

The Eagles completed their roster this past week by signing four new players: defenders Nelsi Morais and Sean Crowley, and midfielders Adrian Gaitan and Aidan McCluskey.

In order to meet the 18-man and two-foreigners limits, the Eagles have refrained from re-signing midfielder Paul Riley. Pat Hughes and Peter Gill are the two foreigners on the team. Gill, however, expects to receive his green card any moment.

When he does, the Eagles will reconsider Riley.

Jorge Acosta is questionable for today's opener while he nurses his right knee, which was reinjured in practice last week. The diagnosis on Acosta is an "anterior cruciate insufficient right knee," which will require a brace with a "five degree hyperextension." Acosta did practice with the team on Friday and hopes to be in the lineup for next weekend's games.

Andy Bakun is the only player from last year's opener against the Boston Bolts that remains on the team. Jorge Acosta was playing in the MISL with the Dallas Sidekicks a year ago at this time. Gill missed the first few weeks, and Mario Fava, Toma Gojcevic, Andranik Eskandarian, and Hubert Birkenmeier also joined the team a few weeks into the season.

The Eagles have won two of three previous meetings with the Lions. Last year, the Lions won 2-0 in Orlando, and the Eagles won 1-0 in a penalty kicks tiebreaker at Hinchliffe Stadium. In 1988, the Eagles won 2-0 in Orlando in their only meeting.

The Lions defense entered the season with a reputation for being difficult to score against. Although the Lions record after two seasons stood at 17 wins and 23 losses, only two teams (the Washington Stars and Tampa Bay Rowdies) have allowed fewer goals. However, only one team (the Miami Sharks) have scored fewer times than the Lions.

Lions goalkeeper Greg Kenney is the APSL East's all-time leading netminder, with a 0.862 goals against average in 29 games over two seasons. Kenney played 12 games for the Eagles in 1988, and still holds the team's single season shutout record with four. Kenney played with the Bolts in 1989.

Last year's Lions goalkeeper, Frank Arlasky, the league's third stinglest 'keeper with a 0.92 goals against average, remains on the team. Lions forward Rod Castro was the league's 10th leading scorer last year, with six goals and five assists for 17 points. Another key player is midfielder Heinz Wirtz, who doubles as an assistant coach.

The Lions opened their 1990 season last night in Maryland by losing to the Bays, 1-0.

The Eagles will play the Washington Stars at 7:05 p.m. next Saturday night in Woodson H.S. Stadium, Fairfax, Virginia, and the Washington Diplomats on Sunday at 4:35 in RFK Stadium in D.C. The next game at Cochrane Stadium is in two weeks, when the Eagles host the Tampa Bay Rowdies at 2 p.m. on May 6.

N.J. EAGLES SIGN FOUR FOR SEASON OPENER

JERSEY CITY, N.J. — The New Jersey Eagles completed their roster in time for their American Professional Soccer League opener by signing defenders Nelsi Morais and Sean Crowley and midfielders Adrian Gaitan and Aidan McCluskey.

All four players will be available for Sunday's opening game at Cochrane Stadium, Jersey City, against the Orlando Lions after impressing new Eagles coach Terry Garbett during late March and April trials.

Morais is best known to area fans for his stint with the Cosmos from 1976-80, during which time he appeared in 63 North American Soccer League games, 14 playoff matches, and helped the Cosmos to three championships.

Before joining the Cosmos, Morais was a teammate of Pele and Carlos Alberto at Santos in the Sao Paulo league of Brazil. Most recently, Morais has played with G.H. Metros in the Over-30 Long Island League.

Crowley is Old Dominion University's all-time leading goal scorer, with 36 tallies in 79 games during four seasons. He was the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year in 1988, when he finished third among NCAA scorers with 18 goals.

While at Old Dominion, Crowley's team won one Sun Belt Conference championship and finished runnerup twice. He was an Academic All-American in 1988, when he was honored by the Old Dominion alumni association as Male Athlete of the Year.

Gaitan, from Oceanside, N.Y., spent the last two seasons with the Washington Stars of the APSL. In 24 games with the Stars, mostly as a defensive midfielder, he contributed a goal and an assist.

Gaitan played for the American University team that reached the NCAA championship game in 1985. He has also played with various U.S. national youth team selections.

McCluskey is Fairleigh Dickinson University's fourth leading alltime scorer, with 47 goals and 25 assists in 85 games. He was a key member of the Knights teams that made NCAA tournament appearances in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

McCluskey was a first team All-American in 1984, when he tallied 18 goals and 11 assists in 22 games. As a junior in 1983, he notched 22 goals and 13 assists in 24 games. He joins the Eagles from the Kearny Scots of the Garden State League.

N.J. EAGLES OPEN SUNDAY AT COCHRANE STADIUM

JERSEY CITY, N.J. -- The New Jersey Eagles will open their 1990 American Professional Soccer League season this Sunday, April 22, at 2 p.m. at Cochrane Stadium, Jersey City, against the Orlando Lions.

The opener will be the Eagles' first game ever in Jersey City, as well as the debut of head coach Terry Garbett, who formerly was a player and assistant coach with the Cosmos.

Garbett will also be introducing several new faces to Eagles fans in the opener. The most significant of those is center forward Pat Hughes, formerly of Seton Hall University and the Boston Bolts.

Players expecting to see APSL action for the first time on Sunday are midfielder Paul Kitson and defenders Kyle Boschen and Mark Harris.

Kitson formerly played with the New York Arrows in the Major Indoor Soccer League. Boschen, a Lehigh University All-American from Morris Plains, N.J., and Harris, a Paterson, N.J., resident who most recently played with the New Jersey Stallions of the North Eastern Super Soccer League, will be making their professional debuts.

