Logan Hunter, a native of Northern California, received a football scholarship from Brigham Young University in 1970. He was the leading receiver in the WAC his senior year at BYU. After completing their education, Hunter and his wife returned to California to work in sales and marketing and start their family.

STEVE VIDETICH general manager



Steve Videtich enters his third year as the General Manager of the Utah Blaze. Videtich manages all of the team's football operations. He also oversees ticket sales, sponsorship fulfillment and AFL compliance. Videtich's front office experience includes time spent with the New York/New Jersey MetroStars and the AFL's Office of Corporate Sponsorships and Licensing.

Prior to becoming General Manager, Videtich was considered one of the AFL's top kickers. His kicking career spanned 13 seasons (1996-2008). He played for the Florida Bobcats, New Jersey Red Dogs, Milwaukee Mustangs, New Jersey/ Las Vegas Gladiators, and Columbus Destroyers,

before rounding out his career with the Utah Blaze. In the inaugural season of the Utah Blaze (2006), Videtich became the all-time leader in kicking points with 1,381. He would later finish his career with 1,594. Videtich ranks second in league history for PAT's made (1,082) and field goals made (182). He holds the AFL career record for consecutive PAT's made (76), and was a two-time AFL Kicker of the Year (1997, 2002) and three-time second-team All-AFL selection (1998, 2000, 2003).

Videtich was a three-sport athlete at Ledford Senior High School in Thomasville, NC. He was a four-time soccer MVP in high school. He attended North Carolina State University, where he was a two-time All-ACC selection (1993, 1994) and a second-team All-American (1994). He graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Industrial Engineering. Videtich currently resides in West Jordan with his wife, Carolyn, and two children: Thomas and Emelia.

In his free time, Steve enjoys playing golf and watching college football.

KARL BATES

Karl Bates enters his second season as Director of Player Personnel for the Blaze. He oversees all aspects of scouting and roster management for the team. With a seven-year AFL playing career on his resume, Bates brings an abundance of first-hand experience to the front office.

Bates began his playing career at Middle Tennessee State University, but transferred to Kentucky Wesleyan College in 1997, where he was mentored by current Blaze Head Coach Ron James. In his senior season, Bates earned firstteam All-American honors after setting a singleseason school record for tackles for loss (24.0) that still stands. He's one of just six players in school history to have his jersey retired.

After his collegiate career, Bates was reunited with his college position coach Ron James when he signed with the AFL's Houston ThunderBears in 2000. In two seasons with the ThunderBears as an offensive and defensive lineman, Bates delivered 25.0 tackles, one pass breakup, one fumble recovery and two receptions for 16 yards.

Bates joined the New Jersey Gladiators in 2002 and returned to the team the following season after the franchise moved to Las Vegas. Bates signed with the Detroit Fury in 2004 and scored the first offensive touchdown of his career, as he hauled in a five-yard scoring strike from quarterback Andy Kelly.

In 2005, Bates re-signed with the Gladiators for his third stint with the franchise. Following the AFL season, he went to Europe and served as a player-coach for the Rosklide Kings of the Danish American Football Federation.

Bates' final AFL campaign came in 2006 as a member of the San Jose SaberCats. The team reached the American Conference Championship before falling to the Chicago Rush, who eventually won Arena Bowl XX. Bates had the most productive season of his career, as he registered 22.0 tackles with a personal-best 5.0 sacks and one pass breakup.

Bates has a combined eight years of coaching experience, as he often coached during the AFL's offseason. He became one of the youngest defensive coordinators in college football history when he was hired at Kentucky Wesleyan College in 2000 at the age of 22. Bates held the position for three seasons from 2000-02. He coached at Seminole High School from 2003-04, serving as Offensive/Defensive Line Coach for the varsity program and Defensive Coordinator for the junior varsity squad. He returned to Europe in 2008 and served as a Head Coach in the Danish American Football League for the Roskilde Kings (2008) and the Hvidorvre Stars (2009-10).

Born and raised in St. Petersburg, FL., Bates attended Seminole High School, where he was a four-year letterman in varsity football and track. In his free time, he enjoys relaxing with his loyal dog of nine years, Harley.

MIKE DIJULIO director of communications



Michael Dijulio enters his first year with the Utah Blaze as the Director of Communications. He manages all communications efforts including team publication content, publicity, credentialing, community relations, web content and broadcasting.

Before joining the Blaze, Dijulio served as the chief research analyst for Scouting Services, Inc. In 2010, he became just the second person since 1968 to co-author "The NFL Draft Report," a publication provided by the National Football League headquarters to the media and league public relations departments in preparation for the NFL Draft. He's also had many articles

published on Scout.com and Fox Sports.

Dijulio attended Washington State University and Bellevue College. He broke into the professional sports industry as a programming intern at a Seattle-based sports radio station.

RON JAMES PRESIDENT/HEAD COACH

Ron James is a 27-year coaching veteran that has earned the respect of his peers and players due to his straightforward, no-nonsense approach. He is known as a strong motivator who demands the utmost level of effort and intensity from his players and staff. James was introduced as the third head coach in Utah Blaze history on July 9, 2008 and enters his fifth season with the organization, as well as his 15th in the Arena Football League. He was named President of the organization on September 29. 2011, and will oversee all general operations.

Under James' guidance, the Blaze turned in the most successful season in franchise history in 2011. The team won a franchise-record nine regular season games and boasted one of the most potent offensive units in the league. Utah produced the AFL's top passing offense (301.2 vpg) while ranking third in total offense (318.2 ypg) and scoring offense (60.1 ppg). The Blaze narrowly missed a playoff berth, losing a tiebreaker for the final spot during the last week of the season.

James began his career with the Blaze in 2007, coaching the offensive and defensive lines under Head Coach Danny White. The following season, he coached both lines and served as Director of Player Personnel. James played an integral role in acquiring and developing Blaze DE Maurice Fountain, who was named to the AFL All-Rookie Team in 2008 and is now a member of the Philadelphia Eagles.

Prior to his tenure with the Blaze. James coached for the AFL's Las Vegas Gladiators. From 2002-04, he served as Assistant Head Coach while also leading the offensive and defensive lines. James also coached the special teams unit and developed one the most dangerous return specialists in AFL history in Sedrick Robinson. Under James' tutelage, Robinson had a breakout campaign in 2003, as he gained 1,743 yards with four touchdowns on

78 kickoff returns. Robinson would end his nine-year AFL career as the league's all-time leader in touchdown returns (30).

