Another notable aspect of the season thus far have been the appearance of celebrities at Gems' home games. Those attending games so far have been Don Drysdale, Bob Uecker, and Rick Cerone of baseball fame and Althea Gibson, the former tennis superstar. Add to that some members of various WBL teams and it adds a lot of color to the hottest team in town, your New Jersey Gems.

As of Feb. 10th, the following Gems players are among the league leaders in the WBL: Ann Meyers-fifth in scoring (23.1), ninth in rebounding (9.9), sixth in assists (5.4), and first in steals (4.7)-Donna Geilstenth in scoring (19.1), tenth in Free Throw % (.761), and fifth in steals (3.1)-Debbie Comerie-tenth in Field Goal % (.505), and seventh in rebounding (10.3).

#### PROFILE ON DONNA GEILS

Donna Geils grew up in Nassau County, Long Island and attended Ellmont High School where she played basketball for two years and graduated early at the age of sixteen. She went on to play two seasons with the AAU New York Chuckles and then went on to Queens College where she played four years as a starter. During her career at Queens, Donna was co-captain, Most Valuable Player, Best All Around Player, Best Defensive Player, Scholar Athlete, and was selected to the Eastern Regional Kodak All American Basketball Team in 1978. She finished her career as the third leading scorer in the college's history.

Her husband, Kenny, is a ninth and tenth grade Social Studies teacher and in charge of the district curriculum in the Sewanhaka District. He loves to play tennis and does a lot of running. According to Donna, he has been a tremendous inspiration to her during her entire career. This is something she is most appreciative of. Ken is always at the Gems' home games and is one of their most loyal fans.

Donna claims, "Life on the road is great fun, but tedious, and very tiring. It really takes a big toll on your energy level." Being the only married woman on the team, Donna says that it has been a big adjustment being on the road, since it keeps her away from her husband and family for extended periods of time.

As for the season so far, Donna says that "It has been a great growing experience for us as a team, and we are continuing to improve. We now enter every game confident, believing in our abilities. We really feel we're a definite contender for the playoffs.

With an average of over nineteen points per game, one would think that the role of Donna Geils on the Gems would be that of a scorer. This is not entirely true. When I'm on the floor, I always try to do what the team needs. If it needs someone to play a little tougher defense, then I'll do that. If it needs more scoring, then I'll try to do that. I've always thought of myself as a team oriented player, but I never could say that before because I've never had the confidence. I was brought on to the team as a shooting guard. I think I have a lot of strengths, but shooting is my greatest one."
