COMMISSIONER JERRY B. KURZ

Jerry B. Kurz returns for his 27th season of Arena Football and fourth season as the AFL's Commissioner. Out-tenured only by the creator of Arena Football, Jim Foster, Kurz has dedicated his life to furthering the sport with a strong business ethic and core values meant to bring the highest quality product to the ever-growing fan base of Arena Football

fans.

In his time as the president of the af2, the League saw extensive growth in small-to-midsized markets, building an extremely dedicated fan base across the country. That foundation helped to fuel the return of the Arena Football League in 2010 after a year on hiatus due to financial instability. Kurz and a group of enthusiastic investors arranged the acquisition of the AFL's assets in bankruptcy court in late 2009 and revived the League in early 2010, fulfilling the promise that Arena Football would be played in 2010.

Kurz has also served as the AFL's Vice President of International Development, where he was in charge of the League's international exposure. During his tenure, he was responsible for administering the H3 Visa program, allowing international players to play for AFL teams stateside. He also arranged and executed all internationally played games for the Arena Football League.

Arena Football isn't Kurz's only claim to fame. He is also a founding member of Gridiron Enterprises, Inc., a sports consulting firm based out of Chicago. Gridiron Enterprises, consisting of Kurz, Foster and attorney William Niro, is the original founder of the AFL. Kurz has been a player, coach, general manager and owner during his lifelong involvement with the game of football. He is also a member of four football Halls of Fame, including membership in the first class of the Arena Football Hall of Fame as well as membership in the arenafootball2 Hall of Fame.

Kurz attended the University of Oklahoma as an undergraduate and later earned his Juris Doctor Degree at Northern Illinois. Kurz is a licensed attorney in Illinois and operated a law firm with his wife, Kathryn Hall, for 20 years. Jerry and his wife, Kathryn, have one son named Matthew, who currently serves as the Director of Player Personnel for the AFL.

