The Metairie, LA native holds a bachelor's degree in Mass Communication with a focus in Broadcast Journalism from Louisiana State University, and she is also a graduate of Mount Carmel Academy High School.

While at LSU, she was involved with Tiger TV, LSU's local television station, and served as a production assistant for two years and a segment anchor for one semester.

In the summer of 2011, she served as an intern with COX 4 where she edited features that aired on COX 4, helped in the production of live TV shows and mastered the art of media management. After serving as an intern for about six months, Asaro learned that she would be a sideline reporter for the COX 4 High School Football Games of the Week.

She completed the 2012 season with a broad knowledge in the complicated process of reporting for live TV. She also hosts a show that airs on COX 4 called "Community LA." Her COX 4 family wishes her all the best as she embarks on a new journey.

"I'm very excited about the opportunity to work with the New Orleans Voo-Doo," said Asaro. "My family at COX 4 has helped to prepare me for my future career and without them, I would have never had the experience of live TV and the opportunities that have come my way. For that reason, I will forever remember those who have gotten me to where I am today and I will always appreciate everything everyone at COX 4 has done for me."

Asaro is the youngest female, at 23 years old, appointed to the Director of Media Relations position in the Arena Football League.

Pat O'Hara is in his second season as the head football coach of the New Orleans VooDoo, and in his first season with the VooDoo, O'Hara has guided the franchise to the playoffs for only the second time in team history in 2012, and did so with 13

rookies on the active roster. As a head coach in the AFL, this postseason goround is O'Hara's third straight.

Not only did O'Hara resurrect the VooDoo franchise from a dismal 3-15 in 2011, but he dropped a bomb on the team record books, setting new single-season team records passing yards (5,190), passing touchdowns (108), touchdowns (145), points (979), and interceptions (36).

O'Hara also has molded another young quarterback in Kurt Rocco, with Rocco becoming the VooDoo's first passer to toss for over 5,000 yards and 100 touchdowns in a season. O'Hara also had three receivers record over 1,000 yards receiving, which the VooDoo had never had more than one receiver tally over a 1,000 prior to his tutelage.

O'Hara previously headed up the Orlando Predators for two seasons prior to joining the VooDoo – both seeing the team go to AFL Playoffs. In fact, his 2010 squad was two points away from going to the ArenaBowl, losing to his quarterback protégé Brett Dietz and the Tampa Bay Storm, 63-62.

O'Hara's 2011 team posted an 11-7 regular season record, and set new team records in points per game (55.6), while scoring over 70 points twice that included a franchise record 85 in a win over Tulsa.

Orlando quarterback Nick Hill blossomed under O'Hara in 2011, completing 67 percent of his passes, while also setting new franchise records in total offense (5,149), passing yards (4,758), pass completions (387) and passing touchdowns (97). Hill's total offense and passing yards numbers led the AFL.

Also, three of Hill's top receivers finished the season with over 100 catches and 1,000 yards receiving each, which included Bobby Sippio who tied Cory Fleming's single-season record of 33 touchdown receptions.

O'Hara brings with him to New Orleans a 19-15 regular season record and a 1-2 post-season mark in his two-year tenure with Orlando.

The AFL great's quarterbacking career began between the walls in 1995 with the Predators, and before it ended, O'Hara would lead two different teams to five ArenaBowls that included claiming the crown three times.

The majority of his playing career was with Orlando, spending six seasons with the club that saw the Predators claim ArenaBowl Championships in 1998 and 2000.

O'Hara then ventured off to the Toronto Phantoms in 2001, guiding the team to the second round of the playoffs in just his first season under center.

After two seasons north of the border, O'Hara returned to the Sunshine State to suit up with the Tampa Bay Storm in 2003. In that season, O'Hara came off the bench to lead the Storm to an ArenaBowl victory over the Arizona Rattlers after starter John Kaleo went down with an injury in the second quarter of the championship game.

The Storm won ArenaBowl XVII thanks to turnover-less relief by O'Hara, accounting for three total touchdowns that included 103 yards passing while completing 7-of-13 passes in the 43-29 win.

O'Hara remained with the Storm until the 2006 season, serving as a playercoach under future hall of fame head coach Tim Marcum before completely trading in the cleats for a clipboard in 2007 to become the team's offensive coordinator.

The Storm went to the playoffs in 2007 behind O'Hara's offensive genius that saw the development of Dietz, who went on to be named Co-AFL Rookie of the Year. Dietz completed a rookie record 65.3 percent (196-of-300) of his passes in his first season between the walls, while throwing for over 2,300 yards and 47 touchdowns in only nine games.

After the conclusion of the 2008 season, O'Hara was hired to be the head coach of the Los Angeles Avengers, but the AFL suspended operations before he could call a play. He was then hired to coach the Tri-Cities Fever of the af2 ranks for the 2009 season, taking over a 0-5 team at the time. The Fever managed to win three of its final eight under O'Hara.

O'Hara also brings a wealth of high school coaching experience to the VooDoo as a volunteer assistant at Point Loma High School (San Diego, Calif.) in 1996, an assistant coach at New Smyrna High School (New Smyrna Beach, Fla.) from 1998-2000, and as the offensive coordinator at Olympia High School (Orlando, Fla.) from 2001-03. It was at Olympia where O'Hara coached NFL Pro-Bowl running back Chris Johnson.

In the offseason, O'Hara also serves as a consultant on movies and has worked on The Longest Yard, Invincible, We Are Marshall, and The Game Plan, while appearing in The Waterboy and Any Given Sunday. O'Hara is a graduate of USC, playing football for the Trojans. He was slated to start his junior season in 1989, but 10 days before the first game of the year, he was hospitalized with torn ligaments in his right knee and a broken leg.

The injuries hampered the rest of his career as a Trojan, and as a senior lost out to freshman quarterback Todd Marinovich. Still, he was drafted in the NFL by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 1991, spending one season with the team until latching on with the San Diego Chargers in 1992. He went on to play with the Chargers until 1994 when he went to camp with the Washington Redskins.

After that season with the Redskins, his arena football career began.



Nick Ward DEF. COORDINATOR

Nick Ward enters his first season with the New Orleans VooDoo. He began his first season coaching in the AFL with the Cleveland Gladiators in 2011, serving as Defensive Backs Coach. In 2012, the Gladiators defense ranked first in the AFL giving up just 48 points per game. Ward also brings ten

years of AFL playing experience to Coach O'Hara's staff.

