John Pettit comes to the Iowa Barnstormers with over 30 years of executive level management experience and a background in startup organizations. Having worked with several championship teams in both the NHL and AHL, as well as Arena Football, John's track record is exemplary in developing winning teams and franchises.

John started his career in upstate New York, overseeing the construction of and managing the Glens Falls Civic Center in the late

1970's. It was there that the Detroit Red Wings recognized John's talents and brought him to Detroit. During his time in Detroit, John directed and managed several properties including Joe Louis Arena and Cobo Arena. He was responsible for overseeing business operations for the Red Wings, and was a part of two Stanley Cup Championships. In addition, John was the Vice President of Stadium Operations for the brand-new Comerica Park.

From 1999 to 2001, John was the Senior Vice President of Business Operations with Madison Square Garden. While with MSG, John oversaw the entire business operation of the New York Rangers AHL team, the Hartford Wolf Pack. During that time, the Wolf Pack won the 2000 Calder Cup Championship, and the team set an AHL record for the highest gross ticket revenue in league history during the playoffs.

John is highly regarded for his professional leadership in developing initiatives utilized industry wide. His expertise at successfully negotiating labor contracts, creating high impact marketing and sales strategies, and developing new departments and programs, has been successfully felt at each of the organizations he has served as Vice President or President of. Mike Hohensee



Head Coach

The 2014 season will be Mike Hohensee's 28th consecutive season in Arena Football and his third as the Head Coach and Director of Football Operations for the Iowa Barnstormers. Hohensee joined the organization on August 16, 2011. He is regarded as one of the best coaches in the history of the AFL, and was rewarded this past season by being inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame.

During his previous 19 seasons, his teams have qualified for the playoffs 13 times. Hohensee is best known for his 10 year run as Head Coach of the

Chicago Rush (2000-2010). During that time period, the Rush made the playoffs every year of their existence, won four division titles and ArenaBowl XX in 2006. Hohensee also coached the now defunct Albany Firebirds to three first-place finishes and has made stops in Washington, New England, Anaheim, Philadelphia and Peoria (af2). His career AFL coaching record of 159-147 makes him the third winningest coach in the history of the league, only 3 victories behind Danny White in the number two spot.

In college, Hohensee played for the Minnesota Golden Gophers. After coming out of junior college at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, California, Hohensee quarterbacked the Gophers for two seasons in 1981 and 1982, setting numerous school passing records. Hohensee went on to play professional football for the Washington Federals of the USFL from 1983-84, and played in the CFL in 1985. In 1987 he joined the Chicago Bears briefly before moving on to quarterback the AFL's Pittsburgh Gladiators during the league's first two seasons in 1987-88 While with Pittsburgh, he threw the first TD pass in AFL history in 1987. Twenty-eight years later, Hohensee is ready to lead the Barnstormers to their first ArenaBowl Championship!

The 2014 season will be Ernesto "Netto" Purnsley's third season as the Barnstormers Defensive Coordinator. He was hired by the Barnstormers on September 30, 2011. Purnsley will once again oversee all aspects of the Barnstormers defensive unit. Purnsley brings a wealth of experience to the Barnstormers organization, having coached in the AFL for 16 seasons. His AFL coaching career began with stops in Albany (1997-98) and Indiana (2000-02). In 2003, he began a 5 year run as Defensive

Coordinator of the Colorado Crush (2003-07), where the team 3 division titles and the Arena Bowl XIX Championship in 2005. In 2008, Purnsley joined Barnstormers Head Coach Mike Hohensee in Chicago as Defensive Coordinator of the Rush. In 2010, Purnsley got his big break when he was named Head Coach of the AFL's Utah Blaze, however his tenure lasted just one year. Purnsley reunited with Hohensee in Philadelphia for the 2011 season, before ultimately landing here in Des Moines. Purnsley is a native of North Carolina. He played college football at Catawba College, where he was a wide receiver and quarterback. In 1991 he was named wide receivers coach at Concord College (West Virginia). He has also coached at Southern Illinois (1994-96), Charleston Southern University (1997) and Murray State (1998-99).

