The Strikers put their 3-6 road record on the line this evening against the New York Cosmos in their third back-to-back game series this evening. Curiously enough, the Strikers have lost both first night games, and with but 24 hours rest, have won both second night games. This is the third consecutive weekend that the Strikers have had to play back-to-back games. Their second night victories have come against Las Vegas and Cleveland.

The Strikers have an 8-9 record, the fourth time they have fallen behind the .500 mark. Every other time of the season that they have slipped below the .500 mark, they have won to even their won-lost record. They have not had a worse record than one game behind the .500 mark all season.

MERRICK'S MOMENT

"There has always been a great rivalry outdoors between the Cosmos and Strikers, and I expect that intense rivalry to continue indoors as well. The Cosmos are coming off a great win against a red-hot Chicago team. With a win like that, they now have the potential to put together a nice winning streak. The new coaching patterns have been established under Ray Klivecka, and the club is obviously adjusting well to his style of coaching. I expect these two teams to begin tonight great encounters of the second league."

GARY ETHERINGTON....his next goal will be his 50th career indoor tally. Gary was a member of the Cosmos for two championship seasons, and was the NASL's Rookie-of-the-Year for the Cosmos in 1978.

MIKE JEFFRIES....drafted in the First Round of the NCAA draft by the Cosmos, the third player selected overall. Winner of the Hermann Trophy Award, Mike was traded to the Strikers for Dan Canter last spring.

CRAIG SCARPELLI....born in Long Branch, New Jersey. "Scarps" shut out the Cosmos in his first NASL outdoor match last June 30th 1-0 at the HHH Metrodome in Minnesota.

JAN GOOSSENS....Mr. Offense....the Strikers' leading scorer has 12 goals in his last nine games, has scored a goal in 12 of the Strikers'17 games, has scored at least a point in all but two games, has two hat tricks and leads the team with six multiple goal games.

MISLaneous...the Strikers have a 3-5 record in the Eastern Division...John Bain continues to impress. The club's smallest player leads the team in assists, is second in points, +/- ratio, and is third in blocked shots and goals, and has scored a point in 12 of the Strikers' 17 games this year...Thompson Usiyan's five goals this year have all come in the road... Picardo Alonso has scored a goal in three of his last four games...the Strikers are 4-2 in one goal games, and 4-1 in games in which they have scored first...John McGrane leads the club with 26 blocked shots...Jan Goossens has scored a goal in every Striker win this year...the Strikers have averaged 3.66 goals on the road and have allowed 6.11 in the same stretch...New York's Dan Canter received the third most votes in the Strikers' recent all-star balloting for defenders...

DEFENDERS STEVE LITT AND GREGG THOMPSON JOIN STRIKER FORCES

#5 Steve Litt Defender

Born: 5/21/54 6'1" 192 lbs. Citizen: England

The Strikers signed 30 year old defender and former Minnesota Kick favorite Steve Litt to an indoor contract on December 7th. Litt holds the distinction as having played the most games in a Minnesota Kick uniform in the six year history of the franchise. He played 165 outdoor matches (1976-1981) and 18 indoor games (1979/80 and 1980/81). He also played 38 indoor games for the San Jose Earthquakes in 1982/83. The original Kick played the last three outdoor seasons with the San Jose Earthquakes and became a free agent last fall.

#10 Gregg Thompson Defender

Born: 8/4/60 5'9" 165 lbs. Citizen: USA

November 30th marked the Twin Cities return of former Stillwater High School (Minnesota) football standout Gregg Thompson. The 24 year old Thompson signed a multi-year contract. After winning the 1978 Minnesota High School Athlete of the Year Award, Thompson passed up full football scholarships to such prestigious schools as Harvard and Yale and all but two Big-10 schools, to attend Indiana University to play soccer. Thompson led the Hoosiers to an NCAA National Championship in 1982 and was named an All-American.

Drafted in the first round of the NASL draft in 1983, Thompson went on to notoriety as the club's Most Valuable Player and Most Popular Player, and won the NASL Rookie-of-the-Year Award the same year. He played all three preliminary games for the United States Olympic team in Los Angeles last summer. He has played two outdoor seasons with the Rowdies plus their 1983/84 indoor season.
