MEDIA POLICIES



Welcome to the 2016 Arena Football League season. In an effort to continue to provide a professional working environment, the following guidelines have been established for the upcoming season.

CREDENTIALS Access to Arizona Rattlers football games for accredited working media will require proper credentials. All credentials are non-transferable, and any unauthorized use will subject bearer to ejection from Talking Stick Resort Arena and confiscation of the credential.

Season credentials will be issued to recognized newspapers, magazines, television and established radio stations making reasonable requests on company letterhead. Please indicate those persons who will be using each credential.

Season and single-game credentials will be issued only to those who make requests on company letterhead. These requests can be sent by email to pgarbow@azrattlers.com and must be requested by Wednesday prior to the game. Pre-arranged credentials may be picked up at the media will-call at the northeast press entrance two hours before game time. No credentials will be mailed.

Media must wear credentials in plain view at all times within the arena. Working media with credentials will have access to the press room at designated times, as well as an assigned seat. Your cooperation is required to maintain a professional working atmosphere.

PHOTOGRAPHERS Photo credentials will be issued in the same manner as other credentials. Field access will be available to photographers from media outlets that have received credentials from the Rattlers media office. Photographers with the proper credentials will enter the arena through the press entrance and proceed down the stairway to the field level. Shooting areas are limited.

PARKING Members of the media who are covering the Rattlers game will be able to park in our parking garage. The garage entrance lot is located south of the building on the corner of First Street and Jackson. All media that contact media relations will be on a list to receive access into the garage. These requests should be made at the same time as credential requests.

PRESS ENTRANCE The press entrance is located on the northeast corner of the Talking Stick Resort Arena. Media members with proper Rattlers credentials will be admitted through this entrance. If a media representative requested credentials for a single game, they also can be picked up at this location. The press entrance will open two hours before game time. Credentials will not be recognized at other arena entrances.

PRESS ROOM The Rattlers media work room is located in the northeast corner of the building on the field level. It can be reached through the press entrance and by walking down the stairs to the field level. The media work room, equipped with telephones, electrical outlets and press materials, will be open two hours before kick-off, during halftime intermission and for post-game work.

GAME-NIGHT SERVICES Statistics will be furnished, including pre-game notes, halftime and final stats. All information will be available in the media work room. Fax service also will be available.

RADIO AND TELEVISION Electronic media representing the visiting team must contact the Rattlers media relations office to ensure broadcast locations and lines. Three business telephones for visiting radio will be furnished by the Rattlers, but specific broadcast loops will have to be ordered by the station. Additional lines or information can be requested through Ashley Mercereau at (602) 379-2058.

Statisticians and spotters are available to assist radio and television broadcasts by contacting Media Relations.

PRACTICES All Rattlers practices are open to the media. Contact Media Relations Front Office to confirm practice schedules from week-to-week.





RON SHURTS, MAJORITY OWNER / CEO

Ron Shurts took over as majority owner and CEO of the Rattlers in 2011. Since then, the Rattlers have gone on to appear in four straight ArenaBowls, and win three straight ArenaBowl Championships.

Shurts has been a part of the Rattlers since the beginning. He has been a season-ticket holder since the team's first snap in 1992.

A prominent Valley entrepreneur and co-founder of Scottsdale- based Annexus[™], Shurts has more than 25 years of experience in financial services, sales and management, and has trained thousands of financial professionals. He also is the owner of Shurwest Financial Group, a national marketing firm for financial advisors, which is also based in Scottsdale.

Before he founded Shurwest Financial Group in 1985, Shurts was an insurance agent selling life insurance, fixed-indexed annuities and long term care insurance to farmers in western Nebraska.

An avid golfer and Nebraska Cornhuskers' fan, he is active in the community. Shurts is a sponsor of Phoenix Suns Charities, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Arizona and The Salvation Army. in 2014 Shurts accepted the Jason Foundation Community Service Award for his, and the Rattlers' dedication to the community. He also is a proud father to his son AJ.





KEVIN GUY, GENERAL MANAGER / HEAD COACH

Kevin Guy begins his 16th season coaching in Arena football, his 12th as a general manager and head coach, and his eighth in that position with the Rattlers.

In 2015, Guy was nominated for the AFL Hall of fame and was inducted into the University of West Alabama Hall of Fame.

In 2014, Guy led one of the AFL's most-storied franchises to its fourth consecutive ArenaBowl appearance and third straight world championship, a 72-32 victory over the Cleveland Gladiators. The Rattlers posted an AFL-record 14 straight victories to start the season, and ended the regular season at 15-3 and going undefeated on their home turf at Ak-Chin Field at US Airways Center.

Guy's offense in 2014 was explosive, scoring 164 touchdowns and averaging a league-leading 63.9 points per game. The Rattlers offense under Guy, was led by its opposing pass offense that threw for over 5,000 yards and averaged a staggerring 8.4 yards per attempt.

In 2013, Guy led the Rattlers to its third consecutive ArenaBowl appearance and second straight world championship, a 48-39 victory over the Philadelphia Soul. The Rattlers posted a then AFL-record 18 victories (first set by the team in 2011).

Under Guy, Arizona's offense led the league in scoring with 170 touchdowns and averaging 66.8 points per game. The Rattlers also fielded one of the league's most stingy defenses, allowing only 48.1 points per game, second to Philadelphia's 46.6. Guy also saw eight of his players receive All-Arena honors, including two first-teamers.

In 2012, Guy led Arizona to its first ArenaBowl championship in more than a decade. The Rattlers won 16 games, earning back-to-back West Division and National Conference championships. The offense scored 158 touchdowns during the regular season and averaged 62.1 points per game, while the defense forced 45 turnovers and allowed 48.9 points per game.

Guy's 2011 team piled up 160 touchdowns during the regular season, averaging 61.9 points per game. The defense, meanwhile, forced 54 turnovers for a plus-34 turnover ratio – the best in the AFL – while holding opposing teams to 46.4 points per game. While the Rattlers would make their first ArenaBowl appearance since 2004, they would come up short in the final seconds, losing 73-70 to the Jacksonville Sharks.

An arenafootball2 Hall of Fame inductee, Guy has proven to be a consistent winner, owning a 72.6 winning percentage (122-46) as a head coach. In 2011, he was named NFL Network Coach of the Year.

Guy joined the Rattlers on Aug. 10, 2007. He had been serving as defensive coordinator for the San Jose SaberCats, which had just won ArenaBowl XXI. The Rattlers, meanwhile, were coming off the second-worst record in the league (4-12). Guy immediately went to work. He retained only three players from the 2007 team and began the 2008 season with nine rookies and seven second-year players. Arizona would win four more games over the previous year and host a first-round playoff game against Grand Rapids. Guy finished second in voting for AFL Coach of the Year, one of only four coaches to receive votes for the award. In 2010, the Rattlers would post their first winning season (10-6) since 2004 and reach the National Conference semifinals, losing 57-49 to the Spokane Shock.

While the AFL reorganized in 2009, Guy continued his duties with the Rattlers and served as a consultant to the general manager and head coach of the Rio Grande Valley Dorados (af2). Guy assisted with all aspects of the organization, including business and football operations. With the help of Guy's advisement, Rio Grande Valley return to the af2 playoffs after failing to reach the postseason the previous year. »» continued



Guy left the af2 with the most wins in the history of the league when he joined the SaberCats in 2005. His 52 victories came in his four seasons, an average of 13 wins per season. He picked up a Coach of the Year award along the way and finished with a 73.2 winning percentage while leading the Tennessee Valley Vipers (2002-04) and Dorados (2005).

In 2005, Guy led the Texas-based Dorados to a 10-6 regular-season record and a trip to the league's National Conference championship game. The Dorados' last victory that season, a 65-42 decision over Tulsa in the playoffs, lifted him to the top of the league's coaching leaders.

With Tennessee Valley, Guy's teams won 39 of 48 regular-season games and claimed a division title each season. In 2003, the Vipers won their first 14 games and reached the conference championship game. Guy would be named Coach of the Year.

Guy's teams consistently were ranked near the top of all major statistical categories during his tenure as an af2 coach. He had 31 players advance from the af2, with five joining the National Football League. He had 14 players earn All-af2 recognition.

In 2001, Guy became the defensive coordinator for the AFL's Florida Bobcats, where his defense limited opposing teams to fewer than 30 points per game twice and forced 26 turnovers. Florida also averaged six defensive stops per game.

