HOUSTON HURRICANE

VS.

NEW YORK COSMOS

Sunday, May 6, 2:30 p.m. - Giants Stadium

TAKING ON THE GIANT AT GIANTS STADIUM Houston plays David to New York's Goliath today as the Hurricane, the surprise team of the young NASL season, takes on the international galaxy of stars that reportedly make the Cosmos the most expensive team in any sport anywhere in the world.

The match marks the first time that the NASL's newest franchise has battled the three-time league champion Cosmos and is the only meeting this year between the two teams.

RADIO COVERAGE BUT NO TV Televising the Cosmos game back to Houston was one of the Hurricane's priorities this season, but no day-of-game air time could be obtained on any of the city's commercial stations. The game will be broadcast live over KTRH radio, however, with announcers Bill Hazen on play by play and Jay Hoffman on color.

MATCHUP OF DIVISION LEADERS As records go, the Hurricane and the Cosmos are fairly evenly matched. The Cosmos, as expected, leads the National Conference Eastern Division. The Hurricane, which has tallied 16 goals and allowed nine in building its record to 5-1, leads the American Conference Central Division with 43 points.

However overpowering the Cosmos' starting lineup (and second string, for that matter) appears, Hurricane Head Coach Timo Liekoski has psyched his team up to go into the game with a winning attitude.

And the Hurricane has much to be optimistic about. It has scored more goals in six games than almost every other team in the league and until April 28's 5-2 beating by Chicago possessed one of the stingiest defenses in the NASL. The team's phenomenal 5-1 start gives it a strong edge in the standings and contrasts favorably with last year's 3-3 record at this point in the season. Incidentally, a year ago the Hurricane had both tallied and given up eight goals in the first six games.

HOUSTON LEADERS The Hurricane midfield is considered one of the strongest in the league, and that's reflected in the league scoring race, where two of the team's link men rank in the top 10. Finnish international Kai Haaskivi (four goals) and West German power-house Walter Schuberth (three goals and two assists) are tied for seventh on the American Conference leaders list with eight points each.

Houston's loss to Chicago cost the team points not only in the standings but also in the goalkeepers' race. Five goals in the back of his net (three more in that one game than in his previous four starts combined) dropped goalie Paul Hammond's average from 0.47 to 1.34. That's still good for seventh on the American Conference list, however.

INJURY REPORT

The entire Hurricane squad is healthy for today's game.

Kyle Rote Jr. broke out of a four-game scoring slump April 28 to pick up his first point as a Hurricane. He assisted on Houston's second goal against Chicago, feeding a pass to forward Juan Carlos Michia, who bounced the ball in off of goalkeeper Paul Coffee.

Defender Stewart Jump, who is to make his first start since April 7 today after a bout with mononucleosis, played as a member of the Cosmos team last summer. He was one of a handful of "outsiders" selected to join the championship team on a monthlong tour of Europe.

ADDITIONS TO MEDIA GUIDE

MANUEL MANZO: Midfielder, 6-0, 172, 26, Mexico

First gained national prominence in his country as a member of the 1972 Olympic Team that participated in the Munich games. Became one of Mexico's most revered soccer heroes as a member of the National Team from 1973 through 1976. Averaged a dozen goals per season over his six-year professional career with three top first division Mexican clubs - Athletico Espanol, Guadalajara, and Universidad Autonoma de Mexico - all of which became co-champions of Mexico. Joined the Hurricane for his first season in the NASL.

RUBEN MORALES: Forward, 5-7, 150, 27, Uruguay

Joined the Hurricane following five seasons with his country's top team, Club Nacional de Montevideo, where he averaged 15 goals a year. Turned professional in 1972 with Sud America and spent two seasons with that leading second division team before transferring to Club Nacional. Broke into the Hurricane starting lineup during the NASLPA strike, having been in tryout camp for a week, and scored two goals (one in an exhibition game) in his first three matches for Houston.
