GARY HINDLEY ON
THE NEW JERSEY EAGLES: "The Eagles have shown a lot of inconsistency in the first half of the season, but seem to have added some talent and some experience to their roster of late. They have improved tremendously on the defensive side and will pose a difficult task in this second game of a back-to-back".

THE STORY--"LION":

Tonight the Lions make their first ever appearance in Hinchliffe Stadium to take on the New Jersey Eagles. It is the second, of a two-game weekend swing through the Northeast for the Lions, having battled the Capitals in Albany last night. In addition, this afternoon's match-up pits two teams headed in totally opposite directions. Last year, Orlando struggled all season at or near the bottom of the ASL southern division, while the Eagles won the North division easily, taking victory in 15 of the 20 games they played. But this year, the Eagles have fallen from the "penthouse" to the "outhouse" of the northern division, currently languishing in last place, while the Lions have claimed their rightful place as the "king of the jungle" so far this year. For the Lions in the first half of the year, it has been a case of sweet revenge for all the abuse they recieved in 1988, and for the Eagles, a sobering fall from grace.

LIONS PAUSE:

As the Lions head into the second half of the season this weekend, we thought it might be interesting to look back at where the Lions stood at this stage last year, and where they are now. Last year, through nine games the Lions sported a 4-5 record. Heading into this weekend, the Lions were 7-2. Through ten games, the Lions were even-money at 5-5. Orlando did not win its seventh game of 1988 until the 16th of the season, this year they did it on their eighth. Win number eight did not occur until the 18th game, and win number nine never did, with the Lions finishing 8-12. So to borrow the phrase, "Orlando Lions, you've come a long way, baby!"...The Lions have now scored at least one goal in ten straight games, the last time they were shutout dates back to last season when the Washington Stars blanked the Orlando Club, 4-0, in Washington on July 30 ...Speaking of streaks, Lou Karbiener saw his team-leading string of 23 consecutive games played end June 2nd, when he was forced to sit out the Miami game after amassing three yellow cards. Robert Heileman now takes over the team lead with 19 consecutive games played. Incidentally, Heileman not only hasn't missed a game in a while, he has not missed a minute of play this year, playing in all 810 minutes so far...Rod Castro, the only Lion voted onto the ASL All-Star line-up by the League's coaches this week, has three points in his last two games, leads the club in scoring (4-3=11) and is tied for third in the ASL in that category. Franklin McIntosh, tied for 7th in the ASL scoring department with (3-2=8), has done most of his damage recently, scoring all three goals and one of his assists in the last three games. McIntosh has scored a goal in his last three games, which is the longest goal-scoring

streak of the year for the Lions...Looking ahead, the Lions face a scedule where they will play their final 11 games of the season over a period of seven weeks, with it fairly evenly spread with six away and five at home. But counting tonight, the Lions will play three out of its next four games away from the friendly confines of Showalter Field.
