STRINGS SHAPE UP AS SEASON NEARS

AMRITRAJ BROTHERS RETURN TO LOS ANGELES


Vijay Amritraj, one of World Team Tennis' premier doubles players, has signed a multivear contract to return to play for the Los Angeles Strings in 1978, it was announced by Strings' General Manager Bart Christensen.

Playing for the Strings in 1976, Amritraj doubled up with Bob Lutz to form the secondbest men's doubles team in the league. Together they won 14 of 18 sets and set a team record of seven straight.

The Strings also signed Amritraj's 21-year-old brother, Ashok, to play in 1978. A member of the Strings' team in 1976, Ashok rounds out the men's roster for the coming

The No. 1 ranked tennis player in India, Vijay will primarily be used this season to play doubles with teammate Ilie Nastase.

"Vijay was an asset to our team two years ago and we're looking forward to his return

in 1978," said Christensen, "He carried the team in doubles in 1976, which is an event we must improve this season. With Chris Evert and Ilie Nastase playing singles and Amritrai teaming with Nastase in doubles, the Strings will be a tough team to beat this coming season."

Voted the most popular player by Los Angeles fans in 1976. Amritraj aced and graced his way through the year with the Strings when he powerfully

served 80 aces while winning fans with his charismatic Indian disposition.

The 24-year-old Amritrai reached international prominence in 1974 when he led India to the Davis Cup finals. Twice a quarter-finalist at the U.S. Open and once at Wimbledon, Amritrai has had key wins over such stars as Bjorn Borg, Jimmy Connors and Rod Laver. He also reached the semifinals at Wimbledon in doubles with his older brother, Anand, in 1976.

TICKET SALES RACE TO ALL-TIME HIGH

The 1978 season will be the biggest yet for the Los Angeles Strings who reached an alltime high for season ticket sales this month when they surpassed their 1977 total. Confident of reaching a goal of 4,000 by the season's start, still one month away, the Strings attribute the increase in sales to the addition of Chris Evert to the roster and a feeling that 1978 could be the last year that good seats will be available.

"With the top ten women tennis players in the world playing team tennis, Los Angeles fans will see top-rated action throughout the season with Evert on the team," said Strings' General Manager Bart Christensen. "Match - ups such as Evert against Virginia Wade, Martina Navratilova, Billie Jean King and Rosie Casals are just a few that can be seen any night of the season at the Forum. People realize the only way to get a good seat to see these stars all season is with a season ticket."

Christensen is confident that crowds in excess of 8,000 will be commonplace this season when Evert joins Ilie Nastase and the Amritraj brothers.

"The New York Apples drew 14,000 fans in Madison Square Garden to see Billie Jean King battle Chris Evert last year," said Christensen. "With Los Angeles as the second largest city in the league behind New York, all indications show that fans will be out in large numbers this season."

Courtside season tickets are currently on sale for \$160 and loge season tickets for \$130.

WADE GOES WEST

The question as to who will play women's singles for the New York Apples, Virginia Wade or Billie Jean King, has been solved by Wade herself who recently signed to play with the Golden Gaters in the Western Division. Sandy Mayer, also from the New York Apples, was the first to break up the WTT championship team when he looked to the West Coast and joined the Gaters. Wade and Mayer join player-coach Frew McMillan in what is expected to be the String's major competitor in the West. Wade, 1977 Wimbledon champion, and the Gaters make their first Los Angeles appearance against Evert and the Strings Friday night, April 28. Continued on page 2

Vitas Gerulaitis left the Indiana Loves to return to his home state of New York to play for the Apples. Gerulaitis, one of the most popular players on the men's circuit, should fit right into the fast-moving New York scene. Even with the loss of Wade and Mayer to the Golden Gaters, the Apples still look like a strong contender for their third WTT championship with Gerulaitis and Billie Jean King leading the way.

Martina Navratilova of the Boston Lobsters finished No. 1 in women's singles last season and has continued her domination into the women's tournament circuit this year with Chris Evert out of action until late March. Navratilova set an unprecedented six consecutive women's professional tennis tour victories when she defeated Dianne Fromholtz in the Detroit Virginia Slims tournament. This extended her tour victory record to 30 matches in 1978 and her six straight tournament wins surpass the five set by Billie Jean King in 1971. Navratilova and the Eastern Division champion Boston Lobsters will play their only Los Angeles match opening night, April 26, at the Forum.