Ward was an assistant for the Mahoning Valley Thunder of arenafootball2 in 2009. He was in charge of the defensive backs for the Thunder during their final season in the af2.

His knowledge of arena football stems from an extensive playing career of ten seasons in the AFL from 2000-2010. Ward accumulated 190.5 tackles, two forced fumbles, eight interceptions and 25 passes defended in 77 career games. He played for six teams, including three seasons for the Georgia Force.

Ward competed at the highest collegiate level while attending the University of Miami (FL). He was a four-year letterman on the football team (1995, 1997-1999) and also participated on the Hurricanes' track and field squad. Ward played alongside the likes of Ray Lewis, Reggie Wayne and Ed Reed during his tenure in Miami.

Doug Miller is in his second season with the New Orleans VooDoo as the team's Special Teams Coordinator, Assistant Defensive Coordinator, and Line Coach and first season as Assitant Head Coach

Miller came to the VooDoo after spending two seasons as the Orlando Predators line coach on O'Hara's staff. Miller also served as the assistant defensive line coach for the Florida Tuskers of the UFL in 2011, while also serving as the Head Coach for the Orlando Fantasy of the Lingerie Football League in 2010 and 2011.

Under the wing of O'Hara in Orlando, Miller helped lead the Predators to back-to-back playoff appearances as an assistant coach. Orlando also ranked No. 2 in Total Defense in 2012, largely due in part to Miller's tutelage with the defensive line and linebackers.

Prior to hanging up the cleats, Miller enjoyed an outstanding 7-year playing career with the Predators. During his tenure with the Predators, Miller played all three offensive line positions, fullback, mac linebacker, and some defensive line. He was named to the All-Ironman Team twice during his career.

Miller finished his AFL career with 75.5 tackles (60 solo) and 9.5 sacks, while also catching seven passes for 25 yards and a touchdown from the tight end position. The Predators went to the playoffs every season with Miller on the team, and made an appearance in the ArenaBowl XX in 2006, losing, 69-61, to Chicago.

The Tampa, Fla. native was a four-year letter winner at Howard University, and a two-year starter on the defensive line. Miller's best season with the Bison came his senior campaign, registering 25 tackles for a loss and 16.5 sacks en route to All-Conference honors.

After his distinguished playing career at Howard, Miller went on to play two seasons with the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL, a season with Scottish Claymores of NFL Europe, and the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL before settling in with the Predators.

VOODOO FRANCHISE TIMELINE

1998

AFL FRANCHISE PURCHASED – On June 3, 1998, the Arena Football League Board of Directors approves the application of New Orleans Saints owner Tom Benson to place a team in New Orleans, marking the first AFL team with NFL ownership.

2002

AFL FRANCHISE AWARDED TO TOM BENSON– On March 7, 2002, the Arena Football League officially awarded Tom Benson an expansion AFL Franchise.

ONLINE POLL GARNERS NAME OF VOODOO FOR AFL TEAM – Following an online poll in the spring of 2002, fans voted for New Orleans' new expansion team to be named the VooDoo.

2003

ANNOUNCEMENT MADE TO START OF NEW ORLEANS VOODOO– On May 13, Tom Benson announced that the New Orleans VooDoo will start play in the New Orleans Arena in February, 2004.

HEAD COACH NAMED – Mike Neu was introduced as the VooDoo inaugural head coach on June 17. Neu served as head coach of the Carolina Cobras in 2002, guiding the Cobras to their first playoff win in club history.

VOODOO HOLD OPEN TRYOUTS – On August 2, over 170 hopefuls displayed their athletic abilities for the New Orleans VooDoo coaching staff and several members of the New Orleans Saints personnel department. This first tryout was held at the University of Louisiana-Lafayette. The team would later hold two more open tryout sessions in November and December which attracted more than 300 additional hopefuls.

COACHING STAFF ANNOUNCED— Mike Neu announced the hiring of Line Coach, Junior Ili and Defensive Coordinator, Kevin Porter for the team's first coaching staff on September 4. Neu would later round out his coaching staff by adding Special Teams Coordinator/Offensive Assistant Tres Sullivan, Full-backs/Linebackers Coach Franklin Thomas and Strength and Conditioning Coach Adam Bailey.

VOODOO STOCKED— With each current AFL team protecting 16 players, the VooDoo were given an opportunity to select from the remaining players during the AFL expansion draft on October 8, The Austin Wranglers and Philadelphia Soul also participated. New Orleans selected D.J. Cooper and Abdul-Salam Noah.

VOODOO MAKES FIRST SPLASH IN FREE AGENCY WITH EIGHT SIGN-INGS – On October 15, the VooDoo created the foundation of their inaugural 2004 squad in the first day of the free agent signing period

for the AFL, signing John Fitzgerald, Tim Martin, Bruce McClure, Adam Metts, Dan Curran, Luke Leverson, Aaron Bailey and B.J. Cohen.

NEW ORLEANS VOODOO DOLLS – During a two-week process in early December, New Orleans held tryouts for their dance team, the New Orleans VooDoo Dolls. 20 women were chosen to be part of the inaugural squad.

INAUGURAL TRAINING CAMP– On January 11, the VooDoo opened their inaugural training camp at the New Orleans Saints practice facility. 35 players kicked off the three-week preseason in anticipation of making New Orleans' 24-man regular season roster.

FIRST REGULAR SEASON GAME – The VooDoo opened their inaugural season with a 42-34 victory over the Philadelphia Soul in Philadelphia, Pa., on February 8.

FIRST HOME GAME – On February 14, the VooDoo played their first home game against the Indiana Firebirds. As 14,236 fans watched, the VooDoo pulled out a last second 41-40 victory at the New Orleans Arena.

ATTENDANCE – Through eight regular season game games, the VooDoo attracted an average of 15,240 fans per game to the New Orleans Arena. New Orleans' average crowd ranked third in the AFL, led attendance figures for teams in the Southern Division and was above the league's average of 12,019.

The VooDoo enjoyed their first sellout when they hosted 16,245 to defeat the Carolina Cobras and then attracted a standing room only crowd of 17,030 for the season finale vs. Austin.

TOPS AT HOME – Another contributing factor to the VooDoo's 11-5 record was their 7-1 mark at the New Orleans Arena. New Orleans, the Colorado Crush and the San Jose SaberCats were tied for the best home record in the Arena Football League. INAUGURAL SEASON – Sparked by an 11-5 start, the VooDoo became the first team in Arena Football League history to win 11 games in their first season, surpassing the 10-4 record by the 1997 Nashville Kats.

