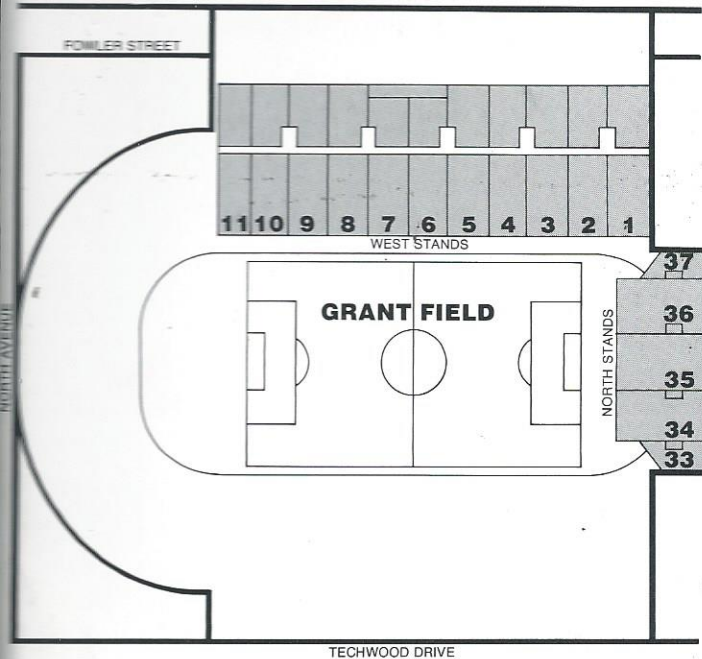
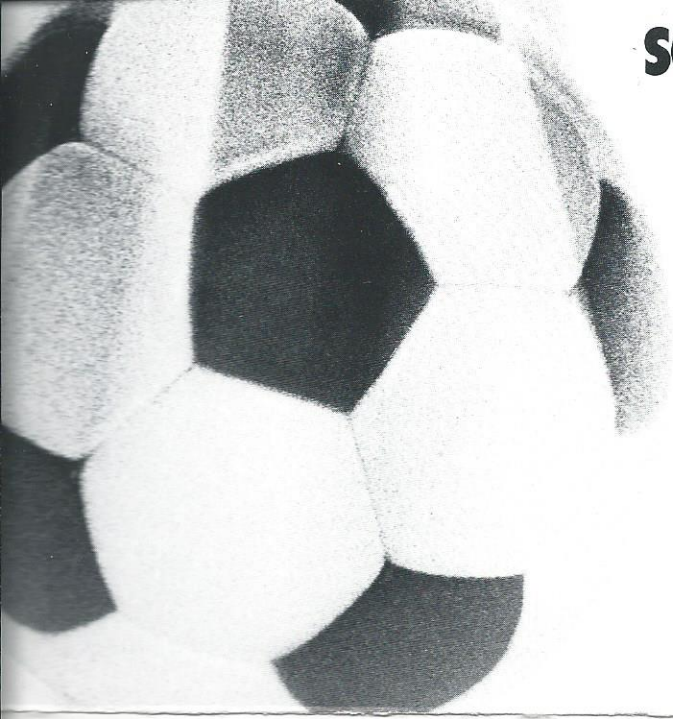

ATLANTA FINALLY HAS REACHED THE STATUS OF A TRUE INTERNATIONAL CITY.

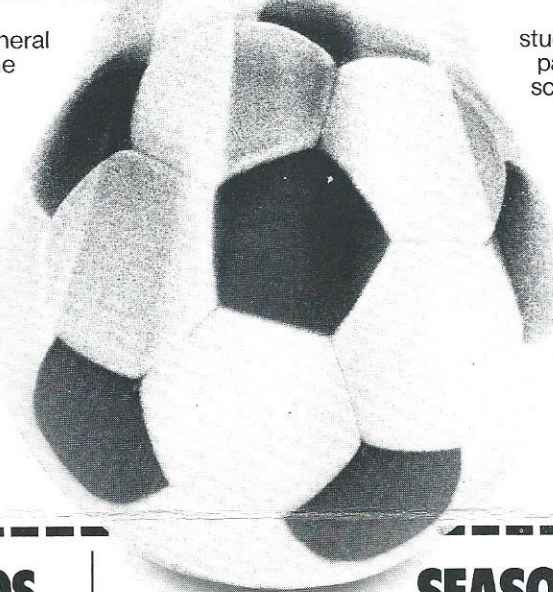
AND ATLANTA IS FINALLY READY FOR THE TRUE INTERNATIONAL SPORT.
