Named one of the “100 Most Important Americans of the 20th Century” by Life magazine and a 2009 recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom, Billie Jean King is also the co-founder of World TeamTennis.

As one of the 20th century’s most respected and influential people, King has long been a champion for social justice and equality. She created new inroads for both genders in and out of sports during her legendary career and she continues to make her mark today.

In 2014, in partnership with Teneo, she launched the Billie Jean King Leadership Initiative to address inclusion and diversity issues in the workplace. In 2016 she addressed both the National Football League and FIFA, the international governing body of soccer, on issues related to gender equality and inclusion.

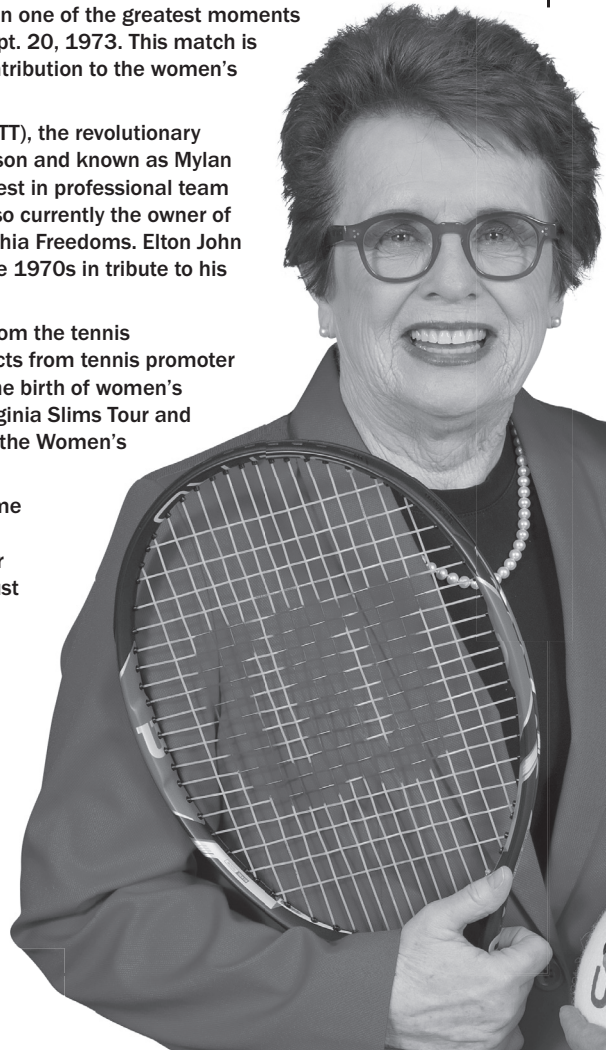
King grew up playing tennis in the California public parks and won 39 Grand Slam titles during her career. She helped form the Virginia Slims Series and founded the Women’s Tennis Association. King defeated Bobby Riggs in one of the greatest moments in sports history – the Battle of the Sexes on Sept. 20, 1973. This match is remembered for its effect on society and its contribution to the women’s movement.

In 1974, King co-founded World TeamTennis (WTT), the revolutionary professional tennis league. Now in its 41st season and known as Mylan World TeamTennis, the league showcases the best in professional team tennis competing for the King Trophy. King is also currently the owner of one of the league’s six franchises, the Philadelphia Freedoms. Elton John wrote the hit song “Philadelphia Freedom” in the 1970s in tribute to his close friend King and her WTT team.

King was one of nine players who broke away from the tennis establishment in 1970 and accepted \$1 contracts from tennis promoter Gladys Heldman in Houston. The revolt led to the birth of women’s professional tennis and the formation of the Virginia Slims Tour and Women’s Tennis Association. She also founded the Women’s Sports Foundation.

In August 2006, the National Tennis Center, home of the US Open, was renamed the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in honor of her accomplishments on and off the court. On August 12, 2009, King was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation’s highest civilian honor. The first female athlete to be honored with the Medal of Freedom, King was presented the award by President Obama in ceremonies at The White House. She was also named to the Presidential Delegation to the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi, Russia.

