GENE SIMMONS

OWNER

Gene Simmons is an Israeli-born American rock bass guitarist, singer-songwriter, record producer, entrepreneur, actor, and television personality. Known by his stage persona The Demon, he is the bass guitarist/co-lead vocalist of Kiss, the rock band he co-founded in the early 1970s. With Kiss, Simmons has sold more than 100 million albums worldwide.



Gene Simmons is a known advocate for ChildFund International's work. He traveled to Zambia during his "Gene Simmons Family Jewels" show to visit several of his sponsored children, of whom he has more than 140. Gene said, "is a stark reminder that life doesn't treat everyone the same."

Gene Simmons' family received the MEND Humanitarian Award for their philanthropic efforts and support for Mending Kids International at the organization's annual gala on November 9, 2013. The award was presented by Mel Gibson. In his acceptance speech, Gene spoke of his own difficult childhood in Israel in a bullet-ridden house. He recalled his mother's excitement when they received a CARE box one day; it wasn't about the contents, it was about knowing that someone cared and that they weren't alone – it gave them hope.

PAUL STANLEY

OWNER

Paul Stanley, is an American hard rock guitarist, singer, and painter, best known for being the frontman of the rock band Kiss. He is the writer or co-writer of many of the band's highest-charting hits. Stanley established the "Starchild" character for his Kiss persona.

HEAD COACH



Omarr Smith begins his first season as the Head Coach of the LA KISS. Smith was previously assistant Head Coach of the ArenaBowl Champion San Jose SaberCats. This will be his fifteenth year in the Arena Football League (AFL) and is tied with the late Coach Tim Marcum with 7 ArenaBowl championships.

A native of Torrance, California, Smith attended Bishop Montgomery High School and earned all-league honors in football, basketball and track. His skills earned him a football scholarship to San Jose State University where he played all four years. After graduating from San Jose State, Smith joined the AFL where he was a key part to three championship seasons with the San Jose SaberCats in 2002, 2004 and 2007. He was also with the Tampa Bay Storm during their championship season in 2003. Smith's famed career ended after his 9th season in the AFL. He tallied an impressive 35 interceptions, 88 pass breakups and 8 defensive touchdowns.

Smith brings seven years of coaching experience to the LA KISS. He spent the last two years with the San Jose SaberCats, as assistant Head Coach, winning the ArenaBowl again in 2015. Prior to the SaberCats, he served as the defensive coordinator for the Arizona Rattlers, where his defense surrendered the second least points per game from 2011-2013 and won the ArenaBowl in both 2012 and 2013. "It is of course bittersweet as the San Jose Sabercats will always hold a very special place in my heart and in my family's," said Omarr Smith, head coach of the LA KISS.

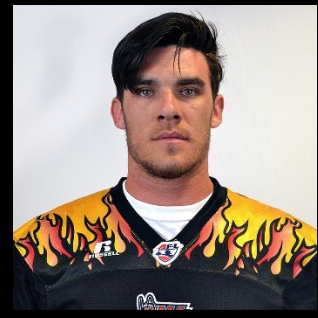

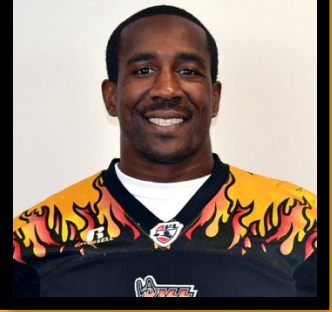

Orlando, FL— The LA KISS (2-2) were unable to overcome four turnovers and were defeated by the Orlando Predators (4-0) by a score of 43 to 40 in front of 10,127 fans at the Amway Center on Saturday evening.

Los Angeles, CA — The LA KISS (2-3) could not contain the Philadelphia Soul's (4-1) high-powered offense and lost by a final score of 56-33 in front of 6,193 fans at the Honda Center on Monday night.

At the end of the third the LA KISS led 39-21.

