His outstanding speed and defensive ability along with his .333 batting average has given the Sox a tremendous in both the field and offensive attack.

In his sixth season of pro ball, the 23 year old Wheeler spent the major portion of the 1974 season at Appleton where he hit .256 with 11 home runs and 56 rbi's. Originally signed by the St. Louis Cardinal Organization, Ed was signed by the White Sox in March 1974.