Remembering Greg Boyd

Last December, the Iowa Barnstormers unexpectedly lost one of their own. Greg Boyd was not only the team's Director of Marketing, but one of their biggest fans. He will always be remembered by his devotion to the Iowa Barnstormers. This 2014 season, the team will honor Greg by wearing his initials on their helmets.

The Early Years

In February 1992, Jim Foster, Founder of the Arena Football League, met with a small group of local investors with the idea of bringing an expansion franchise to Des Moines, Iowa. One year later the Arena Football League played its first game in Iowa; a preseason match-up between the Arizona Rattlers and Cleveland Thunderbolts. The teams played in front of a sell-out crowd of 10,082. Following the success of that game, the AFL brought their All-Star Game to Des Moines that August and in April of 1994, Des Moines was awarded an expansion franchise for the 1995 season!

On February 6, 1995 the Iowa Barnstormers introduced John Gregory as their first ever head coach. The Barnstormers kicked off their inaugural season on the road May 12th against the Milwaukee Mustangs and returned home a week later on May 20th to take on the Miami Hooters. By the end of June the Barnstormers had sold out four straight games. Their good fortune continued through the summer as the team qualified for playoffs, scoring their first playoff win in August of 1995.

It only took until their second season for the Barnstormers to make it to their first league championship game as they qualified for ArenaBowl X in 1996. Unfortunately, the Barnstormers were unable to pull out a victory. However, a sold-out crowd in Veterans Memorial Auditorium along with a record TV audience tuned in to ESPN to see the boys play in "The Barn." They made a repeat appearance to the ArenaBowl in 1997, but once again fell short of a victory.

Barnstormers Bitten By Sharks Again in Jacksonville

Jacksonville, FL – The Iowa Barnstormers faced off against the Jacksonville Sharks on Friday night at Sea Best Field in Jacksonville, FL. For the third straight season, Iowa came up short against the Sharks, falling this time by a narrow margin of 40-34. Trailing by 11, DL Mike Lewis sacked Morris at the 4 yard line, forcing a fumble that was returned for a touchdown by Iowa LB Darnell Carter. On the next Jacksonville Drive Morris was intercepted by Iowa DB Jason Simpson and two plays later Raterink connected with WR Marcus Harris for a 43 yard touchdown to give the Barnstormers their first lead of the night 28-27. Jacksonville reclaimed the lead 34-28 on the final play of the 3rd quarter as Morris hit Harvey for his third TD of the game.

After trading defensive stops, the Barnstormers tied the game at 34-34 when Raterink found Harris in the end zone for a 25 yard touchdown. The Sharks replied with a 5 yard pass from Morris to White, regaining the lead 40-34 with just over 4 minutes remaining in the game. The Barnstormers had one final opportunity to regain the lead, but their effort fell short as Jacksonville stopped the Iowa offense on downs with just over a minute to play to seal the victory.

The Tampa QB did exactly that, driving his team the length of the field. Facing a 4th and goal situation from the 3 yard line with .3 seconds remaining on the clock, McPherson connected with WR Joe Hills for the game winning score, sending the Iowa faithful home disappointed.

The turnover gave the SaberCats one last shot at victory and they looked as if they were prepared to do it, marching the length of the field before being stopped at the 8 yard line. From there San Jose had 4 opportunities to punch the ball into the end zone, but the Iowa defense held strong on 4 straight downs to seal the victory for the Barnstormers.

Barnstormers Denied Victory By Orlando

Iowa Loses 55-41, Officially Eliminated From Playoff Contention

ORLANDO, FL – The lowa Barnstormers played another hard fought game on Saturday night at the Amway Center in Orlando, Florida. However four untimely turnovers were too much for lowa to overcome as they dropped a 55-41 decision to the Predators. However these two scores turned out to be the only two lowa would have in the first half. Orlando rallied behind QB Aaron Garcia to take a 21-14 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The Predators received the opening kickoff and were driving when Iowa DL William Stokes sacked Garcia, forcing a fumble that was returned by Iowa's Matangi Tonga for a TD, evening the score at 21-21. Once again though, Orlando would respond with two more Garcia TD passes to open up a 34-21 lead. However, the Barnstormers returned the favor again as Raterink connected with WR Jesse Schmidt on consecutive drives to tie the game again at 34-34 just seconds into the final quarter.