Collins caught a 10-yard touchdown from Stanley to start the fourth quarter. The PAT was good and the score was 46-20. Mitchell returned the ensuing kickoff 55 yards for a touchdown and the score was 46-27. The Steel were at the three yard line in scoring position when Dan Buckner intercepted Thomas’ pass and returned it 47 yards for an LA KISS touchdown, which was the “AFL Highlight of the Game”. Following Victorian’s second interception of the game, Pete Thomas replaced Stanley at quarterback. On his first play from scrimmage, the rookie threw his first career touchdown when he found Morgan 12-yards down the field and in the corner of the end zone. On the final play of the game, Obi intercepted Thomas’ pass and ran it 52-yards for a touchdown. The final scoreboard had the LA KISS beating the Portland Steel by a score of 66 to 27. The 66 points scored is the second most in franchise history and only three points shy of the record set on June 14, 2014 against Portland.

Next week, the LA KISS will have their first of two bye weeks of the 2016 season. Then they will travel to Arizona to take on the Rattlers, who currently sit in first place of the National Conference. The 6:00 pm game will be available to be streamed live on ESPN3 and WatchESPN.

LA KISS Suffer Costly Injuries and Lose to the Arizona Rattlers, 47-34

Phoenix—The LA KISS (3-4) weren't able to overcome key injuries and lose to the Arizona Rattlers (6-2) in front of a crowd of 14,519 fans at the Talking Stick Resort Arena in Phoenix, AZ on Saturday night.

After replacing Nathan Stanley, who suffered an injury in the second quarter, quarterback Pete Thomas completed 13 of 27 passes for 214 yards and three touchdowns. Brandon Collins had a stellar performance, recording eight catches for 135 yards and three touchdowns. Donovan Morgan added four receptions for 80 yards and two touchdowns and DJ Stephens tallied four receptions for 43 yards.

Arizona Rattlers quarterback Nick Davila threw for 265 yards and five touchdowns, completing 20 of 35 pass attempts. Chase Deadder led the Rattlers receivers with eight receptions for 106 yards and two touchdowns. Joe Matthews had five receptions for 84 yards and three scores, while Rod Windsor added 51 receiving yards on five receptions.

Fredrick Obi led the LA KISS defense with seven solo tackles. Clevan Thomas recorded the LA KISS' only interception of the game, which was his 80th career interception. He is only the second player in AFL history to reach this milestone. For the Rattlers, Chase Deadder led the team with seven tackles and a 10-yard interception return touchdown. Allen Chapman added three tackles and an interception.

After the LA KISS won the coin toss and deferred to the second half, Joey Cujedo kicked off to the Rattlers. On the first offensive possession of the game, Thomas intercepted a Davila pass in the end zone, giving the LA KISS the possession. Then the LA KISS were within one-yard from scoring but could not find the end zone and turned the ball over on downs. On the ensuing possession, Davila found Mathews for a 22-yard touchdown. Alex Zendejas missed the kick and the score was 6-0 with 5:12 left in the quarter. On the next possession, Morgan caught a 40-yard touchdown from Stanley. The Cujedo point after attempt was good, which gave the LA KISS a one-

point lead with 1:03 remaining left in the quarter. At the end of the first, the LA KISS led by a score of 7-6.

On the first possession of the second quarter, the Rattlers, on fourth down, regained the lead when Davila hit Matthews for a 22-yard touchdown. The Zendejas kick was good and the Rattlers led by a score of 13-7. A Stanley pass, which was intended for Morgan, was intercepted by Chapman and returned 48 yards for a touchdown. Zendejas was successful of the point after and the score was 20-7 with 9:40 left in the half. Two plays later, Stanley found Collins for a 20-yard touchdown. After a successful PAT, the score was 20-14. The Arizona Rattlers turned the ball over on downs, and the LA KISS regained possession with 59 seconds left in the half. On the third play of the drive, Deadder intercepted a Stanley pass and returned it 10-yards for a touchdown. Zendejas found the uprights, which gave the Rattlers a 13-point lead. Stanley suffered an injury and was replaced by Pete Thomas at quarterback. The LA KISS cut the lead to one possession when Thomas hit Morgan for a nine-yard touchdown. Cujedo's kick was no good and the score was 27-20. As time expired in the half, Matthews caught a 31-yard touchdown pass from Davila to extend the Rattlers' halftime lead to 34-20.