Sue Barker has filled the position on the Phoenix Racquets' roster left open by Chris Evert when she signed with the Strings. Barker was selected WTT's Female Rookie of the Year last season while playing with the Indiana Loves.

The Cleveland Nets have moved their franchise to New Orleans and will be known as the Sun Belt Nets. They will play 9 matches at the Superdome and their remaining home games in different cities in the Southern section of the United States.

A CHAT WITH CHRIS

QUESTION: What made you decide to play team tennis in

Los Angeles?

EVERT: I enjoyed playing in Phoenix but it's time for me to move on to a bigger city. Los Angeles is a great sports town and the interest is just phenominal here. We're going to have a super team and hopefully we'll bring home the championship.

QUESTION: Is it more fun playing tennis when teammates

are involved?

EVERT: It is. The team aspect is very unselfish. You're winning for six other players and if you lose everyone takes part in being down.

QUESTION: What goals are there left for you because you've won everything that a woman

could win?

EVERT: Right now the goals are more personal. I still don't think I'm a perfect tennis player. I can improve my serve and volley, so that is a challenge to me.

QUESTION: Have you ever played mixed doubles with Nas-

tase?

EVERT: We played one match four years ago against Arthur Ashe and Billie Jean King. It was quite an experience.

QUESTION: Assuming you're going to play singles, do you have a preference whether you'll play women's or mixed doubles?

ÉVERT: I think I'm better off playing women's doubles and Ilie's better off playing men's doubles. He's a great doubles player. But I'm sure it would be very entertaining for



me if I played doubles with him. QUESTION: Do you feel there's more competition for

you in tennis now?

EVERT: I played my best tennis in 1976 when I played against Evonne Goolagong in almost every final. I would compare that with Jimmy Connors and Bjorn Borg right now. The better players I play the better my game is.

QUESTION: Must a woman be a champion regardless of the surface that she's compet-

ing on?

EVERT: To be a champion you have to win major titles on every surface. If I just won Forest Hills every year and lost at Wimbledon and all the other fast court titles I wouldn't be considered a champion.

QUESTION: What is your

toughest surface?

EVERT: Grass is still tough for me. It's not consistent. There's a little bit of luck involved winning Wimbledon, even when I've won it I think I've been a little bit lucky.

ROBINSON'S CITY OF HOPE TENNIS TOURNEY

The Sinth Annual City of Hope Tennis Tournament, sponsored by Robinson's, will be played throughout Southern California on Saturday, April 15, in Palm Springs, and Sunday, April 16, in Los Angeles and Orange Counties.

The course which traditionally attracts 3,000 plus players, will be bed on courts (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.) in Orange County, Palm Springs. San Gabriel Valley, Beverly Hills, Pasadena, San Fernando Valley, West Los Angeles, South Bay and Long Beach and the beach from Marbu to Playa del Rey.

Mixed doubles teams will play a round robin of eight games, 40 games per couple five couples on each court. Classifications are A through notice. The entry fee of \$40 per couple is tax deductible and players must enter as a mixed doubles team. Fee includes play and a no-bost tournament party at the end of the day. A non-player fee of \$12 provides admission to the party. Entry deadline is April 7.

Robinson's and the Los Angeles Strings are also offering a special night for City of Hope patrons, April 28 at 8 p.m., when the Strings battle the Golden Gaters. The featured match-up will be Chris Evert of the Strings against the 1977 Wimbledon champion, Virginia Wade, of the Golden Gaters. A special playing appearance by Tracy Austin, who has been named the 1978 "Champion of Champions" in honor of the Champions for Hope, will also highlight the evening.

Any tickets purchased to the match through Robinson's or the City of Hope will qualify the buyer for a drawing for a trip to Wimbledon via British Airways. Part of the proceeds from the Strings' tickets purchased through the City of Hope will also go to the chapter.

A presentation will be made to the City of Hope tournament winners during a special half-time spot.
