PORTLAND FACES LA EXPRESS IN CRUCIAL WESTERN CONFERENCE BATTLE

Portland Breakers vs. LA Express

DATE: Saturday, April 27, 1985

BROADCAST: KEX Radio 1190AM

PLACE: Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum (70,078)

This Week Portland travels to Los Angeles for its third consecutive road game. The Breakers began their three-game journey at New Jersey on April 14, and played on the 21st at Baltimore.

The Breakers are 3-6 on the season following two losses to Eastern Conference foes. New Jersey beat Portland 34-7, while Baltimore edged the Breakers, 26-17.

Los Angeles is 2-7 this season and is coming off a stinging loss to Western Conference leader Denver, 51-0. The Express has defeated the powerful Houston Gamblers (18-17) and San Antonio (38-7).

Portland will put its Saturday night winning streak on the line this week. All three Breaker wins have come on Saturday night's this season. Portland will also be looking for its first road win.

BIG PLAYS SPELL DEFEAT FOR BREAKERS AGAINST BALTIMORE, 26-17

Last Week Take away two big plays that went in Baltimore's favor Sunday and Portland would have had its first road victory of 1985. A 50-yard interception return and an 82-yard touchdown run by RB Kelvin Bryant put the Stars ahead 14-0 with just 7:30 expired in the 1st quarter.

Portland trailed 17-0 when QB Matt Robinson hooked up with WR Frank Lockett on an 85-yard scoring toss. Lockett took the throw in stride at midfield and out-ran the Star secondary into the end zone. Baltimore managed a field goal late in the 2nd quarter and the half ended with the Stars leading, 20-7.

Bryant scored his second TD early in the 3rd quarter to give the Stars a 26-7 advantage, but Portland battled back. Robinson tossed a four-yard TD to TE David Bayle with 3:28 to go in the 3rd, bringing the Breakers within two touchdowns of Baltimore.

The only points scored in the final period came with 8:19 remaining on a beautiful 43-yard field goal by Tim Mazzetti. Mazzetti, who is nearly recovered from a nagging groin injury, was perfect on Sunday with 2 of 2 PATs and 1 of 1 FG attempts. Punter Jeff Gossett kicked 5 times for a 49.4 average and put two inside the 20 yard line.

Lockett was the game's leading receiver with 4 catches for 139 yards. Dino Hall (3-14) and Anthony Allen (2-19) added to the receiving numbers. Robinson was 13 of 32 with two TDs but threw four interceptions. Portland played without starting OT Dan Hurley and NT Jearld Baylis. LB Howard McAdoo also missed the contest.

Defensively Portland was led by NT Jeff Merrell, who filled in for Baylis. Merrell tallied eight tackles. DE Kenny Neil and DE Robert Brannon each recorded QB sacks. The game also marked the return to action of LB Marcus Marek, the team's leading stopper the past two seasons. Marek was injured in the season opener at Arizona and hadn't played until Sunday. He managed 6 tackles against the Stars.



BREAKERS VS. EXPRESS

Portland and Los Angeles will kickoff the second half of the 1985 USFL season at the LA Coliseum in a 5 p.m. showdown. It marks the first time this year that the Breakers will tangle with an opponent that they have already played. Portland hosted Los Angeles in their home opener on March 2, in a wild affair that the Breakers won 14-10. Portland's record at the halfway point is 3-6, while the Express sits at the bottom of the Western Conference at 2-7.

THE SERIES The Breakers-Express series is knotted at 1-1. Los Angeles defeated the Breakers in Boston in 1983, by the narrow margin of 23-20. In that contest, the Express battled back from a 20-16 deficit in the Coliseum, as Mike Rae found Kris Haines in the end zone with a six-yard scoring strike in the final seconds to steal the win. In the game played earlier this season, the Breakers debuted in front of their new fans in Portland, and came away with a wild 14-10 victory in front of 25,232 at Civic Stadium. Buford Jordan rambled for 110 yards on 17 carries, including the go-ahead score on the first play of the fourth quarter. The Express mounted four drives in the final frame and the last ditch effort by Steve Young and company ended at the Breaker four-yard line as time ran out.

THE COACHES Breaker Head Coach Dick Coury's record in the USFL is 22-23. The 1983 USFL Coach of the Year is in his third season as the Breaker mentor, having been with the club since its' inception. He began his career in professional football as an assistant with the Denver Broncos under John Ralston, the Denver head coach during the 1972 and 1973 seasons, and now the president of the Breakers. Coury journeyed to Portland after his stint in Denver, to coach the Portland Storm of the World Football League. He spent five seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles (1976-81), helping the Eagles to the Super Bowl in 1981. Coury has also coached at the collegiate level, inaugurating the program at Cal State Fullerton, while also assisting at USC under John McKay. A native of Athens, Ohio, Coury is a 1951 graduate of Notre Dame.

Express Head Coach John Hadl battled through at baptism of fire as a rookie coach last season, working with a mostly rookie squad as he became more of a teacher than a pro coach. Yet, he took the Express to a 10-8 record and the Pacific Division championship before bowing to Arizona in the Western Conference title game. Hadl's head coaching record now stands at 12-15. Hadl is best known for his on-field duty as a quarterback, spending 16 years behind the center for the San Diego Chargers, Los Angeles Rams, Green Bay Packers and Houston Oilers. The 44-year old Hadl led San Diego to three Western Division titles (1963-64-65) while taking the Chargers to the AFL championship in 1963.

THE PLAYERS Two players with strong Oregon roots are vital cogs in the Express offense, and have been hampered by injuries of late. Gary Zimmerman (Oregon) and Jeff Hart (Oregon State) are important starters in the LA offensive front, but Hart has been sidelined with a knee injury, while Zimmerman has been slowed with a bad shoulder. . . . Express quarterback Young saw limited action in last week's 51-0 loss to Denver, hitting on 5 of 10 passes for 63 yards with one interception. He is still recovering from an injured knee, and will be listed as questionable this week. . . . Portland's Buford Jordan carried the ball four times for 10 yards against Baltimore, and will again be in the "questionable" category this week with that strained hamstring. . . . Breaker wide receiver Anthony Allen will be making a return trip home of sorts at the LA Coliseum. Allen played with the Express in 1984, hauling down 14 passes for 234 yards.

BROADCAST KEX Radio 1190 AM will broadcast the game live, Saturday, April 27, with the pre-game show beginning at 4:30 p.m. The veteran Ray Scott and Greg Barton will call the action.