The fourth quarter continued to be much of the same as Garcia hooked up with WR Jason Geathers to regain the lead for the Predators. On the ensuing kickoff Orlando forced a fumble by Iowa DB Jason Simpson and recovered the ball at the Barnstormers 3 yard line. On the next play, the Predators extended their lead to 48-34 on a 3 yard TD run by Mykel Benson. The team's then exchanged touchdowns one final time, however the 14 point difference was too much for the Barnstormers to overcome.

The Kurt Warner Impact

In 1998 the Barnstormers saw one of their stars, and former Iowa native Kurt Warner, shine even brighter when the quarterback signed a contract to play for the NFL's St. Louis Rams. Warner would later lead the Rams to a SuperBowl XXXIV victory in January, 2000. Warner led the Rams back to the SuperBowl once again in 2002 and later brought the Arizona Cardinals to their first SuperBowl game in franchise history in 2010.

With Warner gone, the Barnstormers found their next great quarterback as newcomer Aaron Garcia grabbed the starting role after Warner's exit. Garcia went on to break many of Warner's team records, spending four years with the Iowa franchise.

Under the leadership of Garcia, the Barnstormers returned to the playoffs in 1999 (improving from 5-9 in 1998 to 11-3 in 1999). The 2000 season sent them to the playoffs once again and was highlighted by the return of Kurt Warner to Iowa to see his #13 jersey become a retired number in the Barnstormers organization.

The Barnstormers Disappearance

OWA

Following the 2000 season, the Barnstormers franchise was sold to the NHL's New York Islanders ownership group, led by Charles Wang and Sanjay Kumar. They believed that the team needed a more modern venue and they were searching to place the team in a larger market. That fall, the AFL approved to move the team from Des Moines to Long Island, New York and renamed the team, the New York Dragons. However, this did not remove the team completely, because the Barnstormers were awarded an af2 franchise carrying the same name. The franchise played one season in af2 before ceasing operations in 2001. Vet's Auditorium was left dark and the Barnstormers were gone.





Eight teams qualify for the playoffs, four from each conference-- American and National. The four qualifying teams in each conference consist of the two division champions and two Wildcards, determined by best overall record. Seeding in each conference is based on overall record, with the top two seeds in each conference reserved for the division champions, regardless of record. In the **First Round, August 2-3**, the first two seeds in each conference are the two division winners. The next two teams are seeded by next best two overall records. Teams ranked 1 and 2 earn home playoff games with 1 hosting 4 and 2 hosting 3. In the **Conference Championship Round, August 9-10** the winner of the 1-4 game plays the winner of the 2-3 game. The home team is decided by the team with the higher seed. The winners of the Second Round will face off in **ArenaBowl XXVII on August 23rd**, with the highest remaining seed hosting the championship game.

Tiebreaking Procedures

Definitions

Strength of Schedule – Combined winning percentage of opponents played.

Best net points in all games – Difference of points scored and points scored against. (Includes all points: offense, defense, and special teams.)

Winning percentage – Total number of wins divided by total number of games.

Division Champions – Two Teams

If two teams are tied for Division Championship:

- 1. Head-to-head (best winning percentage in games between clubs)
- 2. Point differential in head-to-head games
- 3. Best winning percentage in division games
- 4. Best net points in all games
- 5. Strength of Schedule
- 6. Coin toss

Division Champions – Three or more teams

(Note: If three or more teams are tied, follow steps until one team is eliminated. Once two teams remain, revert back to Step 1 of the two team tiebreaker to determine which team advances.)

