Brett Bouchy
Managing Member



Brett Bouchy is entering his 15th season as Managing Partner of the Orlando Predators. Under his leadership the Predators have won two Arena Bowl Championships (1998 and 2000). In 2013, the Orlando Predators have forged a broadcast partnership with WKMG channel 6. The team and station have reached a two year agreement, making WKMG the local broadcast home through the 2014 season.

An esteemed innovator and leader within the AFL community, Bouchy serves on the AFL's Executive Committee and is the Chairman of the League's Sales and Expansion Committee.

Bouchy helped steer the Arena Football League and playing a key role in its reconstitution and re-launch following the suspended 2009 season, Bouchy returned as the Managing Partner of the Orlando Predators for the 2010 Season. Under his guidance in 2011, the Predators extended their playoff streak to a league-leading 19 straight seasons.

After a disappointing season in 2012 (14-4), Bouchy came up with a business plan to turn things around for the Predators and their fans for the 2013 season. In late January, 2013 the Orlando Predators unveiled the Predators Performance Guarantee (also known as the PPG). The PPG guarantees a winning season (a minimum of 10 wins) to our fans and our season ticket holders will benefit from receiving a game credit (based on a sliding scale) for the following season if our on field performance does not meet our guarantee. The basis of the PPG is on the idea that as consumers, we expect to have a certain level of quality or a standard of service. Bouchy stated "why should professional sports be any different".

Originally, Bouchy was part of the team that purchased the Orlando Predators in 1996. At that time, he served as President of Orlando Predators Football, LLC. During his time with the Predators, Bouchy served the team in many capacities and helped transform the company into Orlando Predators Entertainment (OPE). OPE was a publicly traded company that included the Predators, a holding company that owned additional shares of the Arena Football League, several minor league hockey and "arenafootball2" franchises and a telemarketing company that specialized in season ticket sales for sports franchises. Bouchy spent two years as President and Chief Executive Officer of OPE, overseeing all aspects of company operations.

After leaving OPE in 2001, Bouchy remained the team's liaison to the AFL. When OPE decided to sell the Orlando Predators Arena team after the 2002 season, Bouchy spearheaded a group of private investors to purchase the team. In November of 2003, Bouchy announced that a group of 19 prominent local businessmen and women had acquired a significant percentage of ownership. This new investor group included some business people that were part of the original Predators ownership group. The sale became final just prior to the start of the 2003 season. The following year under Bouchy's leadership, several more highly regarded members of the Orlando Community joined the Predators Ownership group, including the Roger Holler Automotive Group.

From 2004 through 2005, Bouchy also held the title of Managing Member and achieved significant accomplishments such as the purchase of a permanent office building, a significant reduction in the team's operating expense, and a return of local investors. Under Bouchy's leadership, the Predators saw a significant increase in season ticket and sponsorship sales heading into the 2007 season. Paid season ticket totals jumped from less than 7,000 in 2003 to more than 11,200 in 2007; while cash sponsorship revenue more than tripled in the previous four years.

During his time with the Orlando Predators, Bouchy has also played an integral role in improving the lives of Central Florida residents through charitable efforts in Central Florida, reaching out to the less privileged members of the community. Brett and his wife Brandy live in Gilbert, AZ, and have five children, Brett Jr., Joshua, Caleb, Saile and Micah.

Pre and Post Game Interviews

During pre-game, players will be available on the field approximately two hours before game time and will be available for about one hour.

Post-game interviews may be conducted both on the field and in the Predators locker room. The locker room will be open to the media following a 10-minute cooling off period after the game. The training room is off limits. The visiting team will establish its own locker room policies.

Practices and Availability

The Predators practice at the Florida Citrus Bowl Complex. Most practices are held at Thunder Field (located on the corner of South Street and S. Rio Grande Avenue). All practices are open to the media.