James was promoted to head coach of the Gladiators in 2005 and held the position for two seasons. His 2005 Gladiators team led the AFL in total offense and total defense. James' squad shattered 14 team records in the process, including new franchise seasonhighs for passing yards (4,664) and total yards (4,996).

From 1999-01, James coached the offensive and defensive lines while serving as Director of Player Personnel for the Houston ThunderBears. He got his start in the AFL as an assistant coach with the Albany Firebirds in 1990.

In addition to his AFL career, James has a combined 14 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level. Most recently, he was an assistant coach at the United States Military Academy at West Point (Army) from 1998-2000 under Bob Sutton (1998). He helped the team make the transition from Division I-A Independent to Conference USA, and coached light weight football at the academy while also serving as Admissions Support Officer. To this day, he still cites the annual Army-Navy game as the greatest rivalry in college football.

James was an assistant coach at Kentucky Wesleyan College for Randy Awrey (1993) and John Johnson (1994-97). He first joined the staff as the Offensive Line Coach in 1993, but was promoted to Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator from 1994-97. Under James' leadership, Wesleyan LB Brian Seider was named the National Defensive Player of the Year and an All-American in 1997. James also mentored current Blaze Director of Player Personnel Karl Bates, who earned All-American status at Wesleyan during the 1999 season.

From 1992-93, James served as the Defensive Coordinator at Hartwick College (NY). Hartwick re-established its football program in 1992 after not fielding a team for 40 yards. The Hawks turned in a 1-7 record during their first year back, but engineered a dramatic turnaround the following season, posting a 4-3-1 mark in 1993.

James began his coaching career at Siena College, serving as the Linebackers Coach and Strength and Conditioning Coach from 1986-89, as well as the Head Coach for the Junior Varsity program in 1988. His was then hired as the Defensive Coordinator for St. Lawrence University from 1990-92. At age 25, James became one of the youngest defensive coordinators in all of college football.

James is well known in football circles as a highly qualified identifier of player talent. He has assisted several NFL scouting departments in procuring talent and has attained championship rings for his role in their successful seasons.

During his playing career, James was a four-year starter at offensive tackle for Siena College and also saw action at defensive tackle. He garnered NCFA All-American first-team accolades and was a two-time first-team All-Conference selection. He earned a Bachelor's of Arts from Siena and an MPA from Rockefeller College.

A native of Albany, NY, Coach James is married to his wife, Lynn. They have a son, Brady and a daughter, Alexis. MEDIA

HC/Offensive Coordinator (2011-present) Matthew Sauk's offensive success on the field is unparalleled. He begins his second season with the Utah Blaze as the Offensive Coordinator and Assistant Head Coach after producing phenomenal results in his inaugural campaign.

In Sauk's first season with the Blaze, he was named the NFL Network's Assistant Coach of the Year after leading one of the AFL's most explosive offensive units. Utah boasted the top passing offense in the league, averaging an impressive 301.2 aerial yards per game. The team also ranked third in scoring offense (60.1 ppg), total offense (318.2 ypg) and passing efficiency (117.3).

Under Sauk's tutelage, Blaze QB Tommy Grady enjoyed a career year in 2011. Grady started the first 15 games of the season and was on pace to shatter AFL passing record before suffering a season-ending injury. Still, Grady tied Joe Germaine's single-season Blaze record with 107 touchdown passes—a mark that ranks fifth in AFL history. He finished as a strong candidate for the league's National Guard MVP of the Year Award, and placed third in passing yards (291.0 per game) and passing efficiency (120.0).

Sauk set multiple collegiate records while attending Utah State from 1996 -97, and still ranks in the top five for passing yards in a career and season. As a senior, he earned second-team All-Big West honors while leading the Aggies to the Humanitarian Bowl.

Sauk began his professional playing career

with the Nashville Kats of the AFL in 2000, learning the quarterback craft behind arena legend, Andy Kelly. He signed with the Tennessee Valley Vipers of the af2 the following season and was named the league's Rookie of the Year after setting several team and league records.

Sauk signed with Los Angeles Avengers of the AFL in 2002 and passed for 61 yards with one touchdown as the backup to Tony Graziani. He re-joined the af2 from 2003-05, returning to the Tennessee Valley Vipers in 2003. Sauk's greatest success came as a member of the Louisville Fire from 2004-05. He earned Offensive Player of the Year accolades in 2005 while toppling single-season af2 records for touchdown passes (99),

completions and passing yards. In the postseason, he broke a singlegame playoff record with 10 passing touchdowns. The season culminated in an American Conference Championship and a berth in ArenaCup VI.

Sauk returned to the AFL in 2006 and signed with the Philadelphia Soul, where he was teammates with current Blaze Defensive Coordinator Michael Brown. He served as the backup to Tony Graziani for the second time in his career and passed for a career-high 1,046 yards with 20 touchdowns and just three interceptions while completing a teambest 65.7 percent of his attempts. In 2007, he signed with the Grand Rapids Rampage and threw for 686 yards with 12 touchdowns.

Sauk began his coaching career in 2008, joining the Spokane Shock of the af2 as Quarterbacks/Wide Receivers Coach. He developed rookie QB Nick Davila, who set single-season team records after throwing for 2,935 yards and 66 touchdowns. Midway through the season, Sauk returned to the field for the final time in his playing career, suiting up for the AFL's Arizona Rattlers. He threw for 928 yards and delivered AFL career-best marks with 21 passing touchdowns and a 107.17 passer efficiency rating. He rejoined the Shock staff at the conclusion of the AFL season and helped guide the teams through the playoffs to an ArenaCup IX berth.

After a long playing career, Sauk spent the 2009 season away from football. He concluded

his career with over 17,000 passing yards and 345 touchdowns, and was inducted in the af2 Hall of Fame in 2009.

Sauk returned to the Shock staff in 2010 as Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Coordinator. He mentored rookie QB Kyle Rowley, who threw for career-bests with 4,475 yards and 102 touchdowns. Sauk's offense placed third in the AFL in scoring (61.4 ppg), as well as fifth in total offense (311.1 ypg) and passing offense (298.3 ypg). The Shock posted a 13-3 record and won Arena Bowl XXIII, as Rowley earned Arena Bowl MVP honors.