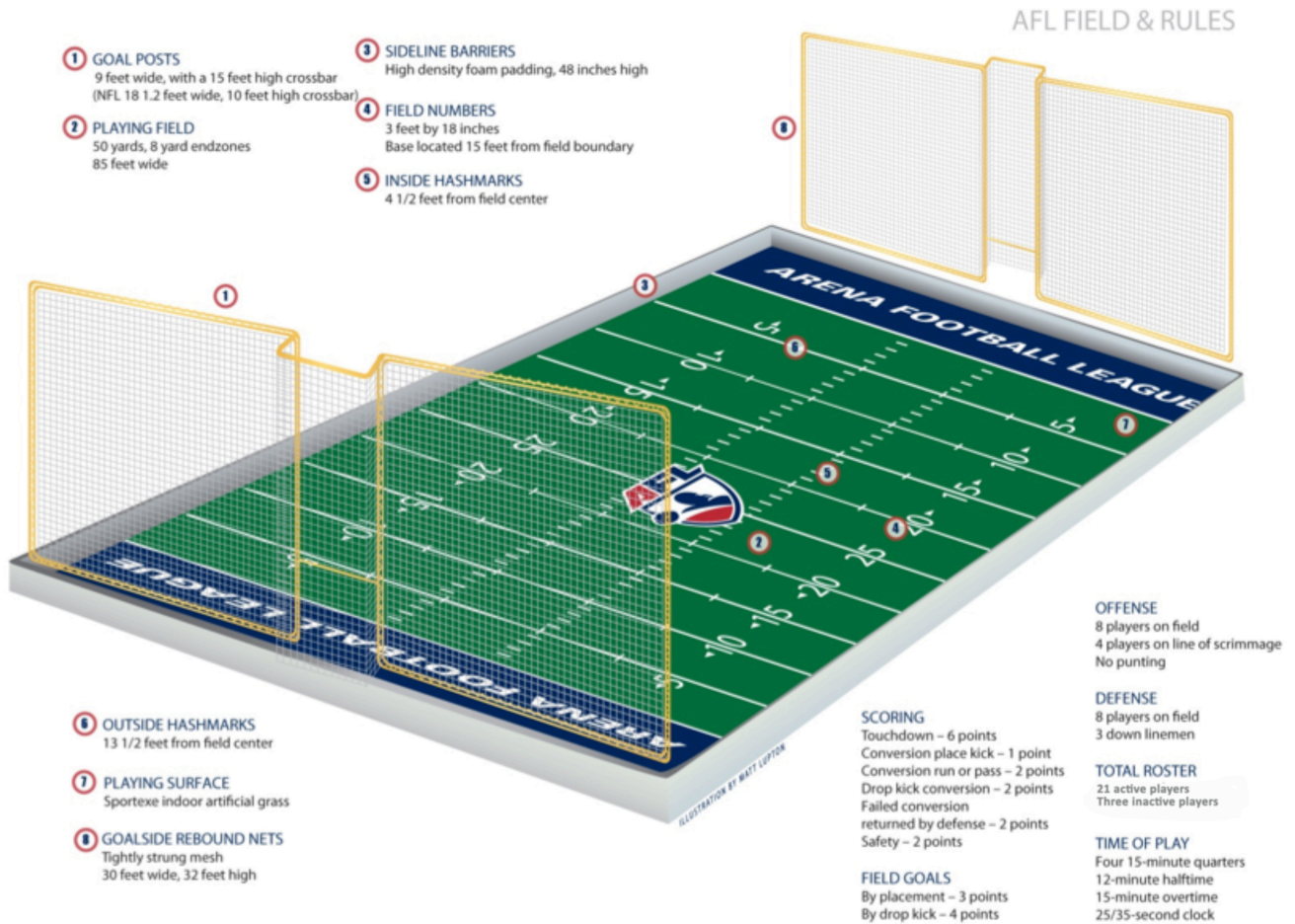

RULES OF THE GAME



FIELD

- An indoor padded surface 85 feet wide and 50 yards long with eight-yard end zones.
- Goal posts are nine (9) feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2 feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30 feet wide by 32 feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight (8) feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48 inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

EQUIPMENT

- The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball. Each ball is manufactured by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 21-man active roster; three-man inactive roster.
- Players may play both offense and defense.
- Substitution: Coaches are permitted to substitute players at will.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two-or-more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap.

TIMING

- Four (4) 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half and when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.

MOVEMENT OF THE BALL AND SCORING

- Four (4) downs are allowed to advance the ball ten (10) yards for a first down, or to score.
- Six (6) points for a touchdown.
- One (1) point for a conversion by place kick after a touchdown, two (2) points for a conversion by drop kick and two (2) points for a successful run or pass after a touchdown.
- Three (3) points for a field goal by placement or four (4) points for a field goal by drop kick.
- Two (2) points for a safety.

KICKING

- Kickoffs are from the goal line. Kickers may use a one-inch tee.
- Punting is illegal. On fourth down, a team may go for a first down, touchdown or field goal.
- The receiving team may field any kickoff or missed field goal that rebounds off the net.
- Any untouched kickoff, which is out of bounds, will be placed at the 20-yard line or the place where it went out-of-bounds, whichever is more advantageous to the receiving team.

PASSING

- Receivers must have one foot inbounds for a catch. A forward pass that rebounds off the rebound net or sideline barrier is a live ball and is in play until it touches the playing surface.

OVERTIME RULES

- Overtime periods are 15 minutes for both the regular season and the playoffs.
- Each team gets one (1) possession to score. If, after each team has had one possession, one team is ahead, that team wins. If the teams are tied after each has had a possession, the next team to score wins.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BALL IN THE STANDS – When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the “lucky” fan that catches the ball keeps it.

DROP KICK – A drop-kicked FG is worth 4 points. A drop-kicked extra point is worth 2 points. Spokane Shock kicker Taylor Rowan was the last man to connect on a two-point dropkick (7/22/2011 vs. Jacksonville).

IRONMAN – Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

FANS – More than 26 million fans have experienced an AFL game in the League’s 24-year history. Last year, in 2011, the AFL drew 1,338,544 fans in the regular season.

“MAC” AND “JACK” LINEBACKERS – “Mac” may rush the QB straight on without stunting, twisting or drop-back coverage. “Jack” must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either LB may cover the fullback or tight end.

OFFENSIVE MOTION – Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

OVERTIME – Arena Football has a unique overtime rule: If a contest is tied after regulation, teams will play a 15-minute overtime. Each team will have one opportunity to score. If, after each team has had one chance to score, the game is tied, the first team to score is crowned the winner.

REBOUND NETS – Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are 30-feet wide, 32-feet high and extend to 40 feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight (8) feet above the surface. The “scoring area” is nine-feet wide and 15-feet high. Nets are stretched taut so that a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. Once the ball caroms off the net, it’s live.

SIDELINE BARRIERS – Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring four (4) inches thick.

STUNTING OR TWISTING – When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there’s no “stunting” or “twisting.” In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen.

TIGHT END – One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap by simply raising his arm and “declaring” himself a tight end. The Mac (rush-eligible) linebacker must line-up on the opposite side of the center from the tight end.

