New Jersey Eagles day of game notes, May 20

A goal by substitute forward Keith Fulk with just two minutes remaining lifted the Penn-Jersey Spirit to a 2-1 win over the Eagles last night at Trenton State College. Fulk, one of six former Eagles on the Spirits roster, scored from seven yards away from a pass from Dan Donigan, who drew goalkeeper Hubert Birkenmeier out of the goal.

The Eagles (2-4) had tied the game at 1-1 at 44:00 when forward Roger Chavez curled a free kick into the upper left corner from 27 yards out. The Spirit (4-3) took the lead 95 seconds earlier when Eagles defender Sean Crowley inadvertently deflected the ball in his own goal trying to break up a pass from midfielder Dave Banks to forward Duane

Robinson in from of the goal.

The Eagles outshot the Spirit, 8-5, and had numerous other opportunities to score. In the first seven minutes, Crowley, midfielder Aidan McCluskey, and Chavez missed chances from inside 10 yards. Defender Nelsi Morais, forward Winston Buddle, and McCluskey also threatened during the balance of the half.

In the second half, Buddle had the Eagles two best chances, shooting over the goal from five yards away after a neat pass from Chavez in the 15th minute, and shooting wide from 15 yards out in the 80th minute.

Birkenmeier needed to make just one save, a beauty in the 38th minute when he stopped forward Michael Brady almost

point-blank in front of the goal.

Last night's night doubled as the first leg of the Turnpike Challenge Cup, established by the Eagles and Spirit to recognize the winner of two-game league series between the teams. If the rivals split the games, the team with the If goal totals are most quals will be awarded the cup. even, the winner will be determined by doubling the value of away goals. If the Eagles triumph 1-0 or by any two-goal margin in the return leg at Cochrane Stadium on Friday night, July 6, they will win the trophy.

Paul Riley played 68:58 in an attacking midfielder/ withdrawn forward role in his return to the Eagles last night. He wore number 7, as he did last year, and McCluskey agreed to switch to number 8.

The Eagles' other new signees, Buddle and midfielder Dan Hatter, played the full 90 minutes in their debuts.

Buddle joins the Eagles from Vasco Da Gama of the North Eastern Super Soccer League. He has played professionally in Cyprus with Anorthosis F.C., and locally with the New York Nationals of the United Soccer League and Connecticut Yankees of the old American Soccer League. While at Westchester Community College, Buddle earned first team All-American honors. He also played soccer at Port Chester High School in New York. He wears number 9.

Hatter joins the Eagles after four outstanding seasons at Fairleigh Dickinson University, where he captained the Knights to a second consecutive NCAA tournament appearance in 1989. He earned first team All-Region and All-Northeast conference honors in 1987, 1988 and 1989. He contributed an important offensive dimension to his sweeper role last season by netting three game-winning goals. He was recently named FDU's male athlete of the year, and honored by the East Conference Athletic Conference for being the athlete with the highest grade point average. He wore number 2 last night, but will be unavailable today because he graduates from FDU in afternoon ceremonies.

A spot on the roster was cleared for Hatter when defender Peter Gill became ineligible for this weekend's games because of paperwork complications relating to his residency status. The Eagles hope to re-activate Gill this week.

The Eagles are 1-3 lifetime against the Fort Lauderdale Strikers. After winning 1-0 at Hinchliffe Stadium in their initial meeting in 1988, the Eagles lost, 4-1, in the return leg at Lockhart Stadium. Last year, the Strikers won, 3-0, in Fort Lauderdale, and 1-0 in New Jersey.

The Strikers enter today's game as the defending American Professional Soccer League champion as well as the APSL East's winningest team, with a 5-1 record. The Strikers lineup includes last year's league leading scorer, forward Ricardo Alonso, who finished with 10 goals and seven assists, forward Alvin James, one of this year's top scorers (three goals through May 7), and midfield Marcello Carrera, who entered the season as the league's sixth leading all-time scorer with eight goals and 18 assists (league record) in 39 games with the Strikers. Other familiair names on the Strikers roster are goalkeeper Arnie Mausser and defender Thomas Rongen.

Forward Jorge Acosta had the stitches from his right leg removed on Friday and will begin his rehabilitation program right after Memorial Day.

The Eagles' next two games are in Florida, against the Miami Freedom on Friday, May 25, at 8:05, and the Strikers on the following night at 8:05. The Eagles return to Cochrane Stadium to host the Freedom on June 3 in the first of three consecutive Sunday, 7 p.m., games. A "buy one, get one free" special is in effect for June 3. For each ticket purchased for that game, fans are entitled to a free ticket for that or any other Eagles game at Cochrane Stadium.