Practices generally run from 8:30am to 11:30am each day. Coaches and players will be available immediately following practice. On the day prior to a game, practices are typically short, no more than one half hour in length. For your convenience, the Predators ask that you inform the Communications Department of your practice attendance plans to ensure a staff member is on-hand to answer any and all questions and to provide additional assistance. The best way to do so is email Johanna Kimberley at jkimberley@orlandopredators.com or call 321-200-3445.

Additionally, the Orlando Predators will be hosting media luncheons the Thursday prior to every home game of the season. Locations and times will be announced on a weekly basis, but the weeks they will be held are as follows: 4/6, 4/19, 5/25, 6/1, 6/15, 6/22, 7/6, 7/13 and 7/27.

Media Work Room

The Media Work Room is located on the event level of the Amway Center, on the south-west corner. The workroom is equipped with telephones and work space and is in a convenient location to the field and locker rooms. Media should enter through the Amway Center employee entrance at the corner of South Street and Hughey. The Amway Center is located at 400 West Church Street, Orlando, FL 32801.

Media Seating

Media seating is located in the Media Loge, located in the northwest corner on the club level of the Amway Center. Seating charts will be placed in the media work room as well as in the media loge. Media are asked to sit in their pre-assigned seats, electrical outlets and telephones will be placed at the press seats for convenience.

A pre-game meal is available to working media beginning two hours before kickoff. The will be served in the media workroom. Soft drinks are available throughout the game in the media workroom.

Weekly Releases/Notes

The Orlando Predators produce a weekly schedule release containing basic information, the practice schedule for the week, media availability and some brief game notes on Monday of every week during the season. A full version of updated Game Notes will be available on the Wednesdays prior to a game.

Amway Center

This year will be the third season the Orlando Predators play in their 'Jungle' at the Amway Center. Hailed as the most technologically advanced arena in the country, the Amway Center is an impressive 875,000 square feet, almost triple the size of the old Amway Arena. The building features sustainable, environmentally friendly design, unmatched technology and a multitude of premium amenities, many available to all patrons in the building. The Amway Center is also the home of the NBA's Orlando Magic.

The Predators previously played in the Amway Arena. Originally opened as the Orlando Arena in 1989, the building served as the home to the Predators from the 1991 inaugural season through the 2010 season.

Known as 'The Jungle' throughout the Arena Football League, the venue served as one of the toughest road destinations, thanks largely to the strong fan support the Predators enjoy. Through the 2011 season, the Predators home record stands at 98-45 (.685).

From 1999 to 2006, the arena was known as the TD Waterhouse Center. It also served as the home of the NBA's Orlando Magic, WNBA's Orlando Miracle, IHL's Orlando Solar Bears and MISL's Orlando Sharks.

COACHING STAFF

Doug Plank

Head Coach



Doug Plank is entering his first season as Head Coach with the Predators. Plank is a former all American safety for the NFL. Prior to joining the Predators, Plank was the head coach for the Philadelphia Soul for two years running.

Plank was born March 4, 1953 in Greensburg, Pennsylvania. After graduating from Norwin School District in North Huntingdon, Pennsylvania, he went on to attend Ohio State University. During his college career, he won 3 Big Ten titles and participated in 3 consecutive Rose Bowls under the renowned coach, Woody Hayes.

Plank's next stop was in 1975, when he was drafted to the Chicago Bears in the 12th round. He spent the next 8 years playing with the Bears and was the first Bear's rookie to lead the team in tackles. Known for his hard hitting and aggressive style, Plank's defensive coordinator, Buddy Ryan named his defense the "46 defense" after Plank's jersey number. Considered one of the hardest hitting safeties in the game, Plank's efforts on the field took a physical toll on his body and he had to retire before the Bear's reached their peak in 1985. Dubbed as one of football's "Hit Men" along side Gary Fencik, which was referenced in the Super Bowl Shuffle in 1985.

In 2001, Plank began his coaching career in the AFL with the Arizona Rattlers as their Defensive Coordinator. Over the next three years with Arizona, he helped lead the team to three consecutive ArenaBowls.