TWO-WAY PLAYERS – One of the most “throwback” features of the Arena Football League is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight football, where at times, some players will play both offense and defense.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

ROSTER LIMITS

From the first day the League allows the signing of free-agent players until the first league-sanctioned cut-down date, teams are prohibited from having more than 35 players on their roster. Players listed on the active list or free-agent signees are considered eligible to be counted for the 35-man roster.

Teams will be required to reduce their active lists to 28 players by 5 p.m. CST 14 days before the first regular season game and to 24 players by 5 p.m. CST seven days before the first regular season game.

Each team may maintain a maximum 20-player roster and 4-player practice squad during the season. In a documented emergency, a team may add an emergency kicker to their roster, no later than one hour before kickoff.

TRADES

The trading period began on November 5, 2012 and will end at 5 p.m. CST on Monday, June 10, 2013. Upon reporting to his new team, each traded player must pass the physical given by his new team. Failure to pass the physical and/or failure to report will nullify the trade.

RESERVE LISTS

The reserve list of each team consists of the following categories; retired, refused to report, inactive reserve, injured reserve, suspended, other league exempt and physically unable to perform.

INJURED RESERVE

A player who is placed on injured reserve list must remain on injured reserve for a minimum of four weeks. Training camp weeks will not count against that total. Teams activating players from their injured reserve list must do so no less than 24 hours prior to that team's game.

PLAYOFF QUALIFICATION, SELECTION OF TEAMS

Eight teams qualify for the playoffs, four from each conference— American and National. The four qualifying teams in each conference consist of the two division champions and two Wildcards, determined by best overall record. Seeding in each conference is based on overall record, with the top two seeds in each conference reserved for the division champions, regardless of record. In the **First Round, August 2-3**, the first two seeds in each conference are the two division winners. The next two teams are seeded by next best two overall records. Teams ranked 1 and 2 earn home playoff games with 1 hosting 4 and 2 hosting 3. In the **Conference Championship Round, August 9-10** the winner of the 1-4 game plays the winner of the 2-3 game. The home team is decided by the team with the higher seed. The winners of the Second Round will face off in **ArenaBowl XXVI on August 17th**.

Tiebreaking Procedures

If, at the end of the regular season, two or more clubs are tied with identical won-lost percentages, the following steps will be taken to determine rank.

Division Champions

If two teams are tied for Division Champions...

1. Record in head-to-head games
2. Record within the Division
3. Record against common opponents
4. Point differential in head-to-head games
5. Point differential in games against common opponents
6. Coin toss

Wildcard

If two teams are tied for the Wildcard...

1. Record in head-to-head games
2. Record within the Conference
3. Record against common opponents
4. Point differential in head-to-head games
5. Point differential in games against common opponents
6. Coin toss

Keith Recine enters his sixth season in the Arena Football League as Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of the San Antonio Talons. He has spent the past five years with the Orlando Predators as Director of Game Day Operations and Corporate Sponsorship Coordinator, and also spent time in the Orlando ticket office. He joined the Predators in 2008 after almost twenty years in the Orlando service industry. He also spent extensive time in public relations and public affairs. He joins the San Antonio Talons this season and is charged with overseeing the team's business operations as well as helping to build the football program.

Recine has been actively involved in local politics in the past and devotes a great deal of time to local public policy issues. He and his wife Sawsan have been married for 17 years and have a 16-year-old son, Mazin.



Head Coach – Lee Johnson



Coach Johnson is in his second season as the San Antonio Talons head coach. Johnson began his coaching career with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League, serving as defensive line coach in 1997 before being promoted to defensive coordinator the following season. He gained NFL coaching experience with an internship for the Denver Broncos in 2002 under then-defensive coordinator Ray Rhodes and defensive line coach Jacob Burney. He served as the defensive line coach for the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in 2001-02, helping guide the team to two World Bowl titles.

Johnson started his Arena Football League coaching career in 2000 as the defensive coordinator for the Carolina Cobras in their inaugural season. From 2003-06, Johnson was on the coaching staff of the Colorado Crush. He was originally named defensive coordinator and spent his final three seasons with the Crush as special teams/line coach. He spent the 2007 season as defensive coordinator of the Austin Wranglers. Johnson was the line coach with the Cleveland Gladiators in 2008. Under his guidance, the offensive line paved the way for fullback Marlion Jackson to rush a league-leading 356 yards and tied for the league lead with 23 rushing touchdowns. Last season, he was the line coach under current Chicago Rush Head Coach Mike Hohensee with the AF2's Peoria Pirates.