On the first play of the second half, Thomas connected with Collins for a 47-yard touchdown. Cujedo make the point after and the Rattlers led by a score of 34-27. Deadder scored on a 20-yard pass from Davila, which, after a successful PAT, made the score 41-27 with 10:15 left in the quarter. On the following possession, Thomas hit Collins for a 25-yard touchdown. The kick found the uprights and Rattlers led by seven points. The Rattlers countered, and retook at two-score lead, with an eight-yard Davila-to-Deadder touchdown. The score at the end of the third quarter was 47-34.

After back-to-back fumbles by both the LA KISS and the Rattlers, the LA KISS were unable to convert a red zone possession and turned the ball over on downs. Then the Rattlers kept possession and ran out the clock. The LA KISS suffered their second loss of the season to the Rattlers by a score of 47 to 34.

Next week, the LA KISS will return home to the Honda Center to host the Portland Steel on Saturday, May 28th. Kickoff is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. and the game will be available to be streamed live on ESPN3 and WatchESPN.

Los Angeles—The LA KISS (4-4) took advantage of the Portland Steel's (0-8) costly fourth quarter special teams mistakes and won a gritty contest by a score of 54 to 42 in front of a 7,150-person Honda Center crowd.

Special Teams Mistakes Prove Costly in the LA KISS' 43-41 Loss to Orlando

Anaheim, CA— The LA KISS (4-5) suffered a tough two-point loss against the Orlando Predators (8-2) in front of 6,193 fans at the Honda Center on Sunday afternoon. The LA KISS, who lost on the game's ultimate play, did not trail the Predators at any point in the game, until the final score.

"It is a very difficult loss to swallow," said LA KISS Head Coach Omarr Smith. "We did not play well enough or pay attention to the details. We lost a game we should have won."

LA KISS quarterback Pete Thomas completed 21 of 39 pass attempts for 237 yards and six touchdowns. Donovan Morgan led the LAK KISS receiving corps with eight receptions for 81 yards and four touchdowns. During the game, Morgan cracked the top-10 of AFL's all-time receptions leaderboard. Brandon Collins hauled in six passes for 76 yards and one touchdown. Fullback Rory Nixon caught two passes for 26 yards and a touchdown.

Orlando Predators quarterback Bernard Morris tallied two passing touchdowns, while completing 16 of 26 passes for 171 yards. Morris also scored on two separate three-yard quarterback keepers. Brandon Thompkins led the Predators' receivers with eight receptions for 82 yards and a touchdown. Larry Brackins collected three receptions for 37 yards.

LA KISS defensive back Mike Willie led all defenders with 11.5 total tackles (11 solo). Newly activated defensive lineman Mike Lewis recorded his first sack as a member of the LA KISS and tallied three total tackles.

After the Predators won the coin toss and deferred possession to the second half, Orlando opened the game by kicking off to the LA KISS. Thomas found Morgan for a 6-yard touchdown. The Joey Cejudo extra point was good and the LA KISS took a 7-0 lead. Orlando were unable to cap off a 10-play drive and turned the ball over on downs on the LA KISS' two-yard line. At the end of the first quarter, the LA KISS led 7-0.

On the first possession of the second quarter, the LA KISS extended their lead to 14 points when Thomas connected with Morgan for a seven-yard touchdown and Cejudo found the uprights. Then Carr caught a 13-yard touchdown from Morris. After a successful kick by Mark Lewis, the score was 14-7 with 6:44 remaining in the half. On the second play of the ensuing possession, Sonie intercepted Thomas' pass. Morris scored on a three-yard quarterback keeper. On the following possession, Morgan scored a four-yard receiving touchdown from Thomas. After Cejudo split the uprights, the LA KISS took a 28-21 lead with 2:10 remaining in the quarter. Thompkins returned the ensuing kickoff 56 yards for a touchdown, which tied the score at 28. The score at the end of the third quarter was LA KISS 28, Orlando Predators 28.