In 2004, Plank was hired as head coach for the Georgia Force. During his first year Plank led his team to the ArenaBowl and again in 2005. In addition, he also led his team to the playoffs every year after. Plank was also awarded the AFL's Coach of the year twice, in 2005 and 2007. Plank's first four years as an AFL head coach, he won more games in that period than any other coach in the history of the AFL.

In 2008, he was a seasonal assistant on the Atlanta Falcons staff. The Falcons played in the Wild Card round of the NFL playoffs.

In 2009 he served as the assistant defensive backfield coach for the New York Jets, under head coach Rex Ryan. That same year, The Jets defense led the NFL in fewest total yards allowed, fewest points allowed, and fewest TD passes allowed. The Jets ended their season with an AFC Championship game against the Colts.

The following year (2010) Coach Plank became the football program assistant for Ohio State University Buckeyes. He also earned himself a share of the Big 10 title while assisting the Buckeyes with an 11-1 record while beating Arkansas in the Sugar Bowl.

In August 2011, Plank became head coach for the AFL's Philadelphia Soul. During his first season, Plank registered a regular season record of 15-3, sending his team to ArenaBowl XXV against the Arizona Rattlers. The following year (2012) Plank assisted in establishing new franchise records in wins, scoring, rushing, and defensive takeaways.

September 2012, Coach Plank was name head coach of the Orlando Predators for the 2013 season.

Kelvin Kinney

Offensive Line/Defensive Line Coach

Kelvin Kinney starts his first year with the Orlando Predators serving as the teams Offensive/Defensive line coach.

After playing college football for Virginia State, Kinney brings over 17 years of professional football experience in his background as a defensive end. He has played for the NFL for the Washington Redskins, CFL for the Toronto Argonauts and Edmonton Eskimos, XFL for the Las Vegas Outlaws and a number of teams in the AFL including the San Jose Sabercats, Detroit Fury, Tampa Bay Storm, Columbus Destroyers and the Dallas Vigilantes.

Chris Siegfried

Offensive Coordinator

Offensive Coordinator Chris Siegfried enters his first year with the Orlando Predators. With over 10 years of Arena Football coaching, Siegfried most recently comes to us as the former head coach of the Pittsburgh Power (2011-2012).

During Siegfried's last season with the Power, he missed the play offs by only one game. Previous to the coaching the Power, Siegfried was offensive coordinator for the Jacksonville Sharks (2010) ending with a season record of 12-4.

From 2009-2007 Siegfried was head coach for the Arkansas Twisters. Chris strengthened his coaching style as an offensive coordinator, helping his teams compile a 32-19 win-loss record. 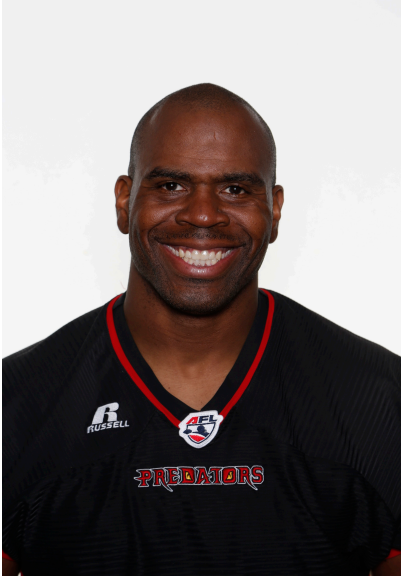

GAME 1 - MARCH 9th, 2012 Pittsburgh Power 40, Orlando Predators 26

The SaberCats were the first to score a touch down, although it did not take long for **T.T. Toliver** to take action and score the Predators their first touchdown after receiving a 36-yard pass from **Chris Leak**, tying the team (7-7) in the first quarter.

Jarvis Williams was first to score in the second quarter tying the Predators with the SaberCats for the second time at (14-14). Glen Fox was the next to score in the second quarter after receiving a 48-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** tying the teams once again (21-21). **Williams** also scored again after completing another 10-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** (27-28).