Sauk and his wife, Michele, have three children, Aysha, Trinity and Xavier. MEDIA

MICHAEL BROWN DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Michael Brown is in his first season with the Utah Blaze as the team's Defensive Coordinator. He was hired by the Blaze on November 2, 2011 after enjoying a decorated nine-year playing career in the Arena Football League. Brown strives to build a defensive unit that dominates the opposition without mercy and prides itself on toughness, both in a mental and physical capacity. He instills in his players the belief that they must be willing to sacrifice and "lay it on the line" for their teammates on and off the field.

Following a standout career as a defensive back at Charleston Southern University, Brown played two seasons with the Charleston Swamp Foxes of the af2 (2002-03) before beginning his AFL career. He joined the Orlando Predators from 2004-05 and in his first two seasons, collected 50.0 tackles, four pass breakups, two interceptions, one forced fumble and one safety. He also gained 284 yards with two touchdowns on 22 receptions and added 67 yards with six more scores on 20 rushing attempts.

From 2006-08, Brown played for the Philadelphia Soul. He made an instant impact on both sides of the ball and was named to the All-Ironman Team in his first year with the organization. Brown delivered 45.5 tackles with four interceptions, three pass breakups and two forced fumbles. He placed second on the team with 80 receptions for 961 yards and 13 touchdowns, adding 101 yards with four scores on 35 carries. Brown also provided a spark on special teams, returning 43 kickoffs for 881 yards and two touchdowns.

In his second season with the Soul, Brown delivered 67.0 tackles, six interceptions, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery. He caught eight passes for 94 yards and one touchdown while also rushing twice for two yards and another score. Brown added 932 yards another touchdown on 47 kickoff returns.

Brown received the Al Lucas Hero Award in 2008 for his contributions as a player and in the community. On the field, he recorded 41.5 tackles, eight pass breakups, five interceptions, four fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles. He notched career-best numbers as a kickoff returner, gaining 1,110 yards with three touchdowns on 61 kickoff returns. Brown helped the Soul claim an AFL Championship, as Philadelphia defeated the San Jose SaberCats in Arena Bowl XXII.

During the league hiatus, Brown returned to his hometown of Gaithersburg, Maryland, He served as a coach at his alma mater, Watkins Mill High School, for two seasons. Brown

Brown returned to the Arena Football League in 2010 as a member of the Oklahoma City Yard Dawgz, where he was teammates with current Blaze QB Tommy Grady and DB David Hyland. Brown's experience afforded him a rare opportunity, as the coaching staff granted him the power to call defensive plays. Brown mentored the younger defensive backs on the team while also contributing 49.0 tackles, five pass breakups, two interceptions and one forced fumble.

Brown re-joined the Philadelphia Soul for his final season in 2011 and again was given the ability to call defensive plays. With Brown's veteran leadership, the Soul finished third in the AFL in pass defense, allowing just 253.7 aerial yards per game. He recorded

61.0 tackles, two pass breakups and a careerhigh eight interceptions, returning one for a touchdown. He also caught six passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns, and added 409 yards on 24 kickoff returns.

Brown concluded his playing career in the AFL with impressive numbers, as he tallied 314.0 tackles, 27 interceptions, 25 pass breakups, six forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries. Offensively, he collected 1,468 yards and 18 touchdowns on 118 receptions while adding 170 yards and 11 scores on 58 carries. Brown also posted 3,457 yards and six touchdowns on 180 kickoff returns.

Off the field, Brown enjoys spending time with his wife, Demetria, and their son Michael Brown, Jr.

RON MCBRIDE **OFFENSIVE LINE COACH**

On February 13, 2012, Ron McBride announced he would end a 97-day retirement and return to the gridiron to coach the offensive line for the Utah Blaze. Over a long and storied college career, he coached over 70 future National Football League players, including NFL All-Pros in Jamal Anderson (Atlanta Falcons), Luther Ellis (Detroit Lions), Steve Smith (Carolina Panthers) and Jordan Gross (Carolina Panthers). McBride is a college football legend in the state of Utah and brings 46 years of invaluable experience to the staff.

McBride served as head coach of the Weber State Wildcats for seven seasons from 2004-2011. He compiled a 43-28 overall record that included two NCAA FCS Playoff appearances. McBride's signature season at WSU came in 2008, when he led the Wildcats to their first Big Sky Conference Championship in 40 years. He arrived at Weber State after coaching the inside linebackers at the University of Kentucky during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

"Coach Mac" is best known for revitalizing the football program at the University of Utah during his 13 seasons as head coach (1990-2002). Prior to his hiring, Utah had reached bowl games just three times in 97 years. Yet in just his third season leading the program, McBride took the Utes to their first bowl appearance since 1964.

Under McBride's guidance, Utah achieved its first 10-win season in school history in 1994 and reached its highest post-season ranking to that point, climbing to No. 8 in the USA Today/ESPN Poll and No. 10 in the Associated Press Poll. McBride concluded his tenure at Utah with 88 victories—a mark that still stands as the secondmost wins by a coach in school history (88-63 overall record).

In April of 2008. Coach Mac was honored by the Utah Football Coaches Association and presented with the first ever Lifetime

Achievement Award for his contributions to football in the state of Utah.

McBride's coaching career began at his alma mater, San Jose State, where he coached the freshman team in 1965 while also serving as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. He joined Piedmont Hills High School (San Jose, CA) as the defensive coordinator from 1966-68 before returning to the college ranks as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Gavilan Junior College (1969-71).

Coach Mac would serve as offensive coordinator under Wayne Howard for the next 10 seasons, beginning in 1972 at UC Riverside. The duo moved on to Long Beach State from 1974-76, where they compiled a 23-10 record. McBride later followed Howard to the University of Utah in 1977 for his first stint with the program. He remained with the Utes for six seasons until leaving for the University of Wisconsin, where he coached the offensive line in 1983 and 1984.

When Jim Fassel was named head coach at Utah in 1985, he hired McBride as the offensive line coach, marking his second tenure with the Utes. In 1987, he left to take the same position at the University of Arizona under Dick Tomey before being promoted to assistant head coach in 1989.