King serves on the boards of the Women’s Sports Foundation, the Andy Roddick Foundation, the Elton John AIDS Foundation and is a member of the President’s Council on Fitness, Sports and Nutrition.

Ilana Kloss leads Mylan World TeamTennis which showcases the best in professional team tennis competing for the King Trophy, the league's championship trophy named after co-founder Billie Jean King. The league celebrated its milestone 40th season in July 2015, one of only five major pro sports leagues in the U.S. to reach that mark. Kloss heads up strategic planning and the day-to-day efforts to secure sponsorships and grow the team tennis concept both in the U.S. and internationally.

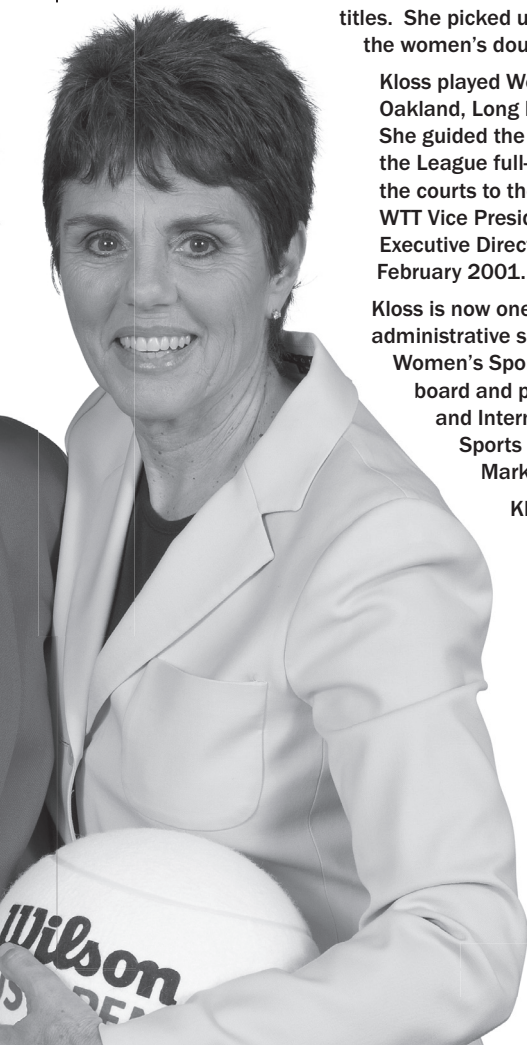
Before her career at WTT, Kloss made her mark as a successful professional athlete. At age 17, she became the youngest No. 1 in South African tennis history. By the time she turned 20, she was the top-ranked doubles player in the world, winning doubles titles at the US Open, Italian Open, U.S. Clay Courts, German Open, British Hard Courts and Hilton Head in 1976. Kloss also added the 1976 French Open Mixed Doubles Championship with Kim Warwick. She also represented South Africa in Fed Cup competition from 1973-77. Kloss won three gold medals at the 1973 Maccabiah Games, capturing the singles, doubles and mixed titles. She picked up her fourth Maccabiah gold medal in 1977, winning the women's doubles.

Kloss played World TeamTennis for several years (San Francisco, Oakland, Long Beach, Miami Beach) before becoming a team coach. She guided the Chicago Fyre to the 1983 WTT title before joining the League full-time as Player Liaison in 1985. The transition from the courts to the office was a smooth one for Kloss who took over as WTT Vice President in 1987 and eventually succeeded King as WTT Executive Director in 1991. Kloss was named CEO/Commissioner in February 2001.

Kloss is now one of the most accomplished women on the administrative side of sports. She is also actively involved in the Women's Sports Foundation (WSF) as a member of the executive board and past WSF board chair. A member of both the National and International Jewish Sports Halls of Fame, she was named Sports Businesswoman of the Year by the Warsaw Sports Marketing Center in 2007.