Sunday's opener also marks the return of two players from the Eagles' outstanding 1988 team, midfielder and captain Paul Duffy and forward Roger Chavez. Duffy spent 1989 with Boston, while Chavez played with the Miami Sharks and Fort Lauderdale Strikers during the season.

Back from last year are forward Paul Riley, midfielders
Jorge Acosta and Andy Bakun, defenders Peter Gill, Andranik
Eskandarian and Toma Gojcevic, and goalkeeper Hubert
Birkenmeier.

Acosta, the league's all-time leading scorer, is a hopeful starter for Sunday's opener while he nurses an injured knee. Gill's availability on Sunday is also being determined on a day-to-day basis.

Also available for Sunday's opener are midfielder Aziz

Ibrahim, a former Fairleigh Dickinson University star and

Jersey City resident, and goalkeeper Mario Fava.

Coach Garbett is continuing to trial players and is hoping to sign a few more names in time for Sunday's game.

Among the possibilities are former Cosmos defender Nelsi Morais, former Fairleigh Dickinson midfielder Aiden

McCloskey, and former Old Dominion midfielder Sean Crowley.

MARYLAND'S FIRST HALF FIREWORKS SINK BOSTON; PENN-JERSEY WINS TO HOLD NORTHERN DIVISION LEAD

The big guns boomed early in Maryland last Saturday. When the smoke had cleared at the 36:20 mark, the hometown Bays had seized a 2-1 lead over the Boston Bolts on outside shots by Rob Ryerson and Jean Harbor, enough to bag their first win of 1990.

In other Easter weekend action, Penn-Jersey pulled out a 1-0 decision over the Washington Stars in the 86th minute, and Albany started its season on a winning note by topping Miami 1-0 at the Orange Bowl, leaving the Capitals tied with Maryland for second place in the ASL North.

Boston midfielder Janusz Michallik made his ASL debut in spectacular fashion, blasting a 25-yard shot into the upper right corner of the Maryland net only 14:50 into Saturday night's contest. The Bolts' lead was short-lived, however. Ryerson's impressive 18-yarder from the top of the penalty area tied the score in the 31st minute; Harbor clinched the win for the Bays less than 5 minutes later off a free kick from well outside the box. Harbor, who signed with the Bays only a week ago, was the league's fifth leading scorer in 1989, notching 7 goals and 5 assists in 13 games with the Washington Diplomats. Both teams mounted strong scoring efforts in the second half, with Ian Hennessey's point-blank shot in the 54th minute providing Boston's best chance to equalize, but Maryland's defense held firm. The Bays are on the road next weekend, facing Miami Sunday at 8:05, while the Bolts are idle until their home opener, a 1989 championship rematch against Ft. Lauderdale on April 28.

Experience may have carried the day in Maryland, but youth ran away with the game for Penn-Jersey in its Saturday night match against the Stars. Rookies Duane Robinson (Adelphi University) and Pat O'Kelly (Seton Hall) teamed for a neat give-and-go with less than 3 minutes remaining to break a scoreless tie and give the ASL's new team on the block its first win. The Stars, 0-2 after two weeks of play, started the 1990 season without either Scott Snyder (knee injury) or John Kerr, Jr. (currently playing with Linfield in the Northern Irish league), their top two scorers for each of the past two seasons. Snyder is expected back for next week's home opener against Ft. Lauderdale, and Kerr when the Irish season ends in May, but meanwhile the team's offense has been struggling. Penn-Jersey's experienced defensive combo of Richie Maher, Brian Ainscough and George Gelnovatch combined to hold the Stars to only

6 shots despite the presence of US national team midfielder Bruce Murray on the visitors' side

and some elusive one-touch passing by the Stars during the second half. The win kept the Spirit on top of the ASL North for a second week, but at a price. Midfielder Michael Brady went off at halftime after reinjuring his right ankle, and Maher left the game in the 86th minute

with a suspected broken arm.

At the Orange Bowl in Miami, Albany spoiled David Irving's head coaching debut by beating the Freedom 1-0 in the season opener for both teams. Miami held the offensive edge statistically, outshooting the Capitals 14-11 and collecting 8 corner kicks to the visitors' 3. But the Capitals' Elvis Comrie was the first, and only, player to find the back of the net, in the 53rd minute off a feed from Ramiro Borja. Albany goalie Bill Steffen picked up 6 saves in his firstever ASL start, a figure matched by Miami 'keeper Patrick Johnston. The Capitals go for their second win next Sunday against the Diplomats at RFK Stadium.

NEXT WEEK: LIONS ON SAFARI IN ASL NORTH; EAGLES OPEN AT HOME

The Orlando Lions debut next weekend with a two-game road trip, starting in Maryland on Saturday (7:35 pm) and wrapping up on Sunday afternoon in New Jersey. The Lions were the surprise team of 1989, opening the season with a 6-game win streak and 5 straight shutouts. At least 12 members of that squad will return in 1990, bolstered in goal by Greg Kenney (Boston)--the league's second-place 'keeper last season with an 0.76 GAA, and player/assistant New Jersey takes the field with an coach Heinz Wirtz, a former MISL all-star at midfield. interesting mix of proven veterans and new faces. Anchoring the defense will be former NY Cosmos Hubert Birkenmeier (GK) and Andranik Eskandarian (D). Returning to the lineup for the first time since 1988 will be forward Roger Chavez (Miami, Ft. Lauderdale) and midfielder Paul Duffy (Boston). 1989 holdovers include ASL all-star Paul Riley (F) and scoring leader Jorge Acosta (7g, 1a). The Eagles look particularly strong at midfield, where Duffy is joined by 1989 returnees Andy Bakun, Toma Gojcevic, 8-year MISL veteran Paul Kitson and AISA standout Pete Tadrick. The Eagles and Lions kick off Sunday afternoon at 2:05.