BLAZE BLOW OUT STORM IN HOME OPENER, 72-36

SALT LAKE CITY— The Utah Blaze blew out the Tampa Bay Storm, 72-36, in front of 10,077 on Tim Dahle field at EnergySolutions Arena. The Blaze handed the Storm their second worst road-loss in team history, the first being a 39 point deficit to the Orlando Predators, 53-13, in 2006.

"It was good to get our first win under our belt tonight and get out all of those first game jitters," said Head Coach Ron James. "There are some things we need to improve on next week for Orlando but this was a great test of our young team's adversity."

Tampa Bay put the first points on the board with a successful 30-yard field goal by K Kyle Chilton (5-11, 185, Pikeville). Former Ute QB Tommy Grady (6-7, 245, Utah) responded with a sixyard touchdown pass to WR Alvance Robinson (5-9, 165, Alabama State). The teams exchanged another touchdown each to finish off the first quarter of play in the Blaze's home opener, 10-13.

The Blaze pulled ahead in the second quarter with Grady connecting with veteran WR Aaron Boone (6-3, 215, Kentucky) and rookie WR Ernie Pierce (6-3, 215, Kansas) for touchdowns. FB Ben Stallings (5-11, 263, Delta State) also tallied a six-yard touchdown run.

Utah's defense emerged in the third quarter with a key interception by DB William Mulder (6-0, 190, Campbellsville) and consistent pressure on the quarterback from the defensive line. The Blaze outscored the Storm 14-7, leading the Storm 43-30 as they entered the final quarter.

The Blaze continued to dominate throughout the fourth quarter, tallying four touchdowns to the Storm's one.

DB Labrose Hedgemon (5-10, 185, Jackson State) led the defense with 7.5 total tackles while Boone led the receiving corp with 11 catches for 135 yards and two touchdowns.

Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game honors went to Grady in his Utah debut. Grady finished the night completing 29-of-39 passes for 306 yards and seven touchdowns.

Mulder earned Riddell Defensive Player of the Game honors after tallying 6.0 total tackles, four pass breakups, one fumble recovery and one interception.

BLAZE FALL TO PREDATORS, 68-53

ORLANDO, FL—The Utah Blaze (1-1) fell to the Orlando Predators (2-0), 68-53, Saturday night at Amway Arena in front of 12,186 fans. The Predators now lead the series 2-1.

"We are trying to build a solid team and week in and week out you want the effort and execution to be at a high level," said Head Coach Ron James. "Unfortunately, we just aren't there yet being a young team, but it's a long season and we'll rectify it this week in practice in preparations for Dallas."

AFL Commissioner Jerry Kurz and Denver Broncos QB Tim Tebow were on hand for the Predators opening night in the new Amway Arena.

The Predators tallied the first score of the evening with a 20-yard touchdown pass to WR Bobby Sippio (6-3, 215, Western Kentucky). Sippio made his AFL return after being placed on League Suspension following an altercation with a fan in the stands during a game. Blaze QB Tommy Grady (6-7, 245, Utah) connected with veteran WR Aaron Boone (6-3, 215, Kentucky) on an eight-yard touchdown pass for Utah's first score of the night. After another Orlando strike, Utah's defense made a key turnover with a forced fumble by DB William Mulder (6-0, 190, Campbellsville) that was recovered by LB Mike Lewis (6-3, 250, Adrian College) However, Orlando's defense turned up the pressure as the guarter ended, holding the Blaze to 13-21.

Utah continued to struggle throughout the second quarter with the exception of Boone's 100th career touchdown with only 35 seconds remaining. K John Wehrle's (6-0, 200, Marshall) kick was blocked, sending the teams to the locker room with the Predators leading, 37-19.

The Blaze scored on the first drive of the third quarter with a four-yard touchdown strike from Grady to Boone, closing the gap to 10 points. Utah outscored the Predators 14-7, but it wasn't enough for the Blaze to catch-up, entering the final quarter of play trailing, 33-44.

Orlando opened up the fourth quarter with a 34-yard touchdown pass from GB Nick Hill (6-3, 215, Southern Illinois) to WR TT Toliver (6-0, 185, Bethune-Cookman). The Predator's were unrelenting after LB Rayshaun Kizer (5-10, 192, Walsh) returned an interception for a touchdown. Despite Grady and Boone connecting on three touchdowns in the fourth quarter the Blaze couldn't capture their first road win.

Grady finished the night completing 31-of-49 passes for 318 yards, eight touchdowns and three interceptions. Boone tallied 12 receptions for 91 yards and six touchdowns, while WR Ernie Pierce (6-3, 215, Kansas) recorded 12 receptions for 138 yards and one touchdown. Mulder led

the defense with 9.0 total tackles, one forced fumble, one interception and one sack.

BLAZE HAND VIGILANTES FIRST LOSS OF SEASON, 69-40

SALT LAKE CITY— The Utah Blaze (2-1) blew out the Dallas Vigilantes (2-1), 69-40, in front of 7,163 on Tim Dahle field at EnergySolutions Arena. QB Tommy Grady (6-7, 245, Utah) and WR Aaron Boone (6-3, 215, Kentucky) both made team history in the team's second home victory of the season.

"I thought our defense was great tonight, that's what made the difference," said Head Coach Ron James. "I told our guys at halftime that if they came up with one more turnover we would put this game away, and they came through. This is a great confidence builder as we head into San Jose next week."

The Blaze were first to put points on the board with a five-yard toss from Grady to WR Ernie Pierce (6-3, 215, Kansas). Dallas responded with a strong drive of their own, ending in an eight-yard touchdown pass from QB Dan Raughbaugh (5-10, 175, Miami) to WR Tiger Jones (5-11, 195 Louisville). The quarter ended with the teams tied, 7-7.

The Blaze started the second quarter with a one-yard rushing touchdown from FB Ben Stallings (5-11, 263, Delta State) to capture the lead. The teams traded touchdowns, keeping the game within one possession until the final minutes of the half. With 48 seconds left, Blaze DL Devon Hicks (6-1, 275, NWMississippi) forced and recovered a fumble, giving the Blaze one last opportunity to extend their lead. Grady converted on a 13-yard touchdown pass

to WR Alvance Robinson (5-9, 165, Alabama State), extending the lead to 14 as the teams entered the locker room, 34-20.

Dallas opened the second half with a one-yard rushing touchdown by FB Derrick Ross (6-3, 204, Tarleon State), but missed the extra point. Utah finished the quarter by scoring three unanswered touchdowns, putting the game out of reach.

