COSMOS @ SOUNDERS  
2-2-2

SEATTLE HOPES TO TAKE A BITE OUT OF THE BIG APPLE tonight, as the Sounders meet the Cosmos for the first time in league play since Soccer Bowl '82. Last season's championship match marked the second time the two teams battled for the league title, and the likewise, the second time the Cosmos earned the championship by beating the Sounders with a one-goal difference. In the 1977 final, Steve Hunt and Giorgio Chinaglia scored for New York, and Tommy Ord tallied for Seattle. 1983's 1-0 title game saw Chinaglia get the game-winner again, clinching the championship at the 30th minute of the game. The all-time series record in NASL play shows the Cosmos with a rather commanding 9-4 advantage over the Sounders. But in games played in Seattle, the Sounders hold a 3-2 edge. The most recent victory over the Cosmos was 1982's second regular-season meeting, when Steve Daley, Peter Ward and Ray Evans scored for Seattle in the 3-2 decision. Roberto Cabanas scored both of New York's goals in that August 4th game. When the Sounders travelled to New York in June, the 20th to be exact, the Cosmos kicked off the '82 home-and-home series with a 3-2 win, on goals by Chico Borja, Steve Moyers and Chinaglia; the Sounders' pair of goals were courtesy of Mark Peterson and Jeff Stock. Just less than a month ago, Seattle and New York faced off in a pre-season game at Portland's Civic Stadium. Chinaglia's penalty kick early in the second half proved to be the game-winner in the 2-0 New York win, with Romero adding the insurance goal at 64:06 on a header from a Vladislav Bogicevic pass.

SPORTING A 1-2 RECORD AND LOOKING FOR THEIR FIRST goal and first win at home, the Sounders will be meeting a Cosmos squad that has yet to win on the road. Seattle's pair of 0-1 Kingdome losses (to Team America 4/23 in the shootout, and to Vancouver 5/7), plus the 2-0 victory over the Strikers (in Fort Lauderdale 4/30), is highlighted by the fact the Sounders have yielded but one goal in regulation time over three games. The Cosmos, with a 2-2 record that's split with home wins and road losses, have allowed eight goals, and scored 11. New York's road record includes a 1-2 loss in Toronto and a 1-4 loss in Fort Lauderdale. Chinaglia scored both goals in opponents' territories.

FIVE-TIME NASL CHAMPION NEW YORK currently boasts four players in the top-ten league scoring chart. Chinaglia, with six goals, leads the NASL with 12 points; and Romero is second with three goals and three assists. Cabanas and Bogicevic are tied with two other players for third place with five points; Cabanas has a pair of goals and one assist, and Bogi has five assists.

SEATTLE SIGNED A NEW MIDFIELDER YESTERDAY, bringing five-year NASL veteran David Bradford on board. Bradford, at 5'5", 138, is a power-packed addition to middle. He's scored 23 goals and assisted on 58 since joining the league in 1978. The complete release on Bradford's signing is attached.

GARY MILLS, SEATTLE PLAYER WHO SUFFERED A BROKEN SHIN in last Saturday's game against the Whitecaps, has been released from Swedish Hospital. Mills received a fractured tibia and fibula in his right shin when Vancouver's Dave Watson collided with him in a clean battle for the ball. Mills, who is at the game tonight, will be out of action for a year. The 21-year-old midfielder, who played for Derby County in England during the winter and arrived at the start of Seattle's 1983 pre-season training with his new bride Susan, is expected to fully recover from the injury. He has not elected to have a pin inserted in the fracture, which means a bit longer recovery, but a stronger healing of the bone.

TRAINING FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE WEEK has a select group session scheduled for the Kingdome tomorrow at 10:00 a.m. with the Reserve Team working out on weights in the afternoon. On Friday there will be a full-team practice at 10:30 in the Dome; and on Saturday the full-team session will be at 10:30, also in the Dome.

THE SOUNDERS NEXT GAME IS THIS SATURDAY, when the Toronto Blizzard blows into town. Seattle last encountered the Blizzard in the first round of the 1982 playoffs. A 4-2 Sounder home win in the first game of the best-of-three series was followed by a 1-2 overtime loss in Toronto. The deciding game, in the Kingdome, went in Seattle's favor, again by a 4-2 margin. Both 1982 regular season meetings went to the Sounders, with a 2-0 road victory in June, and a 2-1 home win a week later. Overall, the Sounders lead Toronto 10-3 in the series record, and are 5-1 against the Blizzard at home.

TORONTO ARRIVES IN SEATTLE TOMORROW, at 1:55 p.m. on flight #197 (Pacific Western) out of Vancouver. The Blizzard are staying at the Marriott, and Pat Surphlis (PR Director) can be contacted to arrange interviews. Ace Ntsoelengoe, who has not played yet this season due to knee surgery, will be travelling to Seattle. Toronto is scheduled to train Friday at 1:30 in the Kingdome for two hours.

SEATTLE'S INJURY REPORT, IN ADDITION TO Mills' fracture which will keep him out a year, includes: defenders - Ray Evans, groin strain, probable; Jeff Stock, shoulder sprain, probable; and Kurt Stierle, knee strain, out; midfielder - Tim Bartro, thigh pull, questionable; and forward - Peter Ward, groin pull, probable.

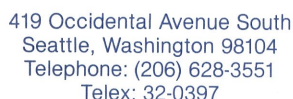

THE COSMOS DEPART IMMEDIATELY AFTER the game tonight, on a red-eye flight back to New York. Their next opponent is the Tulsa Roughnecks in Giants Stadium on Sunday, May 15th. The Sounders next meet New York, back east, on June 20th for the second game in the league home-and-home series. The two teams will meet before that in the Trans Atlantic Challenge Cup, on Sunday, June 5th, in the round-robin tournament's doubleheader.

TRANS ATLANTIC CHALLENGE CUP UPDATE: Sao Paulo, whom the Sounders host in the first game of the tournament (Kingdome, May 30, 7:30 p.m.), was eliminated from the quarterfinals of Gold Cup play, on Sunday (May 8) in a 1-0 loss to Atletico PR. Fiorentina (in Seattle June 1) beat Sampdoria, 3-1, on Sunday, with Luciano Miani and Francesco Graziani getting the goals, plus an own goal. Fiorentina concludes its Italian League season this Sunday, away, against Pisa. It is now in fifth place in League standings with 33 points.

SOUNDERS SEASON TICKET HOLDERS will receive a bonus of free tickets to a Sounders' game, as an extra bonus, and as a way to introduce Sounders soccer to people who have never seen a Sounders game before. Starting May 16th, season ticket holders will be sent a like number of tickets as they have on their account. Each person will be asked to give the tickets to someone who would not normally attend a game, giving them a chance to experience professional soccer.