Prior to his coaching career, Johnson had a playing career spread across the NFL, World League, CFL, and AFL. Johnson was member of the Washington Redskins when they won the Super Bowl in 1991. Most of his success as a player came in the AFL. Johnson played three seasons split between the Tampa Bay Storm and Charlotte Rage.

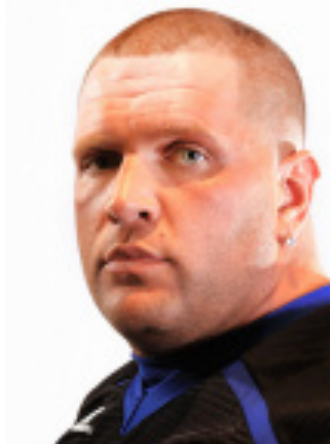

SAN ANTONIO- The San Antonio Talons (1-0) narrowly beat the Utah Blaze (0-1), 54-48, in front of 6,886 fans at the Alamodome.

Reigning ArenaBowl champion quarterback Aaron Garcia led the way for Talons, completing 23-of-37 throws for 341 yards and eight touchdowns and one interception. He found receivers Jomo Wilson and Carl Moore for three scores a piece while also hooking up with Jason Willis on two more touchdown completions.

Defensive back Josh Jones led Utah with 8.0 tackles and picked off a first quarter pass attempt by Garcia that led to a Blaze score. Nose guard Keenan Mace also notched the team’s only sack in the first quarter. He forced Garcia to fumble on the play, and defensive end Mike Lewis was able to recover the loose ball. Utah again converted the turnover into points.

The teams traded scores throughout much of the game, leading to a 48-48 tie in the fourth quarter. With 5:27 remaining, Utah drove the ball to the Talons 18-yard line before the offense stalled. Tommy Grady faced fourth-and-long when Ken Fontenette intercepted him in the end zone. Two plays later, Garcia lofted a 34-yard touchdown pass to Jomo Wilson to seal the game.

QB Garcia’s 34-yard pass to Jomo Wilson with 54 seconds left in the game gave the San Antonio Talons their final lead in an exciting thriller, winning their inaugural game.

Talons Slay SaberCats 72-47

SAN ANTONIO – With an impressive display of offensive skills, the San Antonio Talons (7-3) ended the No. 1 San Jose SaberCats (7-3) winning streak by a score of 72-47.

What could best be described as an opportunistic night for San Antonio, the Talons converted every turnover into a touchdown and scored after every onside kick recovery. San Antonio forced four turnovers, two interceptions and two fumbles, and recovered five onside kicks throughout the night.

“We jumped up on them,” said Lee Johnson, head coach. “San Jose doesn’t get in to many onside kick situations, but we put them in a situation where they pretty much had to, and we capitalized on all of them.”

San Antonio’s offense led by Arena Bowl XXIV Champion quarterback, Aaron Garcia, developed an early lead in the first quarter, scoring three touchdowns on three possessions and putting up 20 points in just the first 10 minutes of the game. The offense scored on every drive of the game allowing the Talons to maintain the lead throughout the entire game. Garcia, the National Guard MVP of the Game, threw for 141 yards and six touchdowns.

The Talons broke their season high in points for the second consecutive week. Chad Cook had two rushing and one receiving touchdown, while Jomo Wilson, Offensive Player of the Game, and Burl Toler, JLS Ironman of the Game, each scored two touchdowns.

The Talons defense held the SaberCats, who have averaged over 70 points per game this season, to their record low, scoring only 47 points. At the beginning of the second half, San Jose’s quarterback, Mark Grieb, had only completed one touchdown pass. Grieb threw for a total of 303 yards and three touchdowns.

San Antonio’s defense had a spectacular third quarter allowing only one touchdown and back-to-back interceptions by Fred Shaw and Eric Crocker. Shaw was awarded Spalding Highlight of the Game for his interception, which he ran back 56 yards for a touchdown.

The Talons’ win against the SaberCats also set another record allowing them to take over the title of longest winning streak of the season with four consecutive wins.

“The winning streak is awesome, but ideally we’re looking ahead to the Arena Bowl,” said Johnson. The closer our wins get to the Championship, the better I’ll feel, but I’ll take it.”

The San Antonio Talons play the Utah Blaze next Saturday, May 26 in Utah. The Talons next home game is Saturday, June 16th in the Alamodome against the Iowa Barnstormers. Kick off is at 7 p.m.

SAN ANTONIO – The Talons (14-3) proclaimed their dominance in the league and beat the Rattlers (12-5) 62-61 to extend their winning streak to 11 consecutive victories on Saturday night in the Alamodome.