At the end of the third quarter Grady hit WR Aaron Boone (6-3, 215, Kentucky) for a 35 yard touchdown pass, giving Grady over 300 passing yards for the game, making him the first Blaze QB to have three straight games with 300 yards or more since 2007.

The fourth quarter began with a 29-point lead for the Blaze, which was the final difference in the game, giving the Blaze their second victory of the season at home.

Boone finished the game with 13 receptions for 226 yards and two touchdowns. His 226 receiving yards are the second most for a single-game in team history, earning him Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game. DB AI Phillips (5-11, 190, Wagner) earned Riddell Defensive Player of the game honors for tallying total tackles, one fumble recovery and

total tackles, one fumble recovery and one interception. DB Labrose Hedgemon (5-10, 185, Jackson State) led the team with 5.5 total tackles, one forced fumble and one interception.

BLAZE LOSE DIVISION CONTEST ON THE ROAD, 75-55

SALT LAKE CITY— The Utah Blaze (2-2) lost their first divisional contest to the San Jose SaberCats (3-2) in front of 8,763 fans at the HP Pavilion Friday night, 75-55. This marks the team's second-consecutive loss on the road.

Eleven-year AFL veteran QB Mark Grieb (6-2, 200, UC Davis) started out the scoring for the evening with 3-yard handoff to FB Chad Cook (6-1, 263, Murray State). Blaze QB Tommy Grady (6-7, 245, Utah) responded with 14-yard touchdown pass to WR Ernie Pierce (6-3, 215, Kansa). The teams exchanged another touchdown before ending the first quarter of play tied, 14-14.

DL Gabe Long (6-3, 290, Utah) turned up the heat at the start of the second quarter, sacking Grieb on the second play of their first drive. San Jose K Juan Gamboa (5-8, 195, Sacramento State) missed two consecutive extra points early in the quarter, giving the Blaze a two-point advantage. However, the Blaze failed to hold on to the lead following a missed opportunity with an onside kick and turnover on downs. The teams entered the locker rooms at half with San Jose leading, 40-28.

San Jose kept up the pressure during Utah's first possession of the third quarter with a quarterback sack and another turnover on downs. The SaberCats started their first drive of the quarter on Utah's 10-yard line, setting them up for a 9-yard touchdown pass from Grieb to WR Samora Goodson (6-3, 205, Southeast Missouri). Utah's offense sparked momentarily on their second possession with a 30-yard touchdown pass from Grady to second-team All-Arena WR Aaron Boone (6-3, 215, Kentucky).

Despite a 55-yard kickoff returned for a touchdown by WR Alvance Robinson (5-9, 165, Alabama State) with 28 seconds remaining in the final quarter, the Blaze was unable to close the gap, falling 75-55 to the SaberCats.

Grady finished the night completing 27-of-48 passes for 321 yards, six touchdowns and one interception, keeping him on track to break former Blaze QB Joe Germaine's record of passing for over 300 yards in five consecutive games. Boone led the receiving corp with 11 receptions for 147 yards and three touchdowns. DB William Mulder (6-0, 190, Campbellsville) led the defense with 7.5 total tackles.

BLAZE STUN SHOCK IN THIRD HOME VICTORY, 69-62

SALT LAKE CITY - The Utah Blaze held off the defending ArenaBowl XXIII Champion Spokane Shock, 69-62, in a game that came down to the final play, in front of 7,649 fans at EnergySolutions Arena.

"The guys made some big plays for us tonight," said Head Coach Ron James after the victory. "I felt our execution was great tonight, and that's the hallmark of a good team. Now we have to use that going forward, and continue to execute in practice as we prepare for our next game at Arizona."

The Blaze opened up the scoring for the night with an eight-yard touchdown pass from QB Tommy Grady (6-7, 245, Utah) to veteran WR Aaron Boone (6-3, 215, Kentucky). The Shock answered back with a touchdown of their own on a seven-yard pass from QB Kyle Rowley (6-1, 205, Brown) to WR Shaun Kauleinamoku (5-10,185, Western Oregon). Blaze FB Ben Stallings (5-11, 263, Delta State) tallied another score on three-yard rushing touchdown, extending the Blaze's lead 13-7 to end the quarter.

On the opening drive of the second quarter, Blaze LB Michael Lewis (6-3, 250, Adrian College) recovered a fumble, setting the stage for the Blaze to deepen the gap. On the ensuing drive, Grady hit Boone for a 14-yard reception, breaking the all-time Blaze record for receiving yards, surpassing former Blaze WR Siaha Burley. Grady struck again with a 10-yard touchdown pass to WR Aaron Lesue (5-10, 195, Utah State). After a successful PAT, the fans rewarded Boone with a standing ovation for his new record. At the end of the half, the Blaze held a 34-21 lead.

Each of the teams exchanged a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter, entering the final quarter of play with the Blaze leading, 45-38.

The Blaze recovered a failed onside kick from the Shock resulting in a seven-yard return for a touchdown by WR Ernie Pierce (6-3, 215, Kansas), giving the Blaze a 13-point lead in the final quarter of play. With the final Blaze touchdown of the game, Boone tied the Blaze all-time career record in touchdowns with 93. With less than one minute remaining, the Blaze had possession of the ball and a seven-point lead, but Spokane stopped them on downs, giving them the ball with three seconds to go. Rowley threw a desperation pass with no time remaining, but it fell incomplete and the Blaze held on for the win, 69-62.

Grady finished the night completing 26-of-33 passes for 245 yards and six touchdowns. Boone led the receiving core with 10 catches for 100 yards and three touchdowns, breaking the Blaze all-time career record for receiving yards as well

BLAZE BIT BY RATTLERS IN OVERTIME, 67-61

PHOENIX - The Utah Blaze (3-3) fell to the Arizona Rattlers (6-0), 67-61, in overtime in front of 8,717 fans at US Airways Center. Arizona extended their undefeated record to six in a nail-biting divisional match-up.

"Tonight we went toe-to-toe with the best team in the league and pushed them to overtime," said Head Coach Ron James. "They simply made one key defensive play in overtime and that was the difference."

Arizona opened up the scoring for the evening with four-yard touchdown pass from QB Nick Davila (6-3, 210, Cincinnati) to WR Kerry Reed (6-2, 205, Michigan State), the Blaze almost came up with an interception but the ball was tipped into Reed's hands. The Blaze answered back with a 27yard touchdown pass from QB Tommy Grady (6-7, 245, Utah) to WR Alvance Robinson (5-9, 165, Alabama State).