The Predators were unable to score in the third, and fell behind on the scoreboard (27-45). In the fourth quarter, **Jarvis Williams** scored one last time for the Predators when he completed another touch down pass form **Chris Leak**. The final score 34-51 for the San Jose SaberCats

Chris Leak went 24 of 47 passes and gained 316 yards for the game. **Glen Fox** gained 125 yards and 1 touchdown. **Jarvis Williams** was the highest scorer with 3 touchdowns and 100 yards, and **T.T. Toliver** with 78 total yards and 1 touchdown for the game.

ORLANDO – After another disappointing loss to San Jose, the Predators head back to Orlando to Face the War on I4, the Tampa Bay Storm, once more this season. Finally breaking their losing streak and gaining a second win for the season (2-11).

T.T. Toliver was the first to score after completing a 30-yard pass from **Chris Leak**, tying the Orlando Predators with the Storm 7-7. **Glen Fox** made the next touchdown after a 3-yard touchdown pass was received from **Chris Leak** and **Jarvis Williams** finished off the third quarter after receiving a 45-yard touchdown pass for a 6 point lead (20-14).

In the second quarter the Predators did not slow down their momentum. **Glen Fox** caught a 37-yard touchdown pass, **Mark Lewis** scored a 21-yard field goal and **Jarvis Williams** ended the first half by completing a 4-yard touchdown from **Chris Leak** ending with a 10 point lead (37-27).

At the beginning of the third quarter, **Chris Leak** scored a touchdown off a 1-yard run (44-27), and **T.T. Toliver** caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from **Leak** tallying a score of 50-27 at the end of the third.

Jarvis Williams was the first to score a touchdown after completing a 15-yard pass from **Chris Leak**, taking the lead on the Voodoo (7-0).

In the second quarter, **T.T. Toliver** completed two touchdown passes from **Chris Leak**, 21-yard pass and a 1-yard pass for a total of two touchdowns putting the Predators in the lead at the end of the first half (21-20).

Chris Jamison rushed 1-yard from a kick by **Mark Lewis** in the middle of the third quarter to take the lead for the third time in the game (28-26).

The Predators and the Voodoo fought neck and neck in the fourth quarter to the end. **Chris Jamison** rushed 6 yards from another kick by **Mark Lewis** making the goal (32-35). **Jarvis Williams** also made a 7-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** for the lead (41-40). In the last 21 seconds the Voodoo made a comeback taking the win (41-48).

Mark Lewis scored a field goal in the first quarter for the predators bringing the score to (3-7) for the Force.

In the second quarter the Predators stepped their game up when **Jarvis Williams** caught a 7-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** raising the score (10-14). **T.T. Toliver** was next to score when he completed an 18-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** and **Glen Fox** followed with a 13-yard touchdown pass from **Leak** (24-28).

Glen Fox held his momentum in the third quarter when he caught another 13-yard pass raising he score to (30-35).

The Predators fought hard in the fourth quarter to defeat the Force. **Mykel Benson** rushed 1-yard at the beginning of the fourth for a touchdown and **Jarvis Williams** followed by completing a 16-yard pass from **Chris Leak** bringing the score to a close (46-49). **Benson** made one last attempt at gaining the lead on the Force rushing another yard for a touchdown but fell short with a final score of (53-56).

Orlando Predators 55, Cleveland Gladiators 34

ORLANDO- The Cleveland Gladiators traveled to Orlando to play the Predators at the Amway Center.

T.T. Toliver started the first quarter off with the first 14-yard pass from **Chris Leak**. In the second quarter the Predators came in strong first when **Glen Fox** caught a 15-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** tying the game again 13-13. **Chris Leak** completed his next pass to **Jarvis Williams**, pushing the Predators in the lead 20-13.

Glen Fox caught another touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** followed by another touchdown pass from **Leak** to **Jarvis Williams** with the final score of 34-20 in the first half.