Guy joined the coaching ranks after an AFL playing career that lasted four seasons. He began the 2000 season as the defensive coordinator of the New Jersey Red Dogs. At 26, he was elevated to interim head coach for the last four games. His team was ranked fourth in the AFL in total defense and fifth in pass defense. Over those final four games, the Red Dogs averaged almost 10 more points per game than over the first 10 games.

As a player, Guy spent four seasons with the Minnesota Fighting Pike (1996), the Red Dogs (1997-99) and the Orlando Predators (1999), primarily as a wide receiver and defensive back. He helped the Predators reach ArenaBowl XIII.

Guy attended the University of West Alabama from 1991 to 1995. He was born Dec. 6, 1972, in Birmingham, Ala..





KANI KAUAHI, ASSISTANT HEAD COACH / OFFENSIVE LINE

Kauahi begins his tenth season with the Rattlers. The Hawaii native spent the early portion of his professional coaching career working with teams in the Canadian Football League, including the Hamilton Tiger-Cats (2006), Ottawa Renegades (2002-05) and BC Lions (1998-2000). He also logged one season with the San Francisco Demons (2001) of the XFL.

Kauahi began his coaching career in 1995 as the offensive line coach at Mesa Community College. He also served as the strength and conditioning coach for the Arizona Cardinals (1996-97).

After playing college football at Arizona State University and the University of Hawaii, Kauahi spent 11 years as a center in the National Football League – twice with the Phoenix Cardinals (1993, 1989-91). He also played for the Kansas City Chiefs (1992), Green Bay Packers (1988) and Seattle Seahawks (1982-86).

Kauahi most recently has been coaching the offensive line at the University of Waterloo , in Waterloo, Ontario, Canada.

Kauahi was born Sept. 6, 1959, in Kekaha, Hawaii. He and his wife, Gay, have three children: Kalei, Kamana and Hana.





DAVE EWART, DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR / DIRECTOR OF PLAYER PERSONNEL

Dave Ewart begins his 23rd year coaching in Arena football, his third with the Rattlers.

Ewart spent the last three years as the head coach of the Tampa Bay Storm, leading the team to the American Conference semifinals in 2013 against the Jacksonville Sharks. He also served seven years as an assistant to the late Tim Marcum, AFL Hall of Fame coach. Ewart was named the Storm's sixth head coach in team history on Feb. 17, 2011.

Ewart's 2011 team recorded an AFL-record 41 sacks. As an assistant in 2010, his defensive line racked up the second-most sacks (29) in the league as the Storm went on to compete in ArenaBowl XXIII.

After serving as an assistant coach at East Tennessee State and Glenville State College in the early 1990s, Ewart began his professional coaching career in 1994 with the Cleveland Thunderbolts. He also spent time with the St. Louis Stampeded (1995-96), Texas Terror (1997), Florida Bobcats (1998, 2000-01) and New England Sea Wolves (1999).

Ewart attended Salem International University, where he played on the offensive line from 1987-88 before transferring to East Tennessee State. He twice was an All-Southern Conference selection and earned Division I-AA All-American honors during his time with the Buccaneers.

Ewart was born March 30, 1969, in Shinneston, W. Va.





SIAHA BURLEY, OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR / DIRECTOR OF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS


Siaha Burley begins his fifth season as a coach in the AFL, his second (nonconcurrent) season with the Rattlers.

Burley spent the 2014 and 2015 seasons as the offensive coordinator for the Orlando Predators. In that time, the Predators consistently ranked in the top 3 on offense, including ranking first in the league this past season in yards per offensive play, averaging 7.1 yards per attempt, and in rushing offense, earning 4.0 yards per rush. Burley was named the 2015 Assistant Coach of the Year.

Prior to his stint with the Predators, Burley was the offensive coordinator for the central division champion Chicago Rush in 2013. That year, the Rush finished in the top five in total offense. In 2011, Burley was named the wide receivers coach for the Arizona Rattlers. That year, the Rattlers made their first of four straight appearances at the ArenaBowl.

As a player, Burley spent the 2004-05 seasons, as well as the 2008 and 2010 seasons with the Arizona Rattlers. In 2005, he set the franchise record with 45 touchdown receptions. Burley also spent time with the Utah Blaze where he earned his second AFL Offensive Player of the Year award in 2007 when he set the league record for reception yards in a season (2,129). Burley began his career with the Orlando Predators, where he earned AFL All-Rookie Team honors in 2001. In his career, he was named to the All-Arena team three times.

The Mesa, Arizona native attended Central Florida University, where he led his team in receiving yards for two straight seasons. Burley has two daughters, Sia Jonet (11) and N'Lae (7).



JEFF JARNIGAN, ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Jeff Jarnigan begins his ninth year in Arena Football, his first with the Rattlers

Prior to joining the Rattlers, Jarnigan spent seven seasons with the San Jose SaberCats, coaching in numerous capacities.

Jarnigan also was the defensive coordinator for the AFL's Austin Wranglers in 2004.

Aside from his AFL experience, Jarnigan also was the head coach for the AF2's Oklahoma City Yard Dawgz from 2005-2006. In 2000, Jarnigan became the head coach for the Minnesota Rage of the Indoor Football League.

From 1988 to 1999, Jarnigan was employed by four collegiate programs (Fort Hays State University, Bethel College, Morningside College, and Carleton College; at each, he generally served as either an offensive line or defensive line coach.

A native of Oklahoma, Jarnigan played football at Southwestern College.

LELAND RODGERS, STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH

Rodgers enters his third season as the Head Strength and Conditioning Coach for the Arizona Rattlers as well as over seeing all areas of sports performance for the team. Prior to joining the Rattlers organization Rodgers started his coaching career working under Coach Howard Schnellenberger after playing for Florida Atlantic University. Coach Rodgers has been a Director of Strength and Conditioning for two different high schools in the East Valley and has worked multiple camps for the Oakland Raiders as well as the Cleveland Browns. Rodgers is a former Head Football Coach at the 6A level in Arizona as well as a defensive coordinator at two other 6A programs.

Coach Rodgers is C.S.C.S certified with the National Strength and Conditioning Association, a certified Sports Performance Coach for U.S.A. Weight Lifting and also F.M.S. certified.



TODD CONNER, EQUIPMENT MANAGER / QUALITY CONTROL

Conner begins his sixth season with the Rattlers, his third as equipment manager and the team's quality control department.

In 2015, Conner earned the Arena Football League's Equipment Manager of the Year award.

Conner joined the Rattlers as a football operations intern in 2010. He had been the general manager of Barro's Pizza in Mesa for 30 years.

Conner was a wide receiver on Fullerton College's team that won the South Coast Conference championship in 1981. He attended Esperanza High School in Anaheim, Ca., and was a part of the school's first state championship in 1979.

Conner resides in Gilbert with his wife, Audrey. He and his wife have two children, Kara and Brianna. Conner also has a granddaughter, Kaydence.

Nick Davila is beginning his seventh season in Arena Football, all with the Rattlers.

In 2015 he completed 313-of-474 passes for 3,519 yards and 87 touchdowns with 10 interceptions in 14 starts for the Arizona Rattlers. In 2014 he was named AFL MVP, Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Year and First Team All-Arena after passing for 4,778 yards and a franchise record 127 touchdowns in 18 games with the Arizona Rattlers. He became the first player in pro football history to throw at least 100 touchdown passes in five consecutive seasons, doing so in his first five years in the League and became the 10th man in pro football history to record at least 500 touchdown passes in a career. Nick earned ArenaBowl XXVII MVP honors after 19-of-25 passes for 237 yards and eight touchdowns en route to becoming the first starting quarterback in AFL history to win three consecutive ArenaBowl titles. He holds the career ArenaBowl records for completions (87), passing yards (1,156) and touchdowns (31). In 2013, he was named second-team All-Arena after passing for 4,847 yards and 110 touchdowns with the Rattlers and became the first quarterback in pro football history to throw at least 100 touchdown passes in four consecutive seasons, doing so in his first four years in the league. Nick was selected for the Al Lucas AFL Pulse Player of the Year for his contributions on and off the field. In 2012, he was selected second-team All-Arena after passing for 113 touchdowns and a single-season franchise record 5,500 yards with the Rattlers and became the first quarterback in pro football history to throw at least 100 touchdown passes in three consecutive season, doing so in his first three years in the league. He also recorded a single-game franchise record 11 touchdown passes against the Utah Blaze on May 19, 2012. He was also named ArenaBowl XXV MVP after setting ArenaBowl records with a passer rating of 142.5 and completion percentage of 76.7 percent against the Philadelphia Soul, and tied the ArenaBowl record for touchdown passes with nine in ArenaBowl XXV. In 2011, Davila was named National Guard MVP of the Year and second-team All-Arena after leading the league in pass efficiency (127.6) and ranking second in completion percentage (70.7) and pass completions (427) with the Rattlers. He led the Rattlers to their best regularseason record in the franchise's 18-year history, notching 16 wins and 2 losses, returning to the Arena Bowl for the first time since 2004. In 2010, he set the AFL record for most passes attempted (617) and completed (415) by a rookie quarterback, as well as league marks for completion percentage (67.3), passing touchdowns (102), and passing yards (4,858) with the Rattlers.