The Blaze continued to match the Rattler's scoring in the second quarter of play with another touchdown to Robinson. Utah went on to outscore Arizona 26-20 in the quarter, despite two failed extra points by K Greg Gundersen (6-0, 190, Wayne State). A key interception in the end zone by DB Brandon Taylor (5-11, 195, New Hampshire) halted the Rattlers with only seconds remaining. The team's entered the locker room with Arizona on top, 34-33.

Utah picked up their first lead of the game on a five-yard touchdown reception by Robinson. On the ensuing Rattler's drive, Taylor returned a fumble to Arizona's 18-yard line, setting the stage for the Blaze to extend their lead. Grady connected on a six-yard touchdown reception with record-breaking WR Aaron Boone (6-3, 215, Kentucky). On that touchdown, Boone became the Blaze's all-time career leader in touchdowns, surpassing former Blaze wide receiver and current Rattler's wide receiver coach Siaha Burley. He is now the Blaze career leader in all three receiving categories (receptions, yards and touchdowns).

Utah's luck began to turn as they entered the fourth quarter of play after a turnover on downs and net recovery that was returned for a touchdown by DB Virgil Gray (5-10, 195, Rhode Island), returning the lead to Arizona. Grady and Boone connected again on a four-yard touchdown reception, narrowing the deficit to one. On another hook-up between Boone and Grady with no time remaining on the clock, the Blaze sent the game into overtime with a successful two-point conversion.

On the Blaze's first possession in overtime, Grady's pass was intercepted by LB Kevin McCullough (6-2, 240, Cincinnati). Arizona scored on a 38-yard touchdown pass to WR Rod Windsor (6-2, 215, Western New Mexico), keeping their undefeated record intact, 67-61.

Grady finished the night completing 30-of-39 passes for 358 yards, nine touchdowns and one interception, receiving the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game for his efforts. Robinson led the receivers with 12 catches for 174 yards and four touchdowns. Defensively, the Blaze were led by Taylor who tallied 13.0 total tackles, one interception and one fumble recovery, earning the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game honors.

DULUTH, GA - The Utah Blaze (4-2) picked up their first road victory of the season on Friday night versus the Georgia Force (5-3) at the Arena at Gwinnett Center.

"We were pleased to get our first road win against a quality opponent," said Head Coach Ron James. "We rose to the challenge in a hardfought contest."

Former Blaze QB Brett Elliott (6-3. 200, Linfield) grabbed the first score of the evening on a 7-yard touchdown pass to WR Maurice Purify (6-3, 225, Nebraska). Utah answered back with a 5-yard touchdown pass of their own from QB Tommy Grady to WR Alvance Robinson (5-9, 195, Alabama State) midway through the first quarter. BLAZE SUFFER FIRST HOME DEFEAT OF THE SEASON, 65-53

SALT LAKE CITY— The Utah Blaze (4-4) fell to the Milwaukee Mustangs (3-6), 56-53, in front of 7,667 fans on Tim Dahle field at EnergySolutions Arena. After being down by 20 in the second quarter, Utah fought back to take the lead before falling in the final minutes. The loss was the first at home for the Blaze this season.

"It's a tough loss for us," said Head Coach Ron James. "We made some mistakes and that kept us from being able to pull off the comeback. Now we have to move on and gear up for San Jose next week."

The Mustangs extended their lead to six with only 16 seconds remaining, giving the Blaze one last drive. On the final play of the game, Milwaukee DB Kelvin Rogers (6-1, 182, Minnesota State) intercepted a pass intended for Boone in the end zone, returning it for a touchdown. BLAZE FALL TO DIVISION LEADER, 72-37

SALT LAKE CITY— The Utah Blaze (5-6) fell to the Western Division-leading Arizona Rattlers (10-2), 72-37, in front of 7,997 fans on Tim Dahle field at EnergySolutions Arena. With the loss, Utah remains in fourth place in the National Conference and is still in contention for a final playoff spot.

"The good news is we're still in the playoff hunt," said Offensive Coordinator Matthew Sauk. "We need to put this game behind us and move on. Tulsa is looking for that same playoff spot we are, so we have to start getting ready now."

TULSA HANDS UTAH THIRD CONSECUTIVE LOSS, 81-51

BLAZE DOMINATE POWER, 81-40

SALT LAKE CITY- The Utah Blaze (6-7) defeated the Pittsburgh Power (7-6), 81-40, in front of 9,096 on Tim Dahle field at EnergySolutions Arena. The 41-point victory ties the largest margin of victory in Blaze history. With the win, Utah remains tied for fourth place in the National Conference and stays in contention for the final playoff spot.

"We were fighting for our lives out there," said Head Coach Ron James. "I told the team that if they had any desire to play in the playoffs then they would have to bring the intensity against Pittsburgh. UTAH SUFFERS LOSS TO SPOKANE, 76-49

SPOKANE— The Utah Blaze (7-9) suffered their second consecutive loss against the Spokane Shock (8-8), 76-49, in the first-ever regular season outdoor arena football game Saturday night. Spokane's defense prevailed and they now hold the tiebreaker in the race towards the playoffs.

"We simply made too many mistakes tonight and that was ultimately the difference," said Head Coach Ron James. "We need to find a way to turn things around this week as we face the VooDoo in our final home game next week at EnergySolutions."

Utah didn't miss a beat in the first quarter under the helm of newly acquired QB Todd Hammel (6-1, 220, Stephen F. Austin), connecting with WR Aaron Lesue (5-10, 195, Utah State) and WR Alvance Robinson (5-9, 175, Alabama State) in the first quarter of play in the Joe Albi Stadium Summer Classic. Each of the team's exchanged a pair of touchdowns and they entered the second quarter tied, 14-14.

Former Blaze back-up QB Erik Meyer (6-1, 215, Eastern Washington) notched the first touchdown of the second quarter on a threeyard run. After a Utah turnover, the Shock jumped ahead and never looked back with a 24yard touchdown pass to WR Chas Gessner (6-5, 215, Brown). Utah was able to cut Spokane's lead to seven with a one-yard run by FB Ben Stallings (5-11, 263, Delta State) on the ensuing drive. However, Spokane quickly answered back on the first play of the next possession with Meyer targeting WR Brandon Tompkins (5-10, 185, Arkansas State) on a 45-yard strike. The Shock continued to maintain their two-score lead throughout the second quarter, entering the locker room on top, 49-35.

