### INVADERS HOST HIGH-SCORING GAMBLERS ON MARCH 10

Going against the USFL's most potent offense--that of the Houston Gamblers--will provide a stern test for Head Coach Charlie Sumner's Oakland Invaders this Sunday,

March 10, at the Oakland Coliseum. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. PST.

The Gamblers (2-0) and Invaders (1-0-1) will be playing for first place in the USFL's Western Conference. Last week, the Invaders and Baltimore Stars played to a 17-17 tie, the first tie in USFL history, while the Gamblers breezed past the Tampa Bay Bandits, 50-28.

Houston's Run 'N' Shoot offense features quarterback Jim Kelly, the 1984 USFL Most Valuable Player. Kelly threw for 4 touchdowns against the Bandits following an opening-day game that saw him throw for a record 574 yards in a 34-33 win over Los Angeles.

"We're going to have our hands full, that's for sure," Sumner said. "We'll pretty much do the same things defensively that we did against Denver [another team using the Run 'N' Shoot] and hope we can keep the ball away from their offense."

What looks to be an emotional battle for first place will be hard-pressed to equal the swing of emotions during last Sunday's game against the Stars. After trailing the Stars, 17-0, late in the third quarter, Oakland's offense came alive when quarterback Bobby Hebert hit wide receiver Gordon Banks with a 48-yard TD pass on the quarter's last play. The ensuing kickoff resulted in a fumble recovered by Oakland's Carl Sullivan, with the result being a 40-yard field goal by Novo Bojovic to close the gap to 17-10.

Later in the fourth quarter, the game appeared to be over when the Stars stopped the Invaders at the 3-yard line with 1:51 left. But Oakland got the ball with :32 left and drove from its 41-yard line to the Baltimore 18-yard line with :05 left.

Anthony Carter, one of the most exciting receivers in football, then caught the game-tying touchdown pass on a short post pattern, forcing the game into overtime.

Oakland's third overtime game in its history saw both teams with opportunities to win but Baltimore's 48-yard field goal attempt by David Trout was short and Bojovic's 48-yard attempt was blocked.

Following the game, Sumner's comments revealed how difficult it is to assess one's emotions following a tie game: "I'm really disappointed. I'm proud of the way we fought back. It's a tough feeling. I'll be prouder tomorrow, but I'm a little down now."

The Gamblers lead the series, 1-0. On April 16, 1984, the visiting Gamblers came from a 20-0 deficit to beat the Invaders, 35-27. Oakland's defense had 4 interceptions, but Kelly still completed 25 of 40 passes for 304 yards. Houston had 504 total net yards and also had 30 first downs.