- 1. Head-to-head (best winning percentage in games among the clubs)
- 2. Best winning percentage in division games
- 3. Best net points in all games
- 4. Strength of Schedule
- 5. Coin toss



Wildcard – Three or more teams

(Note: If three or more teams are tied follow steps until one team is eliminated. Once two teams remain, revert back to Step 1 of the two team tiebreaker to determine who advances)

- 1. Head-to-head (best winning percentage in games between the clubs)
- 2. Best net points in all games
- 3. Strength of schedule
- 4. Best winning percentage in division games
- 5. Coin Toss

Other Tie-Breaking Procedures

- 1. Only one team advances to the playoffs in any tie-breaking step. Remaining tied teams revert to the first step of the applicable two team division or Wildcard tie-breakers. As an example, if two teams remain tied in any tie-breaker step after all other teams have been eliminated, the procedure reverts to Step 1 of the two-team format to determine the winner. When one team wins the tiebreaker, all other teams revert to Step 1 of the applicable two-team or three-team format.
- 2. In comparing records within the division among tied teams, the best winning percentage is the deciding factor, since teams may have played an unequal number of games.

Conference Seeding Tie-Break Procedure

If both division winners in the same conference finish with the same record, the following will break the tie for seeding purposes:

- 1. Head-to-head, best winning percentage in games between clubs
- 2. Point differential in head to head games
- 3. Total net points in all games
- 4. Strength of schedule
- 5. Best winning percentage in division games
- 6. Coin toss.

ArenaBowl Tie-Break Procedure

- 1. Highest Playoff Seed
- 2. Overall record (Best winning percentage)
- 3. Head-to-head, best winning percentage in games between clubs (if applicable)
- 4. Point differential in head-to-head games
- 5. Total net points in all games
- 6. Strength of schedule
- 7. Coin toss

Commissioner Jerry B. Kurz

Jerry B. Kurz returns for his 28th season of Arena Football and fifth season as the AFL's Commissioner. Out-tenured only by the creator of Arena Football, Jim Foster, Kurz has dedicated his life to furthering the sport with a strong business ethic and core values meant to bring the highest quality product to the ever-growing fan base of Arena Football fans.

In his time as the president of the af2, the League saw extensive growth in small-to-midsized markets, building an extremely dedicated fan base across the country. That foundation helped to fuel the return of the Arena Football League in 2010 after a year on hiatus due to financial instability. Kurz and a group of enthusiastic

investors arranged the acquisition of the AFL's assets in bankruptcy court in late 2009 and revived the League in early 2010, fulfilling the promise that Arena Football would be played in 2010.

Kurz has also served as the AFL's Vice President of International Development, where he was in charge of the League's international exposure. During his tenure, he was responsible for administering the H3 Visa program, allowing international players to play for AFL teams stateside. He also arranged and executed all internationally played games for the Arena Football League.

Arena Football isn't Kurz's only claim to fame. He is also a founding member of Gridiron Enterprises, Inc., a sports consulting firm based out of Chicago. Gridiron Enterprises, consisting of Kurz, Foster and attorney William Niro, is the original founder of the AFL. Kurz has been a player, coach, general manager and owner during his lifelong involvement with the game of football. He is also a member of four football Halls of Fame, including membership in the first class of the Arena Football Hall of Fame as well as membership in the arenafootball2 Hall of Fame.

Kurz attended the University of Oklahoma as an undergraduate and later earned his Juris Doctor Degree at Northern Illinois. Kurz is a licensed attorney in Illinois and operated a law firm with his wife, Kathryn Hall, for 20 years. Jerry and his wife, Kathryn, have one son named Matthew, who currently serves as the Director of Player Personnel for the AFL.



RULES OF THE GAME





AFL 101

FIELD

- An indoor padded surface 85 feet wide and 50 yards long with eight-yard end zones.
- Goal posts are nine (9) feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2 feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30 feet wide by 32 feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight (8) feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48 inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

EQUIPMENT

• The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball. Each ball is manufactured by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 21-man active roster; three-man inactive roster.
- Players may play both offense and defense.
- Substitution: Coaches are permitted to substitute players at will.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two-or-more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap.

TIMING

- Four (4) 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half and when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.

MOVEMENT OF THE BALL AND SCORING

- Four (4) downs are allowed to advance the ball ten (10) yards for a first down, or to score.
- Six (6) points for a touchdown.
- One (1) point for a conversion by place kick after a touchdown, two (2) points for a conversion by drop kick and two (2) points for a successful run or pass after a touchdown.
- Three (3) points for a field goal by placement or four (4) points for a field goal by drop kick.
- Two (2) points for a safety.