ARIZONA SHOCKS SPOKANE 60-43

Phoenix, Ariz.– The Arizona Rattlers' (1-0) quest for a four-peat started strong with a 60-43 home win over the Spokane Shock (0-1).

The Rattlers began their quest for history tonight in front of a crowd of 9,455 and they did so with and entirely new wide receiving core. Tysson Poots is in Las Vegas, Maurice Purify is still out from an injury he suffered last season, and Rod Windsor and Kerry Reed were both held out as game time decisions by head coach and general manager Kevin Guy. Jared Perry and Markee White have both played for Arizona in the past. Chase Deadder is beginning his third season in the Arena Football League (AFL). Ronnell Pompey is beginning his first season in the AFL and with the Rattlers after earning the spot from attending an open tryout with the Rattlers this past February.

Tonight was a celebration for the Rattlers. It began with the Rattlers unveiling their 2014 ArenaBowl championship banner, and with the Arizona governor Doug Ducey doing the honorary coin flip. It ended with an exciting win for Arizona.

Spokane started strong with a 35 yard touchdown pass from quarterback Carson Coffman to wide receiver Mike Washington.

The Rattlers answered with a 1 yard run from fullback Mykel Benson, after a 30 yard pass from quarterback Nick Davila to wide receiver Jared Perry put them on the one.

The Shock responded with a 10 yard touchdown pass from Coffman to Washington. The extra point attempt from kicker Taylor Benson was blocked by linebacker Tyre Glasper.

Arizona once again answered with a touchdown catch from wide receiver Jared Perry from a scrambling Davila. The drive stayed alive because of two converted two first downs from Benson.

The ensuing kickoff clanked off the upright and was recovered by Rattlers wide receiver Markee White for another Arizona touchdown. After a good extra point attempt from kicker Jeremy Shelley, the Rattlers held a 21-13 lead.

The second quarter started similar to the first for Spokane with a 36 yard touchdown pass from Coffman to Washington.

After two big receptions of 18 and 14 yards to White that put the Rattlers in scoring position, Davila finished off the drive with a 10 yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Chase Deadder.

Spokane's very next play was a completed pass from Coffman to wide receiver Rashaad Carter who fumbled the ball and was recovered by Rattlers defensive back Jeremy Kellem. Arizona capped off the drive with a 3 yard touchdown run by Benson. Shelley's extra point attempt was blocked by nose guard Terrence Taylor.

Coffman slowly drove the Shock down the field on their next possession, which concluded with a 3 yard run by nose guard Bryson Kelly.

Spokane failed to recover their own onside kick, putting the Rattler's in good scoring position. The Shock's defense, however, was able to hold, and forced Arizona to attempt a field goal. Shelley's attempt was good, giving the Rattlers a 37-27 lead.

The Shock had 36 seconds left in the half to work with, and was able to drive down to the Rattlers 7 yard line. But with 1 second left, linebacker Glasper broke through Spokane's line and sacked Coffman, ending the half.

The Rattlers did not slow down in the second half with 13 unanswered points. It began with a 3 yard touchdown pass from Davila to Deadder. Shelley's extra point attempt was no good. Arizona's defense came up big with a forced fumble on backup quarterback Jarrett Brown by defensive end Marcus Pittman, which was recovered by Glasper. The Rattlers then scored on a 5 yard pass from Davila to Deadder, making the score 50-27.

At this point Spokane's fortunes began to turn with 16 unanswered points. It began when Brown scrambled for a 10 yard touchdown run. Then the Shock's linebacker Derrick Summers sacked Davila for a safety. The Shock then took their next possession down for another touchdown with a 3 yard run by Kelly.

Unfortunately for Spokane, this was the closest they got to the Rattlers. Arizona added 10 more points with a 16 yard field goal from Shelley and a 2 yard touchdown run from Benson.





RATTLERS (2-1) HOLD ON TO BEAT CLEVELAND (2-1) 49-41

Cleveland, Ohio – The Arizona Rattlers (2-1) looked to bounce back this Saturday against the Cleveland Gladiators (2-1) after being upset last week by Las Vegas, and in front of 12,776 Gladiator fans, they did just that with a 49—41 victory at the Quicken Loans Arena in Cleveland, Ohio.

The Rattlers receiving corps are finally beginning to get healthy, with wide receivers Rod Windsor and Kerry Reed both making their first starts of the season, and the Rattlers were a different team bec ause of it. All seven touchdown passes thrown tonight were caught by Windsor (4 touchdowns) and Reed (3 touchdowns). For his efforts Rod Windsor earned both the J. Lewis Small Playmaker of the Game award for his 4 touchdowns and 156 reception yards, and the Cutters Catch of the Game for his one handed touchdown catch in the 1st.

Arizona Rattlers quarterback Nick Davila was the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game tonight with 352 yards and seven touchdown passes. Davila's seven touchdowns moves him past John Kaleo for seventh all-time in passing touchdowns. Davila is currently leads all active players with 586 career touchdowns.

Every time the Rattlers began to put some distance between them and the Gladiators, Cleveland was able to find a way to respond. Fortunately for Arizona, they were able to hold on with an interception from defensive back Jeremy Kellem in the closing seconds to seal the victory.

The Rattlers came out strong when a pass by Cleveland quarterback Shane Austin was intercepted by defensive back Arkeith Brown. Four plays later, Arizona quarterback Nick Davila threw a touchdown pass to Reed for his first of 3 touchdowns.

The rest of the first quarter both teams went back and forward with Cleveland scoring on a rushing touchdown from fullback Jeremy Richardson (Cleveland kicker AdrianTrevino missed the point after), and a touchdown pass from Austin to wide receiver Dominic Goodman. The Rattlers scored on two touchdown passes from Davila to Windsor, and with 10 minutes left in the half, the Rattlers led 21-13.

The Gladiator's next possession ended with a turnover on downs deep in the Rattlers territory. Arizona however, was able to take advantage with a 30 yard touchdown pass from Davila to Reed.

Arizona then stopped Cleveland again, when Austin threw another interception; this one caught by defensive back Jeremy Kellem. However, despite Arizona being able to successfully kill off the rest of the second quarter, with 1st and goal with 10 seconds remaining at Cleveland's 5 yard line, Davila threw an interception on the goal line to defensive back Terrence Sanders, who ran it back 50 yards for a Cleveland touchdown to end the half at 28-20 Arizona.

The second half again was a seesaw battle. Every time the Rattlers scored, the Gladiators were able to respond. Arizona had a chance to put the game away late when up by 8 and 43 seconds left in the game, Rattlers kicker Jeremy Shelley attempted a 16 yard field goal, which went wide right. This gave the Gladiators the ball down by 8 with 38 seconds to go in the game.

Arizona was finally able to seal the game with the interception thrown by Austin to Kellem with 20 seconds left in the 4th.

The Rattlers return to action next Saturday, April 18th when they host the Portland Thunder (2-1) on Ak-Chin Indian Community Field at US Airways Center. Kickoff is at 6:00 p.m.

RATTLERS ROLL PAST THE THUNDER 65 -47

Phoenix, Ariz. – The Arizona Rattlers (3-1) flexed its defensive muscle Saturday night with a victory over their conference rival, the Portland Thunder (2-2) by a score of 65-47.

With this win, head coach and general manager Kevin Guy is now one win away from tying Jay Gruden for 6th place all-time career regular season wins. Guy currently has 81 regular season wins.

Arizona leaned heavily on the defense in the first half and the offense in the second to earn this win. Rattlers quarterback Nick Davila had an outstanding night throwing 9 touchdowns (6 of them going to wide receiver Rod Windsor) and had 319 passing yards. The defense back Marquis Floyd was able to force 2 fumbles and defensive back Jeremy Kellem caught an interception.

Although the Rattlers seemed to be clicking on both offense and defense, Arizona still struggled on special teams. The Rattlers are on their third kicker this week when Fabrizio Scaccia was unable to go today due to a pulled muscle. In his place was former Arizona Wildcat kicker Alex Zendejas, who only went 5 for 9 on point after attempts (PATs). Zendejas was better on kickoffs. He averaged 50 yards on the kickoff and was able to kick the ball off the bar or the net on most of his attempts.