By the third quarter the Predators gained a 41-20 lead on the Cleveland Gladiators when **Glen Fox** caught another 15-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak**.

Jarvis Williams dominated the fourth quarter when he completed 2 touchdowns passes from Leak for a final score of 55-34 against the Cleveland Gladiators.

Chris Leak completed 30 of 35 passes with 316 yards for a total of 8 touchdowns for the game. **Jarvis Williams** totaled 147 receiving yards and 5 touchdowns. **Glen Fox** came in second with 85 receiving yards with 2 touchdowns and **T.T. Mark Lewis was the only one to score in the first quarter when he made a 33-yard field goal bringing the score to 3-7.

In the second quarter **Marlon Moye-Moore** rushed the ball 1-yard from a kick by **Mark Lewis** scoring a touchdown for the team raising the score 9-13. In the third quarter, **Travis Coleman** made a 40-yard fumble recovery (16-27).

In the fourth quarter **Jarvis Williams** completed an 11-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** bumping the score to (23-34). **Chris Leak** made the final play and ended the quarter for the Predators by rushing 8 yards for a touchdown. The final score 30-48 for the Jacksonville Sharks.

Williams held his energy into the second quarter, completing another 6-yard pass from **Leak** brining the score up 21-10. **Glen Fox** was next to complete a touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** holding the lead 28-20.

T.T. Toliver made a touchdown off a 52-yard kickoff return by **Mark Lewis** taking back the lead 35-31. **Chris Jamison** also rushed 1-yard from a kick by **Mark Lewis**. **Jarvis Williams** scored the final touchdown in the last play for the Predators after catching an 8-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Leak** for a final score of 49-39 win for the Predators.

Chris Leak completed 18 of 25 passes and 143-yards for 5 touchdowns. **Toliver** gained 67 receiving yards, and **Jarvis Williams** with a total of 60 yards and 4 touchdowns. **Glen Fox** also made 26-yards and one touchdown for the team.

2010

The Predators returned to action follow a tumultuous 2009 when the AFL went dark to restructure... After getting off to a slow start at 0 – 3, first year head coach, and former Preds QB, Pat O’Hara led the team to an 8 – 8 finish, pushing the Predators playoff streak to a league-leading 18 consecutive seasons... Rookie Quarterback Nick Hill quickly caught on and led Orlando to nine wins in the final 14 games of the season.... Hill set multiple team records including passing yards (4,289) and rushing yards (284)... The defense was anchored by DB’s Rayshaun Kizer and Kenny McEntyre, both recipients of 2010 All-Arena First Team honors.... The season ends in a one point loss to rival Tampa Bay Storm in the AFL conference championship game.

2011

The Predators vastly improved from 2010 in their first year at the new Amyway Center. Head coach Pat O’Hara led the team to an 11-7 season, qualifying for the playoffs for the 19th consecutive season. Second year quarterback Nick Hill set multiple team records including pass yards (4,758), rushing yards (391), passing completions(387), and passing touchdowns (97). Rayshaun Kizer and Travis Coleman were two of the stars among the defense. Kizer led the team in tackles (108.0), interceptions (16-team record), and defensive touchdowns (3). As the fourth seed in the American Conference, the Preds lost to the Jacksonville Sharks in the conference semifinals, 48-63.

2012

The Predators entered their 21st season in the AFL under direction of coach Bret Munsey. The season got off to a problematical start with the players going on strike, seeking a doubling of their wages. The first game, March 9th between the Pittsburgh Power and the Predators was played as scheduled game with replacement players making up about three-quarters of the roster. However, players began crossing the picket line by the second quarter and the AFL announced the work stoppage ended just two hours after the game had finished. First year quarterback Chris Leak recorded passing yards (2793), rushing yards (83), passing completions (245) and passing touchdowns (55) Simeon Castille and Travis Coleman stood out as defensive players with Castille lead the team in tackles, making a total of 108.5 for the season. COMMISSIONER JERRY B. KURZ

Jerry B. Kurz returns for his 27th season of Arena Football and fourth season as the AFL's Commissioner. Out-tenured only by the creator of Arena Football, Jim Foster, Kurz has dedicated his life to furthering the sport with a strong business ethic and core values meant to bring the highest quality product to the ever-growing fan base of Arena Football fans.

