NEW JERSEY EAGLES vs MIAMI SHARKS

Hinchliffe Stadium, Paterson, NJ

RECORDS: The Eagles are 4-0...they are the only undefeated team in the American Soccer League...The Sharks are 2-2 following last night's loss.

LAST GAME: The Eagles beat the Maryland Bays 4-1 in the home opener last Sunday...Jorge Acosta scored three goals, while Dave Masur recorded the Eagles game winner...The Sharks lost to the Albany Capitals in Albany last night, 2-1.

LAST MEETING: The Eagles beat the Sharks 2-1 in the first ever ASL game on April 9...Paul Duffy and Jorge Acosta recorded the first two goals in Eagles history that night, while Horacio Ponce scored the Miami goal--the first in league history.

COACHES: The Eagles Ed Kelly is in his first pro assignment...he played in the NASL, MISL and old ASL...he is also the head coach at Seton Hall University...Miami's Carlos Alberto is a New Jersey area favorite...he played for the Cosmos during the club's glory years in the late seventies and early eighties...he was captain of Brazil's World Cup Championship team in 1970...coached his former team, Fluminense in Brazil.

TOP PLAYERS: Jorge Acosta is quickly establishing himself as the scourge of ASL goalkeepers...in four games, Acosta has scored six goals, including three last week, and added an assist...he has scored in all four of the Eagles games...the Eagles have two undefeated goalkeepers...Greg Kenney beat Orlando and Washington, while Terry Higgins posted wins against Miami and Maryland...National Team Players Peter Vermes and Tab Ramos are back with the Eagles, after missing two of the last four games...The Sharks lineup features former Brazil World Cup star Dirceu Guimares...he played for Brazil in the 1974, 1978 and 1982 World Cups...going into last night's game, he had scored 1 goal, and added one assist...Miami's leading scorer is Jose Luis Moya, who had 2 goals and an assist prior to last night...Troy Edwards and Horacio Ponce also had single goals.