The Rattlers defense was stifling, only allowing the Portland Thunder to score 13 first half points. Arizona's defensive back Marquis Floyd forced his first fumble on wide receiver Duane Brookes that went for a touchback on Portland's opening drive. Kellem, the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game, caught an interception from quarterback Kyle Rowley late in the second half and returned it to mid-field, which was the AFL Highlight of the game. The Rattlers also forced two turn-overs on downs, including one where the Thunder had a first and goal on the 1 yard line.

The Rattlers offense was just as affective, with Davila throwing 4 first half touchdowns, including a 3 yard pass to wide receiver Markee White, an 11 yard pass to Windsor who was the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game, and two catches by wide receiver Kerry Reed, the first was a 32 yard bomb, and the second was an impressive 1 handed grab late in the second quarter which was the Cutters catch of the game. Davila did throw one interception to defensive back Bryce Peila. The first half ended with the Rattlers doubling up on the Thunder 26-13.

The second half was more of a seesaw battle. Rattlers scored twice in the third quarter with two touchdown passes from Davila to Windsor, and 8 yard pass, and a 5 yard pass. The Rattlers failed to convert on both 3rd quarter PATs.

Portland responded with a 7 yard touchdown run by fullback John Martinez. This was the only rushing touchdown scored by either team. They also had a 12 yard pass from Rowley to wide receiver Jamar Howard.

RATTLERS (4-1) ROCK THE KISS (0-5), 68-30

Los Angeles, Cali. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers roll to their 4th win of the season with a strong performance at the Honda Center in Anaheim Saturday night against the Los Angeles KISS, defeating them by a score of 68-30.

The game, which was nationally televised on the CBS Sports Network, was the first of three games the Arizona Rattlers will face the KISS this season.

It was a tale of two halves for Arizona Rattlers quarterback Nick Davila. He had an incredibly efficient first half, throwing 19 completions of 22 attempts and 6 touchdowns passes to 4 different receivers, including one of the two touchdown passes to 300-pound tight end Joe Gibbs.

The second half however was much different. Davila only threw one more touchdown in the third, and left the game early in the 4th with a lower body injury. "We will get (Davila) back to our doctor and have him take a look at him. If he can't go, he can't go," head coach and general manager Kevin Guy said. "We have a lot of confidence in BJ (Coleman) and it's a team game." Overall, Davila was 24 of 32, 7 touchdowns, and 1 interception.

The KISS started their backup quarterback Brian Zbydniewski after their starter, Adrien McPherson, was hurt after their game last week against Orlando. The Rattlers defense made it difficult on Zbydniewski, who was sacked 4 times, twice by defensive tackle Anttaj Hawthorne, and once by both defensive ends Tyre Glasper and Marcus Pittman. Zbydniewski was also picked off twice, once by defensive end Arkeith Brown and once by defensive end Jeremy Kellem. Kellem has now caught at least 1 interception in three straight games. He also recovered a fumble.

Arizona's special teams also looked much better Saturday night. Kicker Fabrizio Scaccia went 8-10 on point after attempts (PAT's), one of which was blocked. He was also very strong on kickoffs, hitting the net on all but one attempts. AJ Cruz also returned to the lineup and returned 4 kickoffs for 75 yards. He also recovered a fumbled off a kickoff.

The Rattlers' next game will be at 6:00 p.m. next Saturday (April 25th) when they return home to face the undefeated San Jose SaberCats (5-0). This will be the first time the two teams face each other since the 2014 Western Conference Finals, where the Rattlers defeated the SaberCats 72-56.

RATTLERS (4-2) LOSE TO THE SABERCATS (6-0) 56-34

Phoenix, Ariz. – The Arizona Rattlers suffered their second loss of the season to the San Jose Sabercats at the US Airways Center Saturday night by a score of 56-34.

A few streaks ended Saturday night. The 2014 MVP and Rattlers quarterback Nick Davila had a streak of 106 straight games played. It would not extend to 107 as quarterback BJ Coleman got the start. Davila was placed on injured reserve Thursday afternoon. The Rattlers 15-game home win streak was also snapped Saturday night.

San Jose did not come out of the game unscathed. The SaberCats suffered a loss at quarterback when halfway through the 3rd quarter; Erik Meyer went down after being hit by defensive tackle Anttaj Hawthorne. He stayed down for several minutes until he was finally taken off the field via stretcher.

Special teams were a bright spot for Arizona, especially with kick returns, as defensive back AJ Cruz had 189 yards on 7 attempts (27 yards per attempt average) and 1 touchdown.

The game started fast. San Jose quarterback Erik Meyer's first pass was completed to wide receiver DJ Stevens for a 33-yard touchdown. This was followed up by back-to-back kickoffs returned for touchdowns. The first was by AJ Cruz, his second of the season. The second was by SaberCats defensive back Reggie Gray.

The Rattlers kept the game close in the first half, and with the first drive of the second half, tied the game at 34 all with a 1 yard run by fullback Mykel Benson. That was the last time the Rattlers reached the endzone.

The SaberCats took the lead again with a touchdown pass from Meyers to wide receiver Reggie Gray. The Rattlers next drive ended with Coleman being sacked by linebacker Francis Maka for a safety.

SaberCats quarterback Nathan Stanley threw for two more touchdowns in the 4th quarter, to end the game.

The Rattlers' next game will be next Saturday, May 9th at 5:00 PM when they visit the New Orleans Voodoo (2-4), who beat the Spokane Shock Saturday night. This will be Arizona's first meeting with the Voodoo since 2013.

RATTLERS (5-2) VICTORIOUS OVER VOODOO (2-5), 47-39

New Orleans, La. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers earn their 5th win of the season at the Smoothie King Center in New Orleans Saturday night against the New Orleans VooDoo, defeating them by a score of 47-39.

Arizona started sluggish, scoring only 20 first half points, and trailed at the end of the half by four. A strong 3rd quarter on all three sides of the ball propelled the Rattlers to victory.

This is Rattlers head coach and general manager Kevin Guy's 84th regular season win, which pushes him to sixth place overall in all-time regular season wins. He passes current National Football League's (NFL) Washington Redskins' head coach Jay Gruden.

The Rattlers started the game short-handed. The 2014 league MVP quarterback Nick Davila is still on injured reserve. Star wide receiver and iron man Kerry Reed also sat out Saturday night's game due to a pulled hamstring. Six year veteran nose tackle Anttaj Hawthorne began the week on a four game league suspension. It has since been reduced to one game, however he still had to miss Saturday night's game.

Rattlers quarterback BJ Coleman once again had stretches of inconsistency, but still had a strong enough game to earn the win and the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game. He was 18 for 31 passing with 4 touchdowns and 160 yards.

Arizona defensive back AJ Cruz started the scoring for the Rattlers with a 57 yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the 1st quarter, which earned him the AFL Highlight of the game. This would be the last time New Orleans would kick off to him in the first half, opting instead to have former Rattler, now VooDoo kicker Garrett Lindholm to kick on-sides twice and squib it once.

The Rattlers first half play made it look like the missing players were just too much for them to bear. However, Arizona came out in the 3rd quarter and once again looked like the defending ArenaBowl champions. Offensively they scored 20 points, twice on passes from Coleman (one to wide receiver Rod Windsor, and the other to wide receiver Darrin Moore), and once on a 5 yard run from fullback Mykel Benson. Defensively, the Rattlers held the VooDoo out of the end zone in the 3rd.

The Riddell Defensive Player of the Game, defensive back Marquis Floyd, got his first interception of the season late in the 3rd quarter. Last season, Floyd had a career high with 13 interceptions, and like this season, he did not get his first pick until later in the season. It was not until week nine that he got that interception. Along with the interception, Floyd ended the game with 6 tackles, 1 pass breakup, and 1 forced fumble.

The Rattlers' next game will be at 6:00 p.m. next Saturday (May 16th) when they return home to seek revenge on the Las Vegas Outlaws (3-2). This will be the first time the two teams face each other since the Outlaws knocked off the Rattlers in week 2. The game will be televised on FOX Sports Arizona.

Back in week two, Las Vegas caught Arizona off-guard with a couple of missed field goals that the Outlaws returned for touchdowns. The Rattlers would not allow another letdown, despite missing some key pieces on offense. Arizona wide receiver Rod Windsor was the only offensive player who started Saturday night to play a snap for the Rattlers last season.

