"WICKED WANDA" - A GEM OF A GEM

Wanda Szeremeta began her playing career at Queen of Peace High School in North Arlington where she became the first 1,000 point scorer in the school's history. Upon graduation, Wanda went to Lamar University in Texas on an athletic scholarship. She transferred to Montclair State for her junior and senior years and the rest is history. In her junior year, Wanda was named to the All-New Jersey Conference Team and it was at this time that she earned her nickname of "Wicked". The title was given to her by the Sports Information Director at Montclair who said, "She had a wicked way about her". Her senior year was almost a dream come true. The squad made it to the final four in the country and it was an experience Wanda will never forget.

The Gems' Captain views her role on the team realistically. "I'll cal' the defenses and I'll make sure that everything is organized out there". Wanda also plays an important role off the court. "I'm the player representative. If we ever have any problems, which we really don't, I'm the mediator between the coaches and management".

When comparing last year's team with the current one, Wanda said, "This year we are more organized. Last year it was more of a one on one type of thing. We're much closer this year and we're more talented. We're a closer knit unit". Concerning next year, she stated, "The most important thing on any club in this league is depth. Next year, the club plans to sign Carol Blazejowski and Tara Heiss and if we get another big girl, we'll either be the number one team or we'll be right up there. Things look really positive". Wanda feels that the league has "the best crop of college talent ever" coming up in this year's draft. The young girls coming up are almost certainly going to ask for higher salaries than the girls already in the league and "Wicked" issues a warning, "They have to realize that we're still in the growing stages and if they keep their salaries down to a degree that is reasonable, then it will be all right".

Wanda really enjoys playing near her home. "I really get a thrill playing in Jersey because there are a lot of people I know and I'd rather play before my family and friends". "Wicked" shows a lot of emotion when she speaks about one of her most important achievements in the sport of basketball. "I'm an original Gem and that means more to me than anything else. I've been the Captain for two years and no one can ever take that away from me. It's something special and no one else will ever have. It's just a super feeling!". No one can deny Wanda Szeremeta of that honor. It's an honor that she truly deserves. Gem Stones found "Wicked Wanda" (she really isn't) to be very sincere in our conversation with her.