The final period opened with a nine-play LA KISS drive, which ended when Thomas pitched a 16-yard touchdown to Nixon. The PAT was good and the LA KISS led by seven points. Then Thompkins returned his second straight kick return for a touchdown and Orlando tied the game at 35 with 8:07 on the clock. Collins caught a 21-yard touchdown from Thomas. The PAT was no good and the LA KISS led 41-35 with 3:10 left in the quarter. Morris scored on another three-yard quarterback sneak. Orlando was unable to take the lead when Lewis missed the PAT and the score remained even at 41 with 10 seconds left in the fourth. With 2:09 left in the third, Morgan of the LA KISS scored on a 45-yard touchdown pass. Danny Southwick was not able to convert on the two-point conversion. With 37 seconds left in the third quarter, the Soul scored a safety after Thomas fumbled the ball in the end zone. The score at the end of the third quarter was Philadelphia 52, LA KISS 25.

LA KISS Comeback Comes up Short, Lose to Rattlers 64-49

Anaheim, CA—A tremendous third quarter was not enough for the LA KISS (5-7) to surmount a 21-point first half deficit and they fell to the Arizona Rattlers (10-3) by a final score of 64-49 in front of a 7,090 person Honda Center crowd on Sunday afternoon.

“It was a very disappointing loss against a very good team,” said Coach Omar Smith “We have got a lot of work to do to compete with the better teams in this league. I believe in our guys. We will get the job done at some point, but it is a process.”

The LA KISS were led by quarterback Pete Thomas, who completed 15-of-36 pass attempts for 291 yards and five touchdowns. Under Armour Offensive Player of the Game, Donovan “Captain” Morgan grabbed seven receptions for 176 yards and three touchdowns. Justin Wilson recorded in two catches for 44 yards and a touchdown. Fullback Rory Nixon added 32 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

For the Rattlers, quarterback Nick Davila threw five touchdown passes and two interceptions, while completing 20-of-32 pass attempts for 251 yards. Maurice Purify led Arizona’s receivers with 10 receptions for 101 yards and three touchdowns. Chase Deadder hauled in three receptions for 39 yards and one touchdown.

Riddell Defensive Player of the Game, Josh Victorian led the LA KISS defense with six and a half total tackles (six solo) and an interception. Fredrick Obi tallied three tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery. Terrance Smith added five tackles. For Arizona, the J. Lewis Small Playmaker of the Game, Jeremy Kellem recorded four and a half tackles and two interceptions. KJ Morton registered two tackles and an interception return touchdown.

After the LA KISS opened the game by kicking off to the Rattlers, Davila connected with Deadder for a 10-yard touchdown. Alex Zendejas’ point after attempt was good and

the Rattlers took a 7-0 lead. Pete Thomas’ second pass of the ensuing possession was picked off by Morton and returned 19 yards for a touchdown. After a successful PAT, Arizona led 14-0 with 7:30 remaining in the quarter. Then, after a six-play drive, the LA KISS scored on a Thomas two-yard quarterback keeper. The Phil Marfuggi kick was no good and with 2:35 left in the quarter the LA KISS trailed by eight points. At the end of the first quarter, the score was LA KISS 6, Arizona Rattlers 14.

Arizona got on the board first in the second quarter with a four-yard Davila-to-Purify touchdown. The Zendejas kick found the uprights and the Rattlers led 21-to-6. On the next possession, Wilson caught a 39-yard touchdown pass from Thomas. The holder fumbled the snap of the point after attempt, which recovered by Arizona and returned 97 yards for a safety. Then Davila found Purify for a 13-yard touchdown and, after the PAT was good, the Rattlers led 30-12. On the first play after a Pete Thomas interception, Benson scored a two-yard rushing touchdown and the Rattlers took a 37-12 lead. With 0:25 left in the quarter, Thomas connected with Donovan Morgan for a 40-yard touchdown. The LA KISS then scored a two-point conversion and the Rattlers were up 37-20. After Davila found Purify for a six-yard touchdown, the Zendejas kick attempt was blocked by Kalafitoni Pole and returned by Josh Victorian for a touchdown. The score at halftime was LA KISS 22, Arizona Rattlers 43.

