ORLANDO SOLAR BEARS NOTES OF INTEREST Wednesday, October 18, 1995

FIRST "W" IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

Center Craig Fisher scored two goals and added two assists to power the Solar Bears to their first victory ever, defeating the Utah Grizzlies 6-5. The Solar Bears used a five-goal second period outburst to put the Grizzlies away last Saturday night. Right wing Kerry Clark scored his second goal in two nights to tie the game 44 seconds into the second period. Defensemen Todd Richards and Jeff Sirkka scored goals 12 seconds apart to give the Solar Bears a two-goal cushion. After the Grizzlies narrowed the margin to 4-3, Fisher and left wing John LeBlanc scored 24 seconds apart to give the Solar Bears a 6-3 lead, which they never relinquished. Goaltender Scott LaGrand picked up the victory, as he stopped 25 of Utah's 30 shots.

HE SHOOTS...

Saturday's victory marked the first time the Solar Bears outshot their opponent in five contests. Orlando fired 31 shots to Utah's 30, including five shots from Fisher, who leads the team with 17 on the season. In fact, that was only the second time in five games that the Solar Bears have cranked out 30 or more shots. The last time they managed that feat was in the home opener against Detroit on October 6 (34). Orlando is currently tied for 17th in the IHL averaging 28 shots per game. The good news for the Solar Bears is that tonight's and Friday night's opponent, the Atlanta Knights, gives up 37 shots per game, also 17th in the IHL.

...HE SCORES

With 11 goals in their past two games, the Solar Bears have begun to find their offensive touch. Offense was scarce in games two and three of the season, when Orlando only found the twine two times in two games. In Las Vegas, Orlando scored five times, and in Utah they tallied a season-high six times. The Solar Bears are 14th in league scoring with 3.60 goals per game. Former 50-goal scorer Craig Fisher leads the Solar Bears in scoring with four goals and seven points in five games, while player/assistant coach Dave Barr is second with six points in five games.

THE FISHER KING

Speaking of scoring, Craig Fisher has relocated his scoring touch scoring twice and added two assists in the Solar Bears win on Saturday in Utah. Fisher was second in IHL goal-scoring last season with 53, and now leads the Solar Bears with four. Orlando traded James Black (acquired with Todd Richards and Bob Joyce for the first pick in the expansion draft) to the Indianapolis Ice for Fisher and defenseman Bob Kellogg in mid-August. With the Ice, Black has two goals and two assists in four games. Fisher also leads the Solar Bears with 17 shots on goal and two power play goals.

POWER SURGE

After a dismal start on the power play this season, the Solar Bears exploded for four goals on six opportunities in Utah on Saturday. Orlando began the season 3-for-34 (8.8%) on the power play in their first four outings. With the four-goal power play output, Orlando emerged from the league's power play doldrums, and is now 12th in the IHL with a more respectable 17.5% efficiency rate. In the next two home games, Orlando will be looking for its first home power play goal of the year.

IS THERE AN "O" IN DEFENSE?

Even without one of their most skilled defensemen, Mark Ferner (broken finger), the Solar Bears' defensive corps have been putting up some impressive offensive numbers. Todd Richards, Jeff Sirkka and Brad Tiley all have five points to their credit, good for sixth among all IHL defensemen. While Richards and Tiley have been known for their offensive prowess, Sirkka has been more of a defensive weapon. In fact, Sirkka's highest offensive output in his six-year professional career was 24 points with the AHL's 1994 Calder Cup Champion Portland Pirates. Richards has averaged over 50 points per season in his last three seasons and Tiley has average over 40 points in that same span.

HELLO AGAIN

Defenseman Garrett MacDonald, who was reassigned by the Solar Bears on September 28, was recalled on October 10. MacDonald had reported to the Richmond Renegades (ECHL) for three days before getting the call. On the three-game west coast trip, MacDonald was a workhorse for the Solar Bears, and picked up 11 penalty minutes in three games. The 6' 183 pound feisty native of Burnaby, British Columbia held his own in a tussle with 6'4 230 pound Las Vegas tough guy Rhett Trombley last Friday in Las Vegas.

ANOTHER DIMENSION

When the Solar Bears acquired right wing Kerry Clark in the off-season, they were looking primarily at his aggressive approach to the game. In just over 400 career professional games, Clark had over 2,000 PIM's coming into this season. While Clark has not lost a step in the aggressive department, he has suddenly found a magic stick as he has scored a goal in each of his last two outings. In each of the last two seasons, Clark scored only nine goals the entire season. For his efforts, the Solar Bears nominated him for their Player of the Week.

GETTING READY FOR HALLOWEEN WEEK

The entire Solar Bears team will make an appearance at Halloween Horror Nights V at Universal Studios on Wednesday, October 25. The Universal Studios staff will treat the Solar Bears to a tour of the Halloween park and then bring them to a live appearance at "Bill and Ted's Excellent Halloween Deadventure" at 8:50 p.m. Also, Solar Bears defenseman Pat Neaton and center Jeff Reid will skate for the United Way on Tuesday, October 31st from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at Rock on Ice ice skating arena. Pre-sold admission is \$4 while admission at the door is \$6. All proceeds will benefit the United Way.

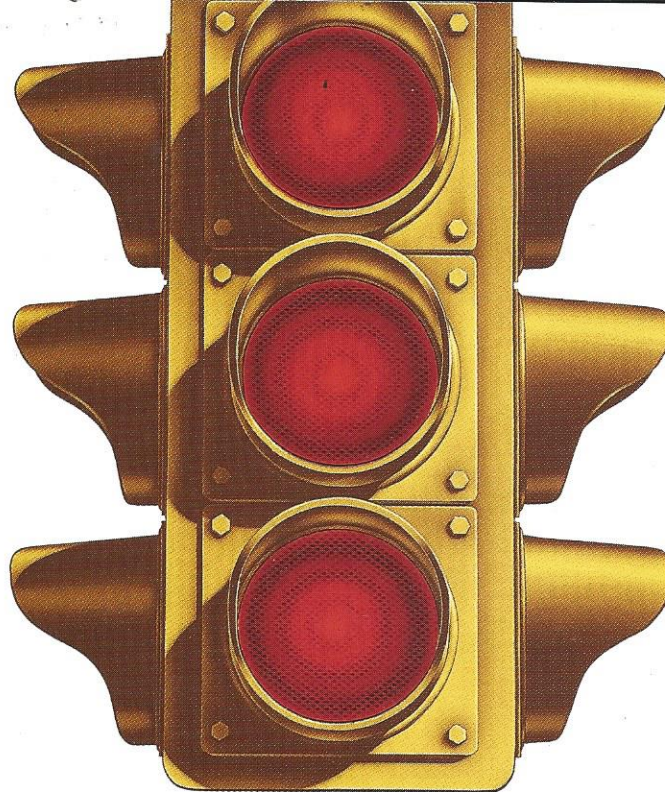
