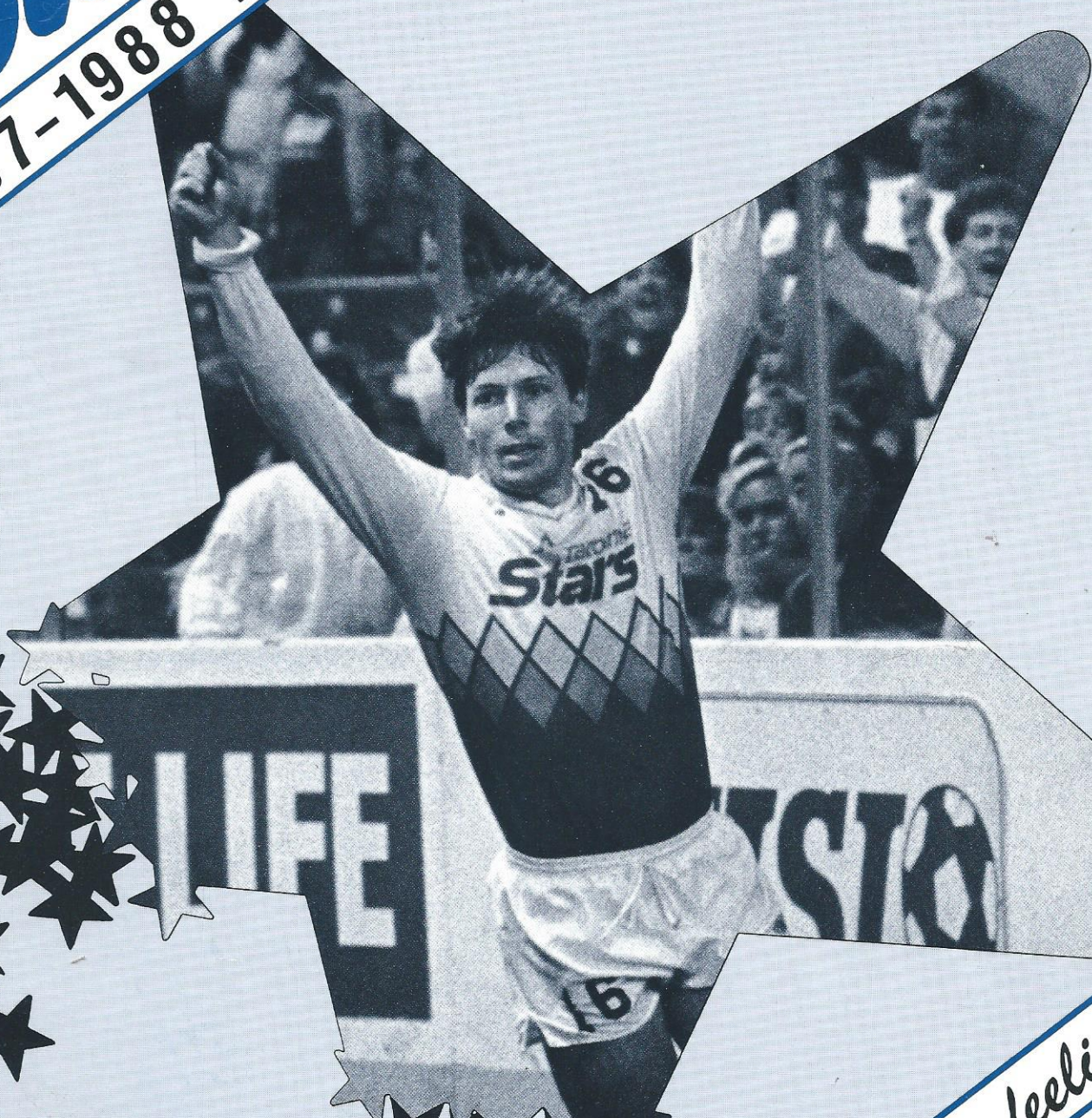

The performance of Tacoma's All-Stars had to have inspired their teammates. Who, tonight, must dust themselves off and start a run for the playoffs.

And it won't be an easy start. Down there on the pitch, in their simulated bee suits, are the feared Sting.

No, not Paul Newman and Robert Redford. The Chicago Sting.

Who come with their own All-Stars. Like Vaccaro, and their one-name guy, Batata, and Pato Margetic, he of the long hair—a Samson of soccer.

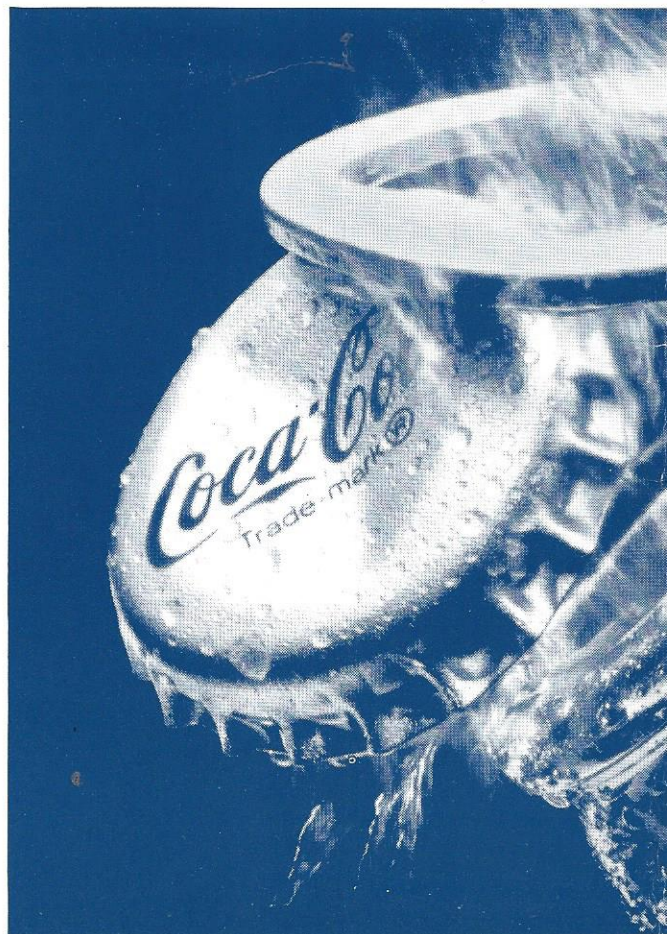

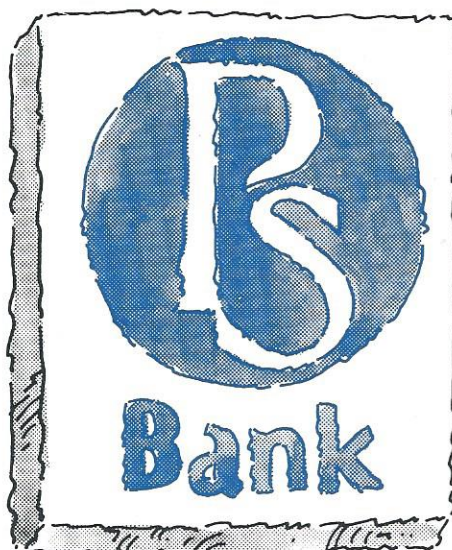