The LA KISS had a huge third quarter. One play after Wilson returned the opening kickoff of the second half 55 yards, Nixon punched a five-yard rushing touchdown, which cut the Rattlers’ lead to 14. Then Morgan hauled in a 19-yard touchdown from Thomas. After the Marfuggi kick split the uprights, the LA KISS trailed 36-to-43. Following a Fredrick Obi interception, Thomas hit Nixon for an 11-yard touchdown. The kick sailed left of the uprights and the LA KISS trailed by one-point. The Rattlers took an eight-point lead on a 34-yard Davila-to-Benson touchdown. Thomas pitched a 43-yard touchdown to Morgan and, after the kick found the uprights, the LA KISS were within one point. The score with one quarter remaining was LA KISS 49, Arizona 50.

The Rattlers scored only points of the fourth quarter on two Benson one-yard rushing touchdowns to extend their lead to 15. The LA KISS were unable to find the end zone in the quarter, as Pete Thomas tossed two interceptions. The final scoreboard had the LA KISS falling to the Arizona Rattlers by a score of 64-to-49.

After the universal Week 14 bye in celebration of Independence Day, the LA KISS will host the Tampa Bay Storm at the Honda on July 11. Kickoff is set for 7:00 p.m. and will be available to be streamed live online via ESPN3/WatchESPN and on the ESPN app.

LA KISS Cruise to Victory Over the Storm, 48-21

Allow All-Time Franchise Low 21 Points

Anaheim, CA—Although the game was tied at halftime, the LA KISS (6-7) outscored the Tampa Bay Storm (1-12) by 27 points in the second half, which allowed them to cruise to a 48-21 victory in front of an electric 6,249-person Honda Center crowd on Monday night.

In his first game in an LA KISS jersey, Fred Williams tallied five catches for 54 yards. Fullback Rory Nixon rumbled his way for 13 yards on the ground and two scores.

For the Storm, quarterback Jason Boltus completed 18-of-38 pass attempts for 251 yards and one touchdown. TT Toliver became the AFL’s all-time leader in all-purpose yards while catching 10 passes for 116 yards and a touchdown. Prechae Rodriguez registered five receptions for 52 yards.

Riddell Defensive Player of the Game, Josh Victorian led the LA KISS defense with nine and a half total tackles (nine solo). Terrance Smith tallied four and a half tackles. For Tampa Bay, Cortez Stubbs led the way with five tackles in the game.

After the LA KISS won the coin toss and deferred possession to the second half, Tampa Bay’s opening 11-play drive sputtered and the Storm turned the ball over on downs. The LA KISS struck first on an 11-yard Stanley-to-Morgan touchdown. Chris Gould found the uprights and the LA KISS led 7-0 with 1:04 remaining in the quarter, which was the score at the end of the period.

It was the Storm who scored first in the second quarter. Boltus hooked up with Toliver for a seven-yard touchdown and, after a successful PAT, the score was even at seven. On the next possession, Nixon plowed through the goal line for a two-yard touchdown run. The kick was good and the LA KISS took a 14-7 lead with 5:11 remaining in the quarter. Then John Brown rumbled his way for a two-yard touchdown run to even the score. On fourth down, Stanley connected with Williams for a 21-yard touchdown. Unfortunately for the LA KISS, upon review, the play was reversed and deemed to hit the ground and the LA KISS turned the ball over on downs. The two teams remained tied 14-14 at halftime.

The LA KISS opened the third quarter with a nine-play drive that was capped off with a three-yard Nixon rushing touchdown. The point after was good and the LA KISS regained a seven-point lead. Following a Tampa Bay turnover on downs, Stanley and Stephens were good for six, on a nine-yard touchdown, which extended the LA KISS lead to 13 with 3:16 remaining in the third. At the end of the third quarter, the LA KISS were ahead of the Storm by a score of 27-to-14.