KICKING

- Kickoffs are from the goal line. Kickers may use a one-inch tee.
- Punting is illegal. On fourth down, a team may go for a first down, touchdown or field goal.
- The receiving team may field any kickoff or missed field goal that rebounds off the net.
- Any untouched kickoff, which is out of bounds, will be placed at the 20-yard line or the place where it went out-of-bounds, whichever is more advantageous to the receiving team.

PASSING

• Receivers must have one foot inbounds for a catch. A forward pass that rebounds off the rebound net or sideline barrier is a live ball and is in play until it touches the playing surface.

OVERTIME RULES

- Overtime periods are 15 minutes for both the regular season and the playoffs.
- Each team gets one (1) possession to score. If, after each team has had one possession, one team is ahead, that team wins. If the teams are tied after each has had a possession, the next team to score wins.



Glossary of Terms

BALL IN THE STANDS – When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the "lucky" fan that catches the ball keeps it.

DROP KICK – A drop-kicked FG is worth 4 points. A drop-kicked extra point is worth 2 points. Spokane Shock kicker Taylor Rowan was the last man to connect on a two-point dropkick (7/22/2011 vs. Jacksonville).

IRONMAN – Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

FANS – More than 26 million fans have experienced an AFL game in the League's 24-year history. Last year, in 2011, the AFL drew 1,338,544 fans in the regular season.

"MAC" AND "JACK" LINEBACKERS – "Mac" may rush the QB straight on without stunting, twisting or drop-back coverage. "Jack" must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either LB may cover the fullback or tight end.

OFFENSIVE MOTION – Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

OVERTIME – Arena Football has a unique overtime rule: If a contest is tied after regulation, teams will play a 15-minute overtime. Each team will have one opportunity to score. If, after each team has had one chance to score, the game is tied, the first team to score is crowned the winner.

REBOUND NETS – Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are 30-feet wide, 32-feet high and extend to 40 feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight (8) feet above the surface. The "scoring area" is nine-feet wide and 15-feet high. Nets are stretched taut so that a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. Once the ball caroms off the net, it's live.

SIDELINE BARRIERS – Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring four (4) inches thick.

STUNTING OR TWISTING – When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there's no "stunting" or "twisting." In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen.

TIGHT END – One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap by simply raising his arm and "declaring" himself a tight end. The Mac (rush-eligible) linebacker must line-up on the opposite side of the center from the tight end.

TWO-WAY PLAYERS – One of the most "throwback" features of the Arena Football League is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight football, where at times, some players will play both offense and defense.

From Interstate 80 from the West: Head east on I-80, take the I-235 exit and continue towards Downtown Des Moines. Take the Downtown Des Moines exit and go south to Wells Fargo Arena.

Parking is available on-site for a cost of \$7 per vehicle. Call the Barnstormers office or Iowa Events Center for rates and special instructions for buses and other large vehicles. Street parking and parking in other downtown parking ramps may vary in price and are typically free on weekends.

The Return

Over the next few years, the sports landscape in Des Moines changed drastically, most notably with the opening of Wells Fargo Arena in 2005. With a new facility in place a group of local investors led by Jeff Lamberti applied for an af2 expansion franchise in 2007 and the Barnstormers were re-born!

The team returned for the 2008 season and the fan support came back as though the team had never left. The Barnstormers may have ended their return season with a record of 6-10, but were second in the league in attendance averaging over 9,000 fans per game. The 2009 season proved that the Barnstormers could only continue to grow, they improved their record to 13-5 they made it to the second round of playoffs and pushed their attendance up to over 9,500 per game.

In 2010, the Barnstormers took their next step forward as they once again became part of the Arena Football League. The 2010 and 2011 seasons provided the Barnstormers with some growing pains, as the franchise finished with 7-9 and 5-13 records. Following the 2011 season, the Barnstormers reached out to Mike Hohensee to become their next Head Coach. Hohensee brings with him a proven track record, including an ArenaBowl victory as Head Coach of the Chicago Rush in 2006. In 2012 Hohensee was named to the Arena Football Hall of Fame. The team has developed a group of young exciting players and is ready to make the next step in 2014. We need you, the fans, to come along for the ride!
