

GAME NOTES

MARYLAND BAYS at NEW JERSEY EAGLES Sunday, May 21, 1989 at Hinchliffe Stadium, Paterson, NJ Kickoff 5:00pm Home Game # 5, 1989 Game # 7 7800 River Road North Bergen, NJ 07047 (201) 861-6607

RECORDS: The Eagles are 1-5 with four points, in fifth place in the American Soccer League's Northern Division...the Bays are 3-1 with 7 points, in second place in the ASL North...all four of the Bays contests have resulted in penalty kick tie-breakers.

SERIES: The Eagles hold a 2-1 edge in the regular season series between the two clubs...New Jersey won both outings at Hinchliffe Stadium last year, 4-1 on April 24 and 2-1 on June 5, while the Bays won the one match in Maryland on May 28 2-1...the loss to the Bays snapped the Eagles seven game season opening win streak.

FUTURE MEETINGS: The two teams will meet twice more this season...both contests will be at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County, June 25 and July 16.

COMINGS & GOINGS: The Eagles waive Amr Aly, this week. No other changes in the roster were made.

EAGLE EGGS: Sadri Gjonbalaj, with 2 goals, l assist, 5 points is the only Eagle among the ASL's leading scorers...no Eagle player has scored in two straight games...Tim Mulqueen has a 1.00 goals against average, tied for fourth best in the league...Paul Riley is the leading vote-getter in the Met Life Player of the Year Balloting with 16 points.

THE BAYS: Maryland has set an ASL record with four straight tie-breakers...the team has scored only three goals in regulation time, two by Phillip Gyau, and one by Kevin Sloan...Nick Broujos has been in goal for all four games, and has allowed 3 goals for a 0.75 average, third best in the league going into this weekend.

LAST GAME: The Eagles lost a heart-breaker to Albany, 2-1. Sadri Gjonbalaj gave New Jersey a 1-0 lead in the 86th minute, but goals by Ramiro Borja and John Harkes in the final four minutes gave the Capitals the win.

NEXT WEEK: The Eagles make their second trip to Florida with back to back games in Miami (Sat 8pm) and Fort Lauderdale (Sun 8pm)...Two more road games will be on tap before the club returns home, Boston (Sat June 3, 7:30pm) and Washington Stars (Sat June 10, 7:30pm).
