#### TODAY'S GAME

This afternoon's contest between the Stars and the New Jersey Eagles will be the season's opener for the Stars and the second home game -- the second game overall -- for the Eagles.

The Stars are looking forward to commencing action in the American Soccer League, having produced a 11-1-2 record in pre-season training.

The Eagles experienced a rough start to their 1989 season, losing their opener at home to the Boston Bolts ~~10-1~~ on April 16.

#### LIFETIME SERIES

The Stars and the Eagles met three times in regular season play during the 1988 ASL season with two those three games decided in overtime shootouts.

The Eagles won the first meeting between the two teams, 5/8/88 at Stalnakar Stadium in Fairfax, Virginia, 3-2. Chris Maier and Rob Olson scored for the Stars in that game while Roger Chavez and Jorge Acosta connected for the Eagles.

The Stars evened the series 7/10/88 at Hinchliffe with a 2-0 victory, thanks to goals from Scott Snyder and Charlie Raphael.

Then, three weeks later, 7/31/88, with the Stars' season on the line, the club used a late goal from John Kerr, Jr. to force another overtime shootout in which the Stars prevailed to produce a 2-1 Washington victory.

## RECENT PERFORMANCES

The Stars produced a 11-1-2 record in pre-season training camp while the Eagles, prior to their ASL season's opener, went 5-1 in exhibition play.

## NEXT GAMES

The Stars will return to Fairfax, Virginia for their home opener at W.T. Woodson High School's Pat Cunningham Stadium, their new home field, when they host the re-structured Miami Sharks on Saturday, April 29, beginning at 7:30 p.m.

The Eagles, meanwhile, take their show on the road for a pair of road contests in the Sunshine State. First, they'll pay a visit to the Tampa Bay Rowdies for an 8:00 p.m. game, Saturday, April 29 before travelling up to Orlando where they'll meet the Lions in a 7:30 p.m. Sunday evening contest.

## PLAYERS NOTES

### NEW FACES

While much of the club's nucleus remains in tact from last season, the Stars do have a number of new players on their 1989 season roster.

### MIKE REYNOLDS

Perhaps most notable among them is former Baltimore Blast (MISL) star Mike Reynolds. Reynolds, brother of Orville Reynolds, who played defender for the Stars last season, was a standout performer in training camp, scoring a number of goals and generally leading the team from his midfield position.

### TOMMY STONE

A teammate of Stars' striker John Kerr, Jr. at Duke University, where he emerged as a feared goal scorer, Stone promises to give the Stars a balanced and potent attack on the front line. In his four-year career at Duke, he racked up 38 goals and 20 assists.

### JIM HICKS

A native of Ipswich, England, Hicks has seen action in 40 English Second Division matches as well as a number of games in the English Third Division. A strong, aggressive defender, he promises to make the Stars' stingy defense an even tougher nut for ASL offenses to crack.

### SHAYON JALAYER

A native American, Shayon (pron. like Cheyanne) is the youngest player on the club's roster. A skilled playmaker and a speedy striker, Stars' coach John Kerr has big plans for the 18-year old, looking upon him as a Washington Star of the future.

### NEW SIGNEES

The Stars also announced the official signing of four additional players -- defender Rick Potts, midfielder Richard Eaton, goalkeeper Jorge Alvial and forward John Tuttle. Potts, Eaton and Alvial return from last year's squad. Tuttle, 21, is a 5-8, 155 lb. striker from William and Mary where he scored 29 goals and 15 assists in four seasons.



### KEY RETURNING PLAYERS

Among the regulars returning to action for the Stars this season are goalkeeper Neil Cowley, defenders Doug Bradley, George Lidster and Doug Davies, midfielders Sonny Askew, Chris Maier and Adrian Gaitan and striker Scott Snyder. Stiker John Kerr, Jr. is expected to re-join the club after his contract with an English Vauxhall Conference team expires in early May.

### INJURY REPORT

Stars' defender Doug Bradley will miss today's game with a severe ankle sprain, ligament and bone damage. Bradley turned his ankle in the Stars' final exhibition game and is expected to miss the next two-to-three weeks.

Forward Charlie Raphael will miss the entire 1989 season, due to a severely broken left leg. The injury also occurred during the exhibition season.

### ALSO SITTING THIS ONE OUT

Thanks to a league ruling which requires penalty points to be carried over from one season to the next, the Stars' will be forced to play their first two games without the services of midfielder-defender Doug Davies. Davies incurred six yellow cards last season.

### OUT OF TOWN ACTION

In the only other match scheduled today, the Washington Diplomats are hosting the Boston Bolts in a 4:00 p.m. match at RFK Stadium.
