OAKLAND INVADERS (7-3-1) vs. LOS ANGELES EXPRESS (3-8)

THIS WEEK

Winners of three straight games, the Oakland Invaders host the Los Angeles Express, losers last week to the Tampa Bay Bandits, 24-14. Oakland has won its last three home games and has a record of 9-1-1 in its last 11 home games. The Invaders are 4-2 in the Western Conference and the Express is 3-5.

SERIES

The Express leads the series, 3-2. Here's a look at the previous five meetings:

LAST MEETING

On March 31, the visiting Invaders won their third straight game and upped their record to 4-1-1 with a 30-6 win over the Express. QB Bobby Hebert completed 15 of 26 passes for 221 yards and 3 touchdowns, while Oakland's defense set a club record by allowing just 177 total net yards. WR Anthony Carter set a club record by scoring 3 touchdowns: two on pass receptions and another on a fumble recovery. S John Sullivan and LB Tim Lucas each had their first career interceptions.

INJURIES

CB Daryl Hart (ankle) did not play against the Renegades, but should be able to play this week. QB Bobby Hebert suffered a mild concussion against Orlando but will be ready to go against the Express.

TELEVISION

ESPN will nationally televise Saturday's game with Fred Manfra (play-by-play) and Marv Levy (analyst). The telecast begins at 3 p.m. PDT.

RADIO

KGO (810), the Invaders' 50,000-watt flagship station, will-carry the broadcast with Joe Starkey (play-by-play) and Lee Grosscup (analyst). The pregame show starts at 2:45 p.m. PDT.

QUOTES FROM CHARLIE SUMNER:

"I'm looking forward to playing at home this week because it will be our only home game in the month of May. We've been playing pretty solid football at home lately and I'd like for us to keep that up.

"I don't think Steve Young has been as effective since his knee injury, but I still think he's a very good quarterback. I'm not sure if they'll use Young or Frank Seurer, but I expect that the Express will come out and play a good game.

"Against Orlando, our defense played well. I thought Fred (Besana) came in and did a good job, too. He came in after Bobby (Hebert) got hurt and threw the ball well."

QUOTES FROM THE PLAYERS QB Fred Besana: "I don't like to see the starting quarterback get hurt, but I did enjoy playing. It was kind of fun. When a team has to cover the guys we've got, it's going to have problems. If they try to shut off one guy, someone else will be open."

DE Dave Browning: "Our defense played solid and the only mistake we made was on a long pass play. I thought we played a good mental game and now we just have to make sure we do it again this week."

LAST WEEK

After a scoreless first quarter in which QB Bobby Hebert was knocked out of the game with a mild concussion, Fred Besana stepped in and completed 14 of 19 passes for 193 yards and 3 touchdowns. Oakland's defense held the Renegades to 199 total net yards, the third lowest in club history.

NOTES

QB Fred Besana's 63-yard touchdown pass to WR Derek Holloway last Sunday was the second longest TD pass in club history...LB Angelo Snipes made his first career start against Orlando and had 5 tackles and a quarterback sack... FB Tom Newton's 3-yard TD catch was his first catch since Game 2 and only his second TD catch of his eight-year career... K Novo Bojovic has made 31 PATs this season, one shy of Kevin Shea's club record of 32 set in 1983... Bojovic, who had a club record of seven straight games with a field goal, missed his only attempt against Orlando... FB Albert Bentley rushed for 82 yards and had 5 catches for 53 yards against Orlando, but still is No. 2 in the Western Conference with 721 rushing yards... P Stan Talley leads the USFL with a 44.3 punting average and has a league-leading 19 punts downed inside the opponents' 20-yard line... DE Monte Bennett, the Invaders' all-time leading sacker, leads the club with 6 for 40 yards this season... The Invaders have set a team record for most touchdown passes in a season with 23... The old mark of 21 was set in 1983... The Invaders have allowed just 3 rushing touchdowns this season and the longest run from scrimmage against the Oakland defense is 19 yards...Oakland takes an 8-4 record on ESPN into Saturday's game against the Express... WR Anthony Carter has 8 touchdown catches, one shy of Wyatt Henderson's club record of 9 set in 1983... WR Gordon Banks maintained his streak of catching a pass in every USFL game when he grabbed a 15-yarder against the Renegades...It was Banks' only catch of the day.