Kloss was elected to the International Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and was inducted during the Maccabiah Games in July 2013. In September 2010, Kloss was honored by the U.S. International Club (USIC) with the Sarah Palfrey Danzig Award for her contributions as a player and administrator. She was also recognized as a Gamechanger in October 2011 by Sports Business Journal as one of the top women in sports business.

Kloss serves on the executive boards of the Elton John AIDS Foundation, Billie Jean King WTT Charities and the Tennis Industry Association. She is also a co-founder of the Billie Jean King Leadership Initiative.

He also provides support in areas of marketing, player relations and intern management. Fitzgerald was previously a web editor for the ATP World Tour and contributing writer to USOpen.org. Fitzgerald graduated from Stetson University in 2010 with a B.B.A. in General Business, with minors in Marketing and Sport Management.



BRYAN HICKS, Director of Officiating

Bryan joined WTT in February 2006. He oversees the officiating department including rules, regulations and statistics, and also assists with onsite operations. Hicks joined WTT after working for the Atlantic Hockey League for four years, where he was the Assistant to the Director of Hockey Operations. Hicks graduated from Neumann College with a B.S. in Sport Management and a M.A. in Education.

Natalee joined Mylan WTT in 2012 after interning in the New York headquarters office for more than a year. X TEAMTENNIS HIGH SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Think WTT with a quick and exciting twist. The X TeamTennis format features one boy and one girl, who plays for their high school team, competing in three sets - boy's and girls singles and mixed doubles. East Coast and West Coast national events are played in conjunction with Mylan WTT matches where the kids get the opportunity to watch the pros!



WTT JUNIOR NATIONALS

This tournament, hosted by WTT co-founder Billie Jean King, is a national junior tournament event featuring 16 coed teams from across the U.S. The event is held every July at the George E. Barnes Tennis Center in San Diego.

The next generation is playing the WTT format with TeamTennis Circuit Events for ages 10 & Under and 12 & Under boys and girls.

BUSINESS LEADERS TAKE CENTER COURT

From the start, Mylan World TeamTennis has been an innovative sports league promoting inclusivity and equality between men and women. To make it happen and thrive over the course of the league's 41 seasons, WTT has been driven by more than a few savvy business people, including one who has been involved from day one.

Billie Jean King has invested in tennis since the beginning – from tournament ownership to industry media to emerging technology. But her heart, passion and energy lie the greatest with the league she co-founded, Mylan WTT, and its mission.

"It's about the fans who come out to watch but more importantly it's also about making a difference every day in the community," said King. "We have entrepreneurs that are owners in Mylan World TeamTennis that I think have that spirit."

Enter Mark Ein, the founder of Venturehouse Group, who has tirelessly cultivated a winning brand with the Washington Kastles in their first eight seasons. His commitment to excellence has led to five consecutive championships (and six overall), but for Ein, the franchise's value extends far beyond the wins and losses.

"I think World TeamTennis ownership is the single most undervalued sports ownership opportunity in the United States," said Ein. "What means the most to me is when I get stopped in my community which happens all the time, sometimes virtually every day where someone tells me they love the team, their kids love the team, some of their best memories over the summer are coming to a Kastles match, a player telling me their highlight of the year is playing for the Kastles. That's rewarding in a way that money can't buy ... but it means that what we're doing has real value and I think that's ultimately how we build and grow franchise value."

The Springfield Lasers' business model is a unique public-private partnership with local businessmen Harry and John Cooper who bought and donated the franchise to the City of

Springfield in 1996. Operated publicly by the Springfield-Greene County Park Board, the Lasers are the longest-standing franchise with 20 seasons in the books. While a King Trophy is the ultimate on-court goal, Owner Representative Bob Belote is quick to point out the alternative measure of success.

“We’re bringing in John Isner again and the kids can see a top 15 pro right there in their backyard and then pick up a racquet, go out and play, enroll in our programs and really emulate the very best in World TeamTennis,” explained Belote. “At the end of the day, we really do want a product out there that represents our community well, the Cooper family well, and ultimately the sport of tennis well too.”

