

1980 L.A. AZTECS SEASON RECAP

RECORD:

Aztecs finish with 20-12 record, the most successful season in the seven-year history of the club and following another record-setting season (18-12) in 1979. Aztecs establish club records for most wins (20), home wins (11), road wins (9), total points (174), home points (93), shots (688) and most consecutive games without being shut out (27). They also tie club marks for most road points (81), fewest times shut out (2), most consecutive games allowing two goals or

less (10) and most consecutive road wins (3).

OFFENSE:

Aztecs finish with 61 goals, third most in the club's history, falling shy of the club-record of 65 set in 1977. Most goals in one game was six in a 6-2 home victory over the Edmonton Drillers on June 28. The Aztecs also scored five goals against the California Surf on June 14 at the Rose Bowl. The Aztecs were shut out only twice (San Diego, 2-0; Tulsa, 1-0), and ended the season with a streak of 27 straight games without being shut out. In the Aztecs first 11 games (6-5 record) the team scored just 13 goals. In the next 10 games (8-2 record) the Aztecs scored 27 goals, with Luis Fernando scoring 14 of them. The team was involved in 21 one-goal games with a 14-7 record. In fact, nine of the Aztecs first 10 games were decided by

one goal with the team recording a 6-4 record.

DEFENSE:

Aztecs allow just 52 goals. Team records seven shutouts, second most in club history, including four times in the first 12 games of the regular season. Most goals allowed was five against Edmonton and San Diego. Most goals allowed in a half was four to those same two teams.

Did not score more than two points in any single game ... Was O-for-1 in Shootout attempts.

Started 31 of the Aztecs' 32 games ... Established club record for most games (31) and most minutes (2715) by a goalkeeper in a single season ... Finished with a goals-against average of 1.33, fourth best in the National Conference ... Recorded seven shutouts, a club record for a single season ... One of his shutouts came against the Cosmos (June 25) at Rose Bowl, ending New York's streak of 55 consecutive regular season games without being shut out ... Recorded shutouts in the first two games of the season (San Jose and Portland) and in four of the first 12 games ... At one point compiled a streak of 205:21 consecutive scoreless minutes ... Failed to stop any of the four penalty kicks taken against him ... Was 0-for-1 in Shootouts (allowing 3 of 4 against Vancouver).

Appeared in 19 games, eight as a starter ... Scored two goals and five assists for nine points ... His first goal of the season was the game-winner with just 58 seconds to play against Memphis (August 9) in a 3-2 Aztecs victory at Rose Bowl ... His other goal (August 13 against San Diego) clinched the home-field advantage for the Aztecs in the first round of the playoffs ... That goal came with just 55 seconds to play in a 5-2 Los Angeles loss ... Four of his five assists came at home, including his assist on Leo Van Veen's game-winning goal in overtime in a 2-1 win over Washington on July 4 ... Was not involved in any Shootout attempts.

Saw action in 25 games, starting 16 of them ... Scored one goal and seven assists for nine points ... Assist total was third best on the club ... Started the first 16 games of the season, scoring one goal and five assists during that time ... Had back-to-back two-assist games against Tulsa and California ... One of his assists against Tulsa came of Luis Fernando's game-winning goal ... Both his assists off the bench led to game-winning goals (Van Veen in overtime against Washington; Dangerfield in final minute against Memphis) ... Joined the Aztecs from America de Rio Preto of Brazil's First Division on April 2 ... Went on to become the third leading scorer in the National Conference with 28 goals and four assists for 60 points in just 28 games ... Established club records for most goals (career and season) with 28 and most points in a season (60) ... Had two three-goal "Hat Tricks" (California and Edmonton) ... Finished with two seven-point games (California, Edmonton) ... four four-point games (Vancouver, Tulsa, Rochester and Ft. Lauderdale), one three-point game, 13 two-point games and one one-point game ... Scored at least one point in 20 of his 28 games ... Had one streak of scoring at least one point in eight straight games (June 28-July 23), two shy of the club record ... Scored six game-winning goals, including a stretch of three consecutive games (Tulsa, California, Philadelphia) ... Established club mark for most shots in a season (178) ... Was voted NASL Player-of-the-Week for his five-goal, one-assist performances against the Roughnecks and Surf in a matter of three days ... Was 0-for-2 in Shootout attempts ... Was 3-for-3 in penalty kicks.

Came to the Aztecs from the California Sunshine of the American Soccer League (ASL) where he was the league's Most Valuable Player in 1979 ... Appeared in 19 games with the Aztecs, starting 16 of them ... Was the fourth-leading scorer on the team with five goals and six assists for 16 points ... Scored game-winning goals against Edmonton and California ... Had six-point game (two goals, two assists) against Edmonton at Rose Bowl on June 28 ... Also had two-assist outing versus Memphis in 3-2 win on August 9 ... Was NASL Player-of-the-Week runner-up to Johan Cruyff for his three-goal, two-assist week against the Cosmos and Drillers ... Was 1-for-2 in Shootout attempts.

His goals were scored against California and Memphis ... Assisted on Fernando's game-winning goal in Tampa Bay ... Other assists came against Minnesota and Memphis ... Was not involved in any Shootout attempts.

His one goal came against Edmonton in a 5-1 loss, while his only assist came against Edmonton in a 6-2 win later in the season ... His 32 games made him only the second player in Aztecs history to appear in more than 100 games in an Aztec uniform ... He has now appeared in 105 game with the Aztecs ... Has now appeared in 41 straight games ... Was 0-for-1 in Shootout attempts.

He suffered a 3-2 overtime loss to the Strikers in that game ... Appeared in 189 minutes on the season, making nine saves on 30 shots ... Finished with goals-against average of 2.38 ... His first appearance of the year came against Vancouver (April 26) when he entered the game at the 12:02 mark for an injured Anhielo ... Three minutes after coming into the game, stopped an Alan Ball penalty kick and led Aztecs to 2-1 victory ... Appeared in Shootout on national television in Toronto and allowed two goals in three attempts (Aztecs lost game).

His game-winners came against Dallas, New York, Washington and Atlanta ... His 14 assists fell just four shy of equalling the club record for most assists in a season, set by George Best in 1977 ... Assisted on game-winning goals against Rochester, Toronto and California ... Had five-point game (two goals, one assist) in a 5-1 victory over the Surf at the Rose Bowl ... Was 1-for-2 in Shootout attempts.