The LA KISS defense continued to shine and opened the final quarter of play with a huge fourth down stop on their 11-yard line. On the ensuing possession, Stanley tossed an 11-yard touchdown to Morgan. The kick was good and the LA KISS were up by 20 points. Plagued by penalties, the Storm still couldn’t muster anything of offense and turned the ball over on downs for the third straight possession. After Stephens hauled in a 24-yard touchdown from Stanley, Adam Kennedy, who replaced Boltus at quarterback, scored on an eight-yard quarterback keeper and the LA KISS lead remained 20 points. Then Stephens’ hat trick score, a 29-yard bomb from replacement quarterback Pete Thomas, extended the LA KISS lead to 27. The LA KISS ultimately walked out of the Honda Center victorious by a score of 48-21.

Next week the LA KISS will host their final home game of the 2016 regular season as they welcome the Cleveland Gladiators to the Honda Center on Saturday, July 16. Kickoff is scheduled for 7:00 PM PST and the game will be broadcast live on the CBS Sports Network.

Fullback Rory Nixon recorded three passes for 41 yards, while scurrying his way for 12 yards on the ground.

For the Gladiators, quarterback Arvell Nelson threw six touchdowns, and scrambled for two more. He completed 19-of-32 pass attempts for 332 yards and one interception. Quentin Sims registered 12 receptions for 197 yards and five touchdowns to lead all receivers. Collin Taylor added four receptions for 81 yards and a touchdown.

Riddell Defensive Player of the Game, jack linebacker Qumain Black led the LA KISS defense with seven and a half total tackles (six solo) and an interception. Fredrick Obi added five solo tackles. For Cleveland, Demar Robinson led the way with five and a half tackles, while Joe Powell recorded four and a half.

After the LA KISS won the coin toss and differed possession to the second half, Cleveland got on the board first when Nelson tossed a 19-yard touchdown pass to Sims. The Adrian Trevino kick split the uprights and the Gladiators took a 7-0 lead with 12:53 remaining in the first quarter. Three plays later, the LA KISS evened the score on a six-yard Stanley-to-Morgan touchdown. After Nelson scored on a three-yard quarterback-keeper, the Gladiators regained a seven-point lead with 5:44 left in the first. Then Stanley tossed a six-yard touchdown to Morgan and, after the Chris Gould kick was good, the score was tied at 14. As time expired in the first quarter, Nelson hooked up with Taylor for a 28-yard score. The PAT was good and Cleveland led 21-14 at the end of the quarter.

After the LA KISS opened the second quarter with a turnover on downs, Mike Lewis forced DJ Brandel to fumble and the LA KISS regained possession. The home team quickly capitalized on Cleveland’s turnover when Stanley his Colin Madison for a four-yard touchdown. Gould’s kick split the uprights and the score was even at 21 with 5:03 remaining in the half. Two plays after an unsuccessful onside attempt by the LA KISS, Sims was good for six on a seven-yard pass from Nelson. The kick was good and the Gladiators were up by seven points. Then, with four seconds remaining in the half, the LA KISS eliminated the Gladiators seven-point lead on a 11-yard Stanley-to-Morgan touchdown. At halftime the LA KISS and Cleveland Gladiators were even at 28 points.

When the LA KISS struck first in the second half, they took their first lead of the game. On fourth down, Stanley plowed through the goal line and scored a one-yard QB sneak. After a successful kick, the LA KISS led 35-28 with 8:16 left in the third quarter. After Cleveland couldn’t muster anything on offense and turned the ball over on downs, Stephens hauled in a 41-yard touchdown pass from Stanley and the LA KISS led by 14 points. At the end of the third quarter, the LA KISS led 42-to-28.

