GAME NOTES: TEA MEN vs. COSMOS APRIL 10, 1982

Fresh off a convincing 3-1 victory last Saturday night over the Ft. Lauderdale Strikers at the Gator Bowl, the Tea Men will be looking to keep their undefeated streak alive tonight as they battle four-time NASL champion New York Cosmos. The Cosmos will host the Tea Men on May 2nd in their only other confrontation this year.

Tonight's match is the Cosmos' season opener and the first chance for the league's all-time scoring leader, Giorgio Chinaglia to reach another milestone, scoring his 200th NASL career goal. The 35-year-old superstar has tallied 155 regular season goals and 44 playoff goals in his six year tenure. If this "Super Feat" is accomplished, the match will be temporarily halted to honor #9.

THE SERIES...IS IT A JINX, OR JUST HARD WORK?

By now, everyone is aware of the stronghold the Tea Men have over the Cosmos. The Teas have won seven straight, taking three of their last outdoor games and four during the indoor season last year. The three outdoor victories have ended in identical 2-1 scores. Tea Men goal scorers last season were Alan Green, Eddie Marasco and Jorge Berrio. Ringo Cantillo leads the team in assists with two. For New York, none other than Giorgio Chinaglia was responsible for both goals.

The Teas' uncanny ability to defeat the Cosmos certainly qualifies as a jinx, but many members of the Tea Men feel it is alot more than that. "We respect the Cosmos, and make them work for every ball," stated Cantillo yesterday. "We try to allow them as little space as possible. We work hard and our efforts have brought results."

CANTWELL'S QUIPS

"The Cosmos have been the glamour team of the NASL over the years and it's always exciting to play against them. Players like Chinaglia, Neeskens, Alberto and Birkenmeier are all world-class performers. This is a critical game for us so we can take a 2-0 record on the road next week. We'll simply play our usual game of hustle and hard work. We know how to beat them, so now it's only a question of execution. Tonight, it will be what we will do, not what the Cosmos do that will determine the outcome of the match."