Hop out on a flight out west and you’ll find San Diego Aviators owner Fred Luddy nodding in agreement with Belote. Luddy, who founded ServiceNow and currently acts as the company’s Chief Product Officer, declares WTT fans “get to see phenomenal athletes performing at their best in a very, very intimate venue. So bringing tennis to lots of people who couldn’t otherwise get to tennis was very important to me.”

Luddy’s attraction to WTT dates back to his days as a 12-year-old, when he was first exposed to the fan-friendly setting. Like in any business venture, Luddy’s goal is to ‘leave it all out on the field’ and he finds that in common with the current set of owners. “We all share this passion for making this thing the best product it can be.”

The relationships fostered through being involved with Mylan WTT are a takeaway that excites FastForward Innovations CEO Lorne Abony, owner of the Orange County Breakers. Abony, an entrepreneur who also co-founded two education technology companies Vemo Education and Schoold, said, “I have forged real, real friendships and real relationships both business-related to WTT and external relationships ... it’s one of the great things about owning a WTT franchise and, frankly, it’s probably one of the best kept secrets in sport generally.”

A dynamic personality in any room, Abony’s vivacity hits its highest point when it comes to winning on a tennis court. Last year, his team in Austin had the best regular season record, but were outdueled by the Kastles in the Mylan WTT Finals. The franchise relocated to Orange County for 2016.

“Our DNA is wired such that we all care deeply about winning and being competitive,” said Abony. “I think that all of us also appreciate that there’s a balance in life and winning is one component of the overall social good.”

This season, Mylan WTT is back in the Big Apple with the New York Empire. Michael Coakley, a member of the franchise’s ownership group which includes several successful New York area business leaders, understands the expectations of the New York sports fan. “The marketplace demands that we have a winning team and everyone in this city expects to win.”

Still for Coakley, a senior vice president for a global consulting firm, year one’s overall focus remains at the grassroots level. “What’s exciting about the Empire is that we are focused on creating a great team brand and bringing professional team tennis back to the New York market,” said Coakley. “We’re really interested in creating a franchise the whole community will get behind.”

For Mylan WTT CEO/Commissioner Ilana Kloss, tennis has also been her life’s work as both a top-class athlete and businesswoman. Kloss has led WTT to some of its biggest sponsorship deals over the years, including Wilson, Domino’s Pizza, Tyco, Advanta, and, most recently, global pharmaceuticals leader Mylan.

The former world No. 1 in doubles has also been at the helm during many of the league’s innovations. “WTT has always been known as the think tank and innovator of our sport,” Kloss said. “A lot of tournaments have adapted what we were doing ... whether it’s colored-branded courts, hitting balls into the stands and being able to keep them, names on the backs of jerseys for team competition. All of those started in WTT, so we’re really proud that we’ve been able to push the sport into trying new things.”

GLOSSARY

IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

Each summer, Mylan WTT takes center stage in professional tennis. Some of the world's best men and women team up to play singles, doubles and mixed doubles in an exciting and unique professional team tennis competition. Here are key terms to know about the Mylan WTT experience.

| THE TEAMS |

Draft

Team rosters are determined through the Mylan WTT Player Draft held in March. The Marquee rounds include some of the biggest names in tennis who typically play a limited schedule. There are four or five rounds to select Mylan WTT roster players. Teams draft in reverse order of the previous year's final team standings (including playoffs), based on overall match won/loss record. Returning franchises have the right to protect players from the previous year's roster.

Six teams will compete during the 2016 season:

New York Empire
Orange County Breakers
Philadelphia Freedoms
San Diego Aviators
Springfield Lasers
Washington Kastles

| THE SCHEDULE |

Regular Season

Each of the teams will play 12 regular season matches - six home, six away.

Post-season

The 2016 Mylan WTT Finals presented by Citi will be Friday, August 26, at The West Side Tennis Club in Forest Hills, N.Y.