The LA KISS defense continued to shine and opened the final period with a Qumain Black interception. Then Stanley tossed a 14-yard touchdown pass, which gave Stephens his second hat trick in as many games. The LA KISS led by 21 points with 7:55 remaining. The Gladiators had a chance to cut their deficit to 14 points on a 15-yard Sims touchdown reception, but the PAT was wide left and they trailed by 15. Two plays after Cleveland completed a successful onside kick, Nelson and Sims were good for six on a 28-yard pass. Morgan, on the immediate play following Cleveland’s unsuccessful onside kick, recorded his third touchdown of the night on an eight-yard pass from Stanley and the LA KISS led by 15. Then Nelson scrambled for a one-yard touchdown to cut the LA KISS lead to 8. Following an onside recovery, which they returned for a touchdown, the Gladiators had a chance to even the game at 56 points. But Nelson couldn’t find an open receiver and the LA KISS retained a two-point lead with a minute left in the game. On the ensuing possession, Stanley converted on fourth and goal and hooked up with Stephens for a seven-yard score. Gould’s PAT split the uprights, which gave the LA KISS a two-score lead with 35 seconds remaining in the game. Cleveland attempted to surmount a last-minute comeback and Sims caught a 19-yard touchdown to bring the Gladiators within two points. However, it was for naught and an onside kick recovery by Morgan clinched the win for the LA KISS. The LA KISS ultimately walked out victorious, and defeated the Gladiators by a score of 63-to-61.

Next week the LA KISS will start their final two-game road trip of the 2016 regular season and travel to Jacksonville to take on the Sharks (5-9) at the Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena on Saturday, July 23rd. The game, which is set to kickoff at 4:00 PM PST, will be available to be streamed live via WatchESPN/ESPN and on the ESPN App.

Injuries Plague LA KISS, Fall to Sharks 46-32

Jacksonville, FL—The LA KISS (7-8) were unable to overcome injuries to three key players and fell to the Jacksonville Sharks by a score of 47-to-26 in front of 11,840 fans at Jacksonville Veterans Memorial Arena on Saturday afternoon.

Due to injuries, the LA KISS lost quarterback Nathan Stanley and defensive lineman Mike Lewis first quarter, as well as offensive lineman Shannon Tevaga in the fourth quarter.

Quarterback Pete Thomas completed 33-of-53 pass attempts for 325 yards and five touchdowns. Donovan “Captain” Morgan, who tallied 13 receptions for 117 yards and a touchdown, led the LA KISS receiving corps. Justin Wilson recorded 11 receptions for 105 yards and two touchdowns.

For the Sharks, quarterback Tommy Grady threw four touchdowns and tossed zero interceptions, while completing 25-of-29 pass attempts for 180 yards. Joe Hills caught eight passes for 69 yards and found the end zone three times. Joe Hills added nine receptions for 45 yards and three touchdowns. Derrick Ross rushed for 62 yards and three touchdowns on 13 attempts.

Jack linebacker Terrance Smith led the LA KISS defense with nine total tackles (seven solo) and one interception. Fredrick Obi added nine tackles. For Jacksonville, Greig Reed led the way with 16 tackles, while Jackson LaRoch added 11 more.

In the first quarter, each team found the end zone once. The LA KISS opened the scoring on a three-yard Thomas-to-Wilson touchdown and the LA KISS took a 7-0 lead with 9:43 left in the quarter. Less than two minutes later, Jacksonville countered when Robustelli caught an 18-yard touchdown from Grady. At the end of the quarter, the score was even at seven.

The Sharks struck first in the second quarter. Derrick Ross rumbled for a two-yard touchdown on the ground and, after a failed PAT, the Sharks led by six. After an LA KISS turnover on downs, Grady tossed a four-yard pass to Hills and the Sharks led 20-7. The LA KISS cut the deficit to six when Wilson hauled in a four-yard pass from Thomas. Jacksonville closed out the half with a four-yard touchdown from Grady to Hills to extend the lead back to 13 points. At halftime, the Sharks led 26-13.

After the LA KISS and the Sharks traded touchdowns in the third quarter, Jacksonville took a 13-point lead into the fourth quarter. In the third, Grady threw a six-yard touchdown to Hills and Thomas found Wilson for a seven-yard score.