Utah misfired on the critical first possession of the second half with Shock DB Alex Teems (6-0, 195, Washington State) picking up an interception. Meyer connected with WR Adron Tennell (6-4, 200, Oklahoma) on the following drive, extending their lead to 20. The Blaze's only score of the quarter came on another oneyard run by Stallings.

Rookie WR Michael Preston (6-4, 205, Heidelberg University) tallied the only Blaze score of the fourth quarter on 37-yard touchdown pass, his second of the evening in his Blaze debut. Utah was unable to overcome their early deficit and now trail Spokane in the playoff race.

Hammel finished the night completing 23-of-34 passes for 258 yards and five touchdowns. Lesue led the receivers with 10 catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns. Stallings was also a huge contributor with eight rushes for 44 yards and two touchdowns. The defense was led by DB Al Phillips (5-11, 190, Wagner) who notched 5.0 total tackles.

BLAZE DEFEAT VOODOO IN THE FINAL SECONDS, 62-58

SALT LAKE CITY— The Utah Blaze (8-9) defeated the New Orleans VooDoo (3-14), 62-58, in front of a season-high 10,361 fans on Tim Dahle Field at EnergySolutions Arena. The final home game of the season came down to the wire as the Blaze came from behind to win in the end.

"We have a resilient organization from top to bottom and that's what you need to have success," said Head Coach Ron James. "We've been adding new pieces to the team and we're finding a way to play together and win."

Both teams were efficient to start the game, scoring on each of their possessions and ended the first quarter tied, 14-14. FB Ben Stallings (5-11, 263, Delta State) set a Blaze single-season record with his 13th rushing touchdown of the season when he rumbled in from five-yards out at the end of the quarter.

Utah QB Todd Hammel (6-2, 245, Utah) kept stride in the second quarter when he hit WR Aaron Lesue (5-10, 195, Utah State) for a 12-yard touchdown. Lesue, who has led the receiving corp since his return from an injury, hurdled over an oncoming defender on his way to the end zone early in the second quarter, earning him Cutter's Catch of the Game. The VooDoo took advantage of three Blaze turnovers in the quarter and went into halftime on top, 38-27.

New Orleans kept the pressure on in the third quarter as VooDoo QB Danny Wimprine (6-0, 230, Memphis) connected twice with WR Skylar Green (5-9, 195, Louisiana State) for short touchdowns. WR Chris Bocage (5-10, 190, USC) kept the Blaze alive, and tied the team's singleseason record, when he returned his fourth kickoff return for a touchdown on the season. The VooDoo led, 55-41, at the end of the quarter.

The Blaze drove the length of the field to start the fourth quarter, resulting in a 17-yard touchdown from Hammel to WR Michael Preston (6-4, 205, Heidelberg). After the VooDoo fumbled on their ensuing possession, the Blaze made their way to the two yard-line where Bocage carried the ball in for a touchdown and tied the game, 55-55. New Orleans drained they clock down to under one minute and then made a 34-yard field goal. Utah started their next drive without a timeout and then proceeded to drive the length of the field meticulously, resulting in a game-winning five-yard touchdown pass from Hammel to Bocage.

Hammel finished the night connecting on 26of-29 passes for 316 yards and five touchdowns. The Blaze receiving corp was led by Lesue who racked up 116 yards and one touchdown on ten receptions. DB Alfred Phillips (5-11, 190, Wagner) led the defense with 5.5 total tackles, one forced fumble, one pass breakup and one interception. The win was Utah's first when trailing in the final minute since March 10, 2007.

UTAH OUTLASTS CLEVELAND, 76-69

CLEVELAND— The Utah Blaze (9-9) overcame the Eastern Division leading Cleveland Gladiators (10-8), 76-69, in their final game of the season at Quicken Loans Arena in front of 6,019 fans. With the win, Utah finishes the season with a franchise-high nine wins.

"We were able to play a solid game on the road and pull off another last second victory," said Head Coach Ron James. "Finishing strong was one of our goals and this is definitely something we can build upon during the offseason."

Utah got off to a rough start with Cleveland's DB Levy Brown (5-11, 200, Florida A&M) picking off QB Todd Hammel's (6-1, 220, Stephen F. Austin) pass on the first drive of the quarter. On the following possession, Cleveland notched the first score of the night with a 15-yard pass to WR Thryon Lewis (6-4, 200, Howard). Hammel connected with WR Alvance Robinson (5-9, 175, Alabama State) on a six-yard strike, tallying their only touchdown of the quarter. After another Cleveland touchdown, Utah's special teams prevailed by returning a blocked kick by DL Caesar Rayford (6-7, 275, Washington), notching a defensive PAT. Nonetheless, Cleveland still held the lead entering the second quarter, 13-9.

The Blaze began the second quarter with a sixyard touchdown pass from Hammel to WR Justin Ore (6-2, 196, Western Oregon) that was followed up by a successful two-point conversion by K Kyle Brotzman (5-10, 190, Boise State). Each of the teams went on to tally three touchdowns in the second quarter. Yet with only seconds on the clock, Utah tied it up with a successful 34yard field goal attempt by Brotzman. The teams' entered the locker room locked up, 34-34, at half.

The teams each exchanged a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter as the Blaze finished on a high-note with WR Chris Bocage returning the kickoff 56-yards for a touchdown before entering the final quarter of play.

The Blaze's momentum continued in the fourth with FB Ben Stallings (5-11, 263, Delta State) racking up two rushing touchdowns. The Gladiators tied it up with 21 seconds remaining on 35-yard pass to WR Dominick Goodman (6-1, 210, Cincinnati). However, it wasn't enough to hold the Blaze in their final outing of the season, with Hammel finding Ore in the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown pass, guiding them to a 76-69 victory over the Gladiators. With the win, Utah finishes the season with a .500 record, matching the franchise's best record (8-8) from 2007.

Hammel finished the night completing 31-of-44 passes for 355 yards and seven touchdowns. Robinson led the receiving corp with nine receptions for 117 yards and four touchdowns. DL Jeramie Richardson (6-1, 265, Angelo State) led the defense in his Blaze debut with 5.5 total tackles and two pass breakups.



