 16; and Sloane Stephens, 16. King and McHale recently won the Easter Bowl, a top junior event. In May 2009, Stephens won the Italian Open Grade A junior event. At the helm is USTA National Coach Roger Smith, a World TeamTennis veteran.


