RECORDS: The Eagles are 0-1 in the American Soccer League's Northern Division...this is the Stars first game of the 1989 regular season...The Eagles were 15-5 last year, while the Stars were 11-9.

THE SERIES: The Stars hold a 2-1 edge in the series between the two clubs...the Eagles won the first game between the teams, 3:2 in pk's on May in Washington, but the Stars captured both matches at Hinchliffe Stadium, 2-0 on July 10 and 2-1 on pk's on July 31...those were the only two regular season losses the Eagles suffered at home last year.

TODAY'S PROMOTIONS: Today is "Hot 97" day. Radio station WQHT will have their "Rolling Thunder" van at the stadium, and will give out 50 prizes at half-time.

NEW PLAYER: The Eagles signed goalkeeper Rodolfo Sapp earlier this week. The 30-year-old Sapp is 5-11 and weights 175. He is a native of Argentina, and has played in Italy and Colombia.

THE STARS: Washington is coached by former Cosmos player John Kerr...their President and GM is former Cosmos coach Gordon Bradley...both Kerr and Bradley have sons on the Stars roster. Doug Bradley is a defender, and John Kerr, Jr. currently with the U.S. National Team is a forward. The Stars leading scorer last year, Scott Snyder was third in the ASL with 8 goals.

STARS PR DIRECTOR: Steve Winter made the trip with the team, and will be available in the press box area to provide information.

NEXT WEEK: The Eagles travel to Florida for a pair of back to back games next weekend. The Tampa Bay Rowdies will provide the opposition on Saturday (April 29) night at 8:00pm in Tampa Stadium. The Eagles will then travel across to Orlando to face the lions in a 7:30 game at Showalter Field on Sunday.

NEXT HOME GAME: The Eagles next home game is Sunday May 7 against the Tampa Bay Rowdies at 5:00pm.