In his time as the president of the af2, the League saw extensive growth in small-to-mid-sized markets, building an extremely dedicated fan base across the country. That foundation helped to fuel the return of the Arena Football League in 2010 after a year on hiatus due to financial instability. Kurz and a group of enthusiastic investors arranged the acquisition of the AFL's assets in bankruptcy court in late 2009 and revived the League in early 2010, fulfilling the promise that Arena Football would be played in 2010.

Kurz has also served as the AFL's Vice President of International Development, where he was in charge of the League's international exposure. During his tenure, he was responsible for administering the H3 Visa program, allowing international players to play for AFL teams stateside. He also arranged and executed all internationally played games for the Arena Football League.

Arena Football isn't Kurz's only claim to fame. He is also a founding member of Gridiron Enterprises, Inc., a sports consulting firm based out of Chicago. Gridiron Enterprises, consisting of Kurz, Foster and attorney William Niro, is the original founder of the AFL. Kurz has been a player, coach, general manager and owner during his lifelong involvement with the game of football. He is also a member of four football Halls of Fame, including membership in the first class of the Arena Football Hall of Fame as well as membership in the arenafootball2 Hall of Fame.

Kurz attended the University of Oklahoma as an undergraduate and later earned his Juris Doctor Degree at Northern Illinois. Kurz is a licensed attorney in Illinois and operated a law firm with his wife, Kathryn Hall, for 20 years. Jerry and his wife, Kathryn, have one son named Matthew, who currently serves as the Director of Player Personnel for the AFL.