FIRST PLAYOFF GAME – After finishing the season with an 11-5 record, the VooDoo qualified for postseason action with the fourth seed. New Orleans hosted the Colorado Crush on June 6 at New Orleans Arena in the club's first playoff game. New Orleans fell narrowly to the Crush 47-44 in front of 14,369 fans.

POSTSEASON HONORS – Following their successful inaugural season, several members, players and coaches of the VooDoo organization were honored for excellence on the field. Coach Mike Neu was named the league's Coach of the Year, FB/LB Dan Curran was a first-team All-Arena selection and named to the All-Ironman team, OL/DL Tim Martin was voted second-team All-Arena and DS Monty Montgomery was named to the AFL's All-Rookie team.

ANDY KELLY SIGNED – On October 5, The VooDoo signed quarterback Andy Kelly, the Arena Football League's all-time leading passer to a contract. Kelly handled snaps for the VooDoo in their second season.

2005

ATTENDANCE– In 2005, the VooDoo's home attendance was ranked third in the Arena Football League at 15,388 and above the league average of 12,829, spurred by five sellout crowds.

ANDY KELLY – QB Andy Kelly, the Arena Football League's all-time passing leader improved the VooDoo's passing offense from 17th in the league in 2004 to third in the league in 2005. Kelly was at or near the top of the league leaders in most categories, completing 466-of-700 passes for 4,657 yards with 96 touchdown passes. Kelly led the AFL in attempts, completions and TD passes, was ranked second in passing yardage and fifth in completion percentage (66.9). He surpassed his own AFL single-season record for attempts and completions.

SECOND STRAIGHT WINNING RECORD – The VooDoo finished the 2005 season with their second straight winning record at 9-7, although they narrowly missed a playoff berth

OPERATIONS SUSPENDED FOR 2006 SEASON – The VooDoo were forced to suspend operations for the 2006 season due to Hurricane Katrina, which caused logistical issues for the team.

FIVE PLAYERS RE-SIGNED – As the VooDoo worked to return to the field in 2007, the team re-signed five players on October 3 whose rights were held by the Kansas City Brigade in 2006 due to the VooDoo's suspension of operations. Among the returnees were FB Dan Curran and QB Andy Kelly.

HENRY TAYLOR SIGNED – As the VooDoo continued their efforts to build a championship caliber club, the team signed DL Henry Taylor on October 5, who led the Arena Football League with 8.5 sack and was a First-Team All-Arena Selection for the Orlando Predators in 2006.

EXPANSION DRAFT – With each current AFL team protecting 16 players, the VooDoo were given an opportunity to select from the remaining players during the AFL expansion draft on October 6. The VooDoo picked a total of 14 players.

NEW ORLEANS TO HOST ARENABOWL XXI – It was announced on December 4 that New Orleans will be the host city for the league's championship game on July 29, 2007. This will mark the city's first team sports championship since Hurricane Katrina.

2007

SEASON TICKET SALES – In their first season back after suspending operations in 2006 due to Hurricane Katrina, VooDoo fans continued to show support for the team. The VooDoo set an AFL record with over 13,000 season tickets sold for the 2007 season.

RETURN TO PLAY – In their first game back in play on March 3, the VooDoo played in Salt Lake City against the Utah Blaze and lost in a 63-61 thriller on a last second field goal.

VOODOO RETURN TO GRAVEYARD – Andy Kelly threw four touchdown passes to help the VooDoo win their first home game since Hurricane Katrina, a 52-45 victory over the Columbus Destroyers on March 9.

AERIAL ATTACK – A thrilling 80-79 loss to the Dallas Desperados on June 9, provided fans with a record-setting attack by the game's quarterbacks. The thriller, which ended on a failed two-point conversion attempt by New Orleans was the first in AFL history in which both quarterbacks accounted for 11 touchdowns apiece. In the losing effort, QB Steve Bellisari threw nine touchdown passes and rushed for two more, while Dallas QB Clint Dolezel threw for 11.

ATTENDANCE – The people of New Orleans embraced Arena Football. The VooDoo led the AFL in average attendance, packing an average of 16,645 fans per game into the New Orleans Arena and selling out every contest.

JAMES LYNCH – FB James Lynch was named to the AFL's 2007 All-Rookie team. Lynch appeared in 13 games with 12 starts and rushed 26 times for 47 yards with five touchdowns. He led all AFL rookie fullbacks with five scores.

ARENABOWL – New Orleans Arena hosted ArenaBowl XXI, a contest that saw the San Jose SaberCats win their third ArenaBowl title, 55-33, over the Columbus Destroyers. ArenaBowl XXI weekend was regarded as one of the most successful events in AFL history, selling out at a neutral site for the first time in the event's history. Based on the success of the event, the league announced on December 16 that ArenaBowl XXII will return to the Crescent City in 2008.

KEY FREE AGENTS RE-SIGNED – The VooDoo moved quickly in the offseason to resign several players from the 2007 squad who are expected to be important contributors to the 2008 squad, including QB Steve Bellisari, DB Chris Brown, FB James Lynch, K Jonathan Ruffin, OL Chad Setterstrom, OL Greg Walker, WR Wendall Williams and QB Danny Wimprine.

DERRICK LEWIS – In their first move in free agency, the VooDoo upgraded their wide receiver corps, with the addition of WR Derrick Lewis, a New Orleans native who

played for the Saints from 2002-03, made a successful move to the indoor game with Austin where he recorded 252 receptions for 3,314 yards and 64 touchdown catches from 2006-07.

LIN-J SHELL – The VooDoo upgraded their secondary, by signing former Orlando Predators DB Lin-J Shell. The fourth-year AFL veteran is coming off a season where he made 110.5 tackles, four interceptions, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and 18 passes defensed, injecting a playmaking presence into the defensive backfield.

2008

DERRICK LEWIS INJURED – New Orleans native Derrick Lewis suffered a seasonending injury in training camp prior to the club's first regular season game.

RED HOT VOODOO – The 2008 squad opened the campaign with a tough 59-42 loss at Los Angeles, but followed up with a club-tying five straight victories to sit at 5-1 after week six of the regular season. In fact, the VooDoo went on to win seven of their next eight games with the lone setback coming at Dallas (L, 55-44) to sit atop the division with a 7-2 record one game past the midway point.

