WTT President Larry King and Indiana Love's owner Bill Bereman spent Christmas in Moscow and arranged for one Russian and one American WTT match to be staged this Spring with our American WTT All-Stars playing a Russian All-Star team. The Loves are also interested in signing **Olga Morozova** to a 1976 pact. Success would certainly make the Indiana team a strong contender in the League.

The Gaters will officially open their season Saturday night, May 1st, at the Oakland Coliseum Arena with the Los Angeles Strings. The full 1976 schedule will be published in our next newsletter.
