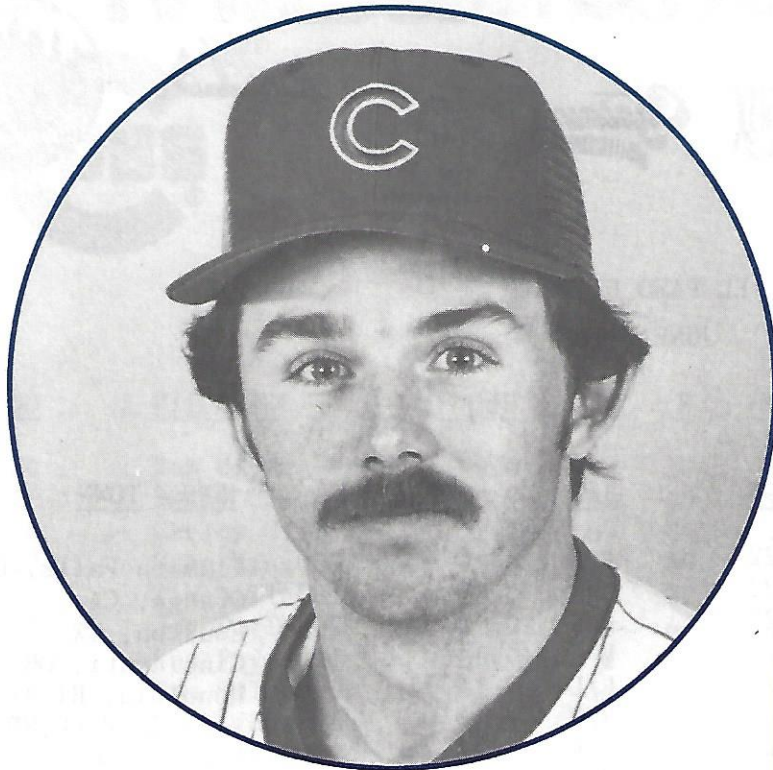

Outfielder

Graduated Maine (Township) West High (Des Plaines, Ill.), 1975; lettered in baseball, soccer, wrestling and track. Batted .404 in his senior year. Graduate of Mississippi State University with B.S. Degree in Education and Science; played varsity baseball. In 1976, his freshman year, he batted .307 in 45 games. In 1977, as a sophomore, he hit .383, third highest in Southeastern Conference, set team and conference records for most stolen bases (25) in one season and set Mississippi State record by hitting safely in 15 consecutive games; was named to All-Southeastern Conference first team. In 1979 he batted .400 overall, .416 during regular season, in helping lead Mississippi State to Southeastern Conference and NCAA South Regional Tournament championships, and a fifth-place tie in College World Series at Omaha, Neb.; was named to All-Southeastern Conference Western Division, All-SEC Tournament, All-Conference, All-Regional Tournament, NCAA All-South Region and NCAA Division I College All-American first teams and was voted Mississippi State's Athlete of the Year. Greatest baseball thrills have been "making first team All-American and playing for United States team in 1977 International World Cup Games in Nicaragua. Graduate student during off-season. Hobby-fishing. Signed first contract by Bob Hartsfield, Chicago Cubs; was Chicago's 25th selection in the June, 1979, free agent draft, regular phase. In 1979 he was selected to play in Midwest League All-Star Game. Was on the Disqualified list from July 15, 1980, to close of season.
