

BLAST BULLETIN



Good evening ladies and gentlemen and welcome to the Baltimore Arena for tonight's game between the Baltimore Blast and the St. Iouis Steamers. Baltimore, currently 20-28 on the season, will be looking to snap a 6-game losing skid tonight against the Steamers, who temporarily halted the Blast's playoff bid last Friday night with a 4-2 win in St. Iouis. Kenny Cooper's club currently trails 4th place Chicago by 1½ games in the battle for the final playoff spot in the Eastern Division, and the Sting will be hosting Kansas City tonight at 8:35 PM EST. Following tonight's game, the Blast will play host to the Kansas City Comets this Saturday night, marking Baltimore's final meeting with a Western Division opponent this season. Plenty of tickets are still available for Saturday night's game against Kansas City.

BLAST/STEAMERS HISTORY: Baltimore lost their last game against St. Louis last Friday night in St. Louis, 4-2. St. Louis is one of just two MISL teams (Minnesota is the other) to have a winning record in regular season play against the Blast, with a 14-12 mark, including a 2-1 edge this season. Lifetime here in Baltimore, (including a 1-2 record in the '83-84 title series), the Steamers have a 5-10 mark, having last won here on November 8, 1984, 5-4 in overtime.

A LOOK AT BALITHORE: This eveining's contest is the 24th of 28 regular season home games for the Blast, who presently sport a 14-9 mark in home games so far in '87-88. Those nine losses here at the Arena are the most the club has ever endured in one season, as are the team's current 19 road defeats. Tonight, the Blast will be looking to put the brakes to a 6-game losing streak, and in the meantime, prevent themselves from tying the club record for most consecutive losses (7), which, ironically, was set earlier this season when the team dropped seven straight games from December 12 to January 6. The current losing streak began in Cleveland on March 10 with a 10-5 loss to the Force, and continued two nights later at home, as the Sting edged the Blast in overtime, 5-4. Three losses out west (Tacoma, Los Angeles, and San Diego) and last Friday's 4-2 defeat in St. Iouis make up the remainder of the ill-timed losing streak. Despite the sub-par record, Baltimore continues to remain in the hunt for a playoff spot in the Eastern Division. Not only does the Blast play 5 of its last 8 games at home, but Baltimore still has two games remaining with Chicago, including a key meeting next Tuesday night in the Windy City. The Sting will make its final regular season visit on April 13. The following is a look at the Blast's scoring leaders.

A LOOK AT ST. LOUIS: St. Louis lost their last game as they were defeated by Dallas, 5-3, last Sunday. St. Louis is led by Poli Garcia, who is the leagues 10th leading scorer with 42 goals and 26 assists, Jerry Gray, 17 goals and 25 assists, and Daryl Doran, 16 goals and 17 assists.

TONIGHT'S STARTING 'KEEPERS: The likely starter for Baltimore is Scott Manning who has a 5-7 lifetime record against St. Louis. Currently this season, Manning is 14-19 with a 4.60 GAA. The probable starter for St. Louis is Slobo Ilijevski who has a 4.55 GAA and a 10-22 record.

INJURY REPORT: For Baltimore, Mike Reynolds, ankle sprain, Michael Brady, ankle sprain, and Franklin McIntosh, toe sprain, are out for tonights contest. St. Louis will be without Nebo, knee injury, and Tony Bellinger, broken foot.
