Back From Three: The Earthquakes have returned home
for tonight's match with the Cosmos

after a three-game road swing through the East that resulted in losses and injuries. During the trip, while losing all three matches, the Quakes, at one time or another, played without four different starters in defender Steve Litt (ankle), midfielders Leonardo Cuellar (ankle) and Chris Dangerfield (foot), and forward Tony Crescitelli (knee). Only Crescitelli's injury appears to be serious as the 25-year-old frontliner may require cartilage surgery on his right knee.

During the road swing the Quakes lost matches to the Toronto Blizzard (7-0 on 6/19), Tampa Bay Rowdies (2-1 in OT on 6/23) and Ft. Lauderdale Strikers (3-2 on 6/26).

Back in First: A win tonight for the locals would push them past the Vancouver Whitecaps and into first place in the six-team Western Division. After holding the divisional lead for exactly one month, the Quakes dropped six points out of the lead this past Saturday, losing a 3-2 decision to the hosting Strikers while the Whitecaps were pounding the hosting Rowdies, 5-2.

The 'Caps are idle tonight, and the Quakes will need a seven-point win to reclaim the lead.

Etherington's Record: Quakes midfielder Gary Etherington is set to break a club record tonight, appearing in his 51st straight starting role with the Red & Black. It is fitting that the 23-year-old utility player (he has played all three field positions in his short five-year NASL career) break the mark against the Cosmos, the club he broke into the North American Soccer League with in 1978. In his initial NASL stint, Etherington copped league Rookie of the Year honors.

Anyhow, Etherington has not missed a regular season game since joining the Quakes before the start of the 1981 season from the Los Angeles Aztecs. The mark he breaks tonight was held by defender Miro Pavlovic, who started in 50 straight games for the Quakes during a two-season Bay Area stay (1976-77).

The Records: Up until the weekend, tonight's game had been billed as a confrontation between two divisional leaders. Well, one divisional leader is here, anyway. The Cosmos are atop the Eastern slate with a sparkling 14-3 record and a league-high 121 standings points. The New Yorkers are currently 27 points ahead of second-place Toronto in the four-club East. The Cosmos carry a 6-3 road record and a 8-0 mark at home in Giants Stadium.

The Quakes meanwhile, are at 10-8 with 83 points in the West. At home this season, the Quakes have earned a 6-4 record, while managing an even 4-4 mark on foreign soil.

Tonight's Officials: Policing the on-field activities of the Quakes and Cosmos tonight is REFEREE ROBERT ALLEN, a resident of Vancouver, B.C. Assisting Allen in his chores tonight are Senior Linesman Gary Shugarts (Seattle) and Junior Linesman Luis Macias of Los Angeles.

Streaks, Etc.: Three is the magic number tonight. The Quakes enter this evening's tilt with three straight losses haunting them. However, the locals can look to a home streak for inspiration, having won their last three Spartan Stadium encounters while outscoring their opponents by a 10-5 margin.

The Cosmos, meanwhile, have won three straight matches since losing a 3-2 decision in Montreal to Le Manic on June 18. The three-game streak carried by the Cosmos is a result of a three-game homestand where the New Yorkers swept while earning the maximum 27 points.

Ingram Needs One: Quakes forward Godfrey Ingram, a 22-year-old Englishman who spent some time with the Cosmos on loan from Luton Town in 1979, needs just one more game-winning goal to tie a club record of six game-deciders in a single campaign. The club standard was set in 1976 by midfielder/forward Ilija Mitic, and equalled the following season by frontliner Paul Child. Ingram, who totals 12 scores in 17 games this year, has five game-winning tallies to his credit.

Quakes Last Outing: Completing a three-game road trip, the Quakes lost a 3-2 score to the Strikers on Saturday at Lockhart Stadium. Below is a look at the game report:

Hewitt Looks for 36th: Mike Hewitt, the seven-season vet of Bay Area play, hits the field tonight with 35 career shutouts, 32 of those while playing for the Quakes. With four blankings on the season, "Huey" is currently the league's fourth all-time leading shutout artist. The 32-year-old Scot is just two goose eggs shy of tying Tulsa's Zeljko Bilecki for the #3 spot among the career aces. The missing game-winner is a team goal registered in a shootout (1-0) win vs. the Seattle Sounders at the Kingdome in the Quakes season-opener on April 11.

One More='81: The Quakes need just one more win this season to equal the number of "W's" recorded during their 11-21 performance last season.

League Leader Here Tonight: As is normally the case, Cosmos forward Giorgio Chinaglia hits the field tonight as the NASL's top scorer this season. The big frontliner boasts a total of 12 goals and 8 assists (32 points) in 17 starts this season.

Been a Long Time: The last time the Earthquakes beat the Cosmos was on August 7, 1976, when the locals hosted a 2-1 win vs. the Pele and Chinaglia-led New Yorkers. Since that time, the Quakes have dropped three straight regular season meetings to the Cosmos, losing 3-0 in New York in '77, 5-0 in New York in '79, and 3-0 at Spartan Stadium in last year's season opener.

The overall series between these two teams stands 4-2, in favor of the Cosmos. In six regular season meetings the star-studded roster of the Cosmos has outscored the Quakes, 16-6, including a shootout goal registered by the New Yorkers in a 2-1 win in 1975.

6 for 6: Quakes leading scorer Godfrey Ingram has tallied six goals over the last six matches, including two two-goal performances.

First of Four: The New York Cosmos are in town tonight for the first game of a four-game road swing that will take the visitors to Vancouver (Saturday), Edmonton (Wednesday, 7/7), and Chicago (Saturday, 7/10) at Comiskey Park. The Cosmos can help the Quakes by beating the Whitecaps and Drillers, both Western Division rivals of the Red & Black.

Quakes Minutemen: There are now just two Quakes who have yet to miss a single minute's playing time after 18 matches in 1982. The Quakes "Minutemen" this season are goalie Mike Hewitt and defender Mike Hunter.

Only one man on the Cosmos roster can boast what Hewitt and Hunter have accomplished, and that man is forward Giorgio Chinaglia.

Chinaglia on the Quakes: Earlier this afternoon at the Le Baron Hotel in San Jose, Giorgio Chinaglia reflected on the Quakes strong performance after 18 matches in '82: "This (the Quakes) is a good team now. They are playing exciting soccer and many of their players are scoring goals, not just one or two. They are making the right moves this season and you can see that in the standings. They have just gotten stronger by picking up Mike Stojanovic. He is a very good acquisition for the Earthquakes. Tonight's game should be very interesting."

Birkenmeier Rested: Cosmos goalie Hubert Birkenmeier received a deserved rest on Sunday when his teammates hosted the Edmonton Drillers. Birkenmeier, 33 and the league's #6 goalie (1.40 GAA), has missed just three games (regular season) since joining the Cosmos from F.C. Freiburg of the West German Second Division.

Next Up for Quakes: Including tonight's game, the Quakes have 14 regular season tilts remaining on their '82 schedule. Of those 14 dates, six are home games and eight are away matches. After tonight's game, the Quakes will knock off two of those road games, travelling to Seattle for a weekend encounter (Saturday) with the Sounders, and moving on to Vancouver for a crucial meeting with the Whitecaps one week from tonight.