On the first play from scrimmage in the fourth quarter, Ross scored on a two-yard rush. After the kick found the uprights, the Sharks led 40-20 with 14:57 remaining. Then Thomas scored on a six-yard quarterback keeper, which cut the lead to two scores. Although the LA KISS were unable to recover an onside kick, they regained possession after a Grady fumble. Unfortunately, the LA KISS could not get anything going on offense and turned the ball over on downs. Then the Sharks and LA KISS traded touchdowns. Ross scored a 13-yard rushing touchdown and Morgan caught a two-yard receiving touchdown. At the end of regulation, the Sharks defeated the LA KISS by a 46-to-32 margin.

Next week the LA KISS end the 2016 regular season in Portland when they face-off against the Steel (2-13) at the Moda Center on Monday, August 1st. Kickoff is set for 7:00 PM PST and the game will be available to be streamed live via WatchESPN/ESPN and on the ESPN App.

LA KISS Drop Regular Season Finale to the Steel, 48-46

Portland, Ore.— In a defensive, back-and-forth battle, the LA KISS (7-9) were defeated by the Portland Steel (3-13) by a final score of 48-to-46 in front of 5,236 fans at the Moda Center on Monday night. The Donny Hageman point after attempt was good and the LA KISS led 7-0 with 8:58 left in the first quarter. On the ensuing possession, the Steel capped off a nine-play drive with a touchdown when Austin hit Perry for a four yards. After a successful kick, the score was even at seven. After a 34-yard kickoff return by Wilson, the quarter ended and the score was 7-7.

Following a 12-yard reception from Sam Tupua, the LA KISS struck first in the second quarter on a one-yard QB sneak by Thomas. The kick was no good and the LA KISS led 13-7. Portland evened the score, but was unable to take the lead, after Perry hauled in an 18-yard touchdown and Moch blocked the PAT. On the first play of the next possession, Sergio Gilliam intercepted Thomas' pass. The Steel were unable to take advantage on the turnover and they turned the ball over on downs. One play after the one-minute warning, Thomas found Morgan for an 11-yard touchdown and the LA KISS took a 20-13 lead with 53 seconds on the clock. The Steel countered with a two-yard rushing touchdown Bryson Kelly and the score was tied at 20, which was the score at the half.

The second half opened with a five straight turnovers and ended with by back-to-back scores. Obi and Gilliam recorded interceptions then Moch recorded a strip-sack on Austin. The fumble was recovered by Mike Lewis, which gave Los Angeles possession. Austin, after an LA KISS turnover on downs, fumbled the ball and the LA KISS recovered the ball on the Steel's 10-yard line. The LA KISS finally were able to find the endzone when Wilson scored on a 10-yard reception from Thomas and the LA KISS took a seven-point lead with 6:04 left in the quarter. On the next drive, Steel fullback Kevin Myers plowed his way threw the goal line for a one-yard rushing touchdown. The kick split the uprights and the game was tied yet again. At the end of the quarter, the game remained even at 27 points.

To start the fourth quarter, Thomas led the LA KISS on a five-play, 47-yard scoring drive, which ended with a 25-yard touchdown to Wilson. After the Hageman kick split the uprights, the LA KISS regained a seven-point lead with 13:22 left in the game. The Steel brought the game to a 34-point deadlock when Carter hauled in an 18-yard touchdown. Then Morgan caught a 32-yard touchdown from Thomas and the LA KISS fired back and took another six-point lead. Portland gained their first lead of the game after a one-yard touchdown run by Kelly and a successful PAT. However, Portland's lead was short-lived. On the first play of the LA KISS' ensuing drive, Thomas found a wide-open LaQuan Williams for a 25-yard score. The two-point conversion attempt was no good, and the LA KISS were up 46-41 with 56 seconds left in the game. The Steel managed the clock perfectly and, with just seven second remaining in regulation, scored on a 13-yard pass from Austin-to-Perry and took a two-point lead. The LA KISS could not find the end zone as time expired and the Portland Steel ended the game on top, 48-46.

Next week the LA KISS will host their first home postseason game in franchise history as they welcome the Cleveland Gladiators to the Valley View Casino Center on Sunday, August 7th. Kickoff is scheduled for 3:00 PM PST and the game will be able to be viewed live on ESPN 3.