CALMING THE STORM – One of the highlight games in the VooDoo's impressive run was a 76-55 victory over division rival Tampa Bay, scoring 76 points – the most by New Orleans in the series – to defeat the Storm, 76-55. Quarterback Danny Wimprine had a career game, notching a personal best in passing touchdowns with seven. The game also featured a 34-point second quarter by the VooDoo – also a team best for the second quarter.

WHEN THE LEVEE BREAKS – Despite an impressive record at the midway mark, the VooDoo went 1-6 the final seven games. The club's only win amidst the shuffle was an 83-61 outburst at home over Columbus. The 83 points was the most scored in single game by the VooDoo franchise, and it was ironically followed by the lowest point total (29 points vs. Georgia) the previous week. In the win against Columbus, wide receiver James Jordan put forth a career effort with eight receptions for 121 yards and three scores. Joining him with three scores was wide receiver Javarus Dudley.

GOIN' OUT WITH A SHOOT OUT – The New Orleans VooDoo entered their final game of the regular season with a chance to go to the playoffs with a win over Grand Rapids, and the largest crowd of the season – 17,006 – showed up to witness the highest scoring affair (156 points) in team history. However, the VooDoo were on the wrong side of an 86-70 decision to end the 2008 season with an 8-8 record.

TIEBREAKER SCENARIO – With the loss, the VooDoo went into a tiebreaker with New York, whom also finished with an 8-8 record. Unfortunately, the VooDoo lost the tiebreaker in the two team's head-to-head matchup going to New York, 58-51, thus nudging New Orleans out of a playoff berth.

WIMPRINE SHINES – Danny Wimprine made the most of his 2008 season, and finished among the league's top 12 in five major passing statistical categories that included completions (335), yards (4,081) and touchdowns (85).

ATTENDANCE STILL SOARING – The VooDoo found themselves in the top 10 in average attendance with an average of 14,321 per home game, ranking sixth in the AFL. POSTSEASON ACCOLADES – The New Orleans VooDoo had several players recognized in the AFL's postseason honors roll call, awarding Norman LeJeune All-Arena Second Team at jack linebacker. LeJeune was also named to the All-Rookie Team. Quarterback Danny Wimprine and FB/LB Henry Bryant were named to the Al Lucas Hero Team.

ARENA BOWL XXII – The New Orleans Arena played host to Arena Bowl XXII that pitted the San Jose SaberCats versus the Philadelphia Soul. The Soul won the game, 59-56, surviving a 22-point fourth quarter effort by the SaberCats.

SHUT DOWN SHOP – On October 13, 2008, New Orleans VooDoo Owner Tom Benson announced that the VooDoo would cease operations.

2009 NO TEAM NEWS

2010

RESURRECTION – On September 14, 2010, Dan Newman purchased the rights to the New Orleans VooDoo, thus, resurrecting a once beloved team by the people of New Orleans.

LEADER CHOSEN – Only seven days after the VooDoo announced that they will play the 2011 season in New Orleans, Newman wasted no time in naming former AFL star Derek Stingley head football coach on September 21. Stingley became only the second head coach in the franchise's history.

2011

LOCALS KNOW BEST – The VooDoo solidified a roster of 35 players as the team geared up for training camp that began on February 18 with entrance physicals. Of the 35 guys reporting, 20 of them were from the state of Louisiana. Only three players: WR Derrick Lewis, K Jonathon Ruffin and QB Danny Wimprine were on the training camp roster from the 2008 team.

BROWN BROTHERS – The New Orleans VooDoo inked two brothers: Darrick and Marcus Brown, making them the team's first brother duo in the secondary. The Brown brothers joined former high school and college teammate Carlese Franklin on the team, with all three prepping at Kentwood High School (Kentwood, La.), then all attending McNeese State (Lake Charles, La.) and now all reuniting with the VooDoo.

ASSITANTS NAMED – On February 8, the VooDoo named AFL Hall of Fame quarter-back Ben Bennett the team's offensive coordinator. On February 15, the team named Cory Fleming Director of Football Operations, and on February 16 Mark Tucker was introduced as the offensive line/defensive line and fullbacks coach.

FREE FOOTBALL – The VooDoo did something unprecedented in professional sports: have a totally free admissions exhibition contest on Feb. 25 versus the Dallas Vigilantes.

STUMBLING OUT THE GATES – The VooDoo struggled from the start of their 2011 campaign by coming up short in six of the team's first seven games of the season. The lone victory came against then unbeaten Cleveland, 34-33, on the road. This marked the second meeting in a row where the VooDoo ended a Gladiators undefeated run. WIMPRINE 101st CAREER TD – In a win over the Cleveland Gladiators, Danny Wimprine connected with Chris Wilson for his 101st career touchdown pass in the AFL to give the VooDoo the lead for good with just under five minutes remaining in the game. BENNETT OUT – After just four games into the regular season, Ben Bennett and the New Orleans VooDoo parted ways. The team was 0-4 in its first four games, failing to score over 56 points in those games.

PHILYAW NAMED O.C. – Shortly thereafter the firing of Ben Bennett, AFL quarter-backing great Ray Philyaw was named the team's new offensive coordinator. Philyaw finished in that role with the team in 2012.

INTRODUCING SKYLER GREEN – In a loss to the eventual ArenaBowl XXIV Champion Jacksonville Sharks, Skyler Green made his debut in the AFL with the VooDoo. In his first game, he totaled 221 all-purpose yards and 5 touchdowns. One of Green's scores was a 57-yard kickoff return.

STRUGGLES LEAD TO FIRING – After posting a 2-12 record, VooDoo owner Dan Newman fired head coach Derek Stingley on June 26. The decision came after a 75-54 loss to the Spokane Shock, marking the team's eighth straight loss at home and ninth consecutive since 2008.

TRADING IN A SUIT FOR A HEADSET – On June 27, Jon Norris resigned from his position as General Manager to become interim head coach for the final four games of the season, during which he led the team to its first ever victory in Tampa Bay.

VOODOO HEX– The VooDoo were unable to earn a win in The Graveyard, finishing 0-9 at home for the season. The team finished the 2011 season with a league low 3-15 record.

