At the end of the season, the player with the most points will receive the Met Life Player of the Year Award.



AMERICAN SOCCER LEAGUE OPENS SEASON SUNDAY; THREE GAMES SET FOR THE FIRST WEEKEND

SCARSDALE, NY, April 12 -- The American Soccer League, with three new coaches scattered among its ten teams, and with a new standings point system, opens its second season this Sunday, when three games are scheduled.

The league's defending champion Washington Diplomats have the honor of kicking off the season, when they entertain the Tampa Bay Rowdies at Robert F. Kennedy Stadium in a 4:00 pm game. One hour later, the New Jersey Eagles, the ASL's 1988 Northern Division champions, will begin the new season by hosting the Boston Bolts. The Albany Capitals will travel to Orlando for a 7:30 pm game in the only interdivisional game on the inaugural weekend's schedule.

"We have the same 10 teams which brought professional soccer back to the East coast last year," said ASL Chairman Clive Toye. "We all anticipate an exciting season and one in which we will continue to pursue our goals of establishing a stable pro soccer league which will provide playing opportunities for the vast number of young athletes who are being produced by the youth programs of America."

The ASL this week announced that plans are underway for a merger with the Western Soccer League, including an ASL-WSL Championship Game

set for September 9 in San Jose.

Among the opening weekend highlights will be the debuts of two of the ASL's three rookie coaches. New Jersey's Bob McNulty took over as the Eagles' head coach last January following a career as assistant coach at Rutgers University and will be charged with defending the team's Northern Division championship. In Orlando, Gary Hindley takes over for the Lions. Hindley, a former goalkeeper, hopes to fashion a playoff caliber squad and will call upon his 30 years of playing and coaching experience to do so.

The other league teams will open their schedules over the next two weekends. The Maryland Bays will open April 22 at Tampa Bay; the Washington Stars will open at New Jersey April 23; the Ft. Lauderdale Strikers will open at home against Orlando April 29; and the Miami Sharks will open up at the Washington Stars April 29, concluding the

NEW STANDINGS POINT SYSTEM IN PLACE FOR 1989 ASL SEASON; TEAMS LIMITED TO ONLY TWO NON-RESIDENT ALIENS ON ROSTERS

At the American Soccer League's annual general meeting last fall, the league's executives revised the system for awarding standings points. For the 1989 season, a team winning in the regulation 90 minutes will receive 3 points; a team winning in the penalty kick tiebreaker will receive 2 points; and a team losing a tiebreaker will earn one point in the standings.

Also new for 1989 is the limit of two non-resident aliens per club. Last year's rules allowed 3 per team, but the charter plans of the league mandated a reduction to 2 for 1989. "Green Card" holders are not affected. Players holding student visas count against the two.

American Soccer League games are all played according to the FIFA Laws of the Game. Each game is 90 minutes in duration, followed by penalty kicks if necessary to break a tie.

BOSTON BOLTS at NEW JERSEY EAGLES...Bolts (9-11 in '88) boast both of New Jersey's 1988 goalkeepers...Greg Kenney and Terry Higgins, now with Boston under head coach Sid Mazzola, will face their former team for the first time...Bolts also count on returning "ironman" Jorge Montoya, their rugged defender who played every minute of every game last year...Eagles new head coach Bob McNulty makes ASL debut...Eagles, defending No. Division champions, have several new signings, including U.S. National teamers Amr Aly and Sadri Gjonbalaj...ASL leading scorer Jorge Acosta is expected to join Eagles following his MISL commitment with the Dallas Sidekicks.

TAMPA BAY ROWDIES at WASHINGTON DIPLOMATS...Diplomats begin defense of their ASL title at RFK Stadium...team that raced to the title with a strong second half of the season is basically intact...leading the way will be Michael Brady (Diplomats' leading playoff scorer with 11 points), and Jean Harbor, who scored 9 points in 9 games after joining the squad midseason...The Rowdies, one of soccer's proudest names, have acquired Irish international Mark Lawrenson to help the defense, and still have the league's leading goalie, Winston DuBose (0.75 gaa in 1988) in the nets.

ALBANY CAPITALS at ORLANDO LIONS...Albany has signed U.S. National teamer John Diffley (midfielder, graduated from American University) and ASL All-Star Elvis Comrie (from the Maryland Bays) to bolster John Bramley's team...also returning is Jeff Guinn, a defender who was an All-Star and the Capitals' 1988 MVP...Orlando's new head coach will count on All-Star Lou Karbienier among others as the Lions begin play in a new home, Showalter Field.

WESTERN AND AMERICAN SOCCER LEAGUES
ANNOUNCE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME, PLAN MERGER

SEATTLE, WA; SCARSDALE, NY--The American Soccer League and the Western Soccer League champions will meet in San Jose, California on September 9, 1989, in a national pro soccer championship game. WSL Chairman William Sage and ASL Chairman Clive Toye announced the title contest simultaneously on both coasts today.

Toye and Sage also announced that they have begun laying the foundation for a merger that will establish a professional circuit of at least 20 teams by 1992.

The two leagues' decision to begin working toward a merger represents a major development in support of the United States Soccer Federation's announced plan to establish a three-tiered national professional league system.

"This is a most significant step forward by our two leagues—a step we believe will help rally the soccer fans of this country as the 1994 World Cup approaches," said Toye and Sage in a joint statement. "These are the two premier leagues in the United States, and it only makes sense for us to join forces in pursuit of our common goals: the promotion of the game, the development of the American player and the wise management of big-league soccer."

According to the joint resolution adopted by the WSL and ASL Boards of Directors, the leagues will begin work at once to finalize details of the eventual merger and begin paving the way for their teams to join the USSF's new Professional Division. A timetable for interleague play will be developed, but not implemented until such a schedule is economically viable.

The two leagues will also devise a joint plan for developing of regional divisions in the central US.

The WSL, known until September, 1988 as the "Western Soccer Alliance," was founded in 1985 with four charter clubs. It opens its fifth season April 22 with nine teams: the defending-champion Seattle Storm, Portland Timbers, Sacramento Jazz, San Francisco Bay Blackhawks, Real Santa Barbara, California Kickers (Los Angeles area), San Diego Nomads, L.A. Heat, and Arizona Condors, based in the Phoenix area.

The ASL begins its 1989 campaign on April 16. All 10 teams are veterans of the League's inaugural season in 1988. Last year's champions, the Washington Diplomats, are joined by the Albany Capitals, Boston Bolts, New Jersey Eagles, Maryland Bays, Washington Stars, Tampa Bay Rowdies, Orlando Lions, Ft. Lauderdale Strikers, and Miami Sharks. An eleventh team, based in the South Jersey/Philadelphia area, will begin play in 1990.

"Since the WSL was formed, its stated purpose has been to serve as the forerunner for a new national professional league," Sage explained. "With this agreement to merge we feel that, in essence, we will take a large step toward that goal. We look forward to working with the ASL officials and clubs to bring about a smooth transition."

"The ASL began with identical objectives and philosophies," Toye continued, "first and foremost being the desire to be of benefit to the game of soccer. With that common ideological base, the practical issues of merging should not be particularly difficult."