Season/Playoff Qualification

For all players other than marquee, a season is defined as either (a) playing in three (3) matches for one team, or (b) playing a total of four (4) matches in one season regardless of the number of teams. To be eligible for Bonus Money or Awards they must appear on the roster for 75% of a team's matches (9 of 12). See page 24 for Bonus Incentives.

All players must participate on their team for three matches during the regular season to qualify for participation in the Mylan WTT Finals presented by Citi.

| ON THE COURT |

Fan Experience

Fan participation is an important part of any Mylan WTT match. Crowds are encouraged to be vocal about great play (while still being respectful of all players) and are allowed to enter/exit the stadium during play without having to wait for a changeover. Often between games, music is played or a DJ fires up the crowd.

Match

A match is a contest between two Mylan WTT teams, consisting of five sets plus Extended Play (if any) and a Supertiebreaker (if necessary). The sets are men's and women's singles, men's and women's doubles and mixed doubles.

Match Order

The home team coach determines the order of sets and turns in the lineup to the head umpire one hour before match start time. Every match includes a halftime break – either after the second or third set.

Officials

Seven roving linespersons and a head umpire comprise the officials at a Mylan WTT match. The head umpire is in charge. His/her decisions are final.

Service Clock

The on-court service clock counts down 25 seconds from the end of a point to the next serve. The first time violation per set is a warning, and additional violations will result in the loss of first service or point penalties.

GLOSSARY

| SCORING |

Keeping Score

- Scoring is no-ad (the first team to win four points wins the game). Game scoring is 1, 2, 3, game.
- All games, sets and Supertiebreakers are won by a margin of one point.
- Each game counts as one point in the team's cumulative match score.
- The receiver has the choice from which side he/she will receive serve should the game reach three points each. In mixed doubles, the serve is always gender-to-gender at 3-3.
- Teams change sides after every four games.
- Let serves are played.

Extended Play

In Mylan WTT matches - every point matters, every game counts. That is never more evident than in Extended Play (formerly Overtime). If the team ahead in the cumulative score wins the final game of the last set, then that team is the winner. If, however, the trailing team wins the final set, the match is sent into Extended Play and continues until a) the leading team wins one game, or b) the trailing team ties the match score. If the score becomes tied, the match is decided by a Supertiebreaker.

Set

The first team to reach five games wins a set. If the set is tied at 4-4, a 9-point tiebreaker is played.

Supertiebreaker

If the match is tied at the conclusion of five sets OR if the trailing team ties the score in Extended Play, a 13-point Supertiebreaker, involving the same fifth set, decides the outcome of the entire match. A coin toss determines the choice of side, server and receiver. Players change sides after six points. The first team to win seven points is awarded a single game and the match.

Tiebreaker

If a set reaches 4-4, a 9-point tiebreaker is played to decide the winner of the set. The first team to reach five points wins the tiebreaker. Players change sides after four points. The tiebreaker counts as one game and decides the outcome of the set.

Substitution

A coach may substitute one player, per set, per gender at the conclusion of a point. If a player is substituted, he/she may not return to the match during that set.

Team

Each team has a coach and four players; two men and two women (five or more players if there are marquee or Wildcard players on the team). Players are permitted to play in a maximum of three sets per match.

Timeouts

As with other professional league team sports, Mylan WTT features the use of GEICO Timeouts during match play. Each team will be allotted two timeouts per set with an additional timeout being awarded to each team if a match goes into Extended Play. GEICO Timeouts will be twenty (:20) seconds in length and do not carry over between sets. Only the coach may call a timeout. Coaches or players may enter the court area during these breaks in action.



BACK IN THE BIG APPLE

Mylan WTT returns to New York City with the New York Empire, a new franchise coached by Patrick McEnroe and featuring Andy Roddick as a marquee player. The Empire will bring professional tennis back to one of the sport's most historic venues, Forest Hills Stadium at The West Side Tennis Club.



