NEW ENGIAND STEAMROLLERS (1-6) AT NEW YORK KNIGHTS (1-6)
Madison Square Garden June 18, 1988

THE PLAYOFF PICTURE

The 38-14 loss by the Los Angeles Cobras to the Detroit Drive on Thursday, June 16 significantly brightens the playoff chances for the Knights or the Steamrollers depending upon the outcome of tonight's contest.

A Knights' victory would move them to within a game of the fourth place Cobras in the race for the final playoff berth with four games remaining for both teams, including a head-to-head clash in Los Angeles on July 2. That game will be the third meeting between the clubs, who split their first two (New York 60 @ Los Angeles 52 on April 30 and Los Angeles 36 @ New York 22 on June 6). A New York victory in Los Angeles would give the Knights a 2-1 edge in the season series which is the first tie-breaker for a playoff berth should the clubs finish with identical records at the conclusion of the regular season. An added plus for the Knights is the Cobras schedule which concludes the season with home and home games against the still undefeated (7-0) Chicago Bruisers.

New England's playoff chances are similar to the Knights'. A Steamrollers win this evening will move them within a game of Los Angeles with four to play, including a matchup between the clubs next week on June 25 at New England. The Cobras won their first meeting, 27-20, on May 26. Should the Steamrollers defeat the Cobras in their next meeting by more than seven points and finish the season with the same record, New England would have the advantage in the second tie breaker -- head-to-head point differential.

TO-KNIGHTS GAME: Tonight marks the second and final meeting between the Knights and the Steamrollers this seeason. In their first meeting at the Providence Civic Center on May 21, New England earned their only win of the season by a score of 24-13. The game was a defensive struggle in which the teams tied the Arena Football League record for the fewest points in a game by both teams (37) while combining for only 216 total yards between them (New England - 131; New York - 85).

NEW YORK KNIGHTS UPDATE: As in the first game between these two teams, in which the Knights played without starters WR/DB Greg Best, WR/DB Stan Hunter and OL/DL A.J. Sebastianelli, injuries could be a factor tonight. New York again will be missing three starters who were injured on Monday against Chicago. WR/DB Greg Best separated his right shoulder, DB/defensive specialist Mark Streeter suffered a strained hip flexor and OL/DL Pete Walters sprained a ligament in his left knee. Returning to the lineup after missing four games is OL/DL A.J. Sebastianelli (#80), who suffered a sprained right ankle in Chicago on May 14. DB Elbert Gray may return after missing one game with a strained right hamstring. OL/DL John Reed (#55), a Long Beach City Colllege alumnus will make his NY Knights debut tonight.

In their last game, a 64-34 loss to the first place Chicago Bruisers, the Knights jumped out to a 26-10 lead early in the second quarter. However, the Bruisers rallied to extend their league record winning streak to seven games by outscoring New York 54-8 during the remainder of the game on the strength of last week's Arena Football MVP QB Ben Bennett's 22 of 35 passing for 209 yards and five TD's.

NEW ENGLAND STEAMROLLERS UPDATE: New England also has their share of physical problems tonight. They will be without the services of OL/DL Steve O'Malley who is sidelined with a sprained right knee. In addition, starting QB will be wearing a flak jacket to protect a cracked rib. Should Smith be forced to the sidelines, backup QB Paul Williams will play while battling a case of the flu. Second string WR/DB Jim Rafferty will play despite a sore neck and badly bruised right hand. OL/DL Kim Johnson (#63) from Oklahoma State is appearing in his first game with the Steamrollers.

New England is coming off of a tough loss to the Pittsburgh Gladiators (45-39) in one of the league's most exciting games ever. The Steamrollers had the ball in field goal range on Pittsburgh's nine-yard line with 27 seconds left in the fourth quarter trailing 38-36. QB Harold Smith's attempted pass for the game winning TD to the league's second leading receiver James Hockaday sailed high into the net and was intercepted by Gladiator Mike Powell who returned it for a 50-yard touchdown sealing Pittsburgh's win.

New England has lost four of their last five games by a total of 26 points and none by more than nine (Pittsburgh 45-39; Chicago 30-21; LA 27-20 and Detroit 29-24).

HOME VS. AWAY: New York Knights are 0-3 at Madison Square Garden this season having lost 54-48 to the Detroit Drive on May 9; 36-22 to the Los Angeles Cobras on June 6 and 64-34 to the Chicago Bruisers on June 13. The Knights have been outscored 154 (51.3 per game) to 104 (34.7 per game) in those three contests.

The New England Steamrollers are 0-2 on the road during the season having lost in Pittsburgh, 82-26, on May 7 and in Los Angeles, 27-20, on May 25. The Steamrollers have been outscored by their opponents 109 (54.5 per game) to 46 (23.0 per game) away from home.

Home teams have won 11 of the 22 games played (50.0%) this year while the visitors also have captured 11 (50.0%). In those contests the home team has averaged 38.9 points per game (856 total) and the visitors 36.5 (802 total).