"SUPERMAN" PJ BERRY – PJ Berry made history in 2011 when he set a new AFL record for all-purpose yards (3,708) in a single regular season as a member of the Voo-Doo. Berry was recognized as JLS Ironman of the Year and as a First-Team All-Arena selection, recognizing his work on both the offensive side of the ball and his record-setting achievements on special teams.

O'HARA ERA BEGINS – On August 8, 2011, owner Dan Newman named former AFL superstar Pat O'Hara as the new VooDoo head coach, only a week after he parted ways with the Orlando Predators. O'Hara became the third head coach in franchise history.

TOMBSTONE VOTED #1 – On September 1, the New Orleans VooDoo Graveyard Tombstone, the team's official game day program, was voted the best publication in the AFL by the league office.

NEW STAFF – On September 22, the VooDoo named AFL veteran and special teams guru Gary Gussman Director of Football Operations. On October 6, Coach O'Hara added Maurice Blanding to his staff as Defensive Coordinator, and on October 12 Doug Miller was announced as Special Teams Coordinator, Assistant Defensive Coordinator, and Line Coach.

ARENABOWL XXV – The AFL announced on September 29 that ArenaBowl will return to New Orleans for 2012 to celebrate the league's Silver Anniversary. The city has previously hosted ArenaBowl XXI in 2007 and ArenaBowl XXII in 2008, the last two neutral site championship games which hold attendance records with over 17,000 attending each game.

KEY RETURNING PLAYERS – The VooDoo front office did not hesitate to resign several of the 2011 season's major contributors who look to continue in the capacity in 2012, including WR/KR Skyler Green, DB Jerron Wishom, WR Carlese Franklin, JLB Alvin Ray Jackson, DB Jasper O'Quinn, and WR L.J. Castile.

STARS ALINE – The VooDoo will look to significantly improve in 2012 with impact free agent signings in first year AFL player and former LSU star Marlon Favorite, eighth-year AFL veteran WR/KR Josh Bush, and experienced AFL QBs Kurt Rocco and Brian Zbydniewski.

Growing Pains

The New Orleans VooDoo currently holds 14 rookies on the 2012 roster. All of the newly accounted for players are looking forward to making their debut this upcoming year. Of the rookies, three: Brian Coulter, Robert Henderson, and Andre Mathis are on the injured reserve.

Three-Year Trio

This year the VooDoo has three players entering their third year in the AFL: QB Brian Zbydniewski, WR Quorey Payne, and OL Lorenzo Breland. All of the players have been with the team since training camp. Their experience will definitely put an edge on the team's performance on the football field.

Louisiana Heritage

Ten men: Rahim Alem, Brian Coulter, Marlon Favorite, Derandus Frye, Daverin Geralds, Skyler Green, Robert Henderson, Courtney Smith, Josh Victorian, and Jerron Wishom are on the 2012 roster and hail from Louisiana. These Louisiana natives are thrilled to be close to their home state.

O'quinn Out

Defensive back Jasper O'quinn is out for the season with a knee injury. The Meadville, Mississippi native has two years AFL experience under his belt and hopes to return to the football field and become 100% healthy again.

Leg-n' It Out, Anyone?

The VooDoo have meshed well in all phases of the game thus far this season with the exception of the kicking game, and now turn to Gary Cismesia to handle kicking duties. Cismesia is in his rookie season in the AFL, having started the 2012 season with the Kansas City Command. He is the VooDoo's fourth kicker this season.

Ending The Curse

The VooDoo ended The Graveyard Curse on April 6 against the Tampa Bay Storm, winning 66-47. The win ended a 12-game home losing streak, dating back to 2008. The last win for the VooDoo in The Graveyard before their win on Friday April 6, 2012 was on May 30, 2008 against the Columbus Destroyers, 83-61. The 83 points scored still stands as the most by the VooDoo.

Where Have the 60's Gone

Scoring 60-plus for the VooDoo last season was a rare feat, in fact, the team only reached the barrier once in a 64-33 victory at Tampa Bay. However, the VooDoo scored 62 in its opening game of the 2012 season. The VooDoo topped that mark with 66 points in a win against Tampa Bay on April 6. The 66 points were also the most points scored by the VooDoo at home since the team's 2008 finale against Grand Rapids on June 21 (L 70-86), until the 68 scored against Orlando (5.18.12).

Lonely Nights

VooDoo FB Joe Alajajian and WR Greg Ellingson played at Florida International, united together with the Panthers for three seasons. Both players were banded again with the VooDoo, sharing an apartment together, but with Ellingson gone to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Alajajian has had some lonely nights at Magnolia Ridge.

Cleveland Connection

Quarterback Kurt Rocco and WR Quorey Payne - former teammates with the Cleveland Gladiators - were in sync with each other in the VooDoo's home opener. Payne finished with 130 of Rocco's 314 yards and 3 of his 6 passing TD's. Unfotunately, Payne was inactive the following two games due to an injury suffered on attempting to make the game's winning touchdown grab, diving head and shoulder first into the end zone wall.

New Season, New Uniforms

To start the 2012 season off with a bang, the New Orleans VooDoo unveiled their new uniforms for the fans to see in The Graveyard. The VooDoo will now sport an all-black at home with a dark red trim and stay with the traditional white top and purple pants for away games.

Candy Shop is OPEN

The VooDoo welcomed defensive back Jamaal Fudge before the team's game versus the San Antonio Talons (6.9.12), and placed DB Jorrick Calvin on reassignment to make the move possible. Fudge has three-plus seasons of NFL experience, and started 2012 in the CFL with the Saskatchewan Roughriders. Fudge made an impact against the Jacksonville Sharks (6.30.12) by returning an onside kick for a touchdown.

Rocco's Modern Life

Kurt Rocco has improved the VooDoo this season at quarterback - the most important position on the field. Rocco has tossed for 300-plus in eight VooDoo games this season, and threw for a career-high 402 against Spokane. Last season in Cleveland, Rocco only had three 300-yard passing games as a rookie, and already has notched 9 through 18 games in the 2012 season.

Down and Out

Defensive end Robert Henderson suffered a season-ending injury (shoulder) in the New Orleans VooDoo's season opener against the Philadelphia Soul - his first game in the in the AFL. Also, defensive end Brian Coulter (knee) went down for the season against Tampa Bay, suffering an injury to the team's first defensive series. Henderson and Coulter hope for a healthy recovery and to return to 100% next season.