GRAF, HINGIS HIGHLIGHT 30th SEASON

WTT celebrates its 30th

anniversary and introduces Instant replay to professional tennis competition. Stefanie Graf makes her return to pro tennis for the first time since 1999 to play WTT. Martina Hingis makes her WTT debut and leads the New York Sportimes to their first title. Hingis lost only one set during the 2005 season and was named MVP of the WTT Finals. Her WTT performance spurred the tennis great to make a successful return to the WTA Tour.



NEW PARTNERS

Mylan, one of the world's leading generics and specialty pharmaceutical companies, and World TeamTennis announced a

three-year agreement whereby Mylan will serve as the title sponsor of WTT, which was renamed Mylan World TeamTennis beginning in 2013. Andy Roddick and Venus Williams join the World TeamTennis ownership group in May 2013.

TURNING 40

World TeamTennis becomes only the fifth U.S. pro sports league to reach the 40th season milestone, joining the National Football League, National Basketball Association, National Hockey League and Major League Baseball.



NAVRATILOVA TURNS 20

Martina Navratilova, playing for the Boston Lobsters in 2009, becomes first player to play 20 seasons in WTT. Kim Clijsters comes out of retirement and

makes her WTT debut for St. Louis in July 2009. Less than two months later, she returns to the pro tour and stuns the sports world by winning the US Open title.



THE KASTLES ERA

In 2011, the Washington Kastles completed the first undefeated season in WTT history (16-0), and won their 2nd WTT Championship with a victory over St. Louis Aces.

One year later, the Kastles did it again. Led by Venus Williams, Washington edged Sacramento in the 2012 Finals to complete their second undefeated season and hoist the King Trophy for the third time in franchise history.

Before winning their 3rd consecutive and 4th overall championship in 2013, the Kastles became the first league champion to be invited to the White House to meet with the President.

Washington also rewrote the sports record books during the 2013 season by setting the mark of 34 consecutive wins (2011-2013), the longest streak in major pro sports league history. The previous mark of 33 consecutive wins was held by the NBA's 1971-72 Lakers.

In 2015, the Kastles set a league record of five consecutive championship titles (2011-15) surpassing the record they shared with the Sacramento Capitals (1997-2000).



4-PEAT & ANDY IS A HIT

Sacramento had an

unprecedented four-peat, winning the title from 1997 to 2000. Seven years later, the Capitals becomes the first team in WTT history to win six championships with the 2007 title. A 17-year-old Andy Roddick breaks onto the pro scene and makes his WTT debut playing a full season for the Idaho Sneakers.

A NEW NAME

In line with the growing global popularity of the sport, the professional league is rebranded from TeamTennis to World TeamTennis.

TEAMTENNIS

Following a brief hiatus, the league returns as TeamTennis

FIRST SET

World TeamTennis, which was founded by Billie Jean King, Larry King, Fred Barman, Jordon Kaiser, Dennis Murphy and Frank Fuhrer, debuts as the inaugural season introduces professional team tennis competition to the sports landscape.

Based on a concept of gender equity, WTT is also the first professional sports league to feature men and women on the same team. It is also the debut of WTT's unique multi-colored court.

The Denver Racquets defeat the Philadelphia Freedoms to win the first championship. League co-founder Billie Jean King is named as the League's first MVP and is also the first woman to coach a team with male pros as the player-coach of the Freedoms.

Among the first team owners was the Los Angeles Strings' Jerry Buss, who went on to own the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers. His daughter Jeanie became the team GM in 1981. Robert Kraft, current owner of the NFL's New England Patriots, became owner of the Boston Lobsters in 1975.

On May 6, 1974, the first World TeamTennis match was played when the Philadelphia Freedoms hosted the Pittsburgh Triangles at the Spectrum. Philadelphia won 31-25.

On May 9, 1974, WTT becomes the first regularly scheduled tennis serves coverage on HBO when the New York Sets take on the Pittsburgh Triangles.