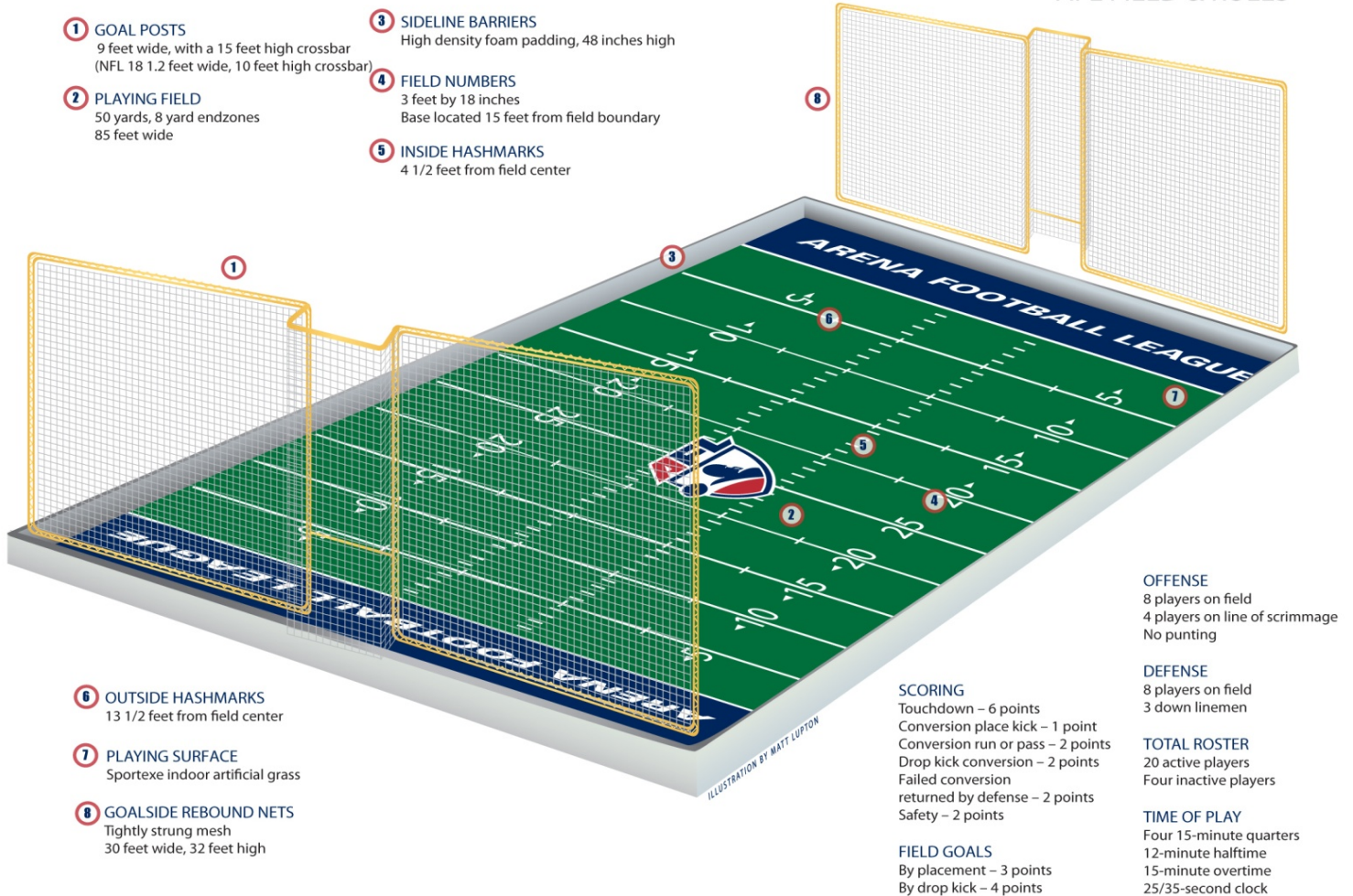

RULES OF THE GAME

AFL FIELD & RULES



FIELD

- An indoor padded surface 85 feet wide and 50 yards long with eight-yard end zones.
- Goal posts are nine (9) feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2 feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30 feet wide by 32 feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight (8) feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48 inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

EQUIPMENT

- The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball. Each ball is manufactured by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 21-man active roster; three-man inactive roster.
- Players may play both offense and defense.
- Substitution: Coaches are permitted to substitute players at will.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two-or-more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap.

TIMING

- Four (4) 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half and when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.

MOVEMENT OF THE BALL AND SCORING

- Four (4) downs are allowed to advance the ball ten (10) yards for a first down, or to score.
- Six (6) points for a touchdown.
- One (1) point for a conversion by place kick after a touchdown, two (2) points for a conversion by drop kick and two (2) points for a successful run or pass after a touchdown.
- Three (3) points for a field goal by placement or four (4) points for a field goal by drop kick.
- Two (2) points for a safety.

KICKING

- Kickoffs are from the goal line. Kickers may use a one-inch tee.
- Punting is illegal. On fourth down, a team may go for a first down, touchdown or field goal.
- The receiving team may field any kickoff or missed field goal that rebounds off the net.
- Any untouched kickoff, which is out of bounds, will be placed at the 20-yard line or the place where it went out-of-bounds, whichever is more advantageous to the receiving team.

PASSING

- Receivers must have one foot inbounds for a catch. A forward pass that rebounds off the rebound net or sideline barrier is a live ball and is in play until it touches the playing surface.

OVERTIME RULES

- Overtime periods are 15 minutes for both the regular season and the playoffs.
- Each team gets one (1) possession to score. If, after each team has had one possession, one team is ahead, that team wins. If the teams are tied after each has had a possession, the next team to score wins.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BALL IN THE STANDS – When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the “lucky” fan that catches the ball keeps it.

DROP KICK – A drop-kicked FG is worth 4 points. A drop-kicked extra point is worth 2 points. Spokane Shock kicker Taylor Rowan was the last man to connect on a two-point dropkick (7/22/2011 vs. Jacksonville).