Don't Mess with Big Joe

Fullback Joe Alajajian tied the VooDoo single-game record for most rushing touchdowns with three against Philadelphia Soul (3.18.12). It was the first time a VooDoo player rushed for three touchdowns in a game since Dan Curran accomplished the feat in 2004.

First Time For Everything

The VooDoo's game versus the Milwaukee Mustangs was the first time in the franchise's history that the team had two receivers record 100-plus yards receiving. Greg Ellingson had 142 yards and Josh Bush finished with 109 to do the honors for the VooDoo. The team accomplished the feat again against Tampa Bay with Quorey Payne and L.J. Castile doing the deed with 101 and 100, respectively.

Happy Trails, Greg Ellingson

Greg Ellingson made his mark with the VooDoo, having his best outing in the team's game against the Utah Blaze with 11 receptions for 167 yards and 4 touchdowns. Ellingson also added 3 kickoff returns for 17 yards. Ellingson recently signed with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and finished his season with the VooDoo with 33 receptions for 475 yards and 8 touchdowns, he also finished with 9 kickoff returns for 50 yards and 4.5 total tackles on special teams.

Killin'em Kellem

Rookie DB Jeremy Kellem has made a name for himself so far with the VooDoo, leading the team with 95.5 tackles that ranks 10th in the AFL. Kellem recorded his first career interception against Milwaukee and a fumble recovery in the team's opener against Philadelphia, while also having an interception against Utah, Tampa Bay, and San Antonio making five-straight games with a takeaway. He also intercepted Kyle Rowley at Spokane, Orlando's Chris Leak and Jacksonville's Benard Morris twice.

Brutal Brutus

Gladel Brutus' first interception in the AFL went 54 yards for 6 points, coming against Utah in the final minute to seal the VooDoo victory. Brutus finished the game with 3.5 total tackles (3 solo) an interception and a pass break up - by far his best day in the AFI.

Welcome Back D-Rob

Demarcus Robinson was activated off Injured Reserve before the Tampa Bay game (4.6.12), and the healthy Robinson burst on the scene with an interception on his first defensive series for the VooDoo. He finished the game with 4.0 tackles (3 solo), 4 pass break ups, and an interception.

Turnover Margin

What a difference a year (and a coach) makes, huh? In 2011, the VooDoo were last in the League in turnover margin (-20); however, this season the team is No. 2 in the AFL in the category, sporting a +14 mark.

Rahim Alem Sent to IR

New Orleans VooDoo added former LSU defensive end Rahim Alem prior to playing Tampa Bay (4.6.12). Alem has played the last four games, but was placed on the IR (neck) prior to the VooDoo's game versus the Orlando Predators (5.18.12). After evaluation, Alem will not return this season, and a decision will be made on his football future.

Kick The Tires, Light The Fires

With both the VooDoo's open dates burned, the team will be full-steam ahead for the remaining 2012 season - 12 straight weeks of football in the regular season.

Building a Castile

VooDoo wide receiver L.J. Castile strung together the best two games of his professional career against Tampa and San Antonio, including a career best 12 receptions for 131 yards and 4 touchdowns in a loss to the Talons. Over those two games before sitting out against Pittsburgh, Castile had 20 receptions for 231 yards and 6 touchdowns. On the season, Castile has 104 receptions for 1,196 yards and 27 touchdowns.

Here Comes The Payne

Quorey Payne did the most with his fourth kickoff return of the season against the Pittsburgh Power, taking it 56 yards before being tackled at the 1-yard line. The VooDoo converted the return into points two plays later. Payne has been utilized in the return game to spell Josh Bush when he is asked to play defense due to injury or fatigue.

Afif In The Mix

The VooDoo traded for reinforcements on the offensive line during the bye week, landing AFL veteran Patrick Afif. Afif stands at 6-foot-7 and weighs in at 325 pounds, and will help protect Kurt Rocco. Afif played to Coach Pat O'Hara in Orlando in 2010.

Back on the Right Track

Prior to the VooDoo's game at Spokane, the team's offense was on a steady decline, posting 279 at San Antonio, 247 versus Pittsburgh, and a season-low 172 total yards at Jacksonville. Also against Jacksonville, the team put the ball on the ground six times, and even though the team only lost one, it was a big one that resulted in a game-changing touchdown for the Sharks. However, the team had a change of fortunes at Spokane with an outburst of 411 yards on offense.

Sack Lunch, Baby

After six games of being sack-less, defensive tackle Marlon Favorite got his first sack of his AFL career at Jacksonville (5.4.12). Truth be told, he should have had another one, but Omar Jacobs completed a desperation heave while he was being taken down by Favorite. He had his first multi-sack game at Orlando (6.22.12), finishing with 2.0.

400-yard Passer

Despite the team's loss at Spokane, quarterback Kurt Rocco tossed for a single-game franchise record 402 yards. Needless to say, it was also a personal-high for Rocco, while tossing 8-plus touchdowns for the third time this season.

Alajajian's Rushing TD Record Watch

Joe Alajajian has 10 rushing touchdowns this season, which puts him in second for most in a single season in VooDoo history. Dan Curran stands atop the list with 21 accomplished in 2004.

Multiple 100-yard receivers

The VooDoo franchise entered this season having never recorded two or more receivers with 100 yards or more in a game. However, under the guidance of Pat O'Hara, the 2012 squad has done it four times. In fact, L.J. Castile was 5 yards away against Spokane from having three receivers with 100 yards.

Accounting For Alvin Ray

Alvin Ray Jackson broke his own VooDoo single season mark of 8 interceptions, set in 2011, after recording two interceptions at Georgia (6.2.12) and broke his own record against San Antonio (6.9.12) with one interception. With two against Cleveland (6.16.12) and one at Orlando (6.22.12) and Tampa Bay (7.14.12), Jackson now has 14 on the season, standing tied at No. 1 overall in the AFL.

Kellem Leaving Mark On VooDoo

Jeremy Kellem set a new VooDoo rookie record with 9 interceptions. Kellem accomplished the task against the Jacksonville Sharks (6.30.12) by intercepting Benard Morris twice. Kellem's 9 interceptions currently leads all AFL rookies.

Jackson Builds Upon Record

Alvin Ray Jackson currently has the most interceptions in VooDoo history for a career with 22. Jackson led all jack linebackers in the AFL last season with 8, and currently leads all this season with 14.

Another Record for Alvin Ray

Alvin Ray Jackson surpassed Chris Pointer (2004-05) to become the team's all-time leading tackler. Jackson accomplished the task against Jacksonville (6.30.12) with his fifth tackle in the game; he finished the game with 7.0 - all solo.