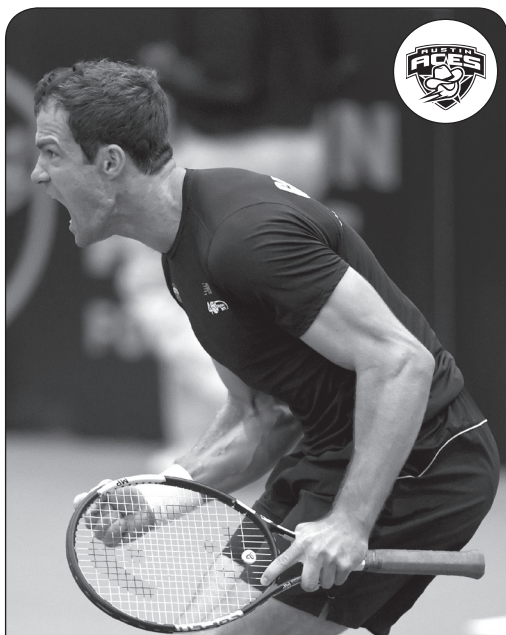

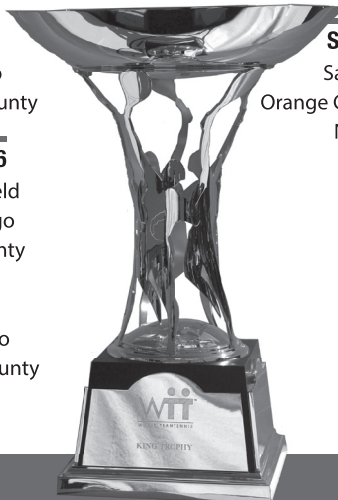

Mylan WTT to Debut at Forest Hills

The 2016 season will see the debut of Mylan World TeamTennis at one of tennis' most historic venues – The West Side Tennis Club in Forest Hills, N.Y.

On 62 occasions, Forest Hills Stadium played host to the US Nationals/Open Tennis Championships. Into its home, it welcomed countless champions who narrated their stories – from Pancho Gonzales and Althea Gibson to Rod Laver and Billie Jean King. It's hosted a record 11 Davis Cup ties in the United States. And it provided a stage for iconic singers such as The Beatles, Barbra Streisand and Jimi Hendrix. Its walls were full of music until the 1990s, when for nearly 20 years, there were only sounds of silence.

The site was resurrected in 2013, when doors opened to a Mumford & Sons concert. Slowly, but surely, harmony was restored with the music scene, though it is in 2016 where Forest Hills Stadium truly feels at home again. The New York Empire, a Mylan World TeamTennis franchise, debuts this summer, bringing professional tennis back to the West Side Tennis Club... with a reverb. Replacing the grass and clay courts at the

former home of the US Open is WTT's trademark multi-colored court. Forty years ago, Jimmy Connors was the headliner. Today, Andy Roddick leads the stars coming to town.

"As both a player and an owner I have always enjoyed all that encompasses Mylan WTT," said Roddick. "To be able to play on the legendary courts at Forest Hills and be involved with a team in a city that I love, New York, will make this even more special."

Among others, Roddick joins New Jersey native Christina McHale, the top roster player selection this year, and reunites with Patrick McEnroe, his former Davis Cup captain. Like Roddick, for McEnroe, being involved with bridging the tennis history at Forest Hills and WTT's innovative product is an opportunity he could not pass up.

"There are few more beautiful places to play tennis than Forest Hills, and it's great to help bring professional tennis back to the facility for the 2016 Mylan WTT season," McEnroe said. "Fans will love the exciting, competitive team play so we hope they will come out and support the Empire. New Yorkers love their championship teams and our goal in year one is to win it all."

Finishing on top will not be an easy feat for the Empire. McEnroe and company are tasked with attempting to solve the seemingly unsolvable puzzle over the past five seasons: the Washington Kastles. Washington seeks a record-breaking seventh overall King Trophy this year and returns the core of its 2015 championship team, highlighted by Martina Hingis and team captain Leander Paes.

Welcome Back, Caro!

