Tonight's opener marks the Skipjacks first season opening at home since their return to the American Hockey League in 1981-82. The Baltimore Skipjacks are setting out to defend their title of 1983-84 Southern Division champions, and they begin the new campaign against long-time AHL rivals - the Hershey Bears.

Second-year Skipjacks coach Gene Ubriaco, who was honored as last season's AHL "Coach of the Year" will have over two-thirds of last year's championship club returning, including co-captains STEVE CARLSON and GARY RISSLING. Other forwards back with the Jacks include last year's second leading scorer JIM HAMILTON, 1982-83 "Rookie of the Year" MITCH LAMOUREUX, TIM HRYNEWICH, TROY LONEY, DEAN DEFAZIO, TED BULLEY, BOB GEALE, and TIM TOOKEY.

At the other end of the ice, fans will be glad to see returning goaltender RO-BERTO ROMANO, second team AHL All-Star TOM THORNBURY, BENNETT WOLF (led the league in penalty minutes), 1982-83 "Outstanding Defenseman" GREG TEBBUTT, and PHIL BOURQUE.

The HERSHEY BEARS are entering their fourth year under coach GARY INNESS, and finished last in the Southern Division last season. The Jacks posted a 7-5-2 record against the Bears last season, four of those wins coming here at the Civic Center. The Bears sport alot of new faces, but do return team leader DOUG MORRISON, their 1983-84 top scorer. They also boast two 1984 Winter Olympic participants, right wing PAUL GUAY (US team) and left wing DAVE DONNELLY (Canadian team).

NOTES TO "BEAR" IN MIND....Skipjacks career record vs Hershey: 10-8-4 (6-2-3 at home, 4-6-1 away)....Hershey goaltender Dave Jenson led Fort Wayne of the IHL last year with a 2.94 GAA....Baltimore's season opening record: 0-2. Both losses came at the hands of Rochester in New York....The AHL season opened Wednesday: NS 5-Adir 5(0T), Thurs: Roch 6-Bing 5 OT, Fred 5-St.C. 3.

HOW TO SCORE A JACKS GAME—Keeping an account of tonight's game is easy since the scoreboard and the PA announcer will provide you with all pertinent information.

REFEREE AND LINESMEN — The names of the 3 on-ice officials will be announced prior to the start of the game.

SCORING — When a goal is scored, enter the new score of the game in the first column, JACKS total goals first. Next, indicate in which period the goal was scored and the time. In hockey, time is announced as elapsed time in the period. Place the initial of the team scoring the goal, the name of the player who scored it, and those assisting (if any) in the remaining columns.

PENALTIES—Indicate the period and the time of the penalty, the initial of the team guilty of the infraction, and the player's name who committed the penalty. Complete your entry by writing the number of minutes assessed and the infraction.

GOALS AND SHOTS ON GOAL—At the end of each period, place the number of goals scored by each team and the shots on goal in the appropriate box. The shots on goal totals will be announced over the PA system after the period ends.

THREE STARS—At the end of the game, the players viewed by the media as the top three will have their names announced. Enter their names in the special section.







ICING



- A Icing is called when a player shoots the puck from his own or defensive - zone across the opponent's goal line (but not through the goal crease). Icing is not called when a team is shorthanded: when a player could have touched puck before it went across goal line; when a player from icing team touches puck first.
- B Icing does not occur when a player shoots the puck from the offensive zone side of center ice into the opposition's end of the rink.


OFFSIDE



OFFSIDE PASS

- C An offside pass occurs when a member of the attacking team passes the puck from behind his own blue line to a teammate across the center
- D An attacking player may pass the puck over the center red line and the blue line to a teammate, as long as the teammate does not cross the blue line before the puck.
- E OFFSIDE

A team is offside when a player crosses the blue line before the puck. The determining factor in an offside is the position of the skates; they must both be over the line ahead of the puck to be considered offside.
