STING TAKE ON COSMOS IN RUBBER MATCH

The Chicago Sting and the New York Cosmos will meet for the third time this season in the rubber match of the season three game series. Each team has a victory at home; the Cosmos winning here 14-10 and the Sting taking a 6-3 verdict in Chicago in their last meeting.

In that game a new NASL record crowd of 18,374 was in attendance. Sting trailed 1-0 at the end of the first quarter as the Cosmos played a very patient and defensive game. Chicago was able to break down the Cosmos defense for three second quarter goals (Koutsoukos, Margetic, and Glenn) for a 3-1 halftime lead.

The Sting scored three unanswered third quarter goals to take a 6-1 lead as Karl-Heinz Granitza scored twice while Derek Spalding added a solo goal. The Cosmos came back to score two fourth quarter goals, but the game was never in doubt at that point as Chicago came away with a 6-3 win.

Sting defender Derek Spalding did a tremendous job marking Giorgio Chinaglia. In the first meeting Chinaglia had 7 goals and 1 assist for 15 points. In the last game with Spalding on Chinaglia, Giorgio failed to get a single point.

In one of the most physical games of the season, the Tulsa Roughnecks outscored the Chicago Sting 10-6 last Saturday night. From the onset, it looked as if the last thing the Roughnecks wanted to do was play soccer. Instead, they se out to physically abuse the Sting. That type of rough house tactics set the tempo for the entire game.

Chicago took an early 2-0 lead when Tasso Koutsoukos scored his 11th goal of the season and Charlie Fajkus scored on a beautiful give and go with Pato Margetic. However, the Roughnecks stormed back on goals by Tim Twellman and a pair by Chris McGrath to take a 3-2 lead after one quarter.

Tasso Koutsoukos scored his second goal of the game to knot the score at 3-3 Tulsa came back on goals by Laurie Abrahams and Victor Moreland to take a 5-3 lead. Ingo Peter pulled the Sting to within one at 10:10 of the second quarter and the score remained 5-4 at halftime.

Joe Morrone put Tulsa up by two goals in the third quarter but Bret Hall got that one back late in the quarter to cut the Tulsa lead to 6-5. With just 4 seconds remaining in the third quarter Chris McGrath scored his third goal of the game to give Tulsa a 7-5 lead.

The Roughnecks continued their assault on the Sting and then even decided to play a little soccer. Goals by Barry Wallace and Walter Schlothauer in an 18 second span extended the Roughnecks lead to 9-5. Chicago's Derek Spalding then scored the most beautiful goal of the game as he raced the length of the field to score a shorthanded goal to cut the lead to 9-6. Chicago then pulled Keeper Jim Brown in favor of a sixth attacker. However, Walter Schlothauer scored an empty net goal to make the final score 10-6.

Fortunately for all concerned, the Tulsa fiasco was over.