Former world No. 1 Caroline Wozniacki returns to play for the first time in a decade. The two-time US Open finalist, who will suit up for the Philadelphia Freedoms, first played in 2006 when, after winning the Wimbledon girls' singles title, celebrated her birthday on a flight to her very first Mylan WTT match. "It was great," said Wozniacki earlier this year. "I actually flew on my 16th birthday. So I had my sweet 16 on the plane. I had actually just won Wimbledon Juniors and then I came in and had a lot of confidence, played really well, played some good matches. I met Bob and Mike (Bryan) and became really close with them, especially over the years since then we've just gotten really closer and closer."

Philadelphia Freedoms: Hitting the Right Notes

Few teams in pro sports have the musical history of the Philadelphia Freedoms.

Just weeks before her Battle of the Sexes showdown in 1973, Billie Jean King and Elton John met at a party in Los Angeles.

Elton, an avid tennis fan who often sat on the team bench during matches, told Billie Jean that he wanted to write a song for her and her WTT team. He debuted the rough cut of the song during the 1974 WTT playoffs, huddling around the Freedoms locker room as the team listened to it on a cassette player. The rest was musical history as the song 'Philadelphia Freedom' climbed to the top spot after it was released in 1975. It's been an iconic anthem for the city of Philadelphia ever since.

King and John's friendship also resulted in their annual charity tennis event, WTT Smash Hits, which has raised more than \$14 million for the Elton John AIDS Foundation and local AIDS charities since 1992.

On the court, the first season for the Freedoms wasn't as successful as their musical legacy. The team lost in the finals to the Denver Racquets, and then a new ownership group, led by Robert Kraft, moved the team from Philadelphia to Boston for the 1975 season. King was also traded to the New York Sets, and it wasn't until 2001 that she and the team would return to the City of Brotherly Love.

This time King was back as the owner, and the newly-reformed Freedoms, led by doubles greats Lisa Raymond and Rennae Stubbs, won the 2001 WTT title in their first season back. Other members of that first championship team were Jimmy Connors, David Di Lucia, Don Johnson and coach Raja Chaudhuri.

Raymond, a local favorite from nearby Wayne, Pa., and Stubbs were joined by Daniel Nestor, Venus Williams, Jaymon Crabb, Casey Dellacqua, Frederic Niemeyer and coach Craig Kardon to help the Freedoms capture their second championship in 2006.

The Freedoms (pictured at right) haven't advanced to the Championship match since 2006, but King thinks this year's team might just hit the right notes.

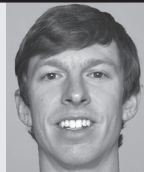

THE KASTLES DYNASTY

In just nine years, the Washington Kastles have not only established a dynasty in Mylan WTT, they have also broken records across all U.S. pro sports leagues. The Kastles have been the standard bearer for excellence in Mylan WTT action in recent years, aka "The Kastles Era".

2009

Won first WTT championship title, edging the Springfield Lasers in a thriller in the nation's capital, 23-20.

2011

Completed the first undefeated season in WTT history (16-0), and won 2nd WTT Championship with a 23-19 victory over St. Louis Aces.

2012

The Kastles did it again one year later, this time in Charleston, S.C. It all came down to women's singles where WTT stalwart Venus Williams topped Sacramento's CoCo Vandeweghe to give Washington their third title with a 20-19 victory to complete their second undefeated season and hoist the King Trophy for the third time in franchise history.

2013

Another season of firsts. Before winning their 3rd consecutive and 4th overall championship in 2013 with a 25-12 win over Springfield, the Kastles became the first league champion to be invited to the White House to meet with President Obama. Washington also rewrote the sports record books during the 2013 season by setting the mark of 34 consecutive wins (2011-2013), the longest streak in major pro sports league history. The previous mark of 33 consecutive wins was held by the NBA's 1971-72 Lakers.

2014

Washington and Springfield met again in the 2014 Finals but there Kastles were again too strong for the Lasers, capturing their 4th straight title with a 25-13 win.

2015

With a 24-18 victory over the Austin Aces, the Kastles set a league record of five consecutive championship titles (2011-15) surpassing the record they shared with the Sacramento Capitals (1997-2000).