This ambitious endeavor was achieved through the cooperation and teamwork of hundreds of individual subcontractors and suppliers and thousands of workers both on and off the job site.

COMMISSIONER JERRY B. KURZ

Jerry B. Kurz returns for his 27th season of Arena Football and third season as the AFL's Commissioner. Out-tenured only by the creator of Arena Football, Jim Foster, Kurz has dedicated his life to furthering the sport with a strong business ethic and core values meant to bring the highest quality product to the ever-growing fan base of arena football fans.

In his time as the president of the af2, the league saw extensive growth in small-to-mid sized markets, building an extremely dedicated fan base across the country. That foundation helped to fuel the return of the Arena Football League in 2010 after a year on hiatus due to financial instability. Kurz and a group of enthusiastic investors arranged the acquisition of the AFL's assets in bankruptcy court in late 2009

and revived the league in early 2010, fulfilling the promise that Arena Football would be played in 2010.

Kurz has also served as the AFL's Vice President of International Development, where he was in charge of the League's international exposure. During his tenure, he was responsible for administering the H3 Visa program, allowing international players to play for AFL teams stateside. He also arranged and executed all internationally played games for the Arena Football League.

Arena Football isn't Kurz's only claim to fame. He is also a founding member of Gridiron Enterprises, Inc., a sports consulting firm based out of Chicago. Gridiron Enterprises, consisting of Kurz, Foster and attorney William Niro, is the original founder of the AFL. Kurz has been a player, a coach, a general manager and an owner during his lifelong involvement with the game of football. He is also a member of four football Halls of Fame, including membership in the first class of the Arena Football Hall of Fame as well as membership in the arenafootball2 Hall of Fame.

Kurz attended the University of Oklahoma as an undergraduate and later earned his Juris Doctor Degree at Northern Illinois. Kurz is a licensed attorney in Illinois and operated a law firm with his wife, Kathryn Hall, for 20 years. Jerry and his wife, Kathryn, have one son named Matthew who is currently a football coach at Lake Forest College.

RULES OF THE GAME

FIELD

FRONT OFFICE

COACHES

• An indoor padded surface 85 feet wide and 50 yards long with eight-yard end zones.

UTRH

- Goal posts are nine feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2 feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30 feet wide by 32 feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48 inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

EQUIPMENT

 The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball.
 Each ball is manufactured by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 21-man active roster; four-man inactive roster.
- Players may play both offense and defense.
- Substitution: Coaches are permitted to substitute players at will.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two-or-more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap.

TIMING

- Four 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half and when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.

MOVEMENT OF THE BALL AND SCORING

- Four (4) downs are allowed to advance the ball 10 yards for a first down, or to score.
- Six (6) points for a touchdown.
- One (1) point for a conversion by place kick after a touchdown, two (2) points for a conversion by drop kick and two (2) points for a successful run or pass after a touchdown.
- Three (3) points for a field goal by placement or four (4) points for a field goal by drop kick.
- Two (2) points for a safety.

KICKING

- Kickoffs are from the goal line. Kickers may use a one-inch tee.
- Punting is illegal. On fourth down, a team may go for a first down, touchdown or field goal.
- The receiving team may field any kickoff or missed field goal that rebounds off the net.
- Any untouched kickoff, which is out of bounds, will be placed at the 20-yard line or the place where it went out-of-bounds, whichever is more advantageous to the receiving team.

PASSING


 Receivers must have one foot inbounds for a catch. A forward pass that rebounds off the rebound net or sideline barrier is a live ball and is in play until it touches the playing surface.

OVERTIME RULES

- Overtime periods are 15 minutes for both the regular season and the playoffs.
- Each team gets one possession to score. If, after each team has had one possession, one team is ahead, that team wins. If the teams are tied after each has had a possession, the next team to score wins.

GLOSSARY



GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BALL IN THE STANDS - When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the "lucky" fan that catches the ball keeps it.

DROP KICK - A drop-kicked FG is worth 4 points. A drop-kicked extra point is worth 2 points. Spokane Shock kicker Taylor Rowan was the last man to connect on a two-point dropkick (7/22/2011 vs. Jacksonville).

FANS - More than 26 million fans have experienced an AFL game in the League's 24-year history. Last year, in 2011, the AFL drew 1,338,544 fans in the regular season.

IRONMAN - Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

"MAC" AND "JACK" LINEBACKERS - "Mac" may rush the QB straight on without stunting, twisting or dropback coverage. "Jack" must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either LB may cover the fullback or tight end.

OFFENSIVE MOTION - Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

OVERTIME - Arena Football has a unique overtime rule. If a contest is tied after regulation, teams will play a 15-minute overtime. Each team will have one opportunity to score. If, after each team has had one chance to score. the game is tied, the first team to score is crowned the winner

REBOUND NETS - Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are 30-feet wide, 32-feet high and extend to 40 feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight feet above the surface. The "scoring area" is ninefeet wide and 15-feet high. Nets are stretched taut so that a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. Once the ball caroms off the net, it's live.

SIDELINE BARRIERS - Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring four inches thick.

STUNTING OR TWISTING - When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there's no "stunting" or "twisting". In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen.

TIGHT END - One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap by simply raising his arm and "declaring" himself a tight end. The Mac (rusheligible) linebacker must line-up on the opposite side of the center from the tight end.

TWO-WAY PLAYERS - One of the most "throwback" features of the Arena Football League is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight football, where at times, some players will play both offense and defense.

PLAYOFF QUALIFICATION, SELECTION OF TEAMS

Eight teams qualify for the playoffs, four from each conference-- American and National. The four qualifying teams in each conference consist of the two division champions and two Wild Cards, determined by best overall record. Seeding in each conference is based on overall record, with the top two seeds in each conference reserved for the division champions, regardless of record. In the First Round, July 27-28, the first two seeds in each conference are the two division winners. The next two teams are seeded by next best two overall records. Teams ranked 1 and 2 earn home playoff games with 1 hosting 4 and 2 hosting 3. In the Conference Championship Round, August 3-4 the winner of the 1-4 game plays the winner of the 2-3 game. The home team is decided by the team with the higher seed. The winners of the Second Round will face off in ArenaBowl XXV on August 10th at the home venue of the higher seeded team.