"We have to develop players," said Rattlers' head coach and general manager Kevin Guy, "I thought our staff has done a great job of that."

The Rattlers defense did not allow a first down until just over a minute left in the first quarter, forcing two straight four and outs. Defensive back Jeremy Kellem earned the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game for his two fourth quarter interceptions.

Arizona Rattlers' quarterback BJ Coleman followed up his AFL MVP performance from last week with another solid performance and earned the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game. His first two completions went for touchdowns, both to Windsor the second of which was the Cutters Catch of the Game. Overall, Coleman threw for 212 yards and 7 touchdowns.

"I'm extremely proud of BJ Coleman and how he played," Guy said. "He is going to continue to grow, and when he's playing, the way he's playing, it gives us flexibility not to rush Nick (Davila) back if we don't have to."

Arizona attacked the Outlaws both from the air and the ground. Rattlers' fullback Mykel Benson rumbled in for two first half touchdowns, and finished the night with 26 yards on 13 carries.

Defensive back and return specialist AJ Cruz had another electric kickoff return, falling 2 yards short of another touchdown. The return was the AFL Highlight of the game. Cruz also was all over the field on defense, notching 4.5 tackles and a pass breakup.

Las Vegas' quarterback JJ Raterink was under pressure all night. He was sacked once by linebacker Tyre Glasper, and also was rushed into some tough throws. While he did have a great second quarter, going a perfect 8 for 8 and 2 touchdowns, the rest of the game he was under 50 percent passing. Overall, he was 16 for 31, 4 touchdown and 2 picks.

The Rattlers' next game will be Saturday, May 30th at 7:00 PM when they visit the Spokane Shock (2-5), who lost to the San Jose SaberCats Saturday night by 55 points. Arizona beat Spokane in this season's opener by a score of 60-43. The game will be televised on ESPN2.

RATTLERS (7-2) GET BIG WIN IN SPOKANE (3-6), 59-47

Spokane, Wash. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers do not have too many losing streaks, and after Saturday's win against the Shock in Spokane, they have one less. Going into Spokane, the Rattlers were 1-5 in Washington, with that single win coming in 2012.

The Rattlers came into the game down another quarterback when Arizona got sudden word this week that quarterback BJ Coleman quit the team. With reigning MVP quarterback Nick Davila still on Injured Reserve, first time Rattlers' quarterback Shane Boyd took over the team, and had no trouble spreading the ball around, throwing 7 touchdowns to four different receivers earning him the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game.

Wide receiver Markee White led all Rattlers' receivers with 3 touchdown passes, including a one-handed fingertip touchdown grab that earned him the Cutters Catch of the game.

Arizona's fullback Mykel Benson had another big game, running for 19 yards on 5 carries, and had 2 touchdowns, one on the ground and one in the air.

Arizona's defense also stepped up in a big way Saturday night. Linebacker and return specialist AJ Cruz was all over the field with 10.5 tackles and a tipped pass to go along with his 50 kick return yards. Defensive tackle Anttaj Hawthorne added another sack in the first. Defensive back Jeremy Kellem caught his seventh interception late in the 4th quarter which essentially ended the game. Kellem's interception, along with his team leading 11 tackles earned him the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game.

Defensive back Marquis Floyd also had a big night, intercepting a pass from Spokane quarterback Warren Smith and returning it 17 yards. This interception tied him with Los Angeles KISS defensive back Rayshaun Kizer for third all-time with 57 career picks.

Spokane's Smith had a strong night in a losing effort, throwing for 319 yards and running for 42 more. He also threw for 6 touchdowns and ran in for another touchdown, which was the AFL Highlight of the Game. He did, however, have two big interceptions that proved to be costly.

The Rattlers' next game will be at 6:00 p.m. next Saturday (June 6th) when they return home to face the Tampa Bay Storm (4-5). The two teams have not faced each other since 2010. The game will be televised on FOX Sports Arizona and streamed online at ESPN3. com or the WatchESPN app on a tablet or smartphone.

RATTLERS (8-2) QUIET THE STORM (4-6), 69-46

Phoenix, Ariz. - Five years is a long time to wait to get revenge. The last time the Rattlers and the Storm met, a controversial no call at the end of the game cost Arizona the win. The three-time defending world champions finally got their chance Saturday night, and Arizona took advantage, defeating Tampa Bay convincingly by a score of 69-46 in front of 12,304 fans.

Rattlers' quarterback Nick Davila returned to the lineup tonight after spending the last five weeks on injured reserve, and he looked like he did not miss a beat, throwing for 9 touchdowns and no interceptions, earning him the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game.

"I thought for his first game back in five weeks, he played excellent," Head Coach and general manager Kevin Guy said. "He will only get better from here."

Davila's 275 yards moved him to 9th place all-time in passing yards, pushing him past Raymond Philyaw. He now has 26,562 all-time passing yards.

The Rattlers took control early, when on Tampa Bay's first possession, defensive end Michael McAdoo sacked Storm quarterback Jason Boltus and forced a fumble which was recovered by defensive tackle Anttaj Hawthorne. The defense from there held strong throughout the first half, only allowing 14 first half points. "We came on really strong in the second quarter," Guy said. "That's the level we can play at when we want to turn it on." The Rattlers, held Boltus to under 50 percent passing (22-46), and while they only got the one sack, they kept the pressure on him throughout the night.

AJ Cruz led the defense with 8 total tackles in the game. He also had one rushing touchdown, and 125 kickoff return yards. His contributions on all aspects of the game earned him the J. Lewis Small Playmaker of the Game award.

Defensive back Jeremy Kellem got to celebrate his birthday by earning the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game with his two interceptions of the night (the first of which earned the AFL Highlight of the Game), to go along with his four pass breakups. This marks the third straight game with at least one interception, grabbing five total in that span.

RATTLERS WIN BIG IN PORTLAND, 69-42

Portland, Ore. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers (9-2) earned their fifth straight win in Portland with a 69-42 victory over the Portland Thunder (3-8) Friday night in the Moda Center. The Rattlers remain undefeated against the Thunder.

The Rattlers started fast when defensive back and kick returner AJ Cruz returned the opening kickoff for a touchdown. This was his first of two in which he returned touchdowns. Cruz also scored twice on offense, once on the ground and once in the air. His overall contributions earned him the J. Lewis Small Playmaker of the Game award, his second straight week earning that honor.

"(AJ) has done an outstanding job for us all year long," Head Coach and general manager Kevin Guy said. "He is a difference maker for us; he plays both sides of the ball, and has done a great job for us."

Arizona's MVP quarterback Nick Davila had an incredibly efficient night. He only had 5 total receptions in the first half, however three of them went for touchdowns. Overall, Davila threw for 146 yards, 4 touchdowns and no interceptions through three quarters of action. He was relieved in the fourth by quarterback Shane Boyd.

Rattlers' defensive back Jeremy Kellem kept his interception streak alive. He has now caught an interception in four straight games, and has 10 total interceptions on the year, which is a career high for Kellem. His interception and 5 tackles earned him the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game award, the fourth straight game he earned that honor.

"I couldn't be more proud of (Jeremy)," Coach Guy said. "He worked his tail off all offseason. He is very committed. He comes out and works hard in practice, and it transitions to the game."

Kellem was not the only defensive player to make an impact in Friday's big win. Defensive backs Marquis Floyd and Arkeith Brown also each caught an interception. Defensive ends Mike McAdoo and Anthony McCloud both got a sack on the Thunder quarterback, while Mack Linebacker Tyre Glasper got two.

Portland starting quarterback Kyle Rowley had a rough night, throwing two first half interceptions. He was replaced in the second half by quarterback Alex Carder, who also threw a pick. Former Arizona and current Thunder wide receiver Jared Perry was one of the few bright spots for Portland. He went for 150 yards receiving and 4 touchdowns, which earned him the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game award.

Phoenix, Ariz. – Two first place teams entered the Snake Pit Saturday night. It was the back-to-back-to-back defending world champion Arizona Rattlers who came away with the 55-35 win in front of 11,673 fans.

Both Arizona and Orlando came into the game with the third and fourth scoring offenses respectively, but it was Arizona's defense that shined in Saturday's matchup. The Rattlers held the Predators to a season low 35 points.

"I thought our defense played outstanding tonight." said head coach and general manager Kevin Guy. "I believe we had seven stops tonight, five were on fourth down."

Defensive back Jeremy Kellem pushed his streak of at least one interception in a game to five, when he picked off quarterback Bernard Morris in the third quarter. Defensive back Arkeith Brown also forced a turnover in the third when he stripped the ball from Orlando wide receiver Larry Brackens after he was held up by defensive back Ben Wells.