IRONMAN – Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

FANS – More than 26 million fans have experienced an AFL game in the League’s 24-year history. Last year, in 2011, the AFL drew 1,338,544 fans in the regular season.

“MAC” AND “JACK” LINEBACKERS – “Mac” may rush the QB straight on without stunting, twisting or drop-back coverage. “Jack” must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either LB may cover the fullback or tight end.

OFFENSIVE MOTION – Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

OVERTIME – Arena Football has a unique overtime rule: If a contest is tied after regulation, teams will play a 15-minute overtime. Each team will have one opportunity to score. If, after each team has had one chance to score, the game is tied, the first team to score is crowned the winner.

REBOUND NETS – Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are 30-feet wide, 32-feet high and extend to 40 feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight (8) feet above the surface. The “scoring area” is nine-feet wide and 15-feet high. Nets are stretched taut so that a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. Once the ball caroms off the net, it’s live.

SIDELINE BARRIERS – Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring four (4) inches thick.

STUNTING OR TWISTING – When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there’s no “stunting” or “twisting.” In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen.

TIGHT END – One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap by simply raising his arm and “declaring” himself a tight end. The Mac (rush-eligible) linebacker must line-up on the opposite side of the center from the tight end.

TWO-WAY PLAYERS – One of the most “throwback” features of the Arena Football League is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight football, where at times, some players will play both offense and defense.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

ROSTER LIMITS

From the first day the League allows the signing of free-agent players until the first league-sanctioned cut-down date, teams are prohibited from having more than 35 players on their roster. Players listed on the active list or free-agent signees are considered eligible to be counted for the 35-man roster.

Teams will be required to reduce their active lists to 28 players by 5 p.m. CST 14 days before the first regular season game and to 24 players by 5 p.m. CST seven days before the first regular season game.

Each team may maintain a maximum 20-player roster and 4-player practice squad during the season. In a documented emergency, a team may add an emergency kicker to their roster, no later than one hour before kickoff.

TRADES

The trading period began on November 5, 2012 and will end at 5 p.m. CST on Monday, June 10, 2013. Upon reporting to his new team, each traded player must pass the physical given by his new team. Failure to pass the physical and/or failure to report will nullify the trade.

RESERVE LISTS

The reserve list of each team consists of the following categories; retired, refused to report, inactive reserve, injured reserve, suspended, other league exempt and physically unable to perform.

INJURED RESERVE

A player who is placed on injured reserve list must remain on injured reserve for a minimum of four weeks. Training camp weeks will not count against that total. Teams activating players from their injured reserve list must do so no less than 24 hours prior to that team's game.

PLAYOFF QUALIFICATION, SELECTION OF TEAMS

Eight teams qualify for the playoffs, four from each conference-- American and National. The four qualifying teams in each conference consist of the two division champions and two Wildcards, determined by best overall record. Seeding in each conference is based on overall record, with the top two seeds in each conference reserved for the division champions, regardless of record. In the **First Round, August 2-3**, the first two seeds in each conference are the two division winners. The next two teams are seeded by next best two overall records. Teams ranked 1 and 2 earn home playoff games with 1 hosting 4 and 2 hosting 3. In the **Conference Championship Round, August 9-10** the winner of the 1-4 game plays the winner of the 2-3 game. The home team is decided by the team with the higher seed. The winners of the Second Round will face off in **ArenaBowl XXVI on August 17th**.

Tiebreaking Procedures

If, at the end of the regular season, two or more clubs are tied with identical won-lost percentages, the following steps will be taken to determine rank.

Division Champions

If two teams are tied for Division Champions...

1. Record in head-to-head games
2. Record within the Division
3. Record against common opponents
4. Point differential in head-to-head games
5. Point differential in games against common opponents
6. Coin toss

Wildcard

If two teams are tied for the Wildcard...

1. Record in head-to-head games
2. Record within the Conference
3. Record against common opponents
4. Point differential in head-to-head games
5. Point differential in games against common opponents
6. Coin toss