'X' Going to Give it to You

New Orleans VooDoo traded DB Leslie Majors to the Chicago Rush for DL Xavier Brown on May 28 - the AFL trade deadline. Brown joined the VooDoo with 6 sacks - one more than the entire VooDoo team combined at the time of his arrival.

Ageless Wonder

New Orleans VooDoo wide receiver Josh Bush is having a career year with 105 receptions for 1,676 yards and 35 touchdowns - all career highs. He needs jsut 18 yards receiving to set a new VooDoo single-season record for most receiving yards in a single season. The 8-year AFL veteran is the oldest member on the VooDoo squad (31) and is having the best season of his career.

Almost Perfect...

Although Kurt Rocco finished 21-of-24 passing at Georgia (6.02.12) and was three incompletions away from perfection, he was 18-of-19 through 3 quarters. Rocco was also not pressured in the loss or sacked, making him the true pocket passer that he is.

Worthy Canidates

When the AFL selects its Rookie of the Year, VooDoo defensive back Jeremy Kellem and defensive lineman Xavier Brown will surely be in the talks. Kellem is 9th in the League in tackles (93.0) while Brown is fourth in sacks (10.0).

Can You Go Home Again?

Kurt Rocco returned to Cleveland (6.16.12) where his wild and crazy ride in the AFL began. His homecoming got off to a rocky start, but Rocco guided the team to a comeback victory, winning 54-42 on the heels of a 26 point fourth quarter. The Gladiators were held scoreless in the fourth quarter.

What Can Brown Do For You?

Xavier Brown recorded his first sack as a member of the VooDoo against Cleveland (6.16.12), and it could not have come at a more opportune time. With the team trailing 42-40 midway through the 4th quarter, Brown sacked Cleveland QB John Dutton for a 7-yard loss, and the ball was recovered in the end zone by Michael Janac for the go-ahead touchdown.

When It Mattered Most...

In back-to-back games, VooDoo defensive lineman Xavier Brown came through with the big sack when the team needed it most. Following the game at Cleveland (6.16.12), Brown came up big against Orlando (6.22.12), sacking Chris Leak with 10 seconds remaining forcing a fumble in the end zone, ultimately leading to a safety. Brown now stands with 10.0 sacks on the season, ranking fourth in the AFL this season and most among rookies.

Big Hands = Big Catches

Courtney Smith has slowly but surely learned the arena game, and got his chance to show his stuff against Cleveland (6.16.12) when L.J. Castile was ejected late in the second quarter. Smith did not have an impact on the first half, but made his presence known in the second, recording all 7 receptions, 94 yards and lone touchdown in the final half. He followed that performance with 7 receptions for 68 yards and a touchdown, and 2 carries for 8 yards and 2 touchdowns at Orlando (6.23.12). Smith, a New Orleans native, is playing in his hometown for the first time since post-Katrina, having been a student at John F. Kennedy High School in 2005.

1,000 yards

For the first time in VooDoo history, the team sports three receivers with over 1,000 yards for the season. L.J. Castile and Josh Bush have been in the club for a while, and welcomed Quorey Payne as the third member after defeating the Orlando Predators (6.22.12) in Week 16.

Rocco's Records

In the team's loss to San Jose (7.07.12), Kurt Rocco set a new VooDoo record for passing yards in a season with 4,697; he now stands with 5,063. Rocco continued his assault on the record books the following week at Tampa Bay (7.14.12), throwing 9 touchdown passes to break the single-season touchdown mark and now stands with 101 on the season. He is the franchise's only passer to throw over 5,000 yards and 100 touchdowns in a season.

He's Not Human; He's a Piece of Iron...

In the VooDoo's loss at Tampa Bay (7.14.12), wide receiver Josh Bush was indestructible, going on to destroy the Storm secondary. In the process, Bush set new VooDoo single-game records for most receiving yards in a game (256), most all-purpose yards in a game (349) and tied for most receiving touchdowns in a game (5). Bush is 18 receiving yards and 7 receiving touchdowns away from setting new VooDoo regular season marks in each. His 1,676 yards receiving currently ranks eighth in the AFL heading into Week 20.

Who is this guy?

Chris Duvalt made his VooDoo debut against the Tampa Bay Storm (7.14.12), and did not disappoint with 4 receptions for 41 yards and a touchdown, 3 carries for 3 yards and a touchdown, and a huge forced fumble and fumble recovery on special teams. He followed that performance with a 116-yard, 3 touchdown performace against Georgia (7.21.12). Duvalt was one of Pat O'Hara's first signees, but was on Other League Exempt, playing in the CFL. Recently cut from the CFL, Duvalt joined the VooDoo.

Kicking it Smooth!

VooDoo kicker Gary Cismesia connected on 21 consecutive PATs - a streak going back to the team's Week 17 game against Jacksonville - before having it broken on against Georgia. He has been perefect his last two games...and now that we have made note of that, Cismesia will be jinxed this game against Georgia! Well, we hope not; however, its like a perfect game in baseball - you don't talk about it while it is happening for fear of the streak ending.

AFL RULES & BASIC TRAINING

RULES OF THE GAME

FIELD

- An indoor padded surface 85 feet wide and 50 yards long with eight-yard end zones.
- Goal posts are nine feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2 feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30 feet wide by 32 feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48 inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

EQUIPMENT

 The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball. Each ball is manufactured by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 21-man active roster; three-man inactive roster.
- Players may play both offense and defense.
- Substitution: Coaches are permitted to substitute players at will.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two-or-more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap.

TIMING

- Four 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half and when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.

MOVEMENT OF THE BALL AND SCORING

- Four (4) downs are allowed to advance the ball 10 yards for a first down, or to score.
- Six (6) points for a touchdown.
- One (1) point for a conversion by place kick after a touchdown, two (2) points for a conversion by drop kick and two (2) points for a successful run or pass after a touchdown.
- Three (3) points for a field goal by placement or four (4) points for a field goal by drop kick.
- Two (2) points for a safety.

KICKING

- Kickoffs are from the goal line. Kickers may use a one-inch tee.
- Punting is illegal. On fourth down, a team may go for a first down, touchdown or field goal.

- The receiving team may field any kickoff or missed field goal that rebounds off the net.
- Any untouched kickoff, which is out of bounds, will be placed at the 20-yard line or the place where it went out-of-bounds, whichever is more advantageous to the receiving team.