"We put Ben Wells in there tonight, and I thought he did an outstanding job," said Guy. "He gave us very good minutes."

Arizona quarterback Nick Davila has yet to throw an interception since his return off injury reserve. He also threw for 221 yards and 6 touchdowns which earned him the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game award.

Defensive back AJ Cruz started on offensive in Saturday's game at wide receiver and once again showed why he is dangerous when he gets his hands on the ball. Cruz ended the night with two touchdowns receiving and another touchdown on the ground. He also had two tackles on the kickoff, and averaged 22.5 yards on kickoff return. For all his contributions, he earned the J Lewis Small Playmaker of the Game award.

Morris, on the other hand, had a much different night. He was under pressure the entire game and was sacked three times. Two of which was by defensive end Michael McAdoo which earned him the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game award. Overall, Morris was only able to complete 50 percent of his passes.

"I thought our pass rush did a great job as well," Guy said. "I don't believe we let (Morris) out of the pocket. I believe we shut those plays down."

The Rattlers' next game will be Saturday, June 27th at 7:00 PM when they visit the surging Los Angeles KISS (3-6). Arizona defeated the KISS in week five by a score of 68-30. The game will be streamed live online on ESPN3.com or the WatchESPN app on a tablet or smartphone.

Phoenix, Ariz. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers (12-2) won their eighth straight game with a 57-43 victory over division rival Las Vegas Outlaws (5-9) Saturday night at the US Airways Center in front of 11,891 fans.

The win marks the 100th victory for head coach and general manager Kevin Guy as the head coach of the Arizona Rattlers. Guy has just been named a finalist to join the 2015 class for the AFL Hall of Fame. He has 101 victories overall as a head coach and a winning percentage of .743 which is best all-time among all AFL coaches. Defensive ends Cliff Dukes and Michael McAdoo both earned a sack and a half, and mack linebacker Tyre Glasper caught Havrilla in the end zone near the end of the third quarter for a safety, which was the AFL Highlight of the Game.

"I thought our defense played outstanding," said Guy. "Our pass rush was relentless up front and our coverage was good."

Rattlers quarterback Nick Davila broke his streak of four straight games without a pick, throwing two in the first half. Davila, however, bounced back with an impressive second half, completing 10 of 12 passes and 5 second half touchdowns. Overall Davila finished with 271 yards and 8 touchdowns. Half of the touchdowns thrown were to wide receiver Rod Windsor, who caught 8 passes for 113 yards and 4 touchdowns. Windsor's performance earned him the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game.

Rookie wide receiver and new acquisition Dan Buckner saw significant action tonight as well. He hauled in 3 catches for 82 yards, including the Cutters Catch of the Game which was a 48 yard pass from Davila for a touchdown in the 3rd.

The Outlaws had a strong push in the fourth quarter, scoring 29 points. This, however, was not enough to overcome the large deficit they incurred through the first three quarters.

Rattlers' wide receiver Rod Windsor also dropped a 4th down touchdown catch late in the fourth quarter. In the end, the mistakes ended up costing Arizona the game.

Phoenix, Ariz. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers (13-3) returned to the win column with a victory over the Los Angeles KISS (4-12) Sunday night at the US Airways Center by a score of 68-55 in front of 11,106 fans.

The Rattlers had their best defensive start of the season. The defense did not allow the KISS offense to score until the third quarter. The Arizona defense was led by linebacker Tyre Glasper who picked off KISS quarterback Danny Southwick with a spectacular one handed grab which was the AFL Highlight of the game. Glasper was also the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game.

On the Offensive side, the Rattlers had a fast start as well. It started with fullback Mykel Benson rushing 21 yards for a score. Benson ended the game with 48 yards on 7 carries (6.9 average).

"We just wanted to get Benson going," said head coach and general manager Kevin Guy. "He's a huge weapon and a fit for us. We are very happy he is in our organization. He works hard and has a great attitude and obviously that transitions to the field."

On Los Angeles' first play on offense, defensive tackle Anttaj Hawthorne recovered the fumble by Southwick, which eventually led to a rushing touchdown by Rattlers quarterback Nick Davila. After a turnover on downs, Davila threw another touchdown, a 36-yard bomb, to wide receiver Rod Windsor. Windsor, who earned the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game, finished with 155 yards and 2 touchdowns.

"We worked hard all week and there was a high tempo offense," Guy said. "I thought they responded well and it transitioned to the game."

The Rattlers led 34-0 with one second left in the second quarter, when Davila through an interception to KISS defensive back Josh Victorian, who ran it back 48 yards for a touchdown. This gave the KISS some momentum.

The KISS came out in the third quarter and immediately scored with a 39-yard pass from Southwick to KISS wide receiver Donovan Morgan. After a fumbled kick return by Arizona, Southwick scored again with a 1-yard pass to wide receiver Tyrone Goard.

The Rattlers were again able to wrestle back the momentum in the fourth quarter when Arizona wide receiver Chase Deadder, who is starting his first game back from injury, caught a short pass, and muscled his way 22 yards for a touchdown. Deadder's catch was the Cutters Catch of the Game.

The Rattlers' next game will be Friday, July 31th at 7:30 PM when they visit their biggest rival, the San Jose SaberCats (15-1). The Rattlers came up short the last time they faced the SaberCats, and will look to even up the series. The game will be nationally televised on the CBS Sports Network.

RATTLERS LOSE TO THE SABERCATS, 56-29

San Jose, Cali. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers (13-4) lost their fourth game this season in San Jose with a 56-29 loss over the San Jose SaberCats (16-1) Friday night in the SAP Center.



Arizona had two quick scores in the second quarter, the first, an eight yard pass from Davila to wide receiver Rod Windsor, the second a 20 yard pass from Davila to wide receiver Kerry Reed. A missed point after made the score 20-7. The SaberCats then countered with two straight scores of their own with passes from Meyer to wide receiver Maurice Purify and fullback Odie Armstrong. The Rattlers scored again with a 10 yard pass from Davila to Windsor, however, a blocked point after attempt was returned by SaberCats' defensive lineman Rodney Fritz for two points, making the score 26-22. San Jose finished the scoring in the second with a four yard pass from Meyer to Purify.

The Third quarter began with the Rattlers recovering the initial kick off, however, they were unable to put the ball in the end zone and was forced to settler with a 27 yard field goal from kicker Fabrizio Scaccia to tie the game at 29. This was the last time the Rattlers scored.

The SaberCats scored four straight times to end the game. Two scores were from Meyer to Gray, one more from Meyer to Purify, and one from Meyer to wide receiver D.J. Stevens.

The Rattlers' will finish out the season next weekend when they return home to face the Portland Thunder (4-12). The game will be on Saturday, August 8th 6:30 PDT and will be nationally televised on CBS Sports Network.

RATTLERS END REGULAR SEASON WITH BIG WIN OVER THUNDER, 67-39

PHOENIX, Ariz. - The World Champion Arizona Rattlers (14-4) ended the regular season with a victory over the Portland Thunder (5-13) Saturday night at the US Airways Center by a score of 67-39 in front of 12,687 fans.

The game was never in doubt as the Rattlers used a dominant, 51 point first half to sail past the Thunder.

Arizona found out before the game that kicker Fabrizio Scaccia would not be able to play, so the Rattlers brought in former Arizona Wildcat Alex Zendejas to fill in for the second time this season. Zendejas did extremely well, going a perfect nine for nine and forcing two touchbacks.

"I was very pleased with special teams," said Head Coach and General Manager Kevin Guy. "Zendejas came in as an emergency kicker and it's the first time all year long we were 100% (in PAT's)."

The first quarter started with Arizona scoring on all three aspects of the game. The Rattlers scored on their first possession with a four yard pass from quarterback Nick Davila to wide receiver Kerry Reed. On Portland's next possession, a fumbled snap by Thunder quarterback Kyle Rowley resulted in a safety by linebacker Tyre Glasper. The ensuing kickoff was returned 57 yards by defensive back Arkeith Brown for a touchdown, which was the AFL Highlight of the Game. The first quarter ended with a 19 yard pass from Davila to wide receiver Rod Windsor.

The second quarter was not much kinder to the Thunder. Portland was able to score three times, the first, a QB sneak by Rowley, and two touchdown passes from Rowley, one to wide receiver Jamar Howard, the other to wide receiver V'Keon Lacey. The Rattlers, however, were able to put up 28 in the second, including a 25 yard touchdown pass from Davila to Windsor as time expired, which was the Cutters Catch of the game. "The lineman did a good job of releasing and getting downfield," Windsor said. "I was able to break a couple tackles and make a play." The half ended with a score of 51-20.

