2010 IN REVIEW

The Boston Breakers take the field for their third WPS season. After finishing 2009 with a 9-7-4 record and missing out on the playoffs by one game, the Breakers didn't miss out on their chance to reach the playoffs in 2010. The Boston Breakers finished the season in second place in the WPS table after making one of the greatest midseason turnarounds in WPS history. Following a 2-1 win over the Washington Freedom to start the season, the Breakers went 0-5-4 in their next nine games. Then, sparked by a 2-1 win over the then second-place Philadelphia Independence on July 4th, the Breakers put together three straight victories and a streak of 9-2-1 over their next 12 games. In the WPS Super Semifinal against the Philadelphia Independence, Lauren Cheney opened the scoring off an assist from Kristine Lilly in the 22nd minute. Philadelphia tied it when Caroline Seger slotted the equalizer past Alyssa Naeher in the 29th minute. After a grueling 90 minutes, the teams went to overtime, where the Breakers were stunned by a goal in the 103rd minute by Danesha Adams. The Breakers ended the year with a 10-9-6 record. Kelly Smith led the team in scoring for a second straight year with 11 goals, good enough for fourth best in WPS.

SCOUTING ATLANTA

The Beat have a whole new look in 2011. Only three players return from last year's team that finished with a 5-13-6 record. The Beat lost starting keeper Hope Solo, Tina Ellertson, Kia McNeill, Carolyn Blank, McCall Zerboni, and Leigh Ann Robinson to free agency. Swiss international Ramona Bachmann returned to play for her previous club, Umea IK, in Sweden. But perhaps the biggest gap the Beat have to fill this season is their attacking front. They traded English international Eniola Aluko and U.S. Women's National Team midfielder Tobin Heath to Sky Blue FC. The Beat did, however, make a few big moves of their own, bringing in U.S. Women's National Team midfielder Carli Lloyd and veteran WPS defenders Cat Whitehill and Heather Mitts. The three players the Beat retained also bring a lot to the field. This group includes midfielder Lori Chalupny, forward Lauren Sesselmann, and goalkeeper Allison Whitworth.

New ARRIVALS

This year's Breakers roster features a number of new faces.

- In the 2011 WPS General Draft, held in January at the NSCAA Convention in Baltimore, the Breakers selected University of Portland standout midfielder **Keelin Winters** with their first pick (sixth overall). Winters' college teammate **Elli Reed**, was selected eighth overall by the Western New York Flash, but was released by the Flash during the preseason. Two days later, Reed signed as a free agent with the Breakers.
- The Breakers did extremely well in the free agent market. They signed U.S.
 Women's National Team co-captain, defender Rachel Buehler, and her fellow U.S. teammate Kelley O'Hara. Both Buehler and O'Hara played for the 2010 WPS Champions FC Gold Pride.
 - In addition to Buehler and O'Hara, the Breakers signed former Chicago Red Stars forward and University of North Carolina standout **Nikki Washington** as well as Washington's former Red Stars teammate, keeper **Kelsey Davis**.
- Katie Schoepfer, the former Sky Blue FC forward and Penn State All-American, signed as a free agent during preseason camp.