PASSING

• Receivers must have one foot inbounds for a catch. A forward pass that rebounds off the rebound net or sideline barrier is a live ball and is in play until it touches the playing surface.

OVERTIME RULES

- Overtime periods are 15 minutes for both the regular season and the playoffs.
- Each team gets one possession to score. If, after each team has had one possession, one team is ahead, that team wins. If the teams are tied after each has had a possession, the next team to score wins.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BALL IN THE STANDS – When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the "lucky" fan that catches the ball keeps it.

DROP KICK – A drop-kicked FG is worth 4 points. A drop-kicked extra point is worth 2 points. Spokane Shock kicker Taylor Rowan was the last man to connect on a two-point dropkick (7/22/2011 vs. Jacksonville).

IRONMAN – Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

FANS – More than 26 million fans have experienced an AFL game in the League's 24-year history. Last year, in 2011, the AFL drew 1,338,544 fans in the regular season.

"MAC" AND "JACK" LINEBACKERS – "Mac" may rush the QB straight on without stunting, twisting or drop-back coverage. "Jack" must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either LB may cover the fullback or tight end.

OFFENSIVE MOTION – Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

OVERTIME – Arena Football has a unique overtime rule. If a contest is tied after regulation, teams will play a 15-minute overtime. Each team will have one opportunity to score. If, after each team has had one chance to score, the game is tied, the first team to score is crowned the winner.

REBOUND NETS – Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are 30-feet wide, 32-feet high and extend to 40 feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight feet above the surface. The "scoring area" is nine-feet wide and 15-feet high. Nets are stretched taut so that a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. Once the ball caroms off the net, it's live.

SIDELINE BARRIERS – Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey

rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring four inches thick.

STUNTING OR TWISTING – When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there's no "stunting" or "twisting". In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen.

TIGHT END – One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap by simply raising his arm and "declaring" himself a tight end. The Mac (rush-eligible) linebacker must line-up on the opposite side of the center from the tight end.

TWO-WAY PLAYERS – One of the most "throwback" features of the Arena Football League is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight football, where at times, some players will play both offense and defense.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

ROSTER LIMITS

From the first day the League allows the signing of free-agent players until the first league-sanctioned cut-down date, teams are prohibited from having more than 35 players on their roster. Players listed on the active list or free-agent signees are considered eligible to be counted for the 35-man roster. Teams will be required to reduce their active lists to 24 players by 5 p.m. CST on the last day of camp. The 21-man active list and three practice players will remain in effect for the remainder of the regular season and the playoffs, including ArenaBowl XXV.

Each team may maintain a maximum 21-player roster and 3-player practice squad during the regular season. Every club may dress a maximum of 21 players for each game. Teams may have a gameday inactive list with a maximum of three players. In a documented emergency, a team may add an emergency kicker to their roster, no later than one hour before kickoff.

TRADES

The trading period began on the Monday following ArenaBowl XXV—and will end at 5 p.m. CST on Monday, May 28, 2012. Upon reporting to his new team, each traded player must pass the physical given by his new team. Failure to pass the physical and/or failure to report will nullify the trade.

RESERVE LISTS

The reserve list of each team consists of the following categories; retired, refused to report, left squad, injured reserve, injured exempt, team suspended, league suspended, other league exempt and physically unable to perform.

INJURED RESERVE

A player who is placed on injured reserve list must remain on injured reserve for a minimum of four weeks. Training camp weeks will not count against that total. Teams activating players from their injured reserve list must do so no less than 24 hours prior to that team's game.

PLAYOFF QUALIFICATION, SELECTION OF TEAMS

Eight teams qualify for the playoffs, four from each conference-- American and National. The four qualifying teams in each conference consist of the two division champions and two Wild Cards, determined by best overall record. Seeding in each conference is based on overall record, with the top two seeds in each conference reserved for the division champions, regardless of record. In the First Round, July 27-28, the first two seeds in each conference are the two division winners. The next two teams are seeded by next best two overall records. Teams ranked 1 and 2 earn home playoff games with 1 hosting 4 and 2 hosting 3. In the Conference Championship Round, August 3-4 the winner of the 1-4 game plays the winner of the 2-3 game. The home team is decided by the team with the higher seed. The winners of the Second Round will face off in ArenaBowl XXV on August 10th at the home venue of the higher seeded team.

Tiebreaking Procedures

If, at the end of the regular season, two or more clubs in the same division are tied with identical won-lost percentages, the following steps will be taken to determine rank.

COMMISSIONER JERRY B. KURZ

Jerry B. Kurz returns for his 27th season of Arena Football and third season as the AFL's Commissioner. Out-tenured only by the creator of Arena Football, Jim Foster, Kurz has dedicated his life to furthering the sport with a strong business ethic and core values meant to bring the highest quality product to the ever-growing fan base of arena football fans.

In his time as the president of the af2, the league saw extensive growth in small-to-mid sized markets, building an extremely dedicated fan base across the country. That foundation helped to fuel the return of the Arena Football League in 2010

after a year on hiatus due to financial instability. Kurz and a group of enthusiastic investors arranged the acquisition of the AFL's assets in bankruptcy court in late 2009 and revived the league in early 2010, fulfilling the promise that Arena Football would be played in 2010.

Kurz has also served as the AFL's Vice President of International Development, where he was in charge of the League's international exposure. During his tenure, he was responsible for administering the H3 Visa program, allowing international players to play for AFL teams stateside. He also arranged and executed all internationally played games for the Arena Football League.

Arena Football isn't Kurz's only claim to fame. He is also a founding member of Gridiron Enterprises, Inc., a sports consulting firm based out of Chicago. Gridiron Enterprises, consisting of Kurz, Foster and attorney William Niro, is the original founder of the AFL. Kurz has been a player, a coach, a general manager and an owner during his lifelong involvement with the game of football. He is also a member of four football Halls of Fame, including membership in the first class of the Arena Football Hall of Fame as well as membership in the arenafootball2 Hall of Fame.

Kurz attended the University of Oklahoma as an undergraduate and later earned his Juris Doctor Degree at Northern Illinois. Kurz is a licensed attorney in Illinois and operated a law firm with his wife, Kathryn Hall, for 20 years. Jerry and his wife, Kathryn, have one son named Matthew who is currently a football coach at Lake Forest College.