Things slowed down in the third quarter as the Rattlers only score was a 4 yard toss from Davila to Windsor. The Rattlers defense held the Thunder scoreless in the third.

With the game in hand, Davila left the game early in the 4th. Overall, Davila completed 18 of 26 with 5 touchdowns and 165 yards. His efforts earned him the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game.

Portland did put up some points in the 4th quarter, however the Thunder ran out of steam after a blocked point after attempt by defensive end Michael McAdoo, which was returned by McAdoo for a two point PAT return. McAdoo finished the night with two sacks, one pass breakup, one PAT block and three quarterback hurries. His efforts earned him the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game award.

The Rattlers' next game will be the conference championship semi-final, where they will face the Spokane Shock. The game will take place next Saturday, August 15th, at the US Airways Center in Phoenix, Ariz. At 6:00 pm PDT. The last time the Rattlers faced the Shock in the postseason was the Conference Final in 2013, where Arizona fell behind early, but fought back to punch their ticket to ArenaBowl XXVI. The game will be televised on FOX Sports Arizona Plus, and streamed online on ESPN3.com or the WatchESPN on a tablet or smartphone.

RATTLERS EARN TRIP TO CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP WITH WIN OVER SHOCK, 72-41

Phoenix, Ariz. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers (15-4) moved on to the National Conference Championship game Saturday night when they defeated the Spokane Shock (7-12) at the US Airways Center by a score of 72-41 in front of 10,322 fans.

The Arizona Rattlers made their fans a bit nervous on Saturday night, when they fell down early in the first quarter by 14. However, a safety on the first play in the second quarter turned the game around.

"Traditionally we always kind of start slow in the first round," head coach and general manager Kevin Guy said. "I was proud of the guys to find a way to overcome it. We were down 14 to nothing. I thought we showed some impressive resilience."

For the second straight week, the Rattlers were perfect on special teams. Rattlers signed kicker Alex Zendejas last week after kicker Fabrizio Scaccia went on injured reserve. Since being signed, he has not missed an extra point.

"Alex has been great for us, not only in his extra points, but his kickoffs have been outstanding," Guy said. "I have been very happy with him. I think the sky's the limit with him."

The Rattlers started slow. Arizona's first two drives ended with turnovers on downs. Spokane capitalized by scoring two quick touchdowns. The first was a 34 yard pass from quarterback Arvell Nelson to fullback Deveric Gallington. The second was an 11 yard pass from Nelson to wide receiver Nick Truesdell. The Rattlers were able to finally get on the board with a six yard touchdown pass from Davila to wide receiver Chase Deadder with a minute to go in the first. Deadder finished the game with 3 touchdowns and 121 yards, and was the Russell Athletic Offensive Player of the Game.

The second quarter belonged to the Rattlers. The first play in the second quarter, defensive end Cliff Dukes got to Nelson in the end zone forcing him to throw the ball away, which was ruled intentional grounding and a safety.

"That safety for us was huge," said Guy. "I thought our guys up front did a great job and our guys in the back did a great job."

The Rattlers scored on the ensuing possession with a 26 yard touchdown pass from Davila to Deadder. The Rattlers and Shock traded blows for the rest of the half, with Arizona ending the half with an 11 yard pass from Davila to wide receiver Kerry Reed, who earned the J. Lewis Small Playmaker of the Game award.

A late attempt by Spokane to close the gap was foiled by defensive back Jeremy Kellem, who intercepted the ball in his own end zone for a touchback with six seconds left in the half. Kellem finished the game with 4 tackles 2 pass breakups to go along with the interception. His efforts earned him the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game award.

The Rattlers extended their lead when they forced the Shock to turn the ball over on downs, and turned that into a 14 yard touchdown pass from Davila to Deadder. Spokane scored on the next possession with an 8 yard pass from Nelson to wide receiver Braylon Bell. Arizona answered with two more touchdowns, both from Davila to wide receiver Rod Windsor, the first of which was a 22 yard catch that was the Cutters Catch of the Game.

The fourth quarter began with a Spokane touchdown from Nelson to wide receiver Jabin Sambrano. This was the last time the Shock would score, as the Rattlers reached the end zone three more times; one a 4 yard pass from Davila to Windsor, and two rushing touchdowns from fullback Mykel Benson.

RATTLERS STREAK ENDS WITH LOSS TO SABERCATS, 67-70

Stockton, Cali. – The World Champion Arizona Rattlers (15-5) fell one play short when they dropped their first postseason game in four years to the San Jose SaberCats (19-1) in Stockton, California by a score of 67-70.

The Arizona Rattlers and San Jose SaberCats fought for 60 minutes through seven ties and seven lead changes. A controversial touchdown with eight seconds left in the game gave the edge to the SaberCats.

The Rattlers had a four point lead and with eight seconds left on the clock, when SaberCats' quarterback Erik Meyer threw a six yard pass to wide receiver Reggie Gray. Gray seemed to have fumbled the ball one yard shy of the end zone which was recovered by the Riddell Defensive Player of the Game Jeremy Kellem. The play however, was ruled a touchdown, and with there not being a sideline view for the official, the play stood.

COMMISSIONER SCOTT C. BUTERA

Three important assets greeted Scott Butera when the Arena Football League asked him to be its new Commissioner at the end of the 2014 season. The first was a committed ownership group eager to grow the Arena Football's undervalued brand. The second was a talented, dedicated group of players, coaches and staff poised to deliver a fast-paced, highly entertaining version of America's favorite sport. The most important was a passionate and intensely loyal group of fans.

For Butera, now in his second full year as commissioner, it was a familiar scene. He spent much of his career dusting off brands by unlocking their hidden values. This time there was the added allure of working on a product for which he admits a certain fanaticism. "Football is my sport. I've followed it from childhood and I played it in school. It's literally been a lifetime passion."

Having made a name for himself by lifting the fortunes of major brands like Tropicana and Foxwoods, Butera arrived at the AFL ready to apply his finely honed business operations and marketing instincts. He did what has made him successful in other ventures. He focused on the positives and used them as building blocks to the future. And there is a lot to build on at the AFL.

Besides owner commitment and staff passion, Butera thinks he's inherited compelling inventory. For one, America's love of football seems almost insatiable. No less than 86 percent of US TV households tuned into the pro sport last Fall; and last summer, the Arena League experienced a respectable growth spurt. Game attendance popped by 3.5 percent over the previous year. The AFL Championship Game at Stockton Arena in San Jose, California attracted a near sellout crowd. TV viewership of the arena game also rose and the League widely increased its social media footprint in 2015.

The challenge for year one, Butera claims, was stability, and it has been largely achieved. For year two the goal is brand building and growth positioning. Butera doesn't think that the League needs to retool the game product. The issue is to build a greater following for it. There is a perceived performance gap in the sport – no games from February to August – and Butera is intent on filling it with the high energy, fan-friendly style of football that is played in his League.

Butera describes AF as the ultimate combination American favorites. America's favorite sport: football. America's favorite season: summer. America's favorite speed: fast. American's favorite price: family. The challenge is to get more exposure for the game and its people. "We need to show people how much fun they can have by following Arena Football."

Butera succeeded in getting ESPN and CBS Sports to buy in with more plentiful game broadcasts. For the first time in 2016, there will be a game of week. The arrangements help get more eyeballs on the game which in turn helps attract strong promotion partnerships with companies who want to give the smart phone generation – millennials and moms, especially – a pulse-raising inarena experience and ways to engage through mobile technologies and social media.

Butera has a few things going for him as he works to grow the Arena Football League. For one, he is a skilled financial executive who has a knack for squeezing a lot of value out of every dollar. For another, as one of his owners said, "He is very solid, steady and talented ... an excellent guy with great business instincts."

Plus, Butera is no stranger to sports marketing. At his last business stop, he helped Foxwoods Resort enter into successful marketing partnerships with the Boston Red Sox, New York Yankees, New York Rangers, New York Knicks and Madison Square Garden.

Butera possesses a rare combination of skills that have helped him revitalize brands.

"He's an investment banker at heart, a great transaction guy," says Tom Benninger, former global head of restructuring at UBS Investment Bank. "But in the last few years, I think he's really developed his operational skills. It's pretty unique to have someone be really good at both."

This rare blend of talents helped him as CEO of Tropicana Entertainment (2008-11) where he managed to revitalize the iconic brand through strategic capital investments, improved regulatory relations, and highly targeted marketing. All the while, he kept the reins on expenses.

Born and raised in Massachusetts, Butera began his financial career in investment banking, spending 20 years with UBS Investment Bank, Credit Suisse First Boston, Smith Barney and Bear Stearns & Co. During that time, he concentrated on analysis and client service for companies in real estate, lodging, gaming and leisure industries.

He earned his MBA at New York University's Leonard N. Stern School of Business. He recently served as a member of the Board of Fellows at his alma mater Trinity College.

TIME OF PLAY

FIELD

- An indoor padded surface 85 feet wide and 50 yards long with eight-yard end zones.
- Goal posts are nine (9) feet wide with a crossbar height of 15 feet (NFL goal posts are 18-1/2 feet wide with the crossbar at 10 feet).
- The goal-side rebound nets are 30 feet wide by 32 feet high. The bottoms of the nets are eight (8) feet above the ground.
- Sideline barriers are 48 inches high and made of high-density foam rubber.

EQUIPMENT

• The official football is the same size and weight as the National Football League ball. Each ball is manufactured

by Spalding, a division of Russell Corporation.

PLAYERS AND FORMATIONS

- Eight players on the field; 21-man active roster; three-man inactive roster.
- Players may play both offense and defense.
- Substitution: Coaches are permitted to substitute players at will.
- Four (4) offensive players must line up on the line of scrimmage.
- Three (3) defensive players must be down linemen (in a three- or four-point stance). One linebacker may blitz on either side of the center. Alignment is two-or-more yards off the line of scrimmage. No stunting or twisting.
- Offensive motion: One receiver may go in forward motion before the snap.

TIMING

- Four 15-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime.
- The clock stops for out-of-bounds plays or incomplete passes only in the last minute of each half and when the referee deems it necessary for penalties, injuries or timeouts.
- Each team is allowed three (3) timeouts per half.



MOVEMENT OF THE BALL AND SCORING

- Four (4) downs are allowed to advance the ball ten (10) yards for a first down, or to score.
- Six (6) points for a touchdown.
- One (1) point for a conversion by place kick after a touchdown, two (2) points for a conversion by drop kick and two (2) points for a successful run or pass after a touchdown.
- Three (3) points for a field goal by placement or four (4) points for a field goal by drop kick.
- Two (2) points for a safety.

KICKING

- Kickoffs are from the goal line. Kickers may use a one-inch tee.
- Punting is illegal. On fourth down, a team may go for a first down, touchdown or field goal.
- The receiving team may field any kickoff or missed field goal that rebounds off the net.
- Any untouched kickoff, which is out of bounds, will be placed at the 20-yard line or the place where it went out-of-bounds, whichever is more advantageous to the receiving team.

PASSING

• Receivers must have one foot inbounds for a catch. A forward pass that rebounds off the rebound net or sideline barrier is a live ball and is in play until it touches the playing surface.

OVERTIME RULES

- Overtime periods are 15 minutes for both the regular season and the playoffs.
- Each team gets one (1) possession to score. If, after each team has had one possession, one team is ahead, that team wins. If the teams are tied after each has had a possession, the next team to score wins.



GLOSSARY OF TERMS

BALL IN THE STANDS When a ball is thrown or bounces into the seats surrounding the playing field, the "lucky" fan that catches the ball keeps it.

DROP KICK A drop-kicked FG is worth 4 points. A drop-kicked extra point is worth 2 points. Spokane Shock kicker Taylor Rowan was the last man to connect on a two-point dropkick (7/22/2011 vs. Jacksonville).

FANS More than 26 million fans have experienced an AFL game in the League's 24-year history. Last year, in 2011, the AFL drew 1,338,544 fans in the regular season.

IRONMAN Signifies participants playing both offense and defense.

"MAC" AND "JACK" LINEBACKERS "Mac" may rush the QB straight on without stunting, twisting or drop-back coverage. "Jack" must stay within an imaginary box behind the line of scrimmage. Either LB may cover the fullback or tight end.

OFFENSIVE MOTION Unlike stadium-played football, one offensive back may go into forward motion prior to the snap of the ball.

OVERTIME Arena Football has a unique overtime rule: If a contest is tied after regulation, teams will play a 15-minute overtime. Each team will have one opportunity to score. If, after each team has had one chance to score, the game is tied, the first team to score is crowned the winner.

REBOUND NETS Goal-side rebound nets extend outward from each upright. The nets are 30-feet wide, 32-feet high and extend to 40 feet above the playing surface. The bottom bars of the frames are positioned eight (8) feet above the surface. The "scoring area" is nine-feet wide and 15-feet high. Nets are stretched taut so that a missed kick attempt will rebound off the net and back into the field of play. Once the ball caroms off the net, it's live.

SIDELINE BARRIERS Similar to the sideboards that surround a hockey rink, the sideline barrier encircles the playing surface. The barrier is made of a high-density foam pad, measuring four (4) inches thick.

STUNTING OR TWISTING When a defensive lineman is rushing the passer, there's no "stunting" or "twisting." In other words, linemen are required to power past offensive linemen.

TIGHT END One offensive lineman must declare himself a tight end prior to the snap by simply raising his arm and "declaring" himself a tight end. The Mac (rush-eligible) linebacker must line-up on the opposite side of the center from the tight end.

TWO-WAY PLAYERS One of the most "throwback" features of the Arena Football League is the fact that the game features eight-on-eight football, where at times, some players will play both offense and defense.



MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

ROSTER LIMITS

From the first day the League allows the signing of free-agent players until the first league-sanctioned cut-down date, teams are prohibited from having more than 35 players on their roster. Players listed on the active list or free-agent signees are considered eligible to be counted for the 35-man roster. Teams will be required to reduce their active lists to 28 players by 5 p.m. CST 14 days before the first regular season game and to 24 players by 5 p.m. CST seven days before the first regular season game.

Each team may maintain a maximum 20-player roster and 4-player practice squad during the season. In a documented emergency, a team may add an emergency kicker to their roster, no later than one hour before kickoff.

TRADES

Upon reporting to his new team, each traded player must pass the physical given by his new team. Failure to pass the physical and/or failure to report will nullify the trade.

RESERVE LISTS

The reserve list of each team consists of the following categories; retired, refused to report, inactive reserve, injured reserve, suspended, other league exempt and physically unable to perform.

INJURED RESERVE

A player who is placed on injured reserve list must remain on injured reserve for a minimum of four weeks. Training camp weeks will not count against that total. Teams activating players from their injured reserve list must do so no less than 24 hours prior to that team's game.



PLAYOFF QUALIFICATION, SELECTION OF TEAMS

Eight teams qualify for the playoffs, four from each conference-- American and National. The four qualifying teams in each conference consist of the two division champions and two Wildcards, determined by best overall record. Seeding in each conference is based on overall record, with the top two seeds in each conference reserved for the division champions, regardless of record. In the First Round, August 15-16, the first two seeds in each conference are the two division winners. The next two teams are seeded by next best two overall records. Teams ranked 1 and 2 earn home playoff games with 1 hosting 4 and 2 hosting 3. In the Conference Championship Round, August 22-23, the winner of the 1-4 game plays the winner of the 2-3 game. The home team is decided by the team with the higher seed. The winners of the Second Round will face off in ArenaBowl XXVIII on August 29th, with the highest remaining seed hosting the championship game.

TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

If, at the end of the regular season, two or more clubs are tied with identical won-lost percentages, the following steps will be taken to determine rank.

DIVISION CHAMPIONS - TWO TEAMS

If two teams are tied for Division Championship:

- 1. Head-to-head (best winning percentage in games between the clubs)
- Point differential in head-to-head games
- 2. 3. Best winning percentage in division games
- 4. Best net points in all games
- 5. Strength of Schedule
- 6. Coin toss

DIVISION CHAMPIONS - THREE OR MORE TEAMS

(Note: If three or more teams are tied, follow steps until one team is eliminated. Once two teams remain, revert back to Step 1 of the two team tiebreaker to determine which team advances.)

- Head-to-head (best winning percentage in games among the clubs)
- 2. 3. Best winning percentage in division games
- Best net points in all games
- 4. Strength of Schedule
- 5. Coin toss

WILDCARD - TWO TEAMS

If it is necessary to break ties to determine the two Wildcard teams from each conference, the following steps will be taken:

- Head-to-head (best winning percentage in games between the clubs) 1.
- 2. 3. Point differential in head-to-head games
- Best net points in all games
- 4. Strength of schedule
- 5. Best winning percentage in division games
- 6. Coin toss


